

Khairatabad MLA Danam Nagender admits defecting to Congress party

Hyderabad: Khairatabad MLA Danam Nagender on Wednesday triggered a fresh political storm by admitting that he had defected to the Congress. Ironically, he is the only MLA who is yet to respond to notices issued by Speaker Gaddam Prasad on disqualification petitions filed by the BRS.

Making candid remarks before the media here, Nagender categorically stated that he belonged to the Congress party and continued to be a Congress MLA. He also vowed to work to ensure the party's victory in the upcoming Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) elections. He said he would campaign across all 300 GHMC divisions for the Congress and its ally, the MIM. Hyderabad city guide

"I do not know which party the other defected MLAs belong to. But I

am definitely in the Congress," he declared in response to media queries.

Nagender's admission assumes significance amid ongoing arguments on the disqualification of 10 MLAs who defected from the BRS to the Congress. He was elected to the Telangana Assembly from Khairatabad on a BRS ticket in the 2023 elections. Soon after his victory, he crossed over to the Congress and later contested the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from Secunderabad on a Congress ticket, though he was defeated. As he had openly contested on a Congress ticket in the Lok Sabha elections, his disqualification appears inevitable, unlike others, which is suspected to have prompted his admission.

While the BRS has pursued the matter aggressively and filed petitions for disqualification of all 10 turncoat MLAs, Assembly Speaker Gaddam



Prasad Kumar recently dismissed disqualification petitions against five MLAs,

citing lack of conclusive evidence that they had formally joined the Congress.

Illegal weapons seized in pre-dawn raid in Hyderabad's Yakutpura



HYDERABAD: In a major operation against persons having a criminal history, the Hyderabad police conducted a raid early on Wednesday morning at the house of Hamza Bin Omer, alias Zafer Pahelwan, at Yakutpura. The police seized illegal weapons from the house.

The raids were conducted by the police to prevent unlawful activities. Zafer Pahelwan has 40 cases registered against him since 1982 and is allegedly attempting to dominate the old city criminal gangs with the help of his associates Sayeed Pahelwan and Suleman Pahelwan, said the police.

Around 60 police personnel participated in a pre-dawn operation in the Yakutpura locality.

Recently, the police arrested two sons of Zafer Pahelwan in connection with the murder of Junaid, who was murdered on December 3. The police are maintaining rowdy sheets against at least seven members who have a blood relation with Zafer Pahelwan. The ACP Mirchowk division, G Shyam Sunder, said Zafer Pahelwan, Sayeed Pahelwan and Suleman Pahelwan are absconding currently.

The Hyderabad police have opened a rowdy sheet against Zafer Pahelwan, a former constable of City Armed Reserve Hyderabad police, in early 1980s. On multiple occasions, he was evicted from the city by the police for indulging in illegal activities.

The police have appealed to the public to come forward and share any information related to the accused or their activities and assured that the identity of informants will be kept strictly confidential.



Construction done unscientifically, says Sridhar Babu

Peddapalli: IT and Industries Minister D Sridhar Babu inspected the damaged check dam built across the Maneru stream in Adavi Somanpalli village of Manthani mandal on Tuesday. He stated that an inquiry should be conducted into the check dam's construction, from its inception to its collapse. "The check dams are not benefiting the farmers and that they were constructed unscientifically," he alleged, in a statement later.

He added that the check dams were built without maintaining quality standards, and a full-scale vigilance inquiry should be conducted quickly. "Those responsible for the check dam's damage would be held accountable, regardless of their position," the minister warned.

He said an inquiry would be conducted to determine the reasons for the collapse of the check dams constructed during the previous government's tenure. "Some people undertook such check dam constructions for commissions, and it is clear whose benefit they were built for," he said.

Sridhar Babu assured that an impartial inquiry would be conducted to find out why these check dams were constructed in the first place when they offer no benefits to the farmers.

Farmers demand urea bags

Khanapur: Upset over not receiving enough urea bags to protect their crops, farmers took to the streets and staged a rasta roko (road blockade) at the Kadam mandal center in Nirmal district on Tuesday.

