Counting Arrangements Finalised for 2026 Municipal Elections in Medchal–Malkajgiri



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 12, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“As part of the 2026 General Elections to Municipalities and Municipal Corporations, elaborate arrangements have been made for the counting of votes in Medchal–Malkajgiri district. District Collector Manu Choudhary informed that counting centres have been established for three municipalities in the district. For Aliabad Municipality, the counting will be held at Sri T. Chaitanya High School, Majidpur. For Muduchinthlapally Municipality, the centre has been set up at Telangana Minority Residential School, Jaggamguda. For Yellampet Municipality, the counting will take place at the Bible College premises. Fourteen counting tables have been arranged at each centre. One supervisor and two assistants have been deployed for each table. In total, 153 personnel have been appointed to oversee the counting process, which will commence at 8:00 a.m. The counting will be conducted under tight security and continuous CCTV surveillance to ensure transparency and smooth proceedings. To maintain law and order, prohibitory orders have been imposed within a 500-metre radius of the counting centres. Assembly of more than five persons is prohibited, and strict legal action will be taken against violators, the Collector stated.

The 4 labor codes brought by the Modi government, the VB-G Ramji Act, the Electricity Amendment Bill, and the Seed Act should be immediately withdrawn: - Telangana Agricultural Workers' Union State Secretary Kondamadugu Narasimha calls

Repel the attack of the central BJP government on the labor and agricultural community..



"(Mandava Srisailam..Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau... Indian Chronicle... February 12): - Telangana Agricultural Workers' Union State Secretary Kondamadugu Narasimha has demanded that the 4 labor codes brought by the Modi government, the VB-G Ramji Act, the Electricity Amendment Bill, and the Seed Act should be immediately withdrawn and repealed. They called on the workers, farmers, and agricultural laborers to unite and repel the attack of the central BJP government on the labor and agricultural community. As part of the nationwide strike of labor, farmers and agricultural labor unions against the policies of the central government across the country on Thursday, hundreds of workers under the auspices of CITU, Telangana Rythu Sangam and Telangana Agricultural Labor Unions held a rally in Bhoodan Pochampally town from the CITU office to Bhuvanagiri Square in the town and organized a two-hour Rastaroko program to protest against Modi's policies. CITU Mandal Convener Manchala Madhu presided over the meeting organized on this occasion, while Narasimha participated as the chief guest of the program and said that since 1992, the burdens on all sections have been increasing day by day since the implementation of liberalization, privatization and new economic policies. He criticized that during the last ten years of Modi's rule, reforms were implemented rapidly, corporate powers were given a boost, and burdens were imposed on all sections, making the lives of the people miserable. He said that the central BJP government has brought 4 labor codes that deprive the working class of its basic rights under pressure from corporates. He expressed his concern that with this, the workers

will lose their right to organize, strike and even their basic rights to bargain. He said that the Modi government is ready to turn the working class into slaves like in the British era. He said that the central BJP government has brought 4 labor codes to privatize huge public sector industries, implement reforms in insurance, banking and industries, and tie up the country's wealth with ten big corporates like Adani and Ambani. He said that large industries, mines and the sea coast in the public sector are being handed over to corporates. He said that India is still an agricultural country and more than 60 percent of the people depend on agriculture for employment and live on very low incomes. He criticized that in these circumstances, there is no remunerative price for the farmers and in these circumstances, the Electricity Amendment Bill is being brought and subsidies are being reduced. He criticized the new VB-G Ramji Act for not protecting the rights of agricultural workers through the employment guarantee scheme. He criticized that the decision to have the state government bear 40 percent of the funds in this act means gradually weakening the employment guarantee law and making agricultural workers unemployed. He said that Trump's tariffs were introduced to turn the working class and farmers in India into slaves and suck their blood like water lilies. He criticized that it is weakening India and damaging its sovereignty and that America is telling our country where to buy crude oil. He said that if the trade agreement signed with America opens the doors to American corporate agriculture and allows them to sell their crops, milk, cotton, soybeans and oil in our country, our farmers will go bankrupt and commit suicide again.

