

Centre's Backing Key to Telangana Urban Growth; Maharashtra CM



“Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), February 7, “Kagaznagar: Devendra Fadnavis, Chief Minister of Maharashtra, stated that the development of municipalities in Telangana is possible only with the support of the Central Government led by Narendra Modi.” He was addressing the Vijaya Sankalpa Sabha, a public meeting organized in connection with the municipal election campaign, held at the SPM Cricket Ground in Kagaznagar on Sunday. “Speaking on the occasion, Fadnavis said that it is the Central Government under Prime Minister Modi that allocates funds to municipalities. He alleged that the Telangana State Government has done little for the development of urban local bodies. He emphasized that the Centre is not only focusing on rural development but is also giving special attention to urban infrastructure by allocating funds under schemes such as the Urban Infrastructure Development Fund (UIDF), the 15th Finance Commission, and AMRUT.” He further stated that substantial funds are being provided for strengthening drainage systems and improving sanitation management in urban areas. “Adilabad Member of Parliament Godam Nagesh said he had secured ₹60 crore for the development of the railway station in the constituency. He added that halts have been provided for several trains and that both railway under-bridges and over-bridges are currently under construction.” Sirpur MLA Dr. Palvai Harish Babu appealed to the people of the town to give the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) an opportunity in the upcoming municipal elections. He assured that efforts would be made to ensure proper utilization of Central Government funds. He alleged that neither the 10-year rule of the

BRS nor the two-year Congress administration has contributed to the town’s development, adding that the town has deteriorated into an unsanitary condition. “The MLA also submitted a memorandum to Chief Minister Fadnavis, seeking cooperation from the Maharashtra Government for the construction of the Pranahita project and requesting the early commencement of national highway works from Bellampalli to Gadchiroli.

SCR GM reviews redevelopment works at railway station

Secunderabad: South Central Railway (SCR) General Manager Sanjay Kumar Srivastava on Saturday, conducted a detailed inspection of the ongoing redevelopment works at Secunderabad Railway Station.

These sand lorries have been illegally transporting sand from Dacharam village in Kukkunoor mandal of Eluru district towards Khammam in the dead of night for some time now. The sand loading point is located very close to the Kukkunoor Police Station and Tahsildar's office, yet the officials are simply watching this activity. There is information that Kukkunoor police recently caught a lorry but released it. Is this true? Doubts are being raised. Is there collusion between the officials and the sand mafia? This question is leading to intense discussion locally. The sand smuggling groups, who started a ramp in the name of a society ramp, have turned it into a hub for illegal sand transportation and have become completely unrestrained. Urea Booking Mobile App: Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Agriculture Officer

“(Mandava Srisailam... Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau... Indian Chronicle... February 7):- This fertilizer urea app will be implemented in our district from tomorrow. Farmers can easily log in to the urea booking app using their mobile number. Anyone can check the current stock of urea bags available with retailers across the district. Only pattadar land owners, ROFR pattadars, non-pattadar farmers, and tenant farmers are eligible to complete the urea booking. To verify your identity and secure the booking, a one-time password will be sent to the mobile number linked to your pattadar passbook. Farmers can book urea bags based on the real-time stock availability reported by retailers. After your booking is successfully completed, a unique booking ID will be generated for your reference. The number of urea bags available for booking will be automatically determined based on the cultivated area registered under your land. To manage distribution efficiently, bookings will be divided into multiple installments at specific intervals according to your cultivated area. You have the flexibility to purchase the booked urea from any retailer or PACS in the district. You can obtain your total booked quantity from different retailers. Please note that once the land area is entered in the cultivation tab, it cannot be changed. The booking will remain active for only 24 hours; after that, if not used, the booking will automatically expire to release the stock back into the system. Farmers should note that from tomorrow onwards, urea can only be purchased through the app. Physical distribution of urea will not take place, as stated by the Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district agriculture officer.

