

One Lakh Indiramma Houses to Be Completed by the End of March

Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy Lays Foundation for Rs 12.48 Crore Development Works in Kamepalli Mandal

Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Staff Reporter March 13, (Indian Chronicle): "Telangana Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy stated that the government is committed to fulfilling the dream of home ownership for all poor families in the state. "On Friday, the minister visited Kamepalli mandal along with local MLA Koram Kanakaiah. During the visit, he laid foundation stones for several development works worth about ₹12.48 crore. He also inaugurated completed double-bedroom houses and handed over house documents to the beneficiaries. "Development Works Initiated" As part of improving infrastructure across the mandal, the minister launched several BT road construction projects. These include: "A road from Jastipalli to Captain Banjara costing ₹3.15 crore" "A road from Lalyathanda to Jagannath Thanda costing ₹3.33 crore" "A road in Uthukuru from Muthyalampadu temple to the cremation ground costing ₹1.80 crore" "A road from Tekulathanda via Pinjarimadugu to Dornakal Road in Thallagudem area costing ₹4.20 crore" He performed the foundation ceremonies for these projects. Villagers in the respective areas welcomed the minister warmly during the visit. "Criticism of Previous Government" "Speaking at public meetings in Mucharla and Pinjarimadugu villages, after handing over houses that had remained incomplete under the previous government, the minister criticized the earlier administration. He said that during their ten-year rule, they failed to construct even one lakh houses across the state. He alleged that poor people were misled in the name of double-bedroom housing schemes and criticized the previous rulers for mocking the Indiramma housing scheme introduced during the tenure of Y. S. Rajasekhara Reddy, while failing to complete housing projects when they were in power. "Second Phase in April" "Minister Ponguleti stated that the current government sanctioned 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses in its very first year after coming to power. Construction work is progressing rapidly, and one lakh houses across the state will be completed and

ready for housewarming ceremonies by the end of March. "He further announced that another phase of Indiramma houses will be sanctioned in April, assuring that every eligible poor family will receive a house. "Welfare Schemes for the Poor" "The minister emphasized that the government is implementing several welfare programs aimed at eradicating poverty. Recognizing the hardships faced by women in poor households, the government has introduced schemes such as: "Distribution of fine rice through the ration system" "Issuance of new ration cards" "200 units of free electricity" He also instructed officials to complete the ongoing development works in Uthukuru before the monsoon season. 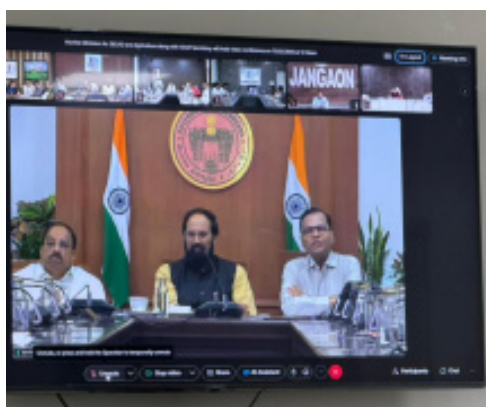
.. Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy Clarifies During Video Conference with Collectors, SPs, and Police Commissioners

“(Mandava Srisailam – Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau – Indian Chronicle – March 13): Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy clarified that there is absolutely no truth to the rumors circulating that a gas shortage has arisen in the state against the backdrop of the ongoing conflict between the United States and Iran. He directed officials to remain vigilant regarding the propaganda being spread, which aims to create baseless misconceptions among the public and throw them into confusion. In view of the confusion prevailing among consumers regarding the supply of LPG gas in the state, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy held a video conference on Friday morning with District Collectors, Superintendents of Police (SPs), and Police Commissioners at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat. He was joined by Minister Thummala Nageswara Rao, Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, and Civil Supplies Commissioner Stephen Raveendra. During the conference, he announced that a high-level committee is being constituted under the leadership of the Chief Secretary. Speaking on this occasion, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy assured domestic consumers that there is no need for any confusion regarding the supply of LPG gas, guaranteeing that adequate supplies would be provided. He strongly refuted the false propaganda circulating on social media platforms, which is attempting to artificially create a gas shortage. He noted that it is precisely due to this confusion that daily bookings have surged to 72%; however, he stated that the government is fully prepared to ensure supplies are delivered on a priority basis—not only to domestic consumers but also to hospitals, educational institutions, old-age homes, and government organizations. He mentioned that gas distribution across the state is being facilitated through a network of 810 LPG distributors. He further explained that while there are 1.29 crore LPG connections statewide, approximately 2.5 lakh cylinders are being supplied on a daily basis. He confirmed that, to date, no instances of gas shortages have been reported at any of the bottling plants within the state. He warned that the government would not tolerate any attempts to engage in black marketing by exploiting these misconceptions, and would instead initiate stringent punitive measures. He stated that 288 cases have already been registered against individuals and entities for engaging in illegal activities—such as unauthorized hoarding, diversion of supplies, and black marketing—by capitalizing on the recent rumors. Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy issued directives to the respective District Collectors, Superintendents of Police (SPs), and Police Commissioners to initiate even stricter actions should LPG distributors continue to engage in such misconduct. He stated that, concurrently, the government has decided to establish a statewide Command and Control Center. He suggested that special committees of officials be constituted in each district, under the chairmanship of the respective District Collector, to review daily stock levels and the supply situation. He ad-



