

Domestic cylinders It is illegal to use it in hotels .Wanaparth District Collector Adarsh Surabhi District Civil Supply Officer Kashi Vishwanath

“Wanaparth Correspondent Indian Chronicle” “Officials said on the occasion that it is a crime to use domestic cylinders used for house hold purposes in business establishments and hotel restaurants. District Civil Supplies Officer Kashi Vishwanath warned that strict action will be taken against such cases. On Monday, District Civil Supplies Officer Kashi Vishwanath along with his team conducted surprise inspections in several hotels in Wanaparth town as per the orders of the District Collector. On this occasion, in the hotels, During the inspections, it was found that LPG gas cylinders intended for domestic use were being used for commercial purposes, hotels, restaurants and bars. A total of 19 domestic cylinders were seized as part of the inspections. Civil Supply officials warned that using domestic cylinders for commercial purposes is against the law and strict action will be taken against such people. Hotel owners are advised to use only commercial cylinders and legal action will be taken against those who violate the rules. He clarified that the officials are committed to properly managing the gas supply system so that the public does not face any problems. District Civil Supply officials have issued warnings to commercial establishments, hotels, restaurants, bars and various commercial establishments that strict action will be taken against any business entity that uses domestic cylinders.



Let's make Wanaparth district a tuberculosis-free district

District Collector Adarsh Surabhi made the call

“Wanaparth Correspondent Indian Chronicle” “District Collector Adarsh Surabhi and District Medical Health Officer Sainath Reddy said on this occasion that Wanaparth district should be made a tuberculosis-free district. Medicines for tuberculosis are available, and if you take medicines regularly for six months and eat nutritious food, tuberculosis can be completely cured, said District Collector Adarsh Surabhi. On Tuesday, on the occasion of World Tuberculosis Eradication Day, under the auspices of the District Medical Health Department, the Collector flagged off the 100-day campaign vehicle at the local TB prevention center. In this 100-day program, medical staff will go to villages and conduct free mobile X-rays and smear tests on people with TB symptoms and provide free medicines to patients with TB. A program to identify tuberculosis patients has already been organized in the district and a program to provide free medicines and nutritional food to tuberculosis patients for six months has been initiated. As part of this program, the Collector distributed nutritional food kits provided by the government to tuberculosis patients.

These kits include food items like wheat flour, good oil, jaggery, groundnuts and pulses. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that TB is a disease and the government has recognized it from the beginning. Free medicines provided by (6) If used regularly for months Cure TB and never get it again in your life It will be over. A month, two. It will take months to heal. If you stop taking the medication, it will take a few days. They said the disease would come back.

That's why Patients should be careful for six months. Taking medication and taking nutritional supplements Tuberculosis can be completely eradicated due to District Medical Health Officer said. Dr. Sainath Reddy, local Tahsildar Ramesh Reddy, medical staff and others participated.

Ravindra Sagar Condemns Arrest of BJP State President

TB-free district is the goal :District Collector Pravinya 100-day 'TB Mukta Bharat Abhiyan v2.0' begins with awareness rally in Sangareddy

"District Collector Praveenya called on everyone in the society to act responsibly and become partners in the achievement of a TB-free Telangana. "On the occasion of World Tuberculosis Prevention Day, "District Collector Dr. Praveenya flagged off an awareness rally at Pothireddipalli Sub-Center in Sangareddy town on Tuesday and launched the 100-day 'TB Mukta Bharat Abhiyan v2.0' program as part of the Public Governance Progress Plan. "Speaking on the occasion, the District Collector said that TB is a completely curable disease and it is possible to eradicate it by raising awareness among the people. He said that the central and state governments have taken special measures with the aim of "TB Mukta Bharat". He said that a 100-day special action plan is being implemented in the district till May 15. "He said that the areas with high TB incidence have already been identified in the district, door-to-door surveys have been conducted within the health sub-centers and special screening tests are being conducted for those above 14 years of age, pregnant women and women suffering from anemia. He said that the results will be provided immediately through mobile X-ray machines equipped with modern technology and immediate treatment and free medicines will be provided to those in need. "He advised the people to contact the nearest government hospital as soon as they see symptoms of TB and to take full treatment without neglecting it. "Students, health staff and ASHA workers participated in this rally in large numbers and raised slogans on TB prevention and created awareness among the people. "District Medical and Health Officer Dr. Vasant Rao, District Tuberculosis Prevention Officer Dr. Arunakumari, medical staff, college students, other officials and others participated in this program.

