

Telangana Budget Ignores Youth, Say AIYF Leaders - Where is Justice for Unemployed Youth



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, March 20, (Indian chronicle):“The All India Youth Federation (AIYF) Telangana State Committee strongly criticised the 2026–27 State Budget presented in the Assembly by Finance Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, alleging that it completely neglects the interests of the youth. At a meeting held at Satyanarayana Reddy Bhavan in Himayatnagar, AIYF State President Vali Ulla Khadri and State Secretary Kalluru Dharmendra condemned the budget, stating that the government has shown a lack of responsibility towards unemployed youth. Addressing the gathering, the leaders said the rising unemployment and growing frustration among educated youth have been ignored. They alleged that the budget gives “zero priority to youth and zero justice to their future.” They pointed out that there is no clarity on job creation for lakhs of unemployed youth, nor any mention of unemployment allowance. They further criticised the increasing reliance on contract-based employment, stating it puts the future of youth at risk. Despite possessing degrees, many young people are struggling to find opportunities, they said. The leaders also alleged misuse of funds under skill development programmes, claiming that such initiatives are limited in scope and lack meaningful youth participation. AIYF leaders criticised the Rajiv Yuva Vikas scheme, alleging it benefits ruling party supporters rather than deserving youth. On sports, they said inadequate budget allocation is reducing opportunities for rural youth. Lack of playgrounds at the village level, absence of support for poor sportspersons, and growing focus on commercial sports reflect government inefficiency. “Education without employment has no value,” the leaders said, questioning the government’s commitment to youth welfare. They also expressed concern over the absence of a clear job calendar, calling unemployment one of the most critical issues faced by the youth. They explained that a job calendar should provide a clear timeline for recruitment, including the number of vacancies, notification dates, examination schedules, and result announcements. Delay and uncertainty in recruitment processes, they said, are increasing frustration among aspirants. The leaders accused the present government of following the same path as the previous administration, warning that continued neglect of youth issues would lead to political consequences. Terming the budget “deeply disappointing,” the AIYF leaders announced that the organisation will intensify statewide protests to demand justice and rights for youth. AIYF State Working President Nerlakanti Srikant, office bearers T. Satya Prasad, Mahender, Bijja Srinivasulu, Yugandhar, and others were present at the meeting.

People-centric Budget prioritises welfare, says Congress leader

Anjan Kumar lauds allocations for education, healthcare and marginalised sections.

In a statement issued on Friday, he said the Budget, presented in the Telangana Legislative Assembly under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, with Finance Minister Bhatti Vikramarka tabling the proposals and Legislative Council proceedings led by Uttam Kumar Reddy, laid strong emphasis on key sectors.

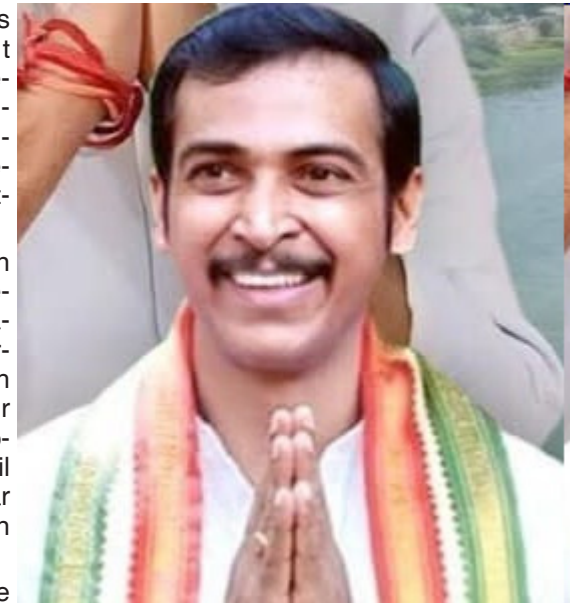
Anjan Kumar welcomed the substantial allocations to education, healthcare, agriculture, and Panchayati Raj institutions, noting that these would strengthen grassroots governance and public services. Highlighting the welfare component, he said the Budget made “unprecedented” provisions for Backward Classes (BCs), Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs), and minority communities. He termed the allocations a significant step towards social justice and equitable growth.

