March 12):- District Collector Anurag Jayanti said that the district is targeting to purchase about 4.5 lakh metric tons of paddy in Rabi season and the officials should work in coordination to ensure that the purchase process goes smoothly without any difficulties for the farmers. ““A meeting was held with the Civil Supply Manager, Civil Supply officials, Agriculture, Co-operative and Mepma officials in the mini meeting hall on Thursday.“Speaking on the occasion, the District Collector said that four lakh fifty thousand metric tons of paddy will come to the purchase centers in the district. He said that 330 purchase centers will be set up in the district. All facilities like gunny bags, tarpaulins, moisture ma- chines, paddy cleaners, weighing equipment should be kept ready in advance at the centers. He said that preventive measures should be taken to prevent short- age of gunny bags and transportation problems, and steps should be taken to import the grain immediately after it is moved to the mills.“In the backdrop of summer, drinking water, tents, cold water in pots, and shade arrangements should be made mandatory at the purchase centers. He ordered that the details of the grain received at the purchase centers every day should be recorded in the truck sheet and records should be maintained. He advised the officials to conduct transparent purchase without any hassle for the farmers at all the purchase cen- ters. Builder Withdraws Petition in Kapra Nala Buffer Zone Construction Case

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, March 12, (Indian chronicle):“The owner of a G+4 building under construction near the Ganapathi temple on the Kapra-Saket road has withdrawn a petition filed in the Telangana High Court regarding the construction within the nala buffer zone. The building was being constructed in the buffer zone of a nala flowing from Kapra Ooru Cheruvu. Local activists had earlier brought the issue to the notice of the authorities, stating that the construction was violating buffer zone norms. Acting on complaints, officials of the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) had earlier demolished some pillars that were reportedly constructed within the buffer zone. Despite this, the builder continued construction up to two slabs and later approached the Telangana High Court by filing a writ petition (WP No.168/2026). Meanwhile, a petition with supporting documents and photographs highlighting the alleged violation was also submitted to the court. The matter was also brought to the attention of the Irrigation Department and municipal authorities. Following a complaint dated February 16, 2026, the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation, Uppal Zone and Kapra Circle officials conducted a detailed inspection. On February 20, GHMC officials marked portions of the structure built over six pillars up to the second slab level, stating that the marked area fell within the buffer zone or setback limits. Officials reportedly indicated that if the six marked pillars were demolished, the remaining slab structure could collapse. Reports from the Irrigation Department also suggested that the nala passing from Kapra Ooru Cheruvu near the construction site might have been altered, which could have become a crucial issue in the court proceedings and posed a potential risk to the entire structure. In view of these developments, the building owner withdrew the petition from the High Court. Taduri Gagan Kumar, Convener of the Right to Information Protection Committee, Medchal-Malkajgiri district, stated that the effort was aimed at protecting the nala buffer zone. He also thanked print and electronic media for highlighting the issue and supporting the campaign against alleged illegal construction. He said the fight against irregularities and illegal activities would continue.

The programme was attended by DGP Shivadhar Reddy, Additional DGP Charu Sinha, Medchal-Malkajgiri District Collector Manu Choudhary, Malkajgiri Police Commissioner Avinash Mohanty, Future City Commissioner Sudheer Babu, and Additional Collector Faizan Ahmed, among other officials. Addressing the gathering, Rahatkar thanked the Hyderabad and Malkajgiri administration for extending full cooperation in organizing the programme. She said coordinated efforts between the National Commission for Women and the local administration would ensure quicker resolution of women’s issues. Rahatkar noted that the Commission receives numerous complaints from across the country, but many women are unable to travel to Delhi to present their grievances. “Keeping this in mind, we decided to reach out to them through the initiative ‘National Commission for



Women at Your Doorstep’. So far, nearly 100 Jan Sunwai programmes have been conducted across the country,” she said. On the occasion of International Women’s Day on March 8, the Commission also planned to conduct grievance hearings simultaneously in nearly 500 districts across the country, with the aim of resolving 15,000 to 20,000 cases, she added. Officials said the cases would be examined at the earliest and necessary steps would be taken to ensure justice for the victims. Government Taking Steps to Ensure Poor Live with Dignity: Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy

