# Banned Alavi nets seized in Vellathur village – Andhra fishermen arrested

## Police raid shocks poaching gangs - accused on the run



“Wanaparthy correspondent Indian Chronicle”“The police have initiated strict action against fishermen who are illegally fishing with banned gillnets in the Krishna River catchment areas in various villages under Chinnambavi mandal in Wanaparthy district. Police conducted a surprise raid on the outskirts of Vellaturu village in Chinnambavi mandal of Wanaparthy district at 4:30 am on Sunday and stopped illegal hunting. Acting on reliable information, District CI Ratnam and Sub-Inspector Raman Goud along with police personnel seized two huge banned Alavi nets in this raid. One accused escaped in this raid, while the other was caught by the police. The arrested person is Raju (father: Kashinath), from Kakinada region of Andhra Pradesh. Police said that the accused was remanded and will be produced in the Wanaparthy court on Monday. Alivi nets, a threat to fisheries, catch and destroy everything from small to large fish at once. Officials warned that this will severely reduce the number of fish in the future, affecting the livelihood of fishermen. For this reason, the government has completely banned such nets. Despite repeated warnings against illegal fishing at night, the police found that some fishermen continue to fish secretly in the Krishna River at night. Investigation revealed that the caught fish are being transported to other states. Gangs of brokers It is reported that brokers from Seemandhra regions are forming their gangs in the coastal areas of the Krishna River and encouraging illegal fishing. Tuni, Kovvur, Rajahmundry, Fishermen from Gajuwaka, Vijayawada, Visakhapatnam areas as well as Odisha and Jharkhand states are being brought in and provided with facilities and are continuing fishing with banned nets. Tents on the river bank, continuous fishing It was found that illegal activities were being carried out by setting up temporary tents on the river banks of villages like Gudem, Peddamarur, Chinnamarur, Chellepadu. Strict action will continue. SI Raman Goud clarified that legal action will be taken against fishermen who did not heed the repeated warnings against the use of banned Alivi nets. ## Malkajgiri Traffic Police Drunk Driving Drive: 118 Booked

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, March 29 (Indian chronicle):“Malkajgiri Traffic Police conducted a special drunk driving drive over the weekend, booking 118 offenders. Among them, 96 were



two-wheeler riders, 4 were three-wheeler drivers, and 18 were four-wheeler drivers, while no cases were registered against heavy vehicles. Based on Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) levels, 103 offenders recorded levels between 36 mg/100 ml and 200 mg/100 ml, 14 offenders between 201 mg/100 ml and 300 mg/100 ml, and 1 offender between 301 mg/100 ml and 550 mg/100 ml. All offenders will be produced before the court. Police stated that drunk driving is a serious offence,

and those causing fatal accidents under the influence of alcohol will be booked under Section 105 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, which carries a maximum punishment of up to 10 years imprisonment along with a fine. In the past week (March 22–28, 2026), a total of 492 drunk driving cases were disposed of in courts, with 30 offenders receiving fine and jail sentence, 7 receiving fine and community service, and 455 receiving fine only.

## Students should spend time on playgrounds instead of getting immersed in cell phones,” said Professor Dr. Venkata Krishna Reddy

