

The role of Presiding and Assistant Presiding Officers is crucial for conducting transparent municipal elections: - Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Hanumantha Rao

February 6):- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Hanumantha Rao said that the role of Presiding and Assistant Presiding Officers is crucial for conducting transparent municipal elections. “On Friday, as part of the 2nd general municipal elections, the District Election Officer and Collector participated in the training classes for POs and APOs at the Zilla Parishad High School in Aleru Municipality and at the Mandal Praja Parishad office in Yadagirigutta Municipality. On this occasion, the District Collector said that the guidelines related to the conduct of elections must be followed meticulously. He stated that they should work with complete understanding and responsibility to avoid any mistakes in election duties. He said that the Presiding Officers should carry out the election process very carefully. He said that the polling materials should be at the distribution center by 8 AM. He said that they should check whether all the polling materials are present. He stated that they should check whether the ballot papers related to the respective polling stations have arrived. He said that they should check in advance whether the ballot boxes are opening easily. He suggested that they should check whether the Swastika symbol and the stamps related to the municipalities have all arrived. He stated that every polling officer must monitor whether each voter is casting their vote into the ballot box at the polling station. He also emphasized the importance of adhering to the schedule on polling day and taking all necessary measures to ensure that voters do not face any inconvenience. He further instructed that after the polling process is completed, the polling materials must be collected carefully and handed over at the reception counters. He urged every Presiding Officer (PO) and Assistant Presiding Officer (APO) to efficiently discharge their duties and cooperate in conducting the elections in a peaceful atmosphere. RDO Krishna Reddy, Municipal Commissioners, Tahsildars, POs, APOs, and others participated in this training program.

February 6):- In view of the polling scheduled for February 11th as part of the 2nd general municipal elections, District Election Officer and Collector Hanumantha Rao stated in a press release that the contesting candidates and political parties must strictly adhere to the 48-hour rule. He said that campaigning must cease 48 hours before the end of polling, and no campaign-related activities should be continued through meetings, rallies, or media and broadcasting channels. He warned that those who violate the rules will be punished under Section 209 of the Telangana Municipalities Act, 2019. He also stated that no campaign activities should be conducted near polling stations in a manner that influences voters. He urged political parties, contesting candidates, and media houses to strictly follow the 48-hour rule and cooperate to ensure free and fair elections.

Ganja Seized in Kapra; Four Arrested

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, February 06, (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“Medchal–Malkajgiri district police seized ganja at two locations in Kapra mandal on Thursday and arrested four persons in connection with the cases. STF B-Team SI Nagaraju and SI Jyothi, along with



their staff, conducted raids in Netaji Nagar and Vamuguda areas under Kapra limits. During the operation, police caught Manda Rahul in Netaji Nagar while he was allegedly selling ganja and seized 131 grams of ganja from his possession. In a separate incident at Vamuguda, 234 grams of ganja were seized. Police arrested four accused—Vishwanath, Manoj, Tanish, and Manda Rahul—in the two cases. According to officials, the accused procured ganja from Maharashtra in one case and from Dholpet in the other, and were selling it in Kapra area. Three motorcycles and three mobile phones were seized from the accused. The arrested persons and the seized material were handed over to Kapra Excise Police Station for further investigation.

Municipal elections should be conducted transparently without any inducements to voters: State Election Commissioner Rani Kumudini

Chronicle... February 6): State Election Commissioner Rani Kumudini has directed that stringent arrangements be made to conduct municipal elections transparently without any inducements to voters. On Friday, State Election Commissioner Rani Kumudini, along with State DIG Mahesh Bhagwat, held a video conference from Hyderabad with the general observers, district collectors, and SPs of undivided Nalgonda and Nizamabad districts regarding the municipal elections. On this occasion, Election Commissioner Rani Kumudini said that the elections should be conducted impartially and with complete transparency, and that care should be taken to ensure that voters are not subjected to any inducements and that the elections are conducted impartially. On this occasion, she gave several suggestions to the district collectors on various issues. DIG Mahesh Bhagwat stated that during the elections, the FST and SST teams should continuously monitor illegal liquor, money, and materials used for inducements. He also mentioned that check posts have been set up at inter-state borders, and shadow teams will be deployed to keep a close watch on those with criminal records to prevent any untoward incidents on polling day. From Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district, District Election Officer and Collector Hanumantha Rao, SP Akshansh Yadav, Election Observer Gautami, and Additional Collector for Local Bodies Bhaskar Rao participated in the video conference. District Collector Hanumantha Rao stated that 212 polling stations have been set up for 104 wards in the six municipalities of the district. State Election Commissioner Rani Kumudini explained that all arrangements have been made to conduct the elections smoothly without any errors. District SP Akshansh Yadav stated that adequate arrangements have been made to conduct the elections under tight security in the areas identified as problematic in the district, and that the elections will be conducted peacefully without



With Canon's EOS VR Utility software, users can create high-quality hemispherical panoramas (2D 180° VR) images that are viewable on a PC or head-mounted display. Unlike its predecessor, the new lens uses the equidistant projection method to maintain a largely uniform compression effect from the centre to the peripheries, retaining a high resolution even after converting to 2D VR. The RF7-14mm f/2.8-3.5L Fisheye STM is bundled with a Drop-in Clear Filter and can be used with the Drop-in Filter Mount Adapter EF-EOS R. The lens also accommodates the Drop-in Variable ND Filter A / Drop-in Circular Polarizing Filter A, which can be purchased separately.