“(State Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said the government is taking several measures to ensure that the poor can live with self-respect and dignity.“(Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Staff Reporter March 12, (Indian Chronicle).“(On Thursday, the minister, along with District Collector Anudeep Durishetty, toured Kusumanchi Mandal and laid foundation stones for several development works. “Earlier, the minister visited Palair village and laid the foundation stone for tourism development works to be taken up at Palair Lake with an estimated cost of ₹5 crore. He also inaugurated the works for a BT road from Mallayigudem to Anjaneya Swamy Temple in Mallayigudem village, to be constructed at a cost of ₹1.35 crore. In Gattusingaram village, he laid the foundation for a new electricity regulator repair center. “Speaking on the occasion, the minister directed officials to develop Palair Lake attractively so that tourists and visitors can spend quality time there. He reviewed the development plans prepared for the lake area and offered several suggestions to officials. “He stated that the BT road works in Mallayigudem would be completed before the upcoming monsoon season. The minister said funds had been released to villages over the past one and a half months and more funds are likely to be released before March 31. He urged that the funds provided by both the Central and State governments should be effectively utilized for village development. So far, development works worth about ₹13 crore have been undertaken in Mallayigudem village, he added. “The minister also said that new ration cards are being distributed to the poor and fine rice is being supplied through the public distribution system. He assured that Indiramma houses will be sanctioned in phases to all eligible poor families. He further mentioned that free bus travel facilities for women have been introduced and a ₹500 bonus for fine paddy is being provided. “In Gattusingaram village, he instructed officials to conduct field verification and provide land ownership documents to poor families who do not have land titles. He also advised officials to repair borewells to ensure there are no drinking water shortages during the upcoming summer season. “District Collector Anudeep Durishetty said it was a pleasure that the minister laid the foundation stone for the BT road from Mallayigudem to Anjaneya Swamy Temple with an estimated cost of ₹1.35 crore. He directed engineering officials to complete the works before the rainy season and make the road available for public use. The Collector also congratulated the newly elected village sarpanch and governing body members and advised them to work sincerely over the next five years for the welfare of the people. “Later, the minister inspected the proposed hospital construction site in Gattusingaram.

Mega Dharna on March 16 Demanding Repeal of 4 Labour Codes

“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Staff Reporter March 12, (Indian Chronicle): “Sheikh Subhan, District President of the Indian Federation of Trade Unions (IFTU), called upon workers to participate in large numbers in the Maha Dharna to be held on March 16 at district headquarters demanding the repeal of the four labour codes which, he said, are severely affecting workers across the country. Speaking at a meeting of key activists of the Telangana Progressive Building and Other Construction Workers Union (affiliated to IFTU) held at Ballepalli in Khammam under the ship of Boda Nageswara Rao, Sheikh Subhan stated that India has more than 50 crore workers and the four labour codes have become a major burden for them. He said that the IFTU national committee has called for nationwide protests, including district-level dharnas on March 16 and a “Chalo Central Labour Office” protest in Hyderabad on March 23. “Subhan said that the historic rights achieved by workers after decades of struggle — such as the eight-hour workday, minimum wages, job security and pension — are being undermined by the Narendra Modi government. He alleged that the government is working only for the benefit of a handful of corporates and is planning to implement the labour-opposing four labour codes from April 1. He demanded that the decision be withdrawn immediately and urged workers to make the March 16 dharna in Khammam and the March 23 protest in Hyderabad a success. On this occasion, Gugguloth Patel, District General Secretary of the Building Construction Workers Union, said that governments are not showing even minimal concern towards construction workers. He alleged that neither the central nor the state governments are able to provide even basic safety equipment to workers and that the labour of workers is being exploited. “He further stated that the Welfare Board meant for construction workers is functioning only through middlemen and the benefits available to workers are very minimal. Workers who apply for claims are forced to wait for years without receiving them, he said. He also pointed out that there are no proper facilities for workers at labour addas. Patel added that governments collect revenue from construction workers through GST on construction materials such as cement, iron, bricks, tiles and paint. In addition, fees are collected by municipalities or panchayats for building construction, and around 1% construction cess is collected on every project which is supposed to be used for the welfare of construction workers. However, he questioned how this money is being utilized if it is not reaching the workers. He appealed to workers to participate in large numbers in the Maha Dharna to be held in Khammam on March 16 as part of the nationwide call given by the IFTU national committee to resolve these issues. On the occasion, campaign wall posters were also released. District leaders Gouni Mohan Rao, Ram Narasayya, Bhadramma, Narasimha Rao, Venkataiah, Srinu, Pasha, Shravan, Somnath and others participated in the programme.