They expressed anger that officials were causing difficulties through the so called "urea app" system.

Fact-finding committee alleges Tanugula, Adavi somanpalli check dams blasted

Hyderabad: A 10-member Fact-Finding Committee, headed by V Prakash, former chairman of the Telangana State Water Resources Development Corporation, alleged in its report that both the Tanugula and Adavisomanpalli check dams built on the Manair river were blasted using explosives.

The Committee alleged that the sand mafia belonging to the ruling party was behind this destruc-

tion. The farmers lamented that it is regrettable that the local Member of Parliament and Union Minister, Bandi Sanjay, is also echoing this claim.

The Committee released a note on their findings on Tuesday. The Committee report said that their findings made it clear that it was destroyed by a bomb blast. It is understood that the 90-metre-long check

Koil Alwar Tirumanjanam' performed ahead of 'Vaikuntha Ekadasi'

Tirumala: Ahead of the auspicious Vaikuntha Ekadasi on December 30, the traditional temple cleansing ritual, Koil Alwar Tirumanjanam, was performed at the Tirumala temple on Tuesday in strict adherence to Agama traditions.

Speaking to the media, TTD executive officer Anil Kumar Singhal said Koil Alwar Tirumanjanam is a long-standing ritual conducted on the preceding Tuesday during four major occasions, Ugadi, Anivara Asthanam, annual Brahmotsavams and Vaikuntha Ekadasi.

As part of the ritual, the entire temple complex, from Ananda Nilayam to Bangaru Vakili, along with all sub-shrines, temple premises, potu, walls, ceilings and puja articles, was purified. Sacred aromatic substances known as Parimalam were sprinkled, followed by thorough cleansing. After completion of special pujas and Naivedyam as per Agamic procedures, devotees were allowed for darshan.

The EO said elaborate arrangements have been made for Vaikuntha Dwara Darshanam scheduled from December 30 to January 8. Over the past two months, officials conducted inspections and prepared detailed plans covering entry and exit



routes, security, annaprasadam distribution, accommodation, queue line management and parking facilities.

Following the directions of Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, a special TTD Board meeting was convened, prioritising common devotees during the 10-day Vaikuntha Dwara Darshanams.

Darshan tokens through the e-DIP system were allotted for December 30, 31 and January 1. Registrations were kept open for five days, attracting about 24 lakh applicants, of whom 1.89 lakh devotees were selected.

Token holders were advised to adhere strictly to their allotted date and time slot to ensure

darshan within two hours. Devotees without tokens will be allowed darshan through Sarva Darshan queues from January 2 to 8. During the same period, 15,000 Rs.300 Special Entry Darshan tickets and 1,500 SRIVANI tickets will be released online daily.

In view of the heavy influx, special darshans for senior citizens, parents with infants, differently-

abled persons, NRIs and defence personnel have been cancelled.

The EO assured adequate annaprasadam arrangements and tight security with 3,500 police personnel and 1,150 TTD vigilance staff deployed, while an Integrated Command Control Centre will monitor crowd movement continuously.

DGGI Vizag zonal unit unearths fake ITC network

Visakhapatnam: Officers of the Directorate General of GST Intelligence (DGGI), Visakhapatnam zonal unit, have unearthed a network involved in fraudulent involvement and passing on of Input Tax Credit

tion, Mallikarjuna Manoj Kumar has been identified as the controller/operator of the said network.

He admitted that transactions were carried out as per his directions and that the entities functioned solely for passing on ITC without real business operations or actual supply.

Also, financial analysis revealed structured diversion and layering of funds linked to the network, indicating planned routing and circulation of funds through multiple corridors. The network operated multiple dummy/invoice-only GST entities to obtain and issue tax invoices without any underlying supply by falsely showing works contract services, manpower supply and construction materials.

The GST officials informed that the accused Mallikarjuna Manoj Kumar was arrested for committing offences under various sections.

