
Agricultural Mechanisation Support for Farmers in Kagaznagar

Hate-Driven Provocations Threaten National Security and Unity

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 18, (INDIAN CHRONICLE): “Incidents and inflammatory campaigns such as the recent kova-banni controversy during the Medaram Sammakka Saralamma Jatara pose a serious threat to India’s unity and national security, said Mohammed Pasha Miya, President of the Muslim Welfare Association Committee, Jawahar Nagar. He was speaking at a round table meeting held on Wednesday at Devender Nagar, Chennapuram, under Kapra, Jawahar Nagar GHMC limits. The meeting brought together leaders of various political parties and public organizations. It was chaired by T. Kalesha, Secretary of the Muslim Welfare Association Committee. Participants strongly condemned sections of



media platforms accused of spreading provocative and misleading narratives that allegedly targeted small traders at the Medaram Jatara. The controversy reportedly involved two vendors from Nandyal in Kurnool district, Sheikh Shavali and Javed, who were selling milk-based sweets at the fair. Leaders alleged that certain media outlets attempted to communalize and regionalize the issue by focusing on names, religion, and place of origin. Speakers at the meeting stated that such divisive propaganda undermines constitutional values, democratic principles, and social harmony. They urged law enforcement authorities and the administration to take strict action against those responsible for spreading hate-driven misinformation. If left unchecked, they warned, such practices could encourage similar divisive tactics across the country. The leaders emphasized that targeting individuals based on religion, caste, region, or identity is unacceptable in a democratic society. They stated that poisonous campaigns that damage brotherhood and social cohesion are detrimental to the nation’s stability. While freedom of expression is protected under the Constitution, they said it must not be misused to incite hatred or communal tension. The meeting also called upon responsible members of the media fraternity to remain vigilant and ensure ethical reporting standards are upheld. Participants stressed that journalism must serve the public interest and strengthen social unity rather than inflame divisions. Merge RTC with Government: AITUC Demands

“Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), February 18, “All India Trade Union Congress (AITUC) District General Secretary Boge Upender has demanded that the RTC be merged with the State Government. “Appealing to workers to make the “Chalo Secretariat” programme on the 24th of this month a grand success, RTC JAC leaders released wall posters at the Asifabad Depot today under the leadership of the Joint Action Committee (JAC) to mobilise support for the agitation aimed at protecting RTC and safeguarding workers’ rights. “Speaking on the occasion, Boge Upender outlined the following demands: “1. The process of merging RTC employees into the State Government should be initiated immediately.”2. The 2021 wage revision should be implemented with 30% fitment.”3. Under the Mahalakshmi Scheme, the State Government must release ₹350 crore every month without deductions and immediately clear pending dues of approximately ₹2,500 crore.”4. Job security must be ensured for RTC workers. All employees working under the “Bread Winner” scheme should be regularised and posts filled under permanent employment.”5. Restrictions on trade unions should be lifted and recognition union elections conducted.”6. Excess workload on employees across all categories must be reduced.”7. Electric buses should be purchased by the State Government and handed over to RTC; RTC lands should not be allocated for private EV operations.”8. Issues faced by women workers must be resolved.”9. Bus strength should be increased in proportion to passenger demand, and vacancies in all categories must be filled.”10. All pending dues of retired employees should be cleared.”11. Those whose higher pension applications were rejected should be given another opportunity to avail higher pension benefits.”Leaders including Depot President Ashok, Secretary Divakar, Assistant Secretary Vilas, Vice-President Praveen, and JAC leaders Ashok, Prem Singh, and K.G. Victim Compensation – Distribution of Double Bedroom Houses to Victims of Serious Crimes

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 18, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“At an official programme held on 18-02-2026 at Malkajgiri Commissionerate, Neredmet, presided over by Sri. Adluri Laxman Kumar, Hon’ble Minister for Scheduled Castes Development, Tribal Welfare, Minorities Welfare, and Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities; Sri. Bakki Venkataiah, Chairman, Telangana SC Commission; Sri. K. Avinash Mohanty, IPS, Commissioner of Police, Malkajgiri and Sri. A detailed exercise was undertaken to scrutinize cases of rape and murder involving SC/ST victims registered between 2014 and 2025 within the jurisdiction of Malkajgiri District, comprising Malkajgiri and Cyberabad Commissionerates. Out of 235 grievous cases identified during this period, a preliminary list of the most vulnerable victims was prepared based on socio-economic indicators and the severity of trauma suffered. Victim compensation, particularly for vulnerable communities, plays a vital role in restoring social standing and human dignity. During the course of investigations, police officers often witness the severe socio-economic and psychological hardships endured by victims. Beyond filing charge sheets and ensuring prosecution of offenders, the focus has been extended to holistic
