

The upcoming municipal elections must be conducted freely, fairly, and in a peaceful atmosphere:

Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Election Officer Hanumantha Rao



“In the wake of the municipal elections... strict enforcement of rules.... Collector Hanumantha Rao” (Mandava Srisailam... Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau... Indian Chronicle... February 9):- District Collector & District Election Officer Hanumantha Rao stated in a press release on Monday that all arrangements have been completed to conduct the upcoming elections for the Bhuvanagiri, Aleru, Yadagirigutta, Pochampally, Choutuppal, and Mothkur municipalities freely, fairly, and in a peaceful atmosphere. He said that the arrangements for the polling, which will be held from 7 AM to 5 PM on the 11th of this month, have been completed. In this context, a silent period will be in effect from 5:00 PM on February 9, 2026, to 5:00 PM on February 11, 2026. It was clarified that during this

period, candidates, political parties, and their followers must strictly adhere to the Election Code of Conduct – 2019. “During the silent period, public meetings, rallies, processions, campaigning through loudspeakers, microphones, and vehicles, door-to-door campaigning, displaying banners, flexes, and posters, election campaigning through social media, and offering inducements such as cash, liquor, and gifts to voters are completely prohibited.” They warned that strict legal action would be taken against those who violate these rules. “They also stated that weapons are prohibited in the vicinity of polling stations... “To ensure the conduct of polling in a peaceful atmosphere, no one is allowed to carry weapons to the polling station or its surrounding areas on the polling day.

Holiday Announcement in view of the Municipality Elections on February 11th:

“(Mandava Srisailam... Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau... Indian Chronicle... February 9):- With the aim of achieving 100 percent polling in the municipality elections, District Election Officer and Collector Hanumantha Rao issued orders declaring a local holiday on February 11th, the polling day, to enable voters to exercise their right to vote in the municipality elections. As per the instructions of the State Election Commission, a general holiday has been declared on February 11th for government and institutional employees in the Bhongir, Alair, Yadagirigutta, Pochampally, Choutuppal, and Mothkur municipalities where polling will take place. Employees working in shops, establishments, and factories located in the election area will be given a paid holiday on the polling day to enable them to cast their vote. A paid holiday has also been declared for workers employed in private establishments. A holiday has been declared for government buildings and educational institutions used for election purposes on February 10th (Tuesday), the day before polling, February 11th (Wednesday), the polling day, and February 13th (Friday), the vote counting day. The Collector instructed the concerned officials to take appropriate action. The Collector urged voters to definitely exercise their valuable vote on the polling day.

February 9): - Additional Collector for Local Bodies, Bhaskar Rao, instructed the concerned officials to make strict arrangements for the Intermediate First and Second Year examinations. ““On Monday, the Additional Collector held a coordination meeting with the concerned officials regarding the conduct of the Intermediate examinations in the mini meeting hall, under the supervision of the District Intermediate Officer. On this occasion, the Additional Collector said that all arrangements should be made for the Intermediate First and Second Year annual examinations from February 25th to March 18th, and instructed the concerned officials accordingly. ““He said that 28 centers have been set up in the district for conducting the examinations. He stated that 6550 Intermediate first-year students and 6263 second-year students, a total of 12813 students, will be appearing for the examinations. He informed that students should reach the examination center by 8 AM for the examinations which will be conducted from 9 AM to 12 PM. He said that the concerned officials should perform the duties assigned to them with utmost care and vigilance. He said that utmost security should be ensured during the transportation of question papers. He instructed that RTC buses should be operated to ensure students reach the examination centers on time, and measures should be taken to ensure continuous power supply at the examination centers. He also directed that drinking water facilities should be provided within the limits of municipalities and gram panchayats. He said that sanitation should be maintained at the examination centers, and first aid kits and medical facilities should be made available

at all centers. He stated that CCTV cameras would be installed at the examination centers, and the opening of question paper envelopes and sealing of answer sheets in envelopes would be done under CCTV surveillance. He said that mobile phones would not be allowed. Section 144 would be in force during the examinations, and xerox centers in the vicinity of the examination centers should be closed. He instructed that flying squads and sitting squads should conduct surprise visits to the examination centers to ensure the smooth conduct of the examinations. ““Additional SP Lakshmi Narayana, Bhongir RDO Krishna Reddy, District Intermediate Officer Ramani, District Education Officer Satyanarayana, District Assistant Treasury Officer Mohan Rao, and other concerned officials participated in this meeting.

