Civil Rights Association Extends Support to Nationwide General Strike on February 12

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 10, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“The Telangana Civil Rights Association has announced its support to the nationwide general strike scheduled to be held on February 12, protesting against what it termed as anti-labour policies of the central government. Speaking to reporters on Tuesday at the Kapra Tahsildar Office, Civil Rights Association State President Professor Gaddam Laxman, Unorganised Workers Federation State General Secretary Sudagani Kumar, and Praja Desabhaktha Movement State General Secretary G. Chandramouli expressed solidarity with the strike. Addressing the media, Laxman called upon workers across the country to unite and fight for their rights. He stated that workers in India had secured several hard-earned rights through prolonged struggles since the British era, and alleged that the central government was attempting to dilute these rights by undermining 29 labour laws. He expressed concern over attempts to privatise welfare schemes under the Welfare Board and demanded protection of workers' rights. He strongly opposed Government Order No. 12, which hands over natural death insurance schemes to private insurance companies, and demanded its immediate withdrawal, insisting that the scheme should continue to be implemented directly by the government as per the earlier system. Laxman also criticised the Electricity Amendment Bill, 2025, stating that it would have adverse effects on the agriculture sector and negatively impact farmers, workers, the middle class, and the general public. He further warned that the proposed replacement of the rural employment guarantee scheme with a new programme could severely affect rural livelihoods. Calling for mass participation in the February 12 general strike, Laxman urged workers, farmers, agricultural labourers, students, intellectuals, and the general public to join the protest and put pressure on the central government to withdraw its anti-people policies.

Woman Missing in Kushaiguda Police Station Limits

At about 6:00 PM, Pavani called her mother and informed her that she would be returning home late. Later, at around 8:00 PM, she again contacted her mother and said that she was at a bus stop and would reach home shortly. After that, when her mother tried calling her again, Pavani's mobile phone was switched off. Despite searching all possible and related places, her whereabouts could not be traced. Based on Renuka's complaint, the police have registered a case and taken up investigation.

Telugu Is a Living, Nectarous Language: OU Telugu Literary Congress Showcases Global Efforts



“Indian Chronicle OU February 10: Telugu is not a dead language but a vibrant, nectarous one, affirmed delegates from across the world at the Second Telugu Literary Congress organized by the Department of Telugu, Osmania University. On the second day of the congress, held at the Arts College, scholars and cultural representatives participated in seminars that highlighted the vitality and global reach of the Telugu language. “In Room No. 121, a seminar on “Efforts and Guidance for the Spread of the Telugu Language in India and Abroad” was chaired by Padma Vibhushan awardee Sanjeeva Narasimha. Speakers from different countries shared their experiences of promoting Telugu culture and literature abroad. Jaya Peesapati from Hong Kong explained how Telugu festivals are celebrated there, with children being taught dance, music, and instruments, alongside the continuation of the Telugu Badi (Telugu School) program. Guduru Srinivas from New York spoke about the Telugu Literary Association’s contributions, including teaching poetry and light music compositions. Kalvala Vishweshwar highlighted that the Global Telangana Association has expanded activities to 30 countries, noting that Telugu is spoken in nearly 100 nations. Vijaya from Australia shared that Telugu programs are conducted every Saturday, where children learn the Mahabharata and Bhagavatam, and also participate in radio broadcasts. Ganesh Thottipudi from Germany emphasized their efforts in making C. P. Brown’s Telugu grammar accessible and developing tools for language learning, noting that Telugu continues to thrive among families abroad across three to four generations. “Other speakers, including Vadlamani Durga, Jandhyala Kishore, and Sharath Babu, stressed the importance of instilling love for Telugu from childhood. Contributions also came from Murthy Remilla, Velmula Krishnarao, Narasimhulu Marathi, ISRO retired scientist Jayakrishna Kishore, Nannaya University Professor K. V. N. D. Prasad, Sagili Sudharani, and several others, who collectively underscored the enduring relevance of Telugu language and literature. “Another seminar, chaired by Professor Y. Reddy Shyamala, focused on “Use of Science and Technology Tools in Telugu Language Research.” She emphasized the importance of leveraging modern technology to strengthen Telugu studies. Dr. Jhansi Udumu spoke about online Telugu teaching, while Sirikonda Narasimha Raju discussed methods to promote Telugu expression.