The Congress leader asserted that the Budget underscored the party’s commitment to the uplift of marginalised sections, adding that such focused interventions would contribute to balanced and sustainable development across the State.

Eligible Farmers Asked to Apply for Rythu Bharosa – Nelakondapalli

Radha has urged eligible farmers in the mandal to apply for the Rythu Bharosa scheme. Only those who have newly obtained Pattadar Passbooks should apply.“Applicants must submit the following documents along with the application form:“Xerox copy of Pattadar Passbook or digitally signed online copy“Xerox copy of Aadhaar card“Xerox copy of bank account details“Farmers are advised to contact the concerned Agricultural Extension Officer and submit their applications.“The last date to apply is the 25th of this month. Therefore, all eligible farmers who have newly received Pattadar Passbooks are requested to apply before the deadline.



DLAC Meeting Held in Medchal–Malkajgiri to Review Approvals and Strengthen PCPNDT Act Implementation

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, March 20, (Indian chronicle):“Medchal–Malkajgiri District Medical and Health Officer Dr. C. Umagouri chaired a meeting of the District Level Advisory Committee (DLAC) on May 9, 2025. The meeting was convened to review and discuss



applications from new institutions seeking approval for the establishment of ultrasound sonography centers, genetic counseling centers, genetic laboratories, and imaging centers under the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, 1994 and Rules, 1996. Renewal proposals of existing centers were also taken up for consideration. During the meeting, the committee examined and approved applications for new registrations and renewals. Members also shared key suggestions to ensure strict enforcement of the PCPNDT Act and discussed an action plan for its effective implementation. Addressing the meeting, Dr. Umagouri stated that conducting or assisting in sex determination in unregistered private health facilities is a punishable offense under the law. She emphasized that sex selection, whether for a male or female child, is strictly prohibited and liable for prosecution. She further warned that diagnostic techniques should not be misused for purposes other than those specified under the Act, and any violation would attract legal action. The meeting was attended by DLAC members including Dr. Guru Bhargav (Pediatrician), Dr. Swarnalatha (Gynecologist), Dr. D. Swarnalatha (Geneticist), Kumar Krupa (NGO representative), and Haimavathi (NGO representative).

“Step-Motherly Treatment to Key Sectors in State Budget” – CPI Leader Dandi Suresh



“Avnreddy Khammam Bureau March 20, (Indian Chronicle):“CPI district secretary Dandi Suresh has criticized the state budget presented by Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, alleging that it neglects key sectors. Speaking to the media, Suresh said the Telangana government has failed to adequately prioritize crucial areas such as education, healthcare, agriculture, and welfare. He pointed out that, given rising costs, there should have been at least a minimum annual increase in allocations to sectors like education and agriculture, but such growth is not evident in the budget. “Suresh further stated that the promises made by the state government to the agriculture sector do not appear to be implemented in the current budget. He added that people had expected a significant focus on welfare and anticipated an increase in pensions, but the allocations suggest that no such hike has been provided. He also criticized the lack of proper budget provisions for RTC employees, contract workers, and outsourcing staff, stating that their issues have not been adequately addressed. “Although the government claims a 10% increase in allocations, Suresh said the figures are not convincing. He also questioned the state’s reported per capita income of over ₹4 lakh, calling it unrealistic and inconsistent with ground realities.

Allegations of Large-Scale Conspiracy Behind Demolition of Poor People's Houses in Khammam

