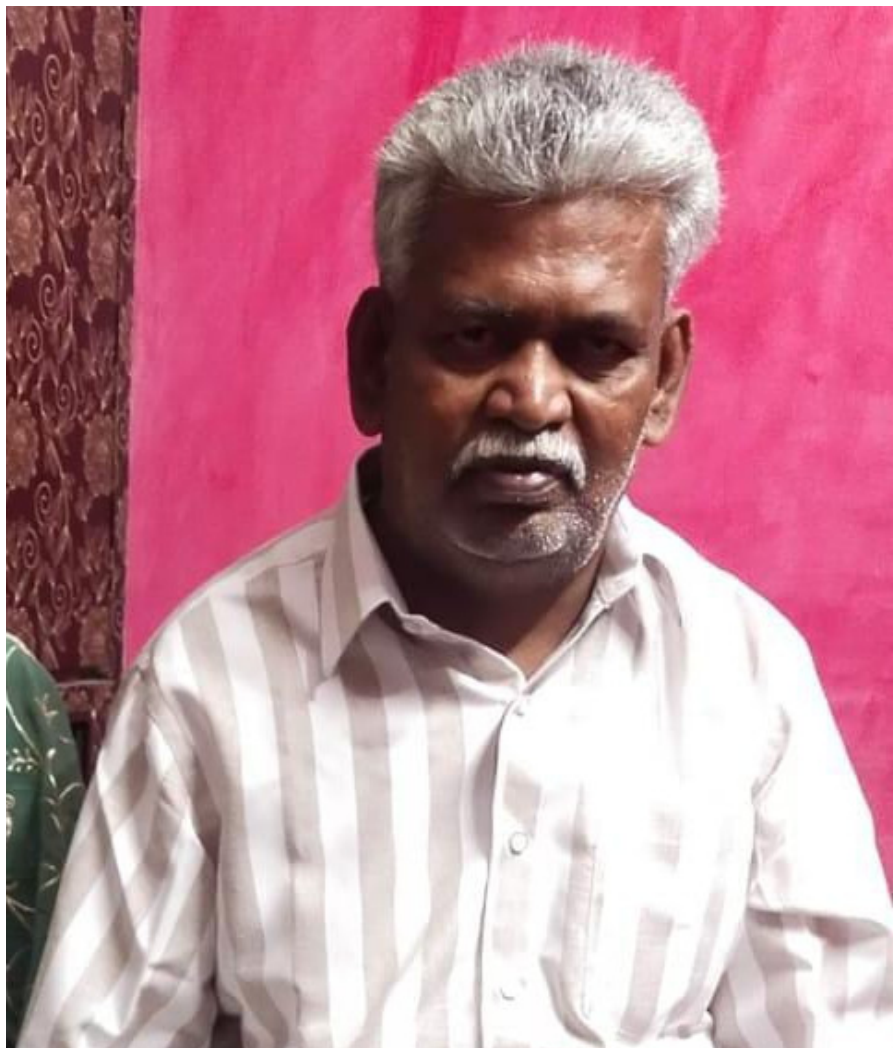

Rash Driving Claims Life of 55-Year-Old Pan Shop Owner in Kushaiguda



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 01, (INDIAN CHRONICLE): “According to the details provided by Mohammed Ghouse Patel, on February 1, 2026, at around 1:40 PM, his father Mohammed Jaffer (55), a pan shop owner, was heading with his family towards D-Mart, Kushaiguda. While crossing the road near the complainant's pan shop at Ashok Nagar, Mohammed Jaffer handed over his mobile phone to his son. At that moment, an unidentified person riding a Pulsar motorcycle bearing registration number TS08 FV 2242, at high speed and in a rash and negligent manner, hit him. Due to the impact, Mohammed Jaffer fell on the road and sustained severe injuries. He was immediately shifted for treatment to Xenia Hospital, ECIL, where the doctor on duty declared him dead. A case has been registered in connection with the incident, and an investigation is underway.

Private Employee Killed in Road Accident at I-Com Bus Stop

On January 31, 2026, at around 7:00 PM, Ramachandra Reddy left his residence for night duty. After traveling by bus, he got down at the I-Com Bus Stop at about 7:30 PM. While crossing the road and proceeding towards his company, an Ashok Leyland goods carrier bearing registration number TS35 TA 5981, coming from Cable X Road towards Charlapally, allegedly hit him. The driver is reported to have driven the vehicle at high speed and in a negligent manner, resulting in the collision. Ramachandra Reddy fell on the road and sustained severe head injuries with heavy bleeding. Local people immediately shifted him to Srikara Hospital in an ambulance. However, during treatment, the doctor on duty declared him dead at 02:49 AM on February 1, 2026. Based on the complaint, a case has been registered, and further investigation is in progress.”

“Section 30 Police Act Enforced Across Vikarabad District Until Feb 28” – SP Sneha Mehra

“Vikarabad, Tandur (Feb 01)“ To maintain law and order, Vikarabad District SP Sneha Mehr announced that Section 30 of the Police Act will be enforced district-wide from February 1 to February 28, 2026. “This is a precautionary measure to prevent any disruption to public life and avoid untoward incidents,” said SP Mehr. “During this period: No dharnas, roadblocks, public meetings, rallies, processions, or gatherings of people are permitted without prior written permission from police authorities.” “SP Mehr clarified: “Organizers must apply at least 7 days in advance for permission — even for festivals or political events. “Even if permitted, organizers must strictly follow conditions — no excessive use of loudspeakers causing noise pollution.” “Damaging public property or obstructing roads will invite strict legal action.” “Special warning: Police will monitor social media platforms like WhatsApp, Facebook, X (formerly Twitter), etc. “Spreading false information, posting content that incites communal tension, or sharing inflammatory comments will lead to FIRs under IT Act & Section 30 Police Act.” “SP urged citizens: “> “Respect the law. Cooperate with police. Help maintain peace.” “Public safety is everyone’s responsibility — stay informed, stay calm, stay lawful.”
