Fire at Mall in Jubilee Hills... Safety Lapses Raise Fresh Concerns

Hyderabad correspondent (KS Reddy) February 26, Indian Chronicle: A fire broke out at a mall on Road No.36 in Jubilee Hills on Wednesday morning, once again drawing attention to recurring safety and compliance issues in commercial buildings across the city. The blaze reportedly began during welding work inside the premises and spread rapidly to the upper floors, sending thick plumes of smoke into the air. People inside the building noticed the fire in time and immediately evacuated. Officials confirmed that no injuries were reported in the incident. Fire department personnel rushed to the spot with three fire engines and brought the flames under control after sustained efforts. An ambulance was kept on standby as a precautionary measure, while police diverted traffic along the busy stretch to ease congestion during the firefighting operation. Sources stated that the mall had remained closed for the past few days and no regular commercial activity was taking place at the time of the incident. Local residents alleged that an unauthorized shed had been con-

structed on the top floor and that a decorative facade structure had been installed at the front without proper approvals. These allegations have raised questions about whether sanctioned building plans were strictly followed and whether mandatory fire safety measures were adequately enforced. Authorities have initiated an inquiry to ascertain the exact cause of the fire and examine compliance records. The incident has also revived concerns stemming from recent fire accidents in Ameerpet, where serious lapses in building permissions and fire safety norms were reported. In two separate cases over the past two months, commercial buildings operating as educational institutes were found to be covered extensively with flex banners and hoardings that obstructed ventilation and access points. During rescue operations, police and fire personnel had to remove these exterior hoardings before reaching occupants trapped inside, resulting in delays and operational challenges. Despite those incidents, several buildings in Ameerpet

reportedly continue to remain covered

with large hoardings, leading to criticism that enforcement by civic authorities has not been stringent enough. Safety experts observe that common violations, including unauthorized structural additions, deviation from approved plans, blocked fire exits and excessive exterior branding, significantly increase risks during emergencies. Urban planners and fire safety professionals emphasize that preventive oversight must be strengthened.



Regular inspections, strict action against unauthorized constructions, mandatory renewal and verification of fire safety certificates, and removal of illegal hoardings are seen as essential measures. High risk activities such as welding should be carried out only with proper permissions and adherence to

safety protocols. While Wednesday's incident did not result in casualties, it has once again underscored the need for consistent enforcement and proactive monitoring to prevent avoidable fire hazards in the city's commercial hubs.