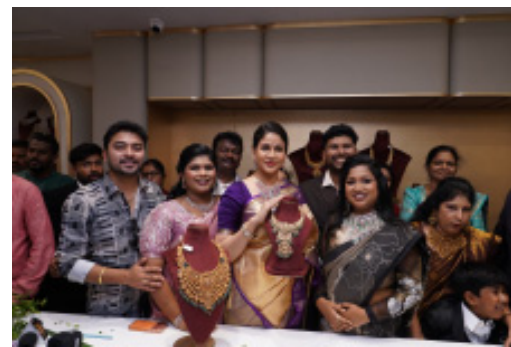

# Uttam Kumar Reddy Vows Accelerated implementation of Krishna Basin projects in Assembly

“Hyderabad, March 29” Stating that the Congress Government is accorded the highest priority and focused attention to all Krishna Basin projects so that every scheme is completed strictly as per the promised schedule, the Minister for Irrigation and Civil Supplies, N Uttam Kumar Reddy on Sunday explained that the delays in the implementation of irrigation projects owed to the very fact that the Congress government inherited massive debt burden. High cost borrowings of previous BRS regime yielded dismal benefits to the irrigation sector. “Intervening during the budget discussions, the minister exposed the systematic neglect under the previous BRS regime, which had spent Rs 1.81 lakh crore on irrigation but diverted the bulk to the now-failed Kaleshwaram project while leaving zero new ayacut under the Palamuru-Rangareddy lift scheme. “The BRS had created two special corporations to borrow Rs 97,000 crore at crippling high-cost, short-term rates, leaving the new government with an outstanding burden of Rs 82,000 crore (Rs 54,000 crore principal plus Rs 27,000 crore interest that continues to accrue). “Since taking charge, the Congress administration has already repaid Rs 41,000 crore principal and Rs 16,000 crore interest and is now replacing these expensive loans with soft, long-term, low-interest facilities to free up funds for actual works. “The current slow-down in project execution is not due to lack of priority but because of the enormous financial mess and wasteful expenditure left behind by the previous regime. “The people of Telangana deserve to know these figures so they can understand the true scale of the challenge. “The Congress Government is fully focused on delivering irrigation water to the farmers of the Krishna Basin and will fulfil its promises — including completion of the Dindi project while cleaning up the financial legacy of high-cost loans, he asserted. “The SLBC tunnel has long been a cherished dream of the people of Telangana, promising to transform irrigation and drinking water supply in the region. The project is progressing with a target completion and commissioning by June 2028. “Following the unfortunate roof collapse in February 2025, which resulted in the tragic loss of workers’ lives, comprehensive relief and rescue operations were carried out. The government and contractors have since adopted the latest available tunnelling technologies and advanced methodologies from around the world. “All possible safety precautions, including scientific monitoring, observational techniques, and enhanced protocols, are being strictly implemented to prioritize worker safety and prevent any recurrence. Work has resumed with renewed focus and determination to deliver this vital infrastructure project safely

and efficiently. “In a major boost, the Minister said the Government has extended a special package of Rs 5,000 crore exclusively for land acquisition, rehabilitation and resettlement issues across irrigation projects, with the entire amount to be released by 2 June 2026. “On the Dindi Lift Irrigation Project specifically, he noted that the BRS had spent nearly Rs 5,000 crore without even finalising the source or headworks. The Congress Government has since finalised both, sanctioned the Rs 1,800-crore Yadula-to-Dindi link, called tenders and is set to commence work immediately, ensuring the scheme delivers 30 TMC (0.5 TMC per day for 60 days) exclusively for the erstwhile Nalgonda district covering Munugode and Devarakonda constituencies, with full completion targeted within the next two years. “Civil Supplies Sector “Sanna Biyyam a landmark initiative “Shifting to civil supplies, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy said that the free fine rice distribution in the state was a landmark initiative towards achieving total food security in independent India. “The Telangana government launched the Sanna Biyyam (fine rice) scheme on March 30, 2025. Under this ambitious programme, the state provides six kilograms of premium-quality fine rice free of cost every month to approximately 3.39 crore beneficiaries, covering around 86 per cent of Telangana’s population. “Hailed as the largest food security programme by any state government in the history of independent India, the scheme marks a significant upgrade in the Public Distribution System by replacing coarser rice with superior ‘sanna biyyam’, ensuring better nutrition and dignity for the beneficiaries. “Acknowledging the genuine difficulties being faced by the public on the LPG front and placed the facts before the Assembly with complete transparency. He clarified that there is absolutely no shortage of domestic 14-kg cylinders, as the Central Government and oil companies are releasing supplies strictly as per the average monthly demand. However, a real shortage does exist in commercial 19-kg cylinders and auto gas, caused entirely by the prevailing international crisis. “The supplies had dipped to just 20 per cent in recent weeks but have now improved to 40 per cent following continuous coordination between the State Government, oil marketing companies and the Centre. “The Minister informed the House that both the oil companies and the Central Government have given written assurances to help eliminate the commercial cylinder shortage and restore full supplies at the earliest, and the Telangana Government is monitoring the situation on a daily basis to ensure quick resolution. ## Public Cooperation is Key to Road Safety: Inspector Srihari

