## Demand to Withdraw Electricity Privatization Bill: JAC Leaders Warn of Strike



“Arvapalli Nagesh khammam Staff Reporter March 10 (Indian Chronicle):“Leaders of the Electricity Joint Action Committee (JAC) demanded that the Central Government immediately withdraw the proposed Electricity Privatization Bill. They warned that if the bill is not withdrawn, electricity employees, engineers, and workers will be forced to go on strike. “The protest was organized by the National Coordination Committee of Engineer Workers Union in Khammam. Employees staged a demonstration in front of the Electricity Department Superintending Engineer’s office during their lunch break. “Speaking on the occasion, JAC leaders said that the Central Government has announced its intention to pass the electricity privatization bill during the current session of Parliament. They stated that privatizing the electricity sector would place a heavy burden on the public and negatively impact the future of the country. The Joint Action Committee of employee unions demanded that the government immediately reconsider and withdraw the decision. “A memorandum outlining their concerns was submitted to the department management. Leaders said that handing over the electricity sector to private companies would harm farmers, common people, and employees. They emphasized that workers, engineers, and employees across the country are united in opposing the decision. “They further warned that privatization could lead to the removal of subsidies, increased electricity charges, and a rise in

overall prices, which would place an additional financial burden on farmers and the common public, ultimately affecting the country’s welfare. “Those who participated in the protest included Chairman T. # Telangana Activists Must Fight to Secure Their Rights

Kodandaram, with activists arriving from all 33 districts.“At Gun Park, the activists gathered once again and paid tributes to the martyrs who sacrificed their lives during the Telangana statehood movement. During the movement for the formation of Telangana state, activists under the Political Joint Action Committee (JAC) fought courageously, faced police baton charges, went to jail, and sacrificed many things for the cause.“Various political parties and organizations supported the movement by adopting Telangana as their main agenda. On that historic day, nearly a million people from the then united districts participated in the protest, making it a significant moment in history. The activists recalled that both the Million March and Sagara Haram remain two of the most remarkable events of the Telangana movement.“The leaders demanded that during the upcoming Assembly budget session on March 15, the government should form a committee of experts and honor every activist who participated in the Telangana movement with appreciation certificates. They also urged the government to fulfill the promises made to activists before the elections under the sixth guarantee in the six guarantees scheme. These include allotment of a 250-square-yard house site, ₹10 lakh for house construction, and a ₹25,000 monthly pension for activists.“They warned that if these promises are not fulfilled, all Telangana movement activists—irrespective of their political party or organization—will unite under one platform and fight to secure their rights. Sandhya purchased Britannia digestive biscuits from Sanath Nagar D-Mart Store for her 4-year-old daughter. To her horror, she found a foreign particle - a plastic cover - embedded inside the biscuit while feeding her. She filed a case in the District Forum in March 2019 against Britannia Industries Private Limited. The District Forum declared that the test reports confirmed by the State Test Laboratory identified the foreign particle as plastic, and awarded ₹25,000 compensation to be paid jointly and severally by Britannia and D-Mart for the mental agony and trauma caused.“Britannia appealed the decision in the Telangana State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission at Khairatabad, but after years of arguments, the appeal was dismissed on February 25th, 2026. The State Forum upheld the District Forum's judgement, ordering Britannia and D-Mart to pay ₹25,000 with accrued interest to Mrs. Sandhya.

## Food safety officials seize unlicensed ice cream stock in Karimnagar

Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, Mar 10: Officials of the Food Safety Department conducted an inspection at a local ice cream manufacturing unit in Alugunur on Monday and seized stock worth ₹6,000 after detecting several violations.



According to officials, P. Rohith Reddy, Gazetted Food Inspector, along with V. Ankit Reddy, Food Safety Officer, inspected the premises of Uttam Ice Cream as part of routine food safety checks in the district.

During the inspection, the team found that the ice cream packets did not carry the manufacturing address or the FSSAI licence number, both of which are mandatory under food safety regulations. Officials also noted that the manufacturer had obtained a food licence under an incorrect category, raising concerns over compliance with prescribed norms.

Following the violations, the authorities seized ice cream stock valued at about ₹6,000 and advised the manufacturer to obtain the appropriate and valid licence at the earliest.

The Food Safety Department also cautioned food business operators against fraudsters posing as department officials and collecting excessive fees for obtaining food licences. Officials urged businesses to remain vigilant and contact the department directly for any licensing requirements.

## Don't harass small newspapers..Pay government advertisement bills immediately:- TWJF leader Mamidi Somaiya appeals to I&PR Commissioner.

“(Mandava Srisailam..Hyderabad..Indian Chronicle March 10):- Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) founding president and state convening committee convener Mamidi Somaiya said that the government is looking down on small and medium newspapers in the state and this trend is not right. He said that small and medium newspapers have been facing many problems for the past two years after the Congress government came to power. He flagged that the state government has been delaying the payment of the bills related to advertisements given to small and medium newspapers and periodicals through the Information and Public Relations Department. He said that on the one hand, advertisements



are not given properly, and on the other hand, bills for the advertisements given are not given, which is causing problems for journalists and newspaper managers. He expressed his concern that newspaper publishers are facing a serious financial crisis due to the government's repressive attitude. He alleged that despite the budget for newspaper advertisements, the government allocates meager funds to periodicals and small and medium newspapers, but despite this, the state finance department officials are giving priority to only a few large newspapers and ad agencies and paying their bills on time, while keeping small and medium newspapers pending. Moreover, he said that for the last few months, the government has completely stopped giving advertisements to periodicals.

Mamidi Somaiya demanded that the arrears of advertisement bills due from the government to small and medium newspapers and periodicals be paid immediately. Similarly, he asked that small and medium-sized dailies and periodicals that have regularity should be empaneled, that government advertisements should be released regularly to small newspapers on par with large newspapers, and that the bills due for advertisements should be released on time. Meanwhile, Mamidi Somaiya spoke to Priyanka, Special Commissioner of the State Information and Public Relations Department, on Tuesday over the phone regarding the pending bills of small and medium-sized newspapers. He said that many newspaper managers are facing difficulties due to the arrival of bills and asked the Commissioner to pay the bills immediately. Mamidi Somaiya said that the Commissioner said that arrangements are being made to release the pending bills.