Narasimha called on the working people of all sections to prepare for struggles against such Modi's destructive policies. Also present at the event were District Assistant Secretary of the Farmers' Association Kota Ramachandra Reddy, Mandal Secretary of the Agricultural Workers' Association Prasadam Vishnu, and CITU Urban Convener Vaddepalli Yadagiri. Labor codes, VBG Ramji Act, National Seed Bill, Electricity Amendment Bills should be repealed immediately:-Aidwa District General Secretary Battupally Anuradha Demand

office to the MDO office in the Turkapalli mandal center and a rastaroko was held at the Telugu Thalli statue. On this occasion, Akhil Bharat Prajatantra Mahila Sangh District General Secretary Battupally Anuradha demanded the immediate repeal of the Labor codes, VBG Ramji Employment Act, National Seed Bill, and Electricity Amendment Bills brought by the Central BJP government. He said that if the labor, farmer, agricultural labor, anti-people “Labor codes, VBG Ramji Act, National Seed and Electricity Amendment Bills followed by the Central BJP government come into effect, the industrial workers working in the mandal will lose the rights, laws, and facilities they have been enjoying so far in the coming period. He said that the management will make the workers work according to their will, there will be more restrictions on the workers, and those who question them will be given notices and fired from their jobs, which is why the workers will have to fight unitedly, regardless of their unions and regions. He said that this will affect the scheme workers and gram panchayat workers. He said that the welfare board for construction workers will be weakened. He said that the remaining porters and transport drivers will face more difficulties. He said that in the coming period, employment guarantee works will become questionable in the mandal. He said that an attempt will be made to hand over electricity to private individuals across the country through the Electricity Amendment Bill, and if this is implemented, the hard work done by the farmers in the villages will be enough only for the current bills. He said that they will have to take loans for agricultural investment and livelihood. He said that the farmers will be in debt and suicides will occur like in the past. He said that the prices of seeds will increase further through the Seed Amendment Bill, and the Center will dominate the seed production centers in the state of Telangana. He said that the central government has given subsidies of Rs 16 lakh crore to corporates during this period. He reminded that not even once has the farmers been waived off their loans. He said that by cutting funds in the budget every year for government schemes, the poor are discriminated against from receiving welfare schemes. He said that the wages of workers are not being increased in line with the rising prices. He said that to what extent is it reasonable to set a daily wage of Rs 176 while treating the workers as slaves? He questioned that not a single person can survive on this wage, how can a family survive? That is why they should fight unitedly and without politics to protest the anti-worker, anti-farmer, anti-agricultural and anti-people policies being followed by the central BJP government. Section 144 Imposed Around Muduchinthalapally Counting Centre

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 12, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“Ahead of the vote counting for the Muduchinthalapally Municipality elections scheduled on February 13, 2026, prohibitory orders have been imposed to ensure maintenance of law and order. CH Sridhar, IPS, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Malkajgiri Zone, has issued orders under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), corresponding to Section 144 of the CrPC, prohibiting assembly of five or more persons within a 500-metre radius of the counting centre. The counting will take place at TGMRSJC, Jaganguda, under the limits of Shamirpet Police Station. The restrictions will

remain in force from 6:00 AM to 11:00 PM on February 13. As per the orders, gathering of five or more persons is prohibited. Carrying weapons, sticks, stones or any items that may disturb public peace is strictly banned. Entry into the counting centre will be allowed only to persons with valid authorization passes. Sloganeering, protests, dharnas and demonstrations near the centre are not permitted. Bursting firecrackers and use of DJ sound systems have also been prohibited. Police warned that strict action will be taken against those spreading rumours or misinformation through social media. Authorities have also clarified that no victory rallies, bike rallies, processions, firecracker displays or public celebrations will be permitted after the counting process. Political parties, candidates and the public have been requested to cooperate with the police to ensure peaceful conduct of the counting process.


