Mandumula Parameshwar Reddy submits representation to Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation Commissioner



“KISHORE VADDEPALLI, Uppal, February 22 (Indian Chronicle):”“Congress Party in-charge for Uppal constituency Mandumula Parameshwar Reddy has requested the release of funds for pending development works in various colonies of the constituency.”“Following the directions of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and District In-charge Minister Sridhar Babu, Parameshwar Reddy met Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy and submitted a memorandum detailing pending works and required financial allocations. BJP Telangana State President Detained Ahead of Visit to Violence-Hit Areas



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 22, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):”“Shri Ramchander Rao, Telangana State President of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), was detained by state police on Sunday as he was leaving to visit Banswada and Kamareddy, where tensions have been prevailing following recent incidents of violence. According to party sources, Rao was scheduled to visit Banswada to meet families allegedly af-

ected by a recent stone-pelting incident. The unrest reportedly followed rising tensions over the alleged harassment of a Hindu woman. Rao planned to express solidarity with the victims and assess the ground situation. He was also expected to travel to Kamareddy, where the BJP MLA camp office was allegedly attacked by Congress workers. The visit aimed to review the circumstances surrounding the incident and extend support to party workers. However, before he could begin his tour, police detained him and shifted him to Bollaram Police Station. The BJP strongly condemned the detention, alleging that Congress and AIMIM leaders were encouraging lawlessness in the state. The party questioned whether the state was witnessing “Praja Palana” (people’s governance) or “police rule,” and alleged

that the current situation resembled an Emergency-like atmosphere. The BJP stated that threats and arrests would not deter its leaders or workers. The party accused Congress and AIMIM of acting together to suppress opposition voices and asserted that it would continue to stand with victims of violence while exposing what it described as government bias.



Mass Protest in Boduppall Demanding House Ownership Rights Under BJP Leadership



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 22, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“A massive protest was organized in Boduppall under the leadership of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), with local residents staging a dharna demanding restoration of their property rights. The agitation highlighted the long-pending issue of house plots in Survey No. 320 and other adjoining survey numbers being included in the prohibited list under the Dharani portal during the previous BRS government led by K. Chandrashekar Rao. Prominent BJP leaders, including Medchal district BJP leader YSR and former MBC Corporation Chairman Taduri Srinivas, participated in the protest and extended support to the affected families. The protestors stated that hundreds of families in Boduppall have been residing in their houses for several years, regularly paying property tax, water tax, and electricity bills. However, the inclusion of these lands in the prohibited list has prevented residents from selling or purchasing properties, as registrations are not being permitted. BJP leaders alleged that when Revanth Reddy was politically struggling in the past, the people of this region supported and elected him as a Member of Parliament. They claimed that after assuming office as Chief Minister, he had assured residents that Survey No. 320 and other affected lands would be removed from the prohibited list and that immediate steps would be taken to enable property registrations. However, they accused the government of failing to fulfill that promise. The leaders criticized the state government, stating that while significant focus is being placed on large-scale projects such as the

proposed “Future City,” the pressing concerns of local families remain unresolved. They alleged that the continued inclusion of these lands in the prohibited list is adversely impacting thousands of families who depend on their property assets for essential needs such as children’s education, marriages, and financial emergencies. The BJP asserted that it will continue its agitation until the lands are removed from the prohibited list under the new land framework introduced by the state government. Party leaders demanded immediate corrective measures to ensure that property registrations are restored and that affected families receive relief at the earliest. The protest concluded with a warning that the agitation would intensify if the government fails to take swift action on the issue.

Kummer child's death.. High Court advocate Prasannakumar seeks High Court intervention

“(Mandava Srisailam.. Hyderabad Indian Chronicle... February 22):- “High Court advocate Nomula Prasannakumar has urgently submitted an application to the higher authorities regarding the brutal death of a two-month-old child in Hyderabad's Nagarkurnool district. He has requested that a full-scale investigation be conducted immediately. The incident, which took place during the Mallanna Jatara in Kummer village of Tadur mandal in Nagarkurnool district, is causing a



huge sensation. According to the details given by the victim's family, the woman was attacked while having darshan in the temple and her family members were also assaulted. It is said that the two-month-old child lost his life in this process. Doubts are also being expressed about the attitude of the local police in this incident. The victims allege that the police did not take appropriate action during the incident and were negligent in registering the case.” In this context, Nomula Prasannakumar sent a memorandum to the Chief Justice of the High Court, state police chiefs and district administration officials. He appealed to conduct an impartial investigation into the incident, take strict action against those responsible, and provide protection to the victim's family. He also requested that the case be investigated by an independent special team to uncover the truth, and that there should be judicial supervision over the investigation. Meanwhile, tensions have

arisen locally over the incident. People have staged protests at the Nagarkurnool Government Hospital. Various associations and public representatives are expressing deep anger over the incident and demanding action against those responsible. The police, however, said that they have initially registered a case of suspicious death and are continuing the investigation. However, the victim's family and locals are expressing dissatisfaction over the matter. The incident has become a topic of discussion across the state.