vised gas consumers to book their LPG cylinders once every 25 days in urban areas and once every 45 days in rural areas. At the same time, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy appealed to the people of the state not to give credence to rumors or book cylinders in excess of their actual requirements; he assured domestic consumers that adequate gas supplies would be provided and that the government would closely monitor the situation on an ongoing basis. Speaking on the occasion, State Agriculture Minister Thummala Nageswara Rao suggested that arrangements be made to procure gunny bags for the Yasangi (Rabi) grain procurement drive and to secure adequate storage space for the harvested grain. He noted that paddy cultivation has increased across the districts and emphasized the need to encourage crop diversification while ensuring the provision of irrigation water based on the specific requirements and conditions of the crops. District Collector Anurag Jayanthi, Additional Collector (Revenue) Venka Reddy, Civil Supplies Officer Roja Rani, District Agriculture Officer Ramana Reddy, Marketing Officer Sabitha, Horticulture Officer Madhavi, and other concerned officials participated in this video conference.

Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti Conducts Surprise Inspection of Nursery in Rajapeta Mandal Headquarters

March 13):- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti conducted a surprise inspection of the nursery located at the Rajapeta Mandal headquarters. During this visit, the District Collector inquired about the total number of saplings planted and the specific varieties that had been cultivated. He instructed the staff to visit the nursery daily to water the saplings, emphasizing the need to maintain a pleasant and refreshing environment within the premises. Subsequently, he inspected the avenue plantation within the Mandal headquarters; expressing displeasure with the concerned officials, he noted that the saplings had merely been planted and neglected—receiving inadequate watering—and observed that weeds had sprouted around the trees. He issued orders to the Field Assistant (FA) to dig pits around the trees to facilitate daily watering and to ensure the surrounding area is kept clean and free of weeds and litter. “Later, the District Collector visited the SC Boys' Residential School located in the Rajapeta Mandal headquarters. During this visit, he inspected the school kitchen and inquired about the specific meal being served that day, verifying it against the prescribed menu. He examined the quality of the food provided to the students, as well as the storage rooms and the provisions required for cooking. He issued instructions to ensure that eggs and vegetables are kept fresh. Furthermore, he inspected the students' dormitory block to verify the condition of the beds and sleeping arrangements provided for the students. He directed that the toilets used by students be inspected and cleaned daily, and that the school premises be maintained in a hygienic condition. Concerned officials participated in this program.

... District Collector Praveenya “Sangareddy, Indian Chronicle correspondent March 13: “District Collector Praveenya has clarified that there is no shortage of gas cylinders used for household needs in the district and consumers



