
# Congress Leaders Offer Prayers to Sammakka–Saralamma

# Congress Leaders Submit Petition Seeking Street Lights and Removal of Water Hyacinth in Devender Nagar, Boduppal



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, January 31, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):““Congress Party senior leaders and local residents submitted a petition to the Boduppal Circle Deputy Commissioner Sailaja, demanding the installation of street lights in Devender Nagar Colony and the immediate removal of water hyacinth from nearby lakes and canals. The petition was led by Devender Nagar Colony president Dayyala Mahesh along with Congress Party in-charge Jinna Raju and colony residents. They stated that the accumulation of water hyacinth (gurra pu dekkka) in lakes and drainage canals has become a major cause of mosquito breeding and water pollution, leading to serious health problems among local residents. Speaking on the occasion, Dayyala Mahesh said that water hyacinth growing in lakes and canals is the primary reason for the rapid increase in mosquitoes and the spread of diseases. He emphasized that temporary removal is not sufficient and demanded permanent clearance of the accumulated hyacinth to effectively control mosquito breeding and protect public health. He further stated that water hyacinth clogging canals and lakes has turned into a severe problem for the people of Boduppal and urged officials to take immediate action. The delegation also requested the installation of street lights in Devender Nagar Colony, citing safety concerns and difficulties faced by residents during night hours. The leaders appealed to GHMC officials to respond promptly and implement long-term solutions by completely removing water hyacinth from water bodies and ensuring basic civic amenities in residential areas. ## Appeal to Kushaiguda Traffic Police Residents Demand Barricades Along Entire Stretch



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, January 31, (INDIAN CHRONICLE): “Residents of Srinivas Nagar Colony have urged the Kushaiguda Traffic Police to install barricades along the entire High Tension Line Road, stating that the four barricades placed on Friday are inadequate to address the ongoing traffic and safety issues. According to locals, merely installing a few barricades does not resolve the problem. They have demanded comprehensive measures across the entire stretch instead of temporary or symbolic action. The High Tension Line Road passes through a busy commercial zone with three to four shopping malls and the Sai Ganga Function Hall. Due to the absence of proper parking facilities for these establishments, vehicles are being parked on the road, causing severe inconvenience to residents. Locals have expressed serious concern over frequent traffic congestion and the increased risk of accidents, especially for pedestrians. Residents have squarely blamed the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) for the situation. They pointed out that while authorities installed road dividers from Netaji Nagar Junction to Gandhi Nagar Road, the High Tension Line Road from Srinivas Nagar towards Radhika has been neglected for years, raising serious questions. The absence of a road divider has turned this stretch into an accident-prone zone, with traffic chaos becoming a daily occurrence. Despite repeated complaints, GHMC officials have failed to take permanent measures such as constructing a divider or implementing effective traffic regulation, residents alleged. In this backdrop, locals have made a specific appeal to the Kushaiguda Traffic Police, stating that the four barricades installed on Friday are insufficient. They have demanded that barricades be placed continuously without gaps along the entire High Tension Line Road, from Gandhi Nagar Road towards Radhika, covering the Srinivas Nagar Colony area. Residents have also requested that these barricades be maintained until GHMC undertakes the construction of a permanent divider. They have further demanded that GHMC authorities immediately initiate work on a permanent road divider on the Srinivas Nagar High Tension Line Road and put an end to the negligence that is endangering public safety.

# Demand to Immediately Stop Construction of Gas Godown in Uppal Bhagayat Colony Residents Submit Representation to Uppal Deputy Commissioner, Town Planning Officials



“KISHORE VADDEPALLI, Uppal, January 31 (Indian Chronicle): “Residents of Uppal Bhagayat, under the banner of their association, submitted a complaint on Saturday to the Uppal Deputy Commissioner and Town Planning officials, demanding the immediate stoppage of a newly constructed gas godown in the area. Local residents, especially women, have expressed serious concern over the construction of the gas godown. “They informed the officials that establishing a hazardous gas godown in close proximity to a residential area poses a grave threat to public safety. The area is densely populated with houses, and a large number of children and elderly people reside there. The presence of a gas cylinder storage godown raises the risk of fire accidents or explosions, which could result in massive loss of life and property in the event of any mishap. “The residents stated that women and children are living in constant fear due to this construction. In their

representation, they also expressed doubts about whether the required safety standards, fire safety clearances, town planning permissions, and approvals from other concerned departments had been properly obtained for the construction of the godown. They pointed out that permitting such a dangerous facility in a residential locality could be in violation of government rules and regulations. “Considering the seriousness of the issue, the residents of Uppal Bhagayat, on behalf of women in the locality, officially submitted a complaint to the Town Planning Officer, Nagireddy, and the Deputy Commissioner. They urged the authorities to take immediate action on this critical public safety issue. “Therefore, the residents appealed to the concerned authorities to immediately halt the construction of the gas godown, conduct a comprehensive inspection, and take appropriate action by prioritizing public safety. If necessary, they demanded that the godown be relocated away from the residential area.