Role of Sarpanches is crucial in Gram Panchayat governance:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Local Bodies Additional Collector Bhaskar Rao

He said that only if the Sarpanchs work well, their villages will get a good name. He said that the powers and duties given to the Sarpanchs in the Panchayati Raj Act should be thoroughly understood as part of the training. He said that the Sarpanchs need to work actively in key areas such as sanitation management and ensuring that there is no shortage of drinking water in the villages. He said that every village should be kept clean.“Later, certificates were given to the Sarpanchs who completed the five-day training program. District Panchayat Officer Vishnuvardhan Reddy, MPDOs, MPOs and concerned officials participated in the program.

**** Teachers should work hard to ensure that backward students achieve hundred percent pass by organizing special classes. (Mandava Srisailam..Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau... Indian Chronicle... February 22):- Since class X is the first step in the student's stage, students should study hard and achieve better results, said Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Hanumantha Rao. "The District Collector conducted a surprise inspection of Beachmahalla Zilla Parishad High School in Bhuvanagiri town on Saturday. Speaking on the occasion, the District Collector... inquired about the total number of students in the school and how many of them were studying in class X. He inquired whether all the class X students were coming to school regularly every day.. or whether anyone was absent. Later, while talking to the students, he asked them questions on Physics and Mathematics subjects. He said that if you wake up at 5 am every morning and check the formulas regularly once or twice, you will have passed with pass marks. He said that the time of the exams is approaching and they should study hard. He advised them not to go swimming in streams and ponds during the holidays and take risks, but to come to school for two days in between the exams and prepare. Later, a surprise inspection was conducted on the midday meal being served to the students. The Collector himself served the meal to the students. Since the quality of the rice was not good, he immediately called the concerned Civil Supply officers and ordered them to supply good rice immediately and provide delicious food to the students as per the menu.

February 22):- The VB-G Rao-G Act brought by the Modi government should be repealed and the 2005 - Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act should be continued, provide basic facilities to the workers at the workplace and give them a daily wage of Rs. 800. Telangana Agricultural Workers Union District General Secretary Kondamadugu Narasimha and District Vice President Jellela Pentaiah have called for a large-scale participation of employment guarantee workers, agricultural laborers and the poor in the "Maha Dharna" being organized in front of the MDO office. On Saturday, the Telangana Agricultural Workers Union Ramannapet Mandal Committee has called for a "Maha Dharna" to be organized in front of the Ramannapet MDO office on March 2nd to resolve the problems of employment guarantee workers. After visiting the employment guarantee areas in



Ramannapet and Vellanki villages, talking to the laborers and understanding their problems, Narasimha and Pentaiah said that the BJP government at the center has damaged the livelihood of the rural poor with the G Ram G Act. He said that the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act has given crores of rural poor the right to live, a basis for survival and bargaining power. He expressed his grief

that there are no rights, no guarantees, and no security in the new law. He said that Modi has brought a corporate profit scheme in place of the employment guarantee. He said that if the old law was useful for the people, then the Giranji Act brought by Modi will be useful for the rural rich classes and landlords. He demanded that the central government repeal the Giranji Act. He said that the employment guarantee workers are in a state of confusion, without shade, without drinking water, without receiving money every week for the work done, and not even knowing how much they will get. He said that since last year in Ramannapet mandal, pay slips have not been given and they are not recorded in the job card, and if you ask him about this, no one will care. He said that some APOs are not in a position to care about the hardships and problems of the employment guarantee workers since they have been working in the same mandal for ten years in the district. He demanded that the government should change the employment guarantee staff and officers who have been working in the same mandal for a long time. Narasimha and Pentaiah requested the workers to participate in the Mahadharna being organized in front of the Ramannapet MDO office on March 2nd to solve the problems of employment guarantee workers and to achieve victory. In addition, leaders of the Agricultural Workers' Union and public associations, employment guarantee workers Kurella Narasimha Chari, Hanumanthu, Balaraju, Narendra, Somulu, Lenin, Mallesh, Ramulu, Surender, Mahesh, Swami, Santosh, Harish, Baburao, Rajitha, Renuka, Shankamma, Bhagya, Mamatha, Parvatamma, Kavitha, Lakshamma, Poolamma, Chandrakala, Sunitha, Pujitha and others participated in this program.