Hyderabad India continues to experience elevated uncertainty due to financial pressures, healthcare concerns, work-life imbalance, and broader societal risks. With the national Index at 79, anxieties around financial preparedness, healthcare affordability, mental well-being, and long-term stability remain widespread.

Vijayawada, however, reports an Index of 63—significantly lower than national and regional benchmarks—indicating relatively higher perceived certainty among its residents. Yet several emerging risks and societal shifts continue to shape the city's underlying anxieties. Leading concerns include fear of being replaced by artificial intelligence at work, vulnerability to online scams,

and the growing prevalence of mental health challenges.

Other prominent worries include religious conflicts affecting social cohesion, natural disasters disrupting daily life, inflation eroding savings, climate-related disruptions, and hesitation in seeking therapy due to personal or social barriers. Balancing personal interests with family time also emerges as a notable concern for residents.

A blend of uncontrollable and controllable factors drives Vijayawada's uncertainty. Uncontrollable risks include online fraud, data-security threats, environmental disruptions, and broader social tensions. Meanwhile, controllable stressors such as AI-related job insecurity, mental-health manage-

ment, rising living costs, and work-life balance highlight areas where awareness, planning, and appropriate support mechanisms can meaningfully reduce anxiety.

City-level data shows that financial depth strongly influences perceived certainty. Uncertainty rises from 59 in SEC A to 66 in SEC C. Insurance ownership displays a non-linear pattern—uncertainty is lowest among residents with two policies (49), but spikes among those with three (94). A similar trend occurs across investment instruments, where uncertainty rises with greater diversification.

Across demographics, uncertainty levels remain similar between men and women. Gen X emerges

as the most uncertain age group (69), compared to Baby Boomers (60), Millennials

(61), and Gen Z (63). Profession-wise and across life stages, uncertainty remains broadly uniform, suggesting that concern patterns are shared widely across the population.

Overall, Vijayawada's findings reflect a national pattern where technological disruption, financial pressures, social risks, and health-related challenges increasingly shape public sentiment. As lifestyle pressures and external risks intersect across life stages, planning ahead and securing appropriate protection remain critical to strengthening confidence and reducing uncertainty.

App-based transport workers to observe All-India 'breakdown' over falling incomes

New Delhi: App-based transport workers across the country associated with Ola, Uber, Rapido, Porter and other app-based ride-hailing platforms will observe "breakdown" on Saturday against falling incomes and "worsening exploitation".

Telangana Gig and Platform Workers Union (TGPWU) and Indian Federation of App Based Transport Workers (IFAT) have called the All-India 'breakdown'. Hyderabad city guide

They said on Friday that the 'breakdown' has been called to protest against falling incomes and 'worsening exploitation' due to the failure of governments to notify minimum base fares under the Motor Vehicle Aggregator Guidelines, 2025.

Shaik Salahuddin, TGPWU founder President and IFAT co-founder and National General Secretary, said that despite the guidelines, aggregator companies continue to unilaterally fix fares, pushing workers into unsustainable working conditions. The key demands of the unions include immediate notification of minimum base fares for app-based transport services in consultation with recognised

worker unions, as mandated under the Aggregator Guidelines, 2025.

They are also demanding strict prohibition of private (non-commercial) vehicles being used for commercial passenger and goods transport, or mandatory conversion to commercial category vehicles as per the Motor Vehicles Act and Aggregator Guidelines, 2025. TGPWU and IFAT have urged the Central and state governments to initiate immediate dialogue with worker representatives and ensure fair, lawful, and sustainable regulation of the app-based transport sector. Salahuddin told IANS that auto-rickshaw and cab drivers of Ola, Uber, Porter and other platforms will participate in the strike by either cancelling ride requests or switch off their ride-hailing apps altogether. According to TGPWU founder President, Telangana alone has about 2.5 lakh autorickshaw drivers, 1.5 lakh cab drivers and about 50,000 Porter drivers. TGPWU had earlier sent a letter to the Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari, Telangana Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar and other officials, informing them about the decision to observe All-India 'breakdown'.