Three Held for Liquor Smuggling; Illegal Liquor Worth Rs3.5 Lakh Seized Details revealed by State Enforcement Assistant Commissioner Pradeep Rao



“KISHORE VADDEPALLI, Uppal, February 9 (Indian Chronicle): State Excise Enforcement officials arrested three persons involved in liquor smuggling at Bhagyaith area in Uppal on Sunday. Illegal liquor worth approximately ?3.5 lakh and a car used for transportation were seized and shifted to the Excise Police Station. Addressing the media at the Uppal Excise Police Station, State Enforcement Assistant Commissioner Pradeep Rao said that based on



credible information that liquor was being illegally transported from Noida (Uttar Pradesh) and Delhi to Hyderabad, special checks were conducted in Uppal. During the inspection, the officials intercepted a car belonging to Uttar Pradesh and arrested three persons identified as Gopal Reddy, Prasad, and Aditya Pratap. From their possession, the police seized 84 bottles of premium Scotch liquor, including Johnny Walker and Teacher's brands, valued at around ?3.5 lakh. The accused were reportedly purchasing liquor at lower prices in Noida and Delhi and selling it at higher prices in and around Hyderabad. The three accused have been remanded to judicial custody. A case has been registered at the Uppal Excise Police Station, and further investigation is underway, officials said.

February 9): Additional Collector for Local Bodies, Bhaskar Rao, stated that the concerned officials must conduct the counting process for the municipal elections to be held in the district responsibly. Strict Action Against Model Code Violations Ahead of Kothagudem Municipal Elections

coming to an end, Deputy Superintendent of Police Adinarayana held a media conference at the DSP office under the directions of District Superintendent of Police Rohith Raju to outline security arrangements and enforcement measures ahead of polling scheduled on the 11th. “Addressing the media, the DSP appealed to citizens to cooperate with the police department to ensure that the elections are conducted peacefully and smoothly. He warned that strict legal action would be taken against anyone found violating the Model Code of Conduct. “Providing details of enforcement activities, he stated that in the limits of Kothagudem town, which comprises 33 divisions, police have seized 40 litres of liquor worth Rs. 34,000 and 5.5 kilograms of banned ganja valued at approximately Rs. 2.70 lakh. Three cases have been registered for violations of the Model Code of Conduct. Additionally, 258 rowdy sheeters and other identified troublemakers have been bound over in 110 cases as a preventive measure to maintain law and order. “The DSP informed that elaborate security arrangements are being made at 110 polling booths located across 41 polling stations in the 33 divisions. Of these, 65 booths have been identified as sensitive and 45 as normal. Adequate police personnel will be deployed to ensure peaceful polling. “He further cautioned that strict action will be taken against anyone attempting to influence voters by distributing liquor, cash, or other inducements. The police department is maintaining close surveillance, and any attempt to disturb peace and public order during polling will not be tolerated, he added

Ganja, worth Rs. 4.76 crore, was destroyed by burning... Kukkadapu Naresh Kumar, Kothagudem constituency

, February 9, Indian Chronicle: Khammam Deputy Commissioner Janardhan Reddy issued orders to burn 953 kg of ganja seized in 47 cases registered across six excise stations in the erstwhile Khammam district (Khammam and Kothagudem districts). Accordingly, the ganja from the cases registered at the stations was collected, and a total of 953 kg was incinerated on Monday at the government-approved AWM Consulting Limited incineration plant. This company is located in Gopalpet, Tallada mandal.



The estimated value of the destroyed ganja is Rs. 4.76 crore. Deputy Commissioner Janardhan Reddy stated that 42 kg of ganja from 9 cases at Khammam-1 Excise Station, 57 kg from 5 cases at Khammam-2 station, 193 kg from 7 cases at Madhira station, 114 kg from 2 cases at Palvancha station in Kothagudem district, 21 kg from one case at Manuguru station, and 625 kg from 23 cases at Bhadrachalam station were incinerated.

48 Hour Silence Period Enforced in Bhadradi Kothagudem Ahead of Municipal Polls

“Bhukya RanjithNaik, Bhadradi Kothagudem Bureau, February 9, Indian Chronicle : Election campaigning for the forthcoming municipal elections in