Fatal Road Accident Near NALSAR University: One Student Killed, Another Injured

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 22, (INDIAN CHRONICLE): “A tragic road accident occurred on the night of February 21, 2026, at around 10:00 PM within the limits of Shamirpet Police Station. The incident took place on the Phase-II, Peddamma Colony road, along the stretch from Shamirpet towards NALSAR University of Law. According to police sources, three students of NALSAR University of Law were travelling on a motorcycle bearing registration number KL 07 CX 1490 from Shamirpet towards the university. The rider has been identified as Priyanshu Kumar Meena, with Saksham and Gopichand as pillion riders. While proceeding on the narrow road, the motorcycle reportedly collided with a Tata truck (TS08UL7958) that had been



negligently parked on the roadside without any warning signals or hazard indicators. Due to the impact, all three students fell onto the road. At the same time, an Ashok Leyland truck (HR 55 BA 9774) coming from the opposite direction — from NALSAR towards Shamirpet — was allegedly being driven at high speed and in a rash manner. The truck ran over Saksham, who had fallen on the road, causing fatal head injuries. He died on the spot. In the accident: “Saksham died at the scene. Priyanshu Kumar Meena sustained shoulder injuries and is currently undergoing treatment. Gopichand escaped without injuries. Preliminary investigation indicates that the accident occurred due to: Negligent parking of the Tata truck (TS08UL7958) on a narrow road without any warning signs. Rash and high-speed driving by the Ashok Leyland truck (HR 55 BA 9774). A case has been registered, and investigation is underway. Legal action will be taken against the concerned drivers and vehicle owners as per law. Public Advisory: Police have urged motorists not to park vehicles on narrow roads without proper warning signals and to strictly adhere to traffic rules and speed limits to ensure road safety. BJP Slams Arrest of State President En Route to Kamareddy, Calls It Undemocratic

Ramchander Rao while he was on his way to Kamareddy has drawn sharp criticism from party leaders, who described the action as undemocratic and an attack on democratic rights. Party representatives questioned whether expressing solidarity with a party MLA has become a crime. They alleged that preventing



electing representatives from meeting party colleagues reflects a growing intolerance within the state government. The BJP further accused the Congress-led government of resorting to house arrests and suppressing political dissent. Drawing parallels with similar actions taken during the previous BRS regime under K. Chandrashekar Rao, party leaders claimed that the present government under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is following the same path.

According to BJP leaders, several party MLAs, MLCs, MPs, and other leaders were placed under house arrest to stop them from extending support and assessing the situation on the ground. They alleged that ruling party leaders are encouraging political intimidation instead of upholding democratic values. The BJP stated that a government entrusted with protecting democracy should not promote what it termed as political vendetta and suppression. The party asserted that the people of the state will respond appropriately to what it called repeated attacks on democratic rights.


No Leniency in RTI Implementation Lapses, Warns RTI Activist

“Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan) February 22, “Display RTI Information Boards in All Gram Panchayats, Demands Vangari Praveen” Vangari Praveen, District General Secretary of the Right to Information Protection Act Society, Komaram Bheem district, has demanded that information boards containing mandatory details under the Right to Information (RTI) Act, 2005 be installed in every Gram Panchayat office. “He stated that to ensure easy access to information for citizens, the names, designations, and contact numbers of the Public Information Officer (PIO) and the Appellate Authority must be clearly displayed on the boards. Additionally, details regarding the duties and responsibilities of officials, office working hours, and government helpline numbers should also be made available to the public. “Praveen stressed that Gram Panchayat officials and staff of public health centres must attend duties on time and function transparently. He emphasized that under the RTI Act, every citizen has the right to question government functioning. Accessing information regarding development works, utilization of funds, and implementation of welfare schemes is a constitutional right of the people, he added. “He further informed that the society would conduct awareness programmes at the village level to educate citizens about the RTI Act and promote transparency in governance.
