Hyderabad Traffic Police Launch Expanded 'Arrive Alive' Drive with Eye Camps for Commercial Drivers

“Hyderabad correspondent (KS Reddy) February 27, Indian Chronicle: In a renewed and expanded push towards road safety, the Hyderabad Traffic Police on Thursday organised eye screening camps and a comprehensive awareness programme for auto, cab and tanker drivers under “Arrive Alive Campaign Phase II”. Officials described the initiative as a more focused and driver centric effort




aimed at addressing practical risk factors such as poor vision and distracted driving issues often overlooked in routine enforcement drives. Unlike conventional awareness campaigns, the programme combined on the spot eye examinations with interactive sessions on traffic discipline, defensive driving techniques and accident prevention strategies. The initiative sought to directly engage commercial drivers, who spend long hours on city roads and play a crucial role in ensuring commuter safety. Traffic Commissioner Joel Davis, IPS, emphasised that modern traffic management goes beyond penalties and enforcement. Preventive awareness is the need of the hour. Defensive driving, anticipation of risks and strict adherence to safety norms can significantly reduce accidents, he said. He highlighted the importance of wearing seat belts, maintaining safe distance, avoiding overtaking from the left and following traffic regulations at all times. Jubilee Hills Zone Traffic DCP Kajal Singh, IPS, urged drivers to undergo periodic eye check ups and prioritise their health. She reiterated that helmet use for both riders and pillion riders is mandatory and warned against mobile phone usage while driving, calling distractions a major contributor to road mishaps. Senior officials, medical professionals and a large number of drivers participated in the programme, reinforcing the message that road safety is a shared responsibility.

Commemoration of Chandra Shekhar Azad Held in Kamalanagar

Man Missing After Leaving Home in Wagon-R Car

Family members searched at all known places but were unable to trace his whereabouts. Based on the complaint lodged by his father, a case has been registered and investigation is underway.

Telangana's development driven by Central support; CM's remarks on Metro are baseless: Kishan Reddy

“ Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, February 27” Union Minister Kishan Reddy asserted that the Congress party, which assumed power by making unrealistic promises, lacks the moral authority to launch personal attacks against him. On Friday, he conducted a padayatra across several localities in the Secunderabad constituency along with party workers to directly engage with citizens and assess their grievances. “Addressing a media interaction thereafter, he urged the Chief Minister to refrain from making unfounded allegations that he was obstructing the state government on key infrastructure projects such as Metro Rail expansion and the Regional Ring Road. He emphasized that, with sustained cooperation from the Central Government, development projects worth several thousand crores are currently underway across Telangana, and stated that he would soon present a detailed PowerPoint outlining these initiatives. He described the Chief Minister's remarks as irrational, despite the Centre's continued support to the state. “As part of his outreach, he visited Warasiguda, Mettuguda, Bauddha Nagar, Adagutta, Tarnaka where residents raised concerns related to deteriorating road conditions, inadequate drainage systems, delays in the allotment of double-bedroom houses, and hardships faced in accessing pension benefits. “He attributed the deterioration of Hyderabad's civic infrastructure to both the previous BRS administration and the present Congress government. Despite repeated recommendations to deploy advanced technology for desilting stormwater drains, the government had failed to act, resulting in



severe urban flooding even after light rainfall. The ongoing protests by corporators over streetlight issues and the struggles of contractors to secure payment of pending bills, he said, underscore the city's administrative collapse. “Highlighting fiscal disparities, he pointed out that although Hyderabad contributes nearly 70 percent of the state's revenue, less than 7 percent is allocated to the city in the state budget. He categorically rejected allegations of obstructing Metro expansion, noting that the state government has yet to submit the Detailed Project Report (DPR) to the Centre. “He clarified that while the BJP does not oppose the rejuvenation of the Musi River, it strongly objects to the displacement of economically weaker sections who have lived in the area for over five decades, and cautioned the government against evicting the urban poor. “He further stated that the redevelopment of the Secunderabad Railway Station, modeled on airport standards, is nearing completion and will soon be inaugurated. As part of the Rail Elevated Corridor initiative, the Centre announced seven bullet train services, of which three have been secured for Secunderabad, he said. “Alleging political maneuvering, he accused the Congress of attempting to politically trade the Greater Hyderabad Mayor, and asserted that the BJP would resist such efforts and demonstrate its organizational strength. He concluded by expressing skepticism over meaningful development in Greater Hyderabad, despite the increase in divisions from 150 to 300.