## Medical Research Workshop Concludes at Gandhi Medical college

## Missing Case Registered in Balaji Nagar

According to the complaint, her younger son, Burugu Satyanarayana (28), works as a gold worker at a gold shop belonging to a resident of Balaji Nagar. He usually leaves for work at around 9:00 AM and returns home by 9:00 PM every day. On 26.01.2026, Satyanarayana left home at approximately 9:00 AM to go to the gold shop. However, he did not return home thereafter. Though he had earlier gone out without informing anyone and returned after two days on a few occasions, this time he did not return at all. Concerned over his prolonged absence, family members searched for him among relatives, friends, and nearby areas, but his whereabouts could not be traced. Based on the complaint of Sanjeevamma, police have registered a missing case and investigation is underway.”

## The mapping process must be carried out meticulously as part of the special comprehensive revision program State Chief Electoral Officer Sudarshan Reddy

January 31):- State Chief Electoral Officer Sudarshan Reddy said that the mapping process should be carried out meticulously as part of the special comprehensive revision program. On Saturday, he held a review meeting via video conference from Hyderabad with

all district election officers, collectors, and EROs on the mapping process undertaken prior to the Special Intensive Revision. On this occasion, the State Chief Electoral Officer said that the special comprehensive revision program being undertaken under the auspices of the Election Commission of India should be conducted effectively. He said that measures should be taken to complete the mapping process by providing assistance and cooperation to the booth-level officers. He stated that booth-level officers should visit every house to complete the mapping process, and that village administrative officers and other officials should be appointed as assistants to the booth-level officers in the mapping process to ensure its speedy completion. He said that discussions should be held with representatives of recognized political parties to create awareness and ensure the appointment of booth-level agents from their respective parties. He stated that booth-level officers should conduct the mapping process by visiting the field, and that their supervisors and AEROs should assist them in the mapping process to ensure that the process is carried out meticulously without any errors. He said that the mapping of women under 40 years of age should be done based on their parents' details, and that publicity should be conducted to make the details of the booth-level officers known to the public. He instructed that the pending Form 6, 7, and 8 applications be processed expeditiously and that attention be paid to blurred photos and duplicate entries. # Cybercrime Police Detect 8 Cases, Arrest 9 Accused in One Week

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, January 31, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“The Cybercrime Police, Malkajgiri Commissionerate, detected eight cybercrime cases and arrested nine accused during the week from January 24 to January 31, 2026. The investigations revealed the involvement of organized cybercrime networks operating across multiple states in India. Among the detected cases, six were related to investment fraud, one to digital arrest fraud, and one to part-time job fraud. Most of the arrested persons were found to be mule account holders who provided their bank accounts to cyber fraudsters on a commission basis, facilitating large-scale financial fraud. The Cybercrime Police also secured refunds amounting to Rs.15,46,628 through court orders, which were successfully returned to victims. In a major digital arrest fraud case, the victim was threatened by fraudsters impersonating officials from TRAI, CBI, and the Supreme Court and was coerced into transferring Rs. 56 lakh. Two accused linked to this case were arrested in Visakhapatnam. Several investment fraud cases involved victims being lured through WhatsApp and Telegram groups, fake trading applications, IPO scams, and social media advertisements promising high returns. Fraudsters initially credited small amounts to gain trust before blocking withdrawals and siphoning off large sums. The arrested accused belong to Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, and Maharashtra, confirming the pan-India nature of the cybercrime syndicates. Public Advisory. Police advised citizens not to trust unknown calls, messages, or social media advertisements promising high returns. People were warned against sharing bank details, OTPs, Aadhaar, or PAN information and cautioned that renting or selling bank accounts is illegal. Citizens were urged to verify investment platforms through official regulators like SEBI. Victims of cybercrime were advised to immediately call the National Cyber Crime Helpline 1930 or report to the nearest Cyber Crime Police Station.