India Has a Strong Democracy but a Weak Prime Minister: CPI Leader K. Narayana

“Avnreddy Khammam Bureau March 12, (Indian Chronicle): “K. Narayana, Chairman of the National Control Commission of the Communist Party of India (CPI), alleged that although India has one of the strongest democratic foundations in the world, it currently has a very weak Prime Minister in Narendra Modi who is not taking effective steps to stop global conflicts. Speaking at a press conference held on Thursday at Giri Prasad Bhavan, Narayana criticized the Prime Minister, stating that Modi is unable to do anything beyond yielding to Donald Trump and does not possess even five percent of the courage shown by former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. “He said the impact of global conflicts has already begun affecting India, leading to rising prices of cooking gas and other essential commodities. Narayana warned that agricultural product prices may also fall as exports are likely to decline. He further alleged that U.S. President Donald Trump is attempting to attack and dominate countries with significant economic resources. According to him, after Venezuela, the U.S. is targeting Iran and attempting action against Cuba as well. Narayana accused Modi of remaining silent and failing to protect the dignity of India’s 1.4 billion citizens, urging the Indian government to speak out against Trump and play a strong role in promoting peace amid what he described as conditions leading toward a possible Third World War. Narayana also criticized the stance of President Droupadi Murmu, saying that while it is a matter of pride that an Adivasi woman holds the position of President, actions that harm tribal communities cannot be supported. He alleged that changes to the Forest Rights Act and the transfer of forest lands to corporate entities are being facilitated with the government’s approval. “He further claimed that under operations against Maoists, tribal communities are being displaced from forests and their lands are being handed over to corporations. According to him, killing Maoist leaders does not eliminate ideology, and attempts to do so will not succeed. “Responding to the Velugumatla incident in Khammam, Narayana questioned why houses of poor residents were demolished only to later consider issuing land titles again. He demanded that land ownership rights be provided to all poor residents living there and alleged that such actions primarily benefit real estate interests. “Target Is to Weaken Communists”: Koonamneni “Koonamneni Sambasiva Rao, State Secretary of the CPI, said the real aim of critics is to weaken the Communist movement, which is why unnecessary allegations are being made against them. “He stated that CPI is fighting to secure land titles for about 8,000 poor families who have built huts across the state and demanded regularization through GO 58. Providing housing sites and building houses for the poor is the government’s responsibility, not charity, he said.”

Collector calls for coordination to implement Praja Palana–Pragati Pranalika

The programme was inaugurated with the lighting of a lamp along with District Collector Anudeep Durishetty and Sathupalli MLA Dr. Matta Ragamayee. Speaking on the occasion, the minister said that the state government is implementing the Praja Palana Pragathi Pranalika 99-day programme across the state from March 6 to June 12 as per the ideas and vision of the Chief Minister and the State Cabinet. He said the objective is to create awareness among the public about the development and welfare programmes being implemented by the state and central governments and to ensure that the benefits reach eligible beneficiaries. “He said that no one enters politics merely to earn money, and that from a sarpanch to a collector, everyone has been given an opportunity by God to serve the people. He added that public representatives always strive to earn a good name by ensuring development and good work in their villages and constituencies during their tenure. The minister stated that leaders have a responsibility to do good for the people who voted for them. He said that if public representatives dedicate some time every morning and evening to public service, visible changes can be achieved at the grassroots level. “Refuting claims that villages were not receiving funds due to the absence of local governing bodies, the minister said that large amounts of funds have been released in the last one and a half months and more funds will be released before March 31. He added that funds ranging from ₹5 lakh to ₹60 lakh have been released to each village based on population and urged public representatives to utilize these funds in a planned manner. “He advised that the funds should be used strictly within the legal framework and ensured that not even a single rupee is misused. The government, he said, is working beyond political considerations to ensure continuous welfare for



poor people. “The minister also urged newly elected representatives to work for the development of their areas irrespective of party lines. “Former MLA Putta Madhu Alleges Political and Police Harassment Behind Congress Activist Satish’s Death; Demands Immediate Investigation

