Delay in Recruitment at ITC Bhadrachalam Paperboards INTUC Leaders Submit Representation to HR GM

Kranthikumar Dasari | Pinapaka Constancy | February 19 | Indian chronicle : are mounting among employees over the prolonged delay in the ongoing recruitment process at ITC Limited – PSPD Unit, Bhadrachalam, located in Sarapaka of Bhadradi Kothagudem district. On Thursday, a delegation led by INTUC representatives, including Employees Union President Gone Rama Rao and General Secretary Yaram Pitchi Reddy, met HR General Manager Shyam Kiran and submitted a formal representation seeking immediate action. According to the union, a recruitment notification to fill vacant posts was issued on October 26, 2024. A written examination was conducted on June 29, 2025, followed by the publication of the list of eligible candidates on November 1, 2025. Interviews were subsequently held between February 9 and February 13, 2026. However, the final selection list has not yet been released, leading to uncertainty and anxiety among candidates. The union urged the management to complete the recruitment process expeditiously and release the final list without linking it to the ongoing 14th wage settlement negotiations. Prolonged delays, they stated, are causing dissatisfaction and confusion among aspirants. The representation also raised concerns regarding the permanent absorption process of transferred and contract workers. The union pointed out that a lack of clarity has led to speculation and unease among the affected employees. Citing Clause 7.32.2 of the 12th Wage Settlement and Clause 4.22.2 of the 13th Wage Settlement, the union demanded that the permanent absorption process be implemented strictly in accordance with the agreed guidelines and in a transparent manner. It also requested that, for the purpose of service calculation, two years of service prior to the date of notification be considered, rather than limiting it to the last two calendar years. The union called upon the management to take prompt and fair action to uphold transparency and maintain employee confidence within the organisation.

Double Bedroom Houses and 35 Kg Rice Allocation Demanded for the Disabled
