Telangana Revises School Timings for Urdu Medium Institutions During Ramzan

““Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), February 16, “Hyderabad, February 14: The Telangana School Education Department has announced revised school timings for Urdu medium government, aided schools and DIET colleges across the State during the holy month of Ramzan.“According to proceedings issued by the Director of School Education, Dr. E. Naveen Nicolas, I.A.S., the revised timings will be in effect from February 19 to March 20, 2026 (both days inclusive). During this period, schools will function from 8.00 a.m. to 1.30 p.m.“The order applies to all Urdu medium schools, Urdu medium sections in parallel medium schools, and Urdu medium sections of District Institutes of Education and Training (DIETs).“The decision follows representations submitted by various teachers’ associations, including the State Urdu Teachers Association Telangana (SUTA), Telangana Urdu Teachers Association (UTA-TS), Telangana State Primary Teachers Association, and the State Teachers Union Telangana.“To compensate for the loss of instructional hours due to the shortened schedule, district authorities have been directed to ensure that:“• Upper primary and secondary schools work one additional day;“• Primary schools extend working hours by half an hour for two days, as implemented in the previous year.“Regional Joint Directors of School Education in Hyderabad and Warangal, along with District Educational Officers across the State, have been instructed to oversee the implementation of the revised schedule.“The department stated that the adjustment aims to facilitate students and staff observing Ramzan while ensuring academic continuity.

Junior Assistant Accused of Corruption; Officials Allegedly Remain Silent

"Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), February 16, "Rebbena Revenue Office Under Scanner"Rebbena: Allegations of serious irregularities have surfaced at the Rebbena Tahsildar Office after the Asifabad District Collector conducted a surprise inspection. During the visit, a Junior Assistant was reportedly found sitting idly at his desk, drawing criticism from local residents. "According to sources, the Junior Assistant has been unable to efficiently discharge basic office responsibilities. Locals allege that he struggles with fundamental tasks such as reading files, drafting documents, and forwarding official papers, raising concerns over administrative functioning. "Background and Appointment" The Junior Assistant, identified as Durgam Janayya, is a native of Kishtapur village. Following his father's demise, he was reportedly appointed as a Village Revenue Assistant (VRA) on compassionate grounds and joined duties at the Rebbena MRO office. It is learnt that he later completed his Intermediate and Degree through open schooling. "Subsequently, as part of the Telangana government's regularisation policy for long-serving VRAs based on educational qualifications, he was appointed as a Junior Assistant in the same office. "Serious Allegations Raised" However, local residents allege that despite holding the post of Junior Assistant, he lacks the necessary skills to manage official duties effectively. Further accusations suggest that he has been working in the same office for an extended period without transfer, allegedly engaging in corrupt practices. "A young farmer and RTI activist, Srinivas, has reportedly submitted a detailed complaint to the Asifabad District Collector, attaching documentary evidence. The complaint alleges that: "• The Junior Assistant possesses a ration card irregularly. "• He has been drawing income certificates improperly. "• He has been working in the same office for many years without transfer. "• He allegedly secured ownership (patta) of 3.00 acres of government land in Kishtapur village. "It is further stated that complaints were raised during the weekly public grievance redressal meetings held every Monday. However, when enquired about the status of the complaint at the Collector's office, officials reportedly stated that the matter is "under process." Despite four months having passed, no action has been taken so far, complainants allege. "Public Demand for Immediate Action" Residents have accused higher authorities of remaining inactive and have demanded that officials wake up to the issue and initiate swift action against the concerned Junior Assistant.

“Sewing Machines Distributed to Minority Women in Chiluka Nagar Division on Initiative of Parameshwar Reddy





South Central Railway GM Orders Crackdown on Track Encroachments, Reviews Safety Measures

The review meeting on railway operational safety was held on February 16, 2026, at Rail Nilayam, Secunderabad. Additional General Manager Satya Prakash, Heads of various departments, and Divisional Railway Managers (DRMs) of Secunderabad, Hyderabad, Vijayawada, Guntakal, Guntur, and Nanded divisions participated, with divisional heads joining via video conference. The General Manager



emphasized the need for heightened vigilance regarding incidents of trespassing and encroachments near railway tracks. He instructed officials to prioritize measures that ensure the safe movement of trains and improve safety at level crossings.