Former Manthani MLA Putta Madhu has alleged that the tragic death of Congress party activist Perugu Satish, a resident of Manthani town, was the consequence of sustained harassment by Manthani MLA Duddilla Sridhar and Ramagundam ACP Madata Ramesh

ASHOKAN “KARIMNAGAR BUREAU. “Putta Madhu visited the postmortem centre where Satish’s mortal remains were kept and interacted with the bereaved family members to ascertain the circumstances that led to the unfortunate incident. According to the family, Satish had consumed pesticide nearly twenty-five days ago after allegedly being summoned and subjected to harassment by ACP Madata Ramesh. He had been undergoing medical treatment for the past several weeks before ultimately succumbing to his condition, an incident that Madhu described as deeply distressing and unfortunate. “The former MLA stated that Satish’s sister alleged the ACP had acted unilaterally without properly verifying the complaint reportedly made by a girl who had accused Satish of troubling her. She claimed that the undue pressure and intimidation by the police officer forced her brother to take the extreme step. “Expressing strong dissatisfaction over the police response, Putta Madhu said that despite the body being brought to the postmortem facility early in the morning, even by 9 a.m. the concerned Sub-Inspector had not arrived to receive the family’s complaint. He further alleged that the Ramagundam police were attempting to dictate the wording of the complaint instead of accepting the grievance submitted by the family members. “He remarked that the Ramagundam police had already been cautioned several times to discharge their duties responsibly and refrain from indulging in political activities. “Police officials are public servants entrusted with maintaining law and order; they must not function as instruments of political influence,” he asserted. He also warned that if such conduct continues, they would expose the alleged political bias of police stations in order to raise public awareness. “Putta Madhu declared that those responsible for the deaths of innocent individuals would not be spared under any circumstances. He warned that appropriate action would inevitably follow against the Ramagundam ACP and the concerned police officials in Manthani. He further stated that the names of officers who fail to rectify their conduct are being documented in what he described as a “Pink Book.” “Criticizing the political leadership in the constituency, Madhu alleged that Manthani MLA Duddilla

Sridhar and his brother were running affairs in the constituency arbitrarily. He observed that it was deeply unfortunate that a dedicated Congress party worker who had contributed to the party’s growth and success was allegedly ignored in his time of distress. “He emphasized that the responsibility of an elected representative is to address the grievances of party workers and citizens directly rather than allowing police intervention that could intimidate them. According to him, the situation suggests that once electoral support is secured, the welfare of party workers is no longer prioritized. “Putta Madhu further accused the Duddilla family of exploiting sections of society for political advantage and stated that he would strive to expose such practices. Identifying himself as a son of the soil belonging to the backward communities, he asserted that his struggle was not motivated by the pursuit of political office or electoral gains but by a commitment to justice and social dignity. “Referring to another recent incident in Suraram where a person named Ramakrishna had died, Madhu alleged that the concerned DSP spoke about the death in a dismissive and insensitive manner. As a public representative with nearly three decades of political experience, he expressed deep concern over what he described as the deteriorating sensitivity within the police system. “He further stated that members of marginalized communities — particularly SC, ST, and BC groups — often become victims of political conspiracies and alleged police excesses. According to him, the death of Satish was the result of the combined actions of the political leadership and the police machinery. “Putta Madhu demanded that the police immediately accept the complaint submitted by the victim’s family and initiate a fair and transparent investigation. He also called upon Manthani MLA Duddilla Sridhar to respond promptly and clarify the circumstances surrounding the alleged police involvement. “The family members reportedly informed him that Satish had approached the Human Rights Commission with a complaint even before his death. Madhu insisted that the local police must formally register the complaint and conduct a thorough inquiry. If necessary, he said, they would approach the judiciary to ensure justice is served. “Concluding his remarks, Putta



Madhu reaffirmed that he and his supporters would stand firmly with Satish’s family and continue their struggle until

justice is delivered and those responsible are held accountable.
