Water Board Staff Swiftly Removing Silted Waste Following Visit of Marri Shashidhar Reddy

Former Minister Marri Shashidhar Reddy Reviews Sanathnagar Constituency issues.

“Indian chronicle, Secunderabad, January 04 : “Former Minister, former Vice-Chairman, and BJP National Council Member Shri Marri Shashidhar Reddy recently visited the Padmarao Nagar area of Bansilalpet Division to inspect a long-pending problem of sewage water overflowing on the road for several months. “After personally reviewing the situation, Shri Shashidhar Reddy immediately lodged a complaint with the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) officials. Subsequently, he held a review meeting at the Begumpet BJP office with available BJP divisional leaders to discuss the issue and related problems in the Sanathnagar constituency. “Following the meeting, Shri Shashidhar Reddy contacted Water Board Division-7 General Manager Vinod Kumar over the phone to enquire about the progress of the works. GM Vinod Kumar informed him that



he was present behind the hospital premises and that Water Board staff were actively removing silt and waste from previously identified buried sewer manholes. He stated that around 5 to 6 cubic meters of silt had already been removed and that he was personally supervising the ongoing works, which were still in progress. “Shri Marri Shashidhar Reddy instructed the General Manager to complete the works at the earliest and ensure that public inconvenience is avoided, emphasizing the need for prompt and effective resolution of civic issues affecting local residents.

Minor Dies After Treatment by Unqualified Practitioner; Accused Arrested in Kaghaznagar



“Taj Khan, Kaghaznagar, January 4 (Indian Chronicle) “Fake Medical Practitioner Arrested for Cheating Public; Minor Girl Dies After Negligent Treatment in Kaghaznagar” A man posing as a medical practitioner without any recognised medical qualifications was arrested for allegedly cheating innocent people and administering negligent treatment that led to the death of a minor girl. “According to police, Madaraveni Akshara, daughter of Ravikumar from Koyavagu village, was taken to the accused’s clinic for treatment. The accused conducted CBP and Widal blood tests, inserted a cannula, administered glucose, and gave a Vamikind injection to control vomiting. “When the girl’s parents returned on the third day stating that her vomiting had not subsided, the accused again administered Vamikind injection through the cannula and referred them to a diagnostic centre in Kaghaznagar for an abdominal scan. The diagnostic report reportedly indicated blood loss through urine due to kidney damage. “Alarmed by her deteriorating condition, Akshara’s parents shifted her to Rainbow Hospital, Hyderabad, for advanced treatment. Despite continued medical care, she was later admitted to

Niloufer Hospital, where she succumbed on December 29, 2025. “Accused Details” The accused has been identified as Tanneeru Bikshapathi (44), son of Narayana, a resident of Sir Silk Colony, Kaghaznagar, in Komaram Bheem Asifabad district. He falsely claimed to be a PMP doctor. “Police stated that, with

limited experience gained while working at Madhu Nursing Home, the accused allegedly set up a separate clinic without any legal qualification, with the intention of earning money by deceiving the public. In 2010, he established a first-aid centre in Koyavagu village under a friend’s name and continued to operate

it illegally. “On November 11, 2025, around 11 a.m., the accused allegedly administered high-dose injections to Akshara, resulting in severe kidney damage, which ultimately led to her death. “A case has been registered, and further investigation is underway. “(K. Sircilla Farmers Shift to Oil Palm Cultivation

KARIMNAGAR: Oil palm cultivation is rapidly gaining popularity among farmers in Rajanna Sircilla district, driven by attractive government subsidies and the assurance of a steady income for up to 35 years. As a result, many farmers are gradually shifting away from traditional crops to oil palm, which is considered resilient to natural calamities and wildlife damage.

The transition aligns with India’s efforts to reduce its heavy dependence on palm oil imports from countries such as Malaysia and Indonesia. To boost domestic production, the government is extending substantial financial support to farmers

Under the scheme, small farmers receive up to 90 per cent subsidy on oil palm plants, while farmers belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe (SC/ST) communities are eligible for 100 per cent subsidy on drip irrigation equipment. While the market price of a single plant is around ₹213, farmers can procure it for as little as ₹20. In addition, the government provides subsidies amounting to approximately ₹52,000 per acre over a four-year period.

Unlike many conventional crops, oil palm is highly resilient and is less affected by heavy rains, hailstorms or cyclones. The crop is also largely safe

from damage by monkeys and wild animals. During the first four years, farmers can cultivate vegetables, turmeric or flowering plants between the rows to earn additional income.

Harvesting begins from the fourth year, with yields initially ranging between five and seven tonnes per acre. Production increases steadily to around 15 tonnes per acre by the seventh year. A processing factory located at Narmetta in neighbouring Siddipet district ensures easy marketing, with companies collecting the produce directly from farms and crediting payments to farmers’ bank accounts within a week.

BRS leader Praveen Kumar joins striking sanitation workers, seeks immediate wage payment



“Taj Khan, Kagaznagar, January 4 (Indian Chronicle)“Sanitation workers of Kagaznagar Municipality, who have been on an indefinite strike for the past six months over non-payment of salaries, intensified their protest on Saturday night by sleeping on the ground in front of the municipal office.“Expressing

solidarity with the workers, BRS State General Secretary Dr. R. S. Praveen Kumar joined the protest and slept alongside the sanitation workers outside the municipal office.“Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Praveen Kumar said that workers had been facing severe financial hardship due to the non-payment

of wages for the last five to six months. He expressed anguish that such a deplorable situation existed in a department directly under the Chief Minister and questioned the condition of employees and workers in other departments.“He warned that failure to provide workers with due respect and timely salaries

could seriously affect public health and sanitation, posing risks to citizens.“Demanding immediate action, he said the Congress government must resolve the municipal workers’ issues without delay. “If the problem is not addressed promptly, the agitation will intensify further,” he cautioned.

