SP Nitika Pant Leads Flag March; Heavy Police Deployment in Kagaznagar



“Taj Khan, Kagaznagar, January 3 (Indian Chronicle)“SP Nitika Pant Leads Flag March in Kagaznagar Ahead of Municipal Elections; Warns of Strict Action for Poll Code Violations“As part of heightened security measures ahead of the municipal elections, a police flag march was conducted today in Kagaznagar town to strengthen law and order and instil confidence among the public.“The flag march was organised under the supervision of the police department in Kausar Nagar and was led by Nitika Pant, Superintendent of Police, Kumram Bheem Asifabad district.“Police officers, station staff, and special party personnel marched through Wards 7, 8, 9, and 24 of Kausar Nagar, covering key roads identified as sensitive in view of the upcoming elections.“Addressing the media, the District SP stated that all necessary police arrangements have been completed to ensure that the municipal elections scheduled for February 11 are conducted in a free, fair, impartial, and peaceful manner. She said the primary objective of the flag march was to maintain public confidence, monitor the security situation, and prevent any anti-social or unlawful activities during the election period.“SP Nitika Pant issued a stern warning that strict legal action would be taken against anyone attempting to create disturbances, intimidate voters, indulge in illegal activities, or violate the Model Code of Conduct. She also clarified that no rallies or campaign activities would be permitted without prior police authorisation.“Urging the public to cooperate, the SP appealed to citizens to strictly follow election rules and immediately inform the police if they notice attempts to influence voters through money, liquor, or gifts. She further stated that four major check posts have been established within the limits of Asifabad and Kagaznagar towns, and that special attention is being given to sensitive wards, with robust police bandobast in place.“To ensure swift response during the elections, a special control room has been set up, reachable at 8712670505 / 551, to address any incidents that may disrupt public safety. The SP added that continuous vehicle checks and naka bandi operations are being conducted across the district, with thorough verification of suspicious persons and vehicles.“She assured that the police de-

partment would maintain constant vigilance to ensure a peaceful atmosphere, enabling voters to exercise their democratic right without fear or intimidation.“The flag march was attended by Kagaznagar DSP Waheeduddin, Inspectors Prem Kumar, Sub-Inspectors Sudhakar, Chandrasekhar, Sandeep, Suresh, Kalyan, Raju, Anil, along with police personnel and special party staff.

Continuation of Prohibitory Orders on Consumption of Alcohol in Public Places

Ashokan. “KARIMNAGAR BUREAU. ““Strict Action Against Unauthorized Drones and DJ Sound Systems”“City Police Act Enforced in Ramagundam Police Commissionerate Limits”“Keeping in view the difficulties faced by the general public, especially women, the prohibitory orders banning the consumption of alcohol in public places have been continued in the Mancherial and Peddapalli zones under the Ramagundam Police Commissionerate, stated the Police Commissioner of Ramagundam, Sri Amber Kishore Jha, in a press statement. “He stated that several complaints have been received regarding nuisance and misbehaviour by individuals consuming alcohol in public places. Due to intoxication, such persons are indulging in unruly acts and using obscene language on roads and streets, causing severe inconvenience to people from all sections of society. To curb such activities and to ensure public safety and order, these prohibitory orders have been enforced. “The prohibitory orders will remain in force from 01-02-2026 to 01-03-2026, and the duration may be extended depending on the prevailing situation. Violators will be dealt with strictly under Section 223 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the provisions of the Hyderabad City Police Act, 1348 Fasli, the Commissioner warned. ““Extension of Prohibitory Orders on DJ Sound Systems and Drones”“The Police Commissioner further informed that the existing ban on the use of high-decibel DJ sound systems has been extended in the Mancherial and Peddapalli zones, and orders to this effect have been issued. “The restriction has been imposed to prevent noise pollution and to ensure that children, senior citizens, patients, and students are not disturbed, particularly during study hours and nighttime. “It was observed that DJ sound systems are being used during various events, gatherings, and demonstrations. However, if the use of a microphone system is absolutely necessary for any programme, prior permission must be obtained from the concerned Divisional Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP). Clear guidelines regarding permissible sound levels and usage areas are already in place. “These prohibitory orders will also be effective from 01-02-2026 to 01-03-2026, with the possibility of extension based on circumstances. Any violation will invite strict legal action under BNS Section 223 and relevant provisions of the Hyderabad City Police Act, 1348 Fasli, the Commissioner cautioned. “Enforcement of the City Police Act in Ramagundam Police Commissionerate”“The Police Commissioner announced that the City Police Act has been enforced in the Peddapalli and Mancherial zones under the Ramagundam Police Commissionerate, in accordance with Ramagundam Police Commissionerate Act 7(1), 2016; Sections 22(1)(a) to (f), 22(2)(a) & (b), 22(3); City Police Act No. IX of 1348 Fasli; Section 30; and the Police Act, 1861. “The enforcement will be in effect from 6:00 a.m. on 01-02-2026 to 6:00 a.m. on 01-03-2026. “During this period, dharnas, rallies, road blockades, public meetings, and assemblies are strictly prohibited within the limits of the Ramagundam Police Commissionerate. Organisers must obtain prior permission from the police authorities for conducting any such events. “The Commissioner also warned that strict legal action will be taken against individuals or organisations attempting to forcibly close institutions, offices, or establishments in the name of bandh, or those resorting to intimidation and coercion. “The Police Commissioner appealed to the public from all sections of society to extend their cooperation to the police department, which is working tirelessly to maintain peace, law, and order in the region.
