

Farmers Allege Irregularities in CCI Cotton Procurement

Farmers Express Anger“With the final week of cotton procurement underway in Komaram Bheem Asifabad district, a large number of farmers are arriving at purchase centres to sell their produce. However, allegations of arbitrary behaviour by Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) staff have triggered unrest among farmers. “On Monday, several farmers from Rajura village in Asifabad mandal brought their cotton to Sri Balaji Ginning Mill for sale. Although CCI officials reportedly approved the quality of the cotton, lower-level staff allegedly refused to complete the procurement process. Farmers expressed strong resentment over the rude behaviour of the staff. “They stated that traders are not offering the Minimum Support Price (MSP), forcing them to approach CCI centres. However, refusal to procure their cotton has left them vulnerable to exploitation by middlemen, resulting in financial losses. “The affected farmers have urged authorities to intervene immediately and ensure that cotton procurement is carried out smoothly without further inconvenience.

Indiramma Housing Beneficiaries Allege Harassment by Forest Officials