BJP Telangana hailed Supreme Court Verdict on SC Reservations



Hyderabad, Mar 24 :: BJP Telangana State President N Ramchander Rao today welcomed the apex court's verdict on Scheduled Caste (SC) reservation and constitutional rights to those who have converted to other religions. In a statement, Ramchander Rao hailed the apex court's decision to uphold a previous ruling by the Andhra Pradesh High Court, calling it a "historic victory for the spirit of the Constitution." Rao emphasized that the SC reservations envisioned by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar were specifically designed for the social upliftment of marginalized sections within the Hindu fold. He noted that the Supreme Court has rightly clarified that claiming the same social status and benefits after conversion is unconstitutional. The State President pointed out that for a long time, some individuals have been undergoing religious conversions while illegally retaining SC certificates to claim reservation quotas. "This has caused grave injustice to genuine Dalit children. The Apex court's verdict will put an end to such irregularities and ensure justice for the truly eligible SC community," he stated. Taking a swipe at rival political parties, Rao remarked that the judgment serves as a "strong slap in the face" to those who encourage conversions and cre-



ate confusion surrounding reservations solely for vote-bank politics." Rao highlighted that numerous instances of individuals using SC certificates after conversion to illegally obtain government benefits have been reported in Telangana. He demanded that the State Government "open its eyes" and strictly implement the Supreme Court's verdict at the field level to protect the rights of eligible SCs. Reaffirming the party's stance, he said "It is the BJP's core ideology that constitutional benefits must reach the genuine beneficiaries and our struggle to protect the rights of Dalit brothers and sisters will continue relentlessly."

BJP CHIEF ASKED PARTY WORKERS TO VISIT VILLAGES AND EXPOSE STATE CONG GOVT

Hyderabad, Mar 24:: BJP State President N Ramchander Rao today asserted that the BJP is an ideological and cadre-based party and every worker must be prepared to take the party's programs, ideology and discipline to the public. He said people of all walks of life including youth and women, joining in the BJP which is a visible reality at the field level, making a BJP government in Telangana a certainty in the coming days. 30,000 Crore Contribution from Peddapalli, Peanuts in Return: MP Vamsi Krishna Criticises Centre

“New Delhi: Peddapalli MP Gaddam Vamsi Krishna strongly criticised the Centre in Parliament while speaking on the Finance Bill on Tuesday, pointing out that Telangana contributes heavily in taxes but receives very little in return. “Sir, we contribute a huge amount in terms of taxes to the centre, but unfortunately, for every rupee we contribute to the centre, we hardly get back 30 paise back to the state,” Vamsi said. “Focusing on his own constituency, he highlighted the massive contribution of NTPC, RFCL and Singareni. “Sir, if you look into Peddapalli, in my constituency, we have NTPC, RFCL, Singareni. In total, we contribute from 25,000 crores to 30,000 crores, sir. But what we get back from the Centre is only 100 to 150 crores, which is equivalent to peanuts, sir. This is not fair.” Vamsi listed several long-pending demands that have been ignored by the Centre. “We have requested the Agricultural University rightfully. Similarly we have requested for a Mining University, we have requested for an ESI Hospital for a lot of Singareni workers, but the Centre is punishing us by not giving a single project fund,” he said. “He specifically mentioned the repeated requests for increasing the pension of Singareni workers to ₹10,000 per month, which have not been addressed. He contrasted this with the Centre’s generosity towards corporates and foreign com-

panies. “But for the tax holidays and data centres, for foreign companies, you are giving lakhs of crores for tax relief,” Vamsi pointed out. “The MP also raised the controversial shifting of a semiconductor project to Andhra Pradesh. “Sir, we wanted a semiconductor facility in Peddapalli with 100 crore, but at the last minute, unjustly, it went to Andhra, and established it there. This is not fair,” he said, adding that they will continue to fight for it. “On tourism and cultural projects in the constituency, Vamsi said, “For tourism and cultural development, in Dharmapuri, there is Koti Lingala temple. Then there is Manthani Ramagiri fort, there is Buddhist Stupa in Peddapalli. We asked funds for these, but even then, not a single rupee was given by the government.” Referring to the MNREGA scheme, Vamsi said, “There is a wonderful scheme, sir, whereby he will earn 200 rupees a day. But after this government came, for the last 10 years, even after spending 7 lakh crores on the scheme, only 200 rupees was given to the people. This is a big scam.” He concluded by accusing the government of favouring the rich while neglecting the poor. “Democracy is by the people, of the people, for the people, but this government is taking decisions against the people of our country, against the poor of our country.”

To prevent cervical cancer in women, HPV vaccine is currently being given free of cost to 14-15 year old teenage girls. If girls take this vaccine just once, they will never get cancer in their lives. The medical community should make parents and teenage girls aware of this important vaccine and ensure that every teenage girl is given the safe HPV vaccine to protect them from cervical cancer. Staff were advised. Earlier, the Collector had his CBP Hb1 blood tests done at the government hospital. District Medical Health Officer Dr. Sainath Reddy, Hospital Superintendent Dr. Aruna Kumari, Dr. Parimala, other medical staff, Telangana MIDC Assistant Engineer Shiva and others were with the Collector.



