Repeal 'VBG Ramji Act' Immediately, Says Congress Leader Sugunakka

“Taj Khan, Kaghaznagar, January 11 (Indian Chronicle)““District Congress Committee (DCC) President Atram Sugunakka has demanded the immediate repeal of the “Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Rural) Act (VBG Ramji),” alleging that it undermines rural livelihoods and constitutional powers of village panchayats. “Addressing a press conference at her residence in Komaram Bheem–Asifabad district, Sugunakka strongly criticised the BJP-led Union government, accusing it of trampling upon people’s right to employment and weakening the constitutionally mandated authority of gram panchayats. “She said the VBG Ramji Act, introduced by the Centre in place of the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), was having a severe adverse impact on the livelihoods of rural communities. The Congress party, she asserted, completely rejects what she described as “dangerous policy changes” brought in through the new legislation. “Sugunakka recalled that MGNREGA not only provided employment to the rural poor but also served



as the backbone of the rural economy. By diluting the Act, she alleged, the Union government was playing with the lives of crores of workers. She demanded the immediate restoration of MGNREGA in its original form. “Warning

of intensified protests, Sugunakka said that if the Centre failed to act, the Congress would launch a strong agitation from the 20th of this month. She added that statewide protests would be organised, if necessary, to safeguard

the rights of rural people. “The press meet was attended by Asifabad Assembly constituency in-charge Shyam Nayak, Market Committee Chairman Mangat, along with several Congress leaders and party workers.