should not be subjected to any panic. “She advised people not to believe the false propaganda being spread on social media about gas supply. “On Friday, a meeting of the District Level Coordination Committee was held under the chairmanship of the District Collector at the Collectorate Mini Conference Hall and the gas supply situation in the district was reviewed. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector directed the officials to take steps to ensure that gas supply is provided to household consumers as well as hospitals, educational institutions, government institutions, hostels, Anganwadi centers and old age homes in order of priority. He warned that strict action will be taken if actions like hiding stocks, illegal diversion and black marketing are done in the name of gas shortage. “Gas consumers are advised not to book cylinders more than required and to book only once in 25 days in urban areas and once in 45 days in rural areas as per the rules. Domestic gas cylinders should not be used for commercial purposes and officials should conduct regular inspections. They also said that gas bookings and supply details should be collected every day and complete monitoring should be done. “District SP Paritosh Pankaj said that if LPG distributors face any problem, they should inform the local SHO or 100 number. He said that if it is found that domestic or commercial gas cylinders are being black-marketed anywhere, cases will be registered and action will be taken. “District Civil Supplies Officer Balasaraja, Assistant Civil Supplies Officer Rajeshwar, Welfare Department Officers Akhilesh Reddy, Jagadish, Rajeshwar Ambadas, Lalitha Kumari, DEO Venkateswarlu, LPG Distributors Association President Pratap Reddy, Vice President Muralidhar Reddy, members and concerned officials participated in this meeting.

iron poles next to existing electric poles, creating a potentially dangerous situation. Locals say the newly installed iron poles are placed extremely close to live power lines, increasing the risk of accidents. The electric pole in the area already has a tangled network of electricity and cable wires. Despite this, Airtel installed an iron pole right beside it.

As a result, the electric wires appear to be dangerously close to the iron structure, raising

fears that they may come into contact at any time. Residents warn that even a slight wind or rain could cause the wires to touch each other, leading to a possible short circuit. The situation has created anxiety among people living in the colony. The area is frequently used by children and elderly residents. Locals say that if the electric wires come in contact with the iron pole, it could lead to a life-threatening accident.

They also point out that during nighttime the wires are not clearly visible in the streetlight, making the situation even more hazardous. Residents allege that they have informed the concerned authorities several times, but no action has been taken so far. They are demanding that Airtel officials and the Electricity Department immediately respond, remove the dangerously placed iron pole, and properly arrange the wires to prevent any mishap. Locals warn that if the issue is not addressed soon, a serious accident could occur at any time.

Do not believe in myths on gas supply —Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy Strict action on gas black market—instructions to officials.

“Kukkadapu Naresh Kumar, Bhadradi Kothagudem Staff Reporter, March 13, Indian Chronicle: State Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy has clarified that there is no truth in the campaign going on that there is a shortage of LPG gas in the state in the wake of the ongoing war between America and Iran. He has ordered the authorities to effectively counter the false propaganda being spread to create confusion among the people on gas supply. On Friday morning, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, along with Associate Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao, Government Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, and Civil Supplies Commissioner Stephen Ravindra, held a video conference with district collectors, SPs, and police commissioners from the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat. On this occasion, a comprehensive review was made of the LPG gas supply situation in the state. Speaking on the occasion, the minister said that there is sufficient LPG gas available to domestic consumers in the state, and there is no shortage anywhere in bottling plants. He said that the confusion among the people is due to false propaganda being spread on social media. He appealed to the people not to fall into such misconceptions and book gas cylinders beyond the need. He said that gas is currently being supplied through 810 LPG distributors in the state. He explained that there are 1.29 crore LPG connections across the state, and about 2.5 lakh cylinders are

being supplied daily. He advised the officials to supply gas to household consumers as well as hospitals, educational institutions, old age homes, and government institutions in order of priority. The minister warned that the government will not ignore acts such as illegal storage, diversion, and black marketing of gas cylinders under any circumstances, curbing misconceptions. He said that 288 cases have been registered across the state for such irregularities so far. He instructed the district collectors, SPs, and police commissioners to take stricter action if the situation continues. He said that a



high-level committee is being formed under the leadership of the chief secretary to monitor the gas supply situation in the state. Similarly, he said that the government has decided to set up a command control center across the state. He suggested that a special committee of officers be formed in each district under the chairmanship of the collector to review the daily storage and supply situation. Consumers were advised to book gas cylinders every 25 days in urban areas and every 45 days in rural areas. Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy said that the government will continuously monitor the gas supply situation without believing any myths. Bhadradi Kothagudem District Collector Ankit and Additional Collector D. Venugopal participated in this video conference from the IDOC office. Later, District Collector Ankit said that they are continuously monitoring the LPG gas supply situation in the district. He warned people not to believe any myths about gas shortages and that strict action will be taken if they indulge in illegal storage or black marketing. The collector ordered the officials of the concerned departments to conduct inspections with continuous supervision. Civil Supplies Department Officer Prem Kumar, Civil Supplies Department Manager Trinath Babu, officials of the relevant departments, and others participated in this meeting.