Centre's Retrospective Tax Assault on Aam Aadmi, Anti-Farmer Mismanagement & Anti-Dalit Bias Exposed: MP Vamsi Krishna

“New Delhi: Peddapalli MP Gaddam Vamsi Krishna launched a sharp attack on the Centre during the debate on the Finance Bill in Parliament on Tuesday, exposing the retrospective tax amendments that are harassing the common man, doubled imports from China despite the “Atma Nirbhar” slogan, and the government’s anti-farmer and anti-Dalit policies.” “If you take a look at retrospective tax amendments, it is on record that the BJP has said that we will not take retrospective tax decisions, but according to section 148, which was amended in 2021-2022, the power given to the AO was seized,” Vamsi said. “He pointed out that this led to more than 20 lakh invalid tax notices being issued across the country, all of which were struck down by High Courts and the Supreme Court. “All the AO’s across the country filed approximately more than 20 lakh invalid tax notices, sir, and all these cases were struck down in the High Court, but the assessment officers have defied the law of faceless assessments, and have filed cases to harass the Aam Aadmi, sir,” he added. “He also highlighted the severe

mismanagement at the RFCL Ramagundam fertiliser plant in his constituency, where production is stuck at only 9 lakh metric tonnes instead of the targeted 12 lakh metric tonnes. “We have given several representations which have been rejected,” he said. “Turning to Dalit issues, Vamsi said, “This government is anti-Dalit. I am a modern day dalit, I am educated and aware. I see the discrimination and injustice against my brothers and sisters.” “He pointed out that out of one lakh odd startups in the country, very few are led by Dalit founders. “There are 1 lakh startups in this country. But how many Dalit founders and how many networks are backing this Dalit sir,” he asked. Vamsi demanded concrete support: “I would like to end by asking for tax relief for dalit founders, dalit employees. If you employ more Dalits, Corporates should be given some incentives and capital access to Dalits to improve and push us forward.”

He noted that multiple representations had been submitted to the government under his leadership, urging the introduction of such legislation, and expressed happiness that the cabinet had acted on those demands. “Save Every Drop, Secure the Future” Harvest Rain, Protect Groundwater: Collector Urges Public



“Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), March 24,” District Collector K. Haritha emphasized that every drop of rainwater must be conserved and used judiciously to ensure sustainable water resources and overcome drought conditions. “She was speaking at the World Water Day 2026 programme jointly organized by the Groundwater Department and Samruddhi Society at Jambuga village in Kagaznagar mandal on Tuesday. “Addressing the gathering, the Collector noted that several countries across the world are purifying and utilizing seawater, whereas in our country, people are fortunate to access naturally available clean water through borewells, wells, and hand pumps. She stressed the need to conserve every drop of rainwater and increase groundwater levels. “She suggested the construction of check dams across streams, water harvesting pits, and recharge pits near borewells to facilitate rainwater percolation into the ground, thereby improving groundwater levels. This, she said, would help avoid difficulties related to irrigation and drinking water. “The Collector pointed out that despite receiving more than normal rainfall in recent years, the lack of proper water conservation and recharge efforts has led to a decline in groundwater levels, resulting in water shortages. She added that numerous public grievances are being received requesting the sanction of hand pumps. “To address this issue, she urged the construction of rainwater harvesting pits in every household. Recalling the past, she said that women once had to travel long distances to fetch water, whereas today the government is providing safe drinking water to every household. She called upon the public to utilize this facility responsibly. “On the occasion, a farmer was felicitated. “District Groundwater Department officials, District Agriculture Officer Venkat, Horticulture Officer Nadeen, Mission Bhagiratha EE Siddique, AD Sambasiva Rao, farmers, and others participated in the programme.

He took her out and raped her. When the girl was not found, her parents went in search and found the girl crying near the hill. When the girl narrated the incident to her mother, the mother immediately filed a complaint at the Gopalpet police station on 27-02-2020. A comprehensive investigation was conducted under the leadership of Gopalpet SI Raman Goud and the then CI Surya Nayak, who registered the case, recorded the victim's state-

ment, arrested the accused and sent him to remand. A charge sheet was filed in the court. The current CI Ratnam, SI Jagan, the court hearing officer and staff coordinated with the witnesses to strengthen the case. In this case, after the public prosecutor Srinivasachari effectively presented arguments, the court concluded that the crime was proven and imposed a severe sentence.