“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Staff Reporter March 20,(Indian Chronicle):““The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has strongly criticized the Congress government in the state, alleging that it has failed to fulfill its promises and has instead become a burden on the poor. The party claimed that there is a major conspiracy behind the demolition of houses belonging to poor people in Khammam, accusing the government of acting in favor of real estate interests. “A large-scale protest was held on Friday at the Khammam Collectorate under the leadership of BJP district president Nelluri Koteswara Rao. The protest turned into a platform for sharp criticism against the Revanth Reddy-led government. BJP leaders and workers raised slogans against the Congress, highlighting issues such as economic distress and the plight of displaced poor families. “After the protest, BJP leaders submitted a memorandum to Joint Collector P. Srinivas Reddy, demanding immediate resolution of public issues. “Anger Over Demolition of Houses“Protesters expressed strong outrage over the demolition of houses built by poor families on Bhoodan Board lands near Khammam town. BJP State Treasurer Devaki Vasudeva Rao condemned the government, accusing it of targeting the poor while allegedly benefiting ruling party-backed interests. “He questioned the government’s decision to recognize only 311 beneficiaries after demolishing houses and demanded clarity on the fate of the remaining affected families. BJP leaders demanded that permanent houses be constructed for all displaced poor families on Bhoodan lands. ““Six Guarantees Zero, Corruption Maximum”““BJP leaders criticized the Congress government led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, alleging that it came to power with false promises, including the “six guarantees,” but failed to implement them sincerely. “They claimed that promises made to farmers, women, unemployed youth, and the elderly have not been fulfilled. The leaders also questioned the state’s financial claims, stating that while the government projected revenues of ₹2.3 lakh crore, actual figures are around ₹1.4 lakh crore, indicating economic distress. “Further, they alleged that the government is prioritizing commissions in contracts and struggling with mounting debts. ““Congress Decline Will Begin from Khammam”““BJP leaders asserted that the downfall of



the Congress government would begin from Khammam, driven by public dissatisfaction. They stated that their agitation would continue until justice is delivered to the poor and the government fulfills its promises. “They also mentioned that senior BJP leaders such as Etela Rajender, Bandi Sanjay, and Kishan Reddy are extending full support to the movement. “The protest concluded with BJP leaders and workers staging demonstrations at the Dharna Chowk and later submitting a representation to the district collector, highlighting public grievances and criticizing the failures of the Congress government.

He directed officials to take steps to improve services based on the children’s feedback. “The Collector also reviewed the health conditions of infants in the childcare center and instructed that continuous medical monitoring be ensured. He emphasized that staff must take full responsibility for the health, nutrition, and safety of every child. Regarding adoption, he directed officials to thoroughly verify the details of prospective adoptive parents at the field level and to strictly follow legal procedures with transparency. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that children in care homes are like members of our own families and deserve nutritious, hygienic, and quality food. He stressed maintaining the highest standards in cleanliness, healthcare, and safety. “He further noted that every child’s future is a valuable asset and that special attention must be given to their health, nutrition, and education. Regular medical check-ups should be ensured, and infrastructure and facilities should be continuously monitored and improved. He also encouraged promoting education, sports, and cultural activities to build confidence among children. “Highlighting the importance of transparency in the adoption process, he said that children should be given in adoption only to eligible families as per legal norms,



ensuring the child’s welfare at every stage. He urged officials and staff to work in coordination without negligence and provide the best services in line with government objectives. “District Welfare Officer Velpula Vijetha, District Child Protection Officer Vishnu Vandana, and other officials were present during the inspection.

Ikat Handloom Sarees and Fabric Products Must Stand Out as a Unique Brand in the Market:

On Friday, the Collector visited the Women’s Ikat Handicrafts Cooperative Society, established under the RURBAN Project, in Ellam Bavi village of Choutuppal Mandal. Interacting with the society members, the Collector inquired about the challenges they face, their production processes, and current marketing conditions. He urged the weavers to fully utilize the various welfare



schemes implemented by the government for their benefit and advised them to explore opportunities for selling their products through online marketplaces as well. The District Collector assured the members that the administration would extend every possible support to preserve the unique identity of Ikat sarees and to successfully establish them as a recognized brand. He stated that Pochampally and Koyalagudem Ikat sarees and fabric products have gained global recognition for their traditional craftsmanship, unique designs, and quality; therefore, there is a need to further strengthen this distinctiveness and establish a sustainable brand image. He assured that measures would be taken in this regard through coordination among the relevant departments. He emphasized the importance of educating the public about the differences between printed sarees and handloom sarees.
