Mahalakshmi Scheme has generated good demand for RTC:

January 7):- Telangana State Government Whip and Alair MLA Beerla Ailaiah stated in the Assembly that the Mahalakshmi scheme has generated good demand for the RTC (Telangana State Road Transport Corporation). He said that sufficient buses should be arranged in the villages. He requested that more electric buses be allocated to the Yadagirigutta depot in the combined district, as it is a large depot. He said that buses are not running in the villages during school holidays and requested that RTC buses be operated even when schools are closed. He said that due to the provision of free bus travel for women under the Mahalakshmi scheme, the RTC is experiencing good demand. He said that women are utilizing RTC bus services at all times. Therefore, he requested that electric buses be provided to the Yadagirigutta depot.” He said that the Mahalakshmi scheme is not applicable to women traveling on buses going to the Yadagirigutta temple hill, which is considered the Telangana Tirupati. This results in the depot having to pay more from the temple's monthly income. He requested that the Mahalakshmi scheme be extended to women traveling on buses to the hill. He requested that new electric buses be introduced in every village. He said that in the last ten years, many people have died during RTC strikes. He stated that under our people's government, the RTC has become profitable and has been protected and supported through the Mahalakshmi scheme.

Euphoria Over Proposed District Reorganisation Renewed Demand to Declare Manthani as Sripada District



“P.S.ASHOKAN“KARIMNAGAR BUREAU.““Welcoming the State Government’s announcement on the imminent reorganisation of districts, mandals, and revenue divisions, Bejjanki Digambar, leader of the Students’ Organisations Joint Action Committee (JAC), expressed profound satisfaction and optimism. “Addressing the media on Wednesday, he stated that the declaration made in the Legislative Assembly by Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy has been widely received with approval across all sections of society. He remarked that the announcement has rekindled long-suppressed hopes among the people of Manthani. “Digambar recalled that despite repeated representations in the past to accord district status to Manthani, the previous government had shown complete apathy towards the demand. He particularly condemned the earlier decision to bifurcate the Manthani Assembly constituency between two districts, terming it an unjust and detrimental move. “He pointed out that this arbitrary division severely hampered the region’s progress, adversely affecting commercial activity, administrative efficiency, and overall socio-economic development. The lack of a unified district structure, he noted, caused long-term inconvenience to the public. “Expressing renewed confidence in the present initiative, Digambar asserted that the proposed district reorganisation offers a historic opportunity to fulfil the long-standing public aspiration of establishing Manthani as Sripada District. He emphasised that this demand reflects the collective will of the people and is vital for balanced regional development. “He further informed that a delegation would soon meet Minister Sridhar Babu to formally present their appeal and seek positive action in this regard.

Aim for 100% Pass in Class 10 Exams: Addl Collector Tiwari

“Taj Khan, Kaghaznagar, January 7 (Indian Chronicle)“District Additional Collector (Local Bodies) and in-charge District Education Officer Deepak Tiwari has directed officials to achieve a 100 per cent pass rate in the Class 10 annual examinations this academic year. “Chairing a review meeting on the ‘Shat Shat Sadhana 2.0’ programme at the conference hall of the Integrated District Offices Complex on Wednesday, Mr. Tiwari urged Mandal Education Officers and headmasters of school complexes to draw up a detailed action plan to ensure complete success. “He emphasised the need for headmasters to monitor student attendance daily and achieve 100 per cent attendance. In cases of absenteeism, they should speak to parents and take steps to ensure regular attendance. “Describing the next three months as crucial for Class 10 students, he instructed teachers to identify those lagging in subjects and conduct special classes. He also suggested that parents be sensitised during Parents’ Committee meetings to keep students away from mobile phones at home. “Mr. Tiwari asked schools to use the Summative Assessment-1 results as a benchmark, deploy subject experts for effective teaching, and focus particularly on English, Science, and Mathematics.
