In Protest Against Government Discrimination

...“Journalists' "Chalo Hyderabad" on the 25th; Journalists Urged to Participate in Large Numbers:

“(Mandava Srisailam... Hyderabad... Indian Chronicle, March 22): Mamidi Somayya, Founder President and State Convener of the Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF), announced that a state-wide "Chalo Hyderabad—I&PR Office" protest program will be organized on the 25th of this month at 11:00 AM. This demonstration aims to protest the attitude of negligence and discrimination adopted by the state government toward journalists. He stated that in the two years since the Congress government assumed power in the state, it has completely neglected the journalistic community. He asserted that the budget presented in the Assembly recently stands as clear evidence of the severe discrimination shown toward journalists' welfare. He termed it appalling that the budget contained absolutely no mention of journalists' welfare—not even a single word regarding their well-being. He expressed deep concern that, despite two years having passed since the government came to power, it has failed to issue even basic new accreditation cards or health cards to journalists. Furthermore, he alleged that there is absolutely no discussion regarding the allocation of housing plots for journalists, and accused the government of evading its responsibility to provide these plots by using a Supreme Court verdict as a pretext. He criticized the fact that a Governing Council has not yet been constituted for the Media Academy, and pointed out that while retired journalists receive pensions in many other states, not a single individual in our state is currently receiving one. He lashed out at the administration for completely stifling small and medium-sized newspapers and periodicals, noting that advertisement bills have gone unpaid for the past two years. He termed it appalling that numerous small and medium-sized publications—operating with valid RNI and PRGI registrations—are being denied empanelment, and are not even being issued accreditation cards. Mamidi Somayya strongly condemned Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, asserting that he has failed to fulfill a single promise made to journalists during the last elections; furthermore, he accused the Chief Minister of adopting a discriminatory and negligent attitude by failing to take any measures for the welfare of journalists. In protest against this negligent stance, he issued a call to journalists across the state to participate in large numbers in the "Chalo Hyderabad – I&PR Office" protest program scheduled for the 25th of this month, and to ensure its resounding success.

AISF Protests Against 'Inadequate' Allocation to Education in State Budget



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, March 22, (Indian chronicle):“Protesting the low allocation to the education sector in the State Budget, the All India Students Federation (AISF) staged a demonstration and burnt copies of the budget at Uppal Depot Dharna Chowk on Sunday. Speaking on the occasion, AISF Medchal–Malkajgiri district secretary MD Anwar alleged that the Congress government had neglected the education sector by allocating insufficient funds. He criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who also holds the education portfolio, for failing to fulfill election promises regarding education funding. Anwar pointed out that out of the total budget of ₹3.24 lakh crore, only ₹26,674 crore was allocated to the education sector, which accounts for just 8.22%. He said the increase of ₹3,566 crore compared to the previous budget—just 1.18%—was inadequate for the development of education. He further stated that the Congress party had promised to allocate 15% of the budget to education in its manifesto, but failed to honor that commitment even in its third budget. He alleged that the budget speech lacked clarity on strengthening primary and higher education and made no substantial commitments toward the development of government universities, except for allocating ₹1,000 crore to Osmania University. Anwar criticized the government for not announcing new universities in district headquarters such as Khammam and Adilabad, and for failing to specify financial allocations for proposed initiatives like 105 integrated residential schools and Telangana Public Schools. He also expressed concern over the lack of dedicated funds for improving infrastructure in government schools,

KGBVs, gurukuls, model schools, minority institutions, and junior and degree colleges. He said there was no mention of increasing mess charges for welfare hostel students or constructing permanent buildings for institutions currently operating in rented premises. While welcoming schemes like the breakfast program and the proposed mid-day meal scheme in junior colleges, he stressed the need for proper implementation. He highlighted that pending fee reimbursement and scholarship dues amount to ₹9,300 crore, whereas only ₹4,343 crore was allocated in the budget, leaving a significant gap. Anwar also noted that several promises made in the Congress manifesto—including distribution of laptops to students, electric scooters for girl students, ₹5 lakh education assurance cards, free internet access to households, and ₹10,000 monthly fellowships for research scholars—were not addressed in the budget. He further criticized the absence of any concrete plan or allocation for establishing international schools in every mandal. Drawing comparisons with the previous BRS government, he said expectations were high that the current administration would prioritize education, but alleged that it too had failed to do so. AISF leaders demanded an immediate revision of the budget to increase allocations for the education sector and ensure meaningful development. District leaders Harish, Aravind, Akash, Sai Kishore, Suresh Vamsi and others participated in the protest.

BALCONY SLAB COLLAPSES, FATHER AND SON DIE

“Hyderabad” A tragic incident occurred under the jurisdiction of Panjagutta Police Station in Hyderabad. The collapse of a balcony slab, which claimed two lives, has caused deep sorrow locally. “Dwarka Prasad, the owner of Srivatsa Apartment in Methodist Colony, Kundan Bagh, had undertaken balcony extension work on the third floor. He had called Devidas (56) and his son Vivek (32) from Sitarambagh to the house to discuss. “While the three were standing on the third-floor balcony discussing the work to be done, the balcony slab suddenly collapsed. As a result, all three fell down at once. In the accident, Devidas and Vivek died on the spot. The apartment owner Dwarka Prasad was seriously injured and shifted to hospital. Police registered case and shifted bodies to Gandhi hospital for postmortem.



QATAR HELICOPTER CRASHED SIX DEAD

“Hyderabad” A tragic accident occurred when a military helicopter belonging to Qatar crashed into sea waters, killing six crew members while one remains missing. Authorities have launched intensive search operations for the missing person. “The Qatar Ministry of Defense, in a statement on X, said that the accident was caused by a technical malfunction in the helicopter, which was on duty. ‘A Qatari helicopter crashed into the country’s waters due to a technical issue while on a routine mission,’ the statement said. “According to the Qatar Ministry of Interior, there were a total of seven crew members on board at the time of the accident. The bodies of six have been recovered. Special teams from the Coast Guard, Border Security, and Internal Security forces are conducting extensive search operations for the missing seventh person. “As the incident occurred amid tense conditions in the Middle East, several suspicions were raised. However, officials clarified that it was purely an accident caused by a technical fault and that there was no hostile action involved.
