Motorcyclist Killed in Accident at Medipally

The deceased was identified as Rishabh Sharma (26), who was riding from Uppal towards Ghatkesar. Near Kanakadurga Bar at Medipally, an oil tanker travelling on the same route allegedly struck the motorcycle from the side. Sharma fell onto the road and suffered severe head injuries. He was immediately shifted to Gandhi Hospital by local residents in an ambulance, where doctors declared him brought dead. Police have taken the oil tanker driver into custody and registered a case. An investigation is in progress to determine the cause of the accident. Police officials appealed to motorists to follow traffic rules and drive cautiously, especially urging heavy vehicle drivers to remain alert and ensure the safety of other road users. 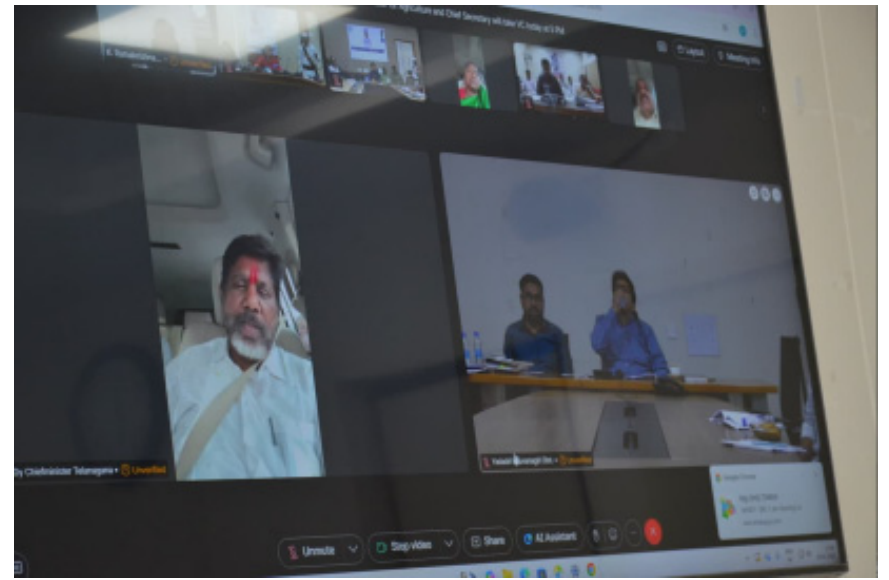
BRS State Leader Bannala Praveen Mudiraj Unveils Chilkanagar Plumbers Union Calendar

ments for the municipal elections must be completed meticulously. On Monday, the District Collector inspected the arrangements for the municipal elections to be held in Pochampally Municipality.

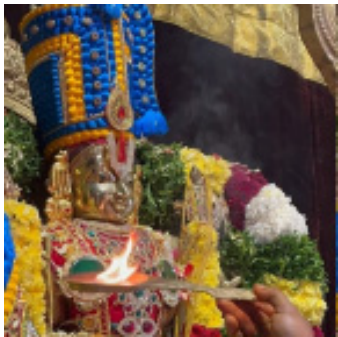


On this occasion, the District Collector inquired about the number of wards in Pochampally Municipality in the context of the municipal elections. He said that they should check how many poll-

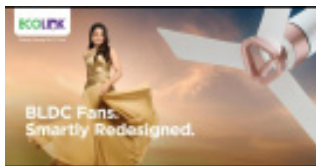

Small cap portfolio exposure to microcaps limited to ~2%

Hyderabad :According to a study by Ventura, portfolio exposure of small cap funds beyond the market cap rank of 1000—or microcaps—remains limited to ~2%. As of November 2025, the small-cap fund category manages ~₹3.7 lakh crore across 32 schemes.

The analysis shows that approximately 83% of small-cap fund portfolios are invested within the top 750 stocks, with the core small-cap segment—comprising stocks ranking 251-750 by market cap—accounting for ~63%. Allocation to stocks ranked 751-1000 stands at ~7%, about 20% is allocated to large and mid-caps, and about ~6% is held in cash and debt for liquidity purposes.



Small cap but large growth

Interestingly, small-cap market capitalization has expanded sharply in the past five years. Companies in the lower deciles of the listed universe have especially exhibited the fastest compounding in median market capitalization. For instance, between June 2020 to June 2025, the 251st rank has increased in market capitalization by ~4.4x, the 500th by ~6.1x, and 750th by ~7.3x.

Perception problem

Allocation to small-caps is also skewed by perception. "Many stocks perceived as large- and mid-cap are actually small-cap stocks for fund managers as per AMFI classification," says Juzer Gabajiwala, Director at Ventura. For example, familiar companies—including CDSL, Gillette, NBCC, PNB Housing Finance, Wockhardt, East India Hotels, Angel One, and Tata Chemicals—are officially classified as small caps even though investors often think of them as mid-cap-like.

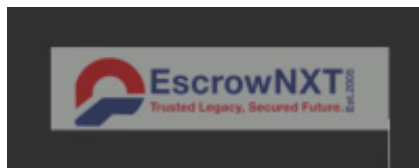
Shift in investor behavior

As per the study, investor behaviour does not always follow short-term performance. Between December 2024 and November 2025, small-cap funds delivered negative returns of roughly -2.4 percent, yet the category saw net inflows of ₹53,165 crore. Instead of pulling back, investors continued to allocate more. This suggests that flows are being driven by long-term conviction rather than short-term price movements. "By nature, smallcaps are volatile and at times risky. However, the category has evolved, portfolio construction has become more disciplined, and the opportunity set continues to broaden. Patience is the key for any portfolio investing and to create "alpha" one must have smallcaps in the portfolio," Gabajiwala concludes.