Additional Collector stresses strict voter mapping ahead of municipal polls



“Taj Khan, Kagaznagar, January 4 (Indian Chronicle)““District Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Deepak Tiwari on Sunday directed officials to carry out the ward-wise voter mapping process in all municipalities with utmost precision.“The Additional Collector inspected MC Gafi School and DAV Laxmipath Singhanian School in Kagaznagar, along with Kagaznagar Sub-Collector Shraddha Shukla and municipal commissioners. During the visit, he reviewed the facilities provided at polling stations and the door-to-door survey being conducted as part of the comprehensive revision of electoral rolls.“Addressing officials, Tiwari said that the voter mapping exercise within municipal wards must be conducted meticulously. He explained that the electoral rolls provided by the Election Commission of India had been made available on the TEPOL portal, and that while voter lists were available polling-station-wise for Assembly constituencies, municipal voters must be mapped ward-wise.“He instructed officials to thoroughly examine objections and complaints received on the draft electoral rolls and to take steps to prepare an accurate and transparent voter list in coordination with agents of recognised political parties.

AIG Hospitals inaugurates Integrated Stroke Command Centre in Hyderabad

Hyderabad: Asian Institute of Gastroenterology (AIG) Hospitals on Sunday inaugurated its state-of-the-art Integrated Stroke Command Centre, an initiative designed to begin stroke management from the moment an emergency call is received, reducing delays in diagnosis and treatment.

The Centre will enable real-time coordination between the emergency call centre, advanced life-support ambulances, radiology services, neuro-intervention teams, and hospital command staff. It ensures continuous monitoring, live communication, pre-hospital data transmission, advanced patient registration, and immediate activation of stroke protocols even before the patient reaches the hospital.

Dr. D. Nageshwar Reddy, Chairman, AIG Hospitals, said, "The Stroke Command Centre is the first step towards stroke awareness, early recognition, and timely intervention."



Illegal Cattle Blood Racket Busted

Hyderabad: Two men were caught extracting blood cruelly from sheep and goats at a butcher's shop in Keesara, where police seized 130 packets of blood stacked with 'human blood' stickers.

According to officials, the duo identified as – Sanjeev, a doctor, and Sonu, caretaker of the shop – had drawn blood from 30 cattle that were alive using vacutainer needles meant for human sample collection. Each packet contained 750 ml and was priced at ₹5,000.

Veterinary doctors confirmed that cattle blood cannot be sold or injected into humans under any circumstances. Investigators said the men were supplying the blood to a trading company in Kacheguda for use in blood agar plates, which laboratories employ to detect pathogens.

Authorities stressed that such collection requires prior approval from the Animal Welfare Board and must not violate anti-cruelty



norms.

Though Keesara police have not registered a case, they alerted the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) and the Animal Husbandry Department. GHMC officials booked a case, seized the packets, and wrote to the collector and district magistrate of Medchal–Malkajgiri for further action.

Sources revealed the duo had been illegally selling goat and sheep blood for nearly three years. Inspector A. Anjaneyulu said the raid was conducted at Sonu Chicken and Mutton Market in Rampally following a tip-off, leading to the seizure of the packets and exposure of the racket.

Telangana: State Plans Flyover from ICCC to Shilpa to Ease Traffic Snarls

Hyderabad: The state government is planning to build a 9-km elevated corridor from the Integrated Command and Control Centre (ICCC) in Banjara Hills to the Shilpa Layout Flyover Road.

This project is expected to ease traffic bottlenecks at multiple places. Road number 45 Jubilee Hills, Film Nagar, Jubilee Hills Checkpost are some of the bottlenecks where commuters will breathe a sigh of relief. This elevated corridor will also ease traffic on the road heading towards Meenakshi Towers and Hitec City too. In addition to this, this corridor will ease traffic coming towards Nanakramguda and other offices in the Financial District from the city via Banjara Hills and Jubilee Hills.



Similarly, in addition to the IT employees and staff working in companies in the Financial District, this project will also benefit the residents living in dozens of housing societies in the Financial district. This elevated corridor will be used to enter and exit the core city through the Outer Ring Road area via Banjara Hills.

This project will be taken up by the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority (HMDA). "We are also engaging consultant for the preparation of detailed project report (DPR) for construction of Elevated Corridor from ICCC to Shilpa Layout flyover Road," said an HMDA official.

In recent times, this is the third elevated corridor that the HMDA has proposed with two other projects being, Paradise Junction to Shamirpet ORR, and Paradise Junction to Dairy Farm Road on NH-44.

"We want to design the flyover in such a way that, if Metro Rail comes up connecting Banjara Hills and Shilpa Layout Flyover Road, the same pier system of the elevated corridor should be used," said an HMDA official.

"With 'same pier system' being one of the aspects, a study will be done to check the number of properties that need to be acquired, environmental impact, traffic assessments and other aspects," he added.