Bhadradi Kothagudem officially concluded at 5.00 pm on February 9, in view of the polling scheduled for February 11. District Election Officer and Collector Jitesh V. Patil, in an official statement, announced the enforcement of a 48 hour silence period prior to polling. “Citing Section 209 of the Telangana Municipalities Act, 2019, the Collector stated that during the silence period, no public meetings, gatherings, rallies, or processions related to elections shall be conducted. Delivering campaign speeches addressing the public and promoting candidates through cinema, television, electronic media, mobile phones, or social media platforms is strictly prohibited. “He further clarified that sending political SMS messages, bulk messages, or attempting to influence voters through entertainment programmes or other indirect

promotional activities during the silence period would constitute a violation of the law. Social media platforms will be closely monitored to prevent the circulation of election related campaign material. “The District Election Officer warned that stringent action will be taken against individuals or groups found violating silence period norms or breaching the Model Code of Conduct. Legal action will be initiated against those who fail to comply with the directions and instructions issued under election regulations. “To ensure peaceful and orderly conduct of polling, Flying Surveillance Teams, Static Surveillance Teams, MCC monitoring teams, and police officials have been directed to remain on high alert. The Collector also instructed authorities to conduct extensive inspections at function halls, hotels, and lodging establishments as part of preventive measures. “As per the directives of the Election Commission, the conduct and publication of opinion polls and exit polls during the restricted period are strictly banned. The Collector appealed to political parties, candidates, and the general public to adhere to election rules and extend full cooperation for the smooth and peaceful conduct of the polling process.

Section 163 BNSS Act Enforced in Ramagundam Police Commissionerate for Peaceful Conduct of Municipal Elections

ASHOKAN .“KARIMNAGAR BUREAU. “Ramagundam Police Commissionerate“Press Release“Date: 09-02-2026“In view of the forthcoming municipal elections scheduled to be held on 11th February 2026, the Ramagundam Police Commissionerate has imposed Section 163 of the BNSS Act to ensure the peaceful, fair, and orderly conduct of the electoral process.“The enforcement of Section 163 will be applicable in the following areas:“Peddapalli Zone: Ramagundam Municipal Corporation, Peddapalli, Sultanabad, and Manthani Municipalities“Mancherial Zone: Mancherial Municipal Corporation, Chennur, Kyathanpally, Bellampalli, and Lakshettipet Municipalities““The restrictions will remain in force from 5:00 PM on 9th February 2026 until the completion of the polling process, and again from 8:00 AM on 13th February 2026 until the completion of counting and declaration of election results, stated Ramagundam Police Commissioner Mr.

Amber Kishore Jha.“During the period of enforcement, gathering of more than four persons at any place is strictly prohibited. Any attempt to disturb the electoral atmosphere through provocative statements, inflammatory remarks, instigative actions, or conduct likely to incite violence or unrest will invite strict legal action, the Commissioner warned.“The restrictions, however, will not apply to personnel engaged in official duties, including police officers, forest officials, central armed forces, home guards, and SPOs.“The Commissioner further clarified that processions, rallies, and public meetings without prior legal permission are strictly prohibited. Carrying sticks, knives, firearms, or any other lethal weapons within a one-kilometre radius of polling stations is completely banned.“Permission must be obtained in advance for the erection of temporary structures such as shamianas and pandals. The use of microphones and loudspeakers, conducting meetings, playing songs, or de-



livering speeches that may incite hostility between communities or groups is strictly forbidden.“Additionally, the display of unauthorised notices, placards, symbols, or any material that defies law-

ful authority during the election period will be treated as an offence under the law.“The Police Commissioner appealed to the public to cooperate with the authorities and contribute to the peaceful and democratic conduct of the municipal elections.

Tight Security Arrangements at Strong Rooms and Counting Centres: Peddapalli DCP B. Ram Reddy

Rowdy-Sheeter Arrested for Attempted Murder Over Old Grudge

“Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, February 09: “ Police arrested a rowdy-sheeter identified as Stephen for attempting to murder a youth by attacking him with a blade and a stick, allegedly over an old personal grudge.” The incident occurred on the evening of February 8 at around 5:40 pm near Mother Mary School, Parsigutta, within the limits of the Mushirabad Police Station. The victim, Surya Anil (25), who works as a delivery boy, was allegedly lured to the spot by the accused Stephen and his associates under the pretext of a compromise. An argument ensued, during which Stephen attacked Anil with a sharp blade, slashing his neck, and also assaulted him on his elbows with a stick, causing severe bleeding injuries. The injured Anil managed to escape and reached the police station, following which the police shifted him to Gandhi Hospital for treatment. “During the investigation, police uncovered that in March 2024, the victim Anil had visited Stephen's house to celebrate his birthday. As Stephen was then lodged in jail, Anil celebrated the occasion with Stephen's father. However, the next day, when Stephen's mother objected, Anil and his friends allegedly attacked her with a beer bottle. A case was registered at Mushirabad Police Station at that time. Nurturing a grudge over the attack on his mother, Stephen allegedly planned to eliminate Anil and carried out the assault. “Based on the victim's complaint, police registered a case and took the accused Kokku Stephen into custody. Further investigation is underway to ascertain the involvement of other suspects in the case.