# CPI Leader Demands Opening of Maize, Paddy Procurement Centers and Release of Sagar Water

“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau March 29,(Indian Chronicle):“CPI District Secretary Dandi Suresh has demanded the immediate opening of maize procurement centers, stating that farmers are suffering heavy losses due to the lack of remunerative prices. He urged the government to procure maize through Markfed at a support price of ₹2,400 per quintal. Suresh pointed out that in the absence of Markfed procurement centers, private traders are attempting to purchase maize from farmers at very low prices, causing losses of ₹800 to ₹1,000 per quintal. He made these remarks during the CPI district committee meeting held on Sunday at Giriprasad Bhavan, under the chairmanship of Jagarlamudi Ranjith. Speaking at the second day of the council meeting, Suresh emphasized that it is the government’s responsibility to ensure fair prices for agricultural produce. He noted that due to good profits last year, maize cultivation was carried out in nearly 2.5 lakh acres in Khammam district. With the Yasangi harvest season beginning, he urged the government to immediately open paddy procurement centers and ensure smooth procurement without any restrictions. Suresh also appealed to the government to release water through the Nagarjuna Sagar Left Canal until April 30, as crops in the ayacut area are at various stages of growth. He warned that farmers who have adopted regulated irrigation schedules may face serious difficulties if water supply is interrupted and demanded continuous water release from April 1 to April 30. Highlighting rural employment issues, he said that lack of work is forcing people to migrate to urban areas. He called for immediate implementation of works under the VBG Ram Ji scheme in rural areas to provide employ-



ment. He also raised concerns about objections being made regarding attendance in employment works and demanded that jobs be provided without interruptions and wages be credited promptly to workers’ accounts. Suresh expressed gratitude to party workers and leadership for successfully organizing the party’s centenary closing meeting. He stated that despite opposition parties uniting against CPI in municipal elections, people supported the party, though it lost in some areas due to various reasons. He stressed the need to focus on strengthening the party structure from the village level to the district level. The meeting was attended by CPI National Council Member Hemanth Rao, State Disciplinary Committee Chairman Mohammed Maulana, and District Assistant Secretary Jitender Reddy, among others.

# Delhi riots case: Sharjeel Imam to surrender at Tihar as interim bail expires



New Delhi: Student activist Sharjeel Imam is set to surrender before Tihar Jail authorities on Monday upon the expiry of the 10-day interim bail granted to him by a Delhi court in connection with the alleged larger conspiracy behind the 2020 North-East Delhi riots.

Imam had been granted interim bail by the Karkardooma Court from March 20 to March 30 to attend his younger brother's wedding and to take care of his ailing mother, subject to stringent conditions.

Additional Sessions Judge Sameer Bajpai had allowed temporary relief, directing Imam to furnish a personal bond of Rs 50,000 along with two sureties of the like amount. The court had also imposed strict restrictions, including a prohibition on interacting with the media or using social media during the interim bail period.

The court had further directed that Imam would only meet his family members, relatives and friends and not con-

tact any witness or any person connected with the case

He was also asked to keep his mobile phone active at all times and share the number with the investigating officer. During the interim bail period, Imam was permitted to remain either at his residence or at the venues of the wedding ceremonies, as specified in his application.

Imam, who has been in custody for over five years, had sought interim bail citing his role as the sole sibling responsible for managing the wedding arrangements and supporting his family, particularly his ailing mother.

The prosecution had opposed the plea, contending that his presence was not indispensable for the ceremonies and that adequate arrangements had already been made by the family. It also argued that there was no emergent medical condition necessitating his release.

Imam is among several student activists who have been booked under the UAPA and various provisions of the

According to the Delhi Police, the violence was not a spontaneous outbreak but the culmination of a premeditated conspiracy involving mobilisation, road blockades and coordinated protests aimed at disrupting normal life and drawing international attention during the visit of then US President Donald Trump.

Earlier this year, the Supreme Court dismissed the bail pleas of Imam and co-accused Umar Khalid in the case, holding that the prosecution material, taken cumulatively and at face value, disclosed reasonable grounds for believing that the accusations against them were prima facie true, thereby attracting the statutory embargo on bail under Section 43D(5) of the UAPA.
