### Critical Woman Given New Life Through Complex Surgery

Investigations including CECT, MRI, and Doppler revealed a large kidney tumor extending into the Inferior Vena Cava (IVC) as a tumor thrombus, indicating an advanced and life-threatening stage of cancer. “Despite the high risk, the Urology Department, along with other specialist teams, successfully performed a Right



Radical Nephrectomy, removed the IVC tumor thrombus (IVC Thrombectomy), and reconstructed the blood vessel (IVC Repair). The patient has now fully recovered and is ready for discharge, said Dr. G. Ravichander, HOD, Urology. “The patient’s family thanked the doctors and the Government of Telangana for providing such advanced treatment free of cost in a government hospital. “Dr.

## Chetana MeeSeva Earns District-Level Recognition for Aadhaar Services



He stated that the decisions made during the previous government's tenure, as well as the currently ongoing tender processes, should also be brought under the purview of this inquiry. He said that if any irregularities have occurred in the allocation of tenders over the past ten years, they should be revealed to the people of Telangana in order to protect the interests of the Singareni company. He emphasized that maintaining transparency and public interest is extremely important in a prestigious public sector undertaking like Singareni.