Chandra Shekhar Azad Death Anniversary Observed in Ghatkesar



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 27, (Indian chronicle): “Ghatkesar: Leaders and members of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) (CPM) paid rich tributes to freedom fighter and revolutionary leader Chandra Shekhar Azad on his death anniversary at the party's mandal office in Ghatkesar on Friday. Speaking on the occasion, CPM Mandal Secretary N. Sabitha said that Azad was one of the foremost revolutionaries of India's freedom struggle and called upon the youth to draw inspiration from his courage and revolutionary spirit in their movements today. She recalled that Azad played a pivotal role in the activities of the Hindustan Socialist Republican Association (HSRA) and intensified revolutionary actions against British rule. After the execution of Ram Prasad Bismil, Azad reorganized the association and worked closely with leaders like Bhagat Singh and Sukhdev Thapar. Sabitha highlighted Azad's involvement in the 1925 Kakori train action and his key role in revolutionary activities, including the assassination of British officer John Saunders alongside Bhagat Singh. She said the 1919 Jallianwala Bagh massacre deeply influenced Azad and motivated him to join the freedom movement at a young age. At just 15, he participated in the Non-Cooperation Movement in 1921 and, when arrested, famously declared his name as “Azad,” his father's name as “Swatantra,” and his address as “Jail” in court. Azad attained martyrdom on February 27, 1931, during a fierce encounter with police at Alfred Park in Allahabad (now Prayagraj). Staying true to his pledge that he would never be captured alive, he shot himself with his last bullet. CPM leaders stated that Azad's famous resolve — to face the enemy's bullets and remain free till the end — continues to inspire generations. Mandal committee members Koyyada Chandramohan, Inayat Khan, R. Srinivas, Rajitha, Balayya and others participated in the programme.

Man Reported Missing in Uppal; Police Register Case

Road Accidents Can Be Prevented Through Precautionary Measures: Police Commissioner

Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt stated that road accidents can be prevented only by following precautionary measures. As part of the prestigious “Arrive... Alive” road safety awareness campaign initiated by the Police Department with the objective of reducing road accidents and fatalities, an awareness program was conducted on Friday at Priyadarshini Engineering College. Students and auto drivers were educated about road safety through a PowerPoint presentation by traffic police officials. Victims who had suffered injuries in road accidents shared their experiences and the hardships faced by their families due to loss of livelihood. The event was attended by students, auto drivers, auto unions, lorry unions, college faculty members, and others. Addressing the gathering as the chief guest, Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt said that the primary goal of the department is to reduce road accidents and fatalities through public participation. He stated that the “Arrive... Alive” campaign is aimed at instilling the importance of road safety in every citizen. He urged everyone to contribute to the success of the program, which promotes reaching destinations safely. He explained that the campaign focuses on developing a culture of safe driving among the public and strengthening road safety

systems. With the cooperation of students, prominent citizens, media, public representatives, and all government departments, the aim is to make Telangana a model state in road safety for the entire country. Special focus is being placed on dangerous habits such as riding two-wheelers without helmets, not wearing seat belts in cars, using mobile phones while driving, drunk driving, jumping signals, crossing stop lines, overloading autos on highways, and overtaking from the left. “Key Precautions During Winter and Rainy Seasons” The Commissioner highlighted that during winter, dense fog reduces visibility of roads, oncoming vehicles, pedestrians, animals, and traffic signals. It becomes difficult to judge the distance of vehicles ahead. Drivers are advised to take the following precautions: “1. Start Early: “Begin your journey earlier than scheduled to avoid rushing, as fog may cause delays.” 2. Avoid Over-Speeding and Overtaking: “Poor visibility makes speeding and overtaking highly dangerous.” 3. Use Low-Beam Lights: “High-beam lights scatter in fog and reduce visibility. Use low-beam headlights and fog lights if available.” 4. Maintain Safe Distance: “Keep sufficient distance from the vehicle ahead to avoid collisions in case of sudden braking.” 5. Follow Lane Discipline: “Drive only within designated lanes to ensure better vehicle identification and safety.” 6. Partially Open Windows: “Slightly lowering windows helps disperse fog concentration inside the vehicle and improves visibility.” 7. Stop if Fog Is Too Dense: “If visibility becomes extremely poor, stop at a safe location and resume travel once conditions improve.” 8.