Notably, this is the fourth arrest made by DGGI, Visakhapatnam zonal unit during the current financial year, underscoring its sustained and focused enforcement against GST evasion and fake ITC frauds.

ABVP flays Lokesh for ignoring students' hardships

Vijayawada: The Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) demanded the State government to immediately fill 3,600 vacant posts in government universities to ensure quality education for students and provide adequate basic infrastructure in educational institutions. The student body also urged the government to clear the pending Rs 6,400 crore fee reimbursement dues without further delay, warning that failure to do so would invite strong student protests.

Addressing the media here on Tuesday, ABVP Andhra Pradesh State Secretary Yaganti Venkata Gopi expressed concern that while students are being forced to migrate to other States in search of better educational opportunities, the education minister is limiting himself to "Hello Lokesh" platforms and ignoring the real hardships faced by students.

Botcha slams 'privatisation' of medical colleges by govt

Visakhapatnam: Leader of Opposition in Legislative Council and former minister Botcha Satyanarayana on Tuesday accused the state government of attempting to hand over medical colleges to private players, calling it a move against the interests of the poor.

Speaking at a press conference here, Satyanarayana said former chief minister Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy had met the Governor to highlight the "true intentions" behind the privatisation drive. He stressed that YSRCP's policy is to keep government medical colleges under state control to ensure access to medical education for the poorest sections.

"The coalition is projecting our stand as a 'threat' while continuing its privatisation scam. But this is not a threat-it is our policy," Satyanarayana asserted.

Referring to the Opposition's recent signature campaign, he said public sentiment is clearly against privatisation. "Anyone can go to the villages and conduct a survey to see the reality," he added.

Satyanarayana also criticised the renaming of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act by the NDA government at the Centre, calling it "unfortunate" and a setback to Gram Swarajya (village self-rule). He questioned why the Centre was not challenged on the issue and why Deputy Chief Minister K Pawan Kalyan remained silent.

Hyderabad police arrest three for drug peddling, seize MDMA and LSD

Hyderabad: A software employee, a bike taxi driver, and an event manager were arrested by the Hyderabad Narcotics Enforcement Wing of the city police for allegedly selling drugs. The police seized 22 grams of hydroponic ganja, 5 grams of MDMA, ecstasy pills – 5.57 grams, LSD blots – 6 and cash Rs 50,000.

The arrested are Ummidi Immanuel (25), event manager, Sushmitha Devi (21), software employee, and Gorla Sai Kumar, a bike taxi driver. According to the police, Immanuel was procuring the drugs through the dark web and supplying them to customers through his live-in partner, Sushmitha Devi Sai Kumar was also procuring drugs from Immanuel and selling them to customers. "The payments for drugs were made through cryptocurrency and the suppliers sent the parcels containing drugs through courier services to Immanuel and Sushmitha Devi," said Gaikwad Vaibhav Raghunath.

On the alleged plight of the students under the coalition government's rule, he alleged that the Chandrababu Naidu-led government had failed to clear fee reimbursement dues and Aarogyasri bills. He further charged that prime lands were being sold at throw-away prices, while corruption and lack of accountability were worsening the state's condition. YSRCP Visakhapatnam district president K K Raju and Anakapalli district president Gudivada Amarnath were also present at the media briefing.

TTD chief quashes rumours on entry to Tirumala during Vaikuntha Darshan

Tirumala: TTD trust board chairman B R Naidu appealed to the devotees not to believe the false propaganda that 'no one with tokens will be allowed to enter Tirumala' which is in circulation on social media regarding the Vaikuntha Dwara Darshan to be held at Tirumala from December 30.

Addressing the media at his camp office in Tirumala on Tuesday evening, the chairman strongly condemned the misleading social media messages claiming that devotees without tokens are not allowed to come to Tirumala. He clarified that no one has the authority to ask devotees not to visit Tirumala.

He stated that TTD officials have been making extensive efforts over the past two months to ensure smooth arrangements for the Vaikuntha Dwara Darshan. Keeping past experiences in view, the State Government has also constituted a sub-committee comprising three ministers to oversee the arrangements.
