

## Resolve Prajavani Petitions Promptly: District Collector Anudeep Durishetty



“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau March 30, (Indian Chronicle): “District Collector Anudeep Durishetty has directed district officials to resolve Prajavani petitions without delay. “During the Prajavani program held on Monday at the Collectorate conference hall, the District Collector, along with Additional Collectors Dr. P. Srija and P. Srinivasa Reddy, received petitions from the public. “A resident, P. Nagul Meera from Proddutur village in Chintakani mandal, submitted a petition stating that stray dogs have been roaming in the village for the past week, creating fear among residents. The Collector instructed the MPDO/MPO to take immediate action. “Residents of Lallathanda, a hamlet in Kamepalli mandal, complained that government land in their village was being encroached upon and illegally sold. They requested protection of the land for government development activities. The Collector directed the Tahsildar to take necessary action. “People from Road No. 13, Sriram Nagar in Khammam Corporation, requested the construction of a CC road, side drainage, and sanctioning of a Mission Bhagiratha pipeline. The Collector instructed the Municipal Corporation Commissioner to address the issue. “D. Shekhar Naik, Secretary of the Dhadi Lambadi Rights Protection Committee, submitted a petition requesting changes to the design of a proposed service road and drainage canal linked to a retaining wall. This is to protect ancestral burial grounds of the Dhadi Lambadi community near the Munneru river in Khammam rural area. The Collector directed the Khammam RDO to examine the matter and take appropriate action. “P. Krishnamurthy from Burhanpur in Khammam Urban mandal stated that he has

been suffering from paralysis for the past ten years and had applied for a disability pension, which has not yet been sanctioned. He requested approval of his pension. The Collector instructed the PD, DRDO to take necessary action. “District Revenue Officer A. Padmashri, ZP CEO Diksha Raina, district officials, and Collectorate AO K. Srinivasa Rao, among others, participated in the program.

## Tight Arrangements for Open School Examinations: District Collector Anudeep Durishetty

A review meeting was held at the Collectorate conference hall with concerned officials regarding the conduct of Telangana Open School Society (TOSS) examinations. The meeting was attended by the District Collector along with Additional Collectors Dr. P. Srija and P. Srinivasa Reddy. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that strong arrangements should be made in Khammam district for conducting SSC and Intermediate Open School examinations from April 20 to April 27. He directed officials to ensure drinking water and other basic facilities at all examination centers. “Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Dr. P. Srija stated that in Khammam district, Open 10th class exams will be conducted for 1,594 candidates and Open Intermediate exams for 1,755 candidates across 8 examination centers. “She instructed that Section 163 BNS be imposed at exam centers and nearby photocopy (xerox) centers be closed. Adequate police security should be arranged for transportation of question papers, and police personnel must be deployed at every examination center. “She also directed that medical camps be set up with ANMs at the centers and that bus services be arranged conveniently for students. “District Revenue Officer A. Padmashri, ZP CEO Diksha Raina, TOSS District Coordinator K. Mangapathi Rao, Superintendent Chava Srinivasa Rao, District Medical and Health Officer Dr. Ramarao, police officials, NPDCL authorities, and other concerned officials participated in the meeting.

# Opposition Trade Unions Demand Immediate Restoration of Repealed Labour Laws; Nationwide Black Day on April 1

“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau March 30, (Indian Chronicle): “Khammam Urban: Leaders of opposition trade unions have demanded the immediate restoration of 29 repealed labour laws. They announced that a nationwide black day would be observed on April 1 under the aegis of opposition unions, urging the repeal of the four new labour codes introduced by the central government. “The joint meeting of opposition trade unions was held at the AITUC office in Giriprasad Bhavan, Khammam, under the chairmanship of AITUC district president Gade Lakshmi Narayana. During the meeting, opposition leaders stated that out of 44 labour laws achieved over the past 100 years by workers’ struggles, 29 laws were completely repealed and replaced with four new labour codes by the Modi government, which favor employers over workers. “They highlighted that crucial labour laws, including the Industrial Disputes Act, the Trade Union Registration Act 1926, the Industrial Employment (Standing Orders) Act 1946, and the Industrial Disputes Act 1947, were repealed and replaced with the Industrial Relations Code 2022. While all provisions appear to be included in the new code, they are difficult to implement in practice. “The leaders expressed concern that the Modi government intends to promote fixed-term jobs without permanent employment, citing schemes like Agneepath and Agniveer as initiating this approach. They also criticized BJP-ruled states such as Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, and Karnataka for approving a 12-hour work system under the guidance of industrialists. They claimed that this policy led to public outrage in Karnataka, resulting in the loss of power by the ruling party. “Opposition trade unions, following the call of the Central Trade Union, announced that a black day would be observed across India on April 1 against the Modi government’s anti-labour policies. As part of this, a protest block will be held at Ambedkar Center at 10 a.m. on Wednesday under the aegis of opposition trade unions. “The meeting was attended by AITUC district general secretary Thota Ramanjaneyulu, working president Ravi Shivarama Krishna, CITU district general secretary T. Vishnuvardhan, INTUC town working president Kukkala Ramakrishna, vice presidents Siddela Nagesh, TSUI state leaders CV Pullayya, K. Srinivas, IFU district president Subani, and district leaders Shankar, among others.



## Comprehensive arrangements for Kondagattu Sri Chinna Hanuman Jayanthi festival

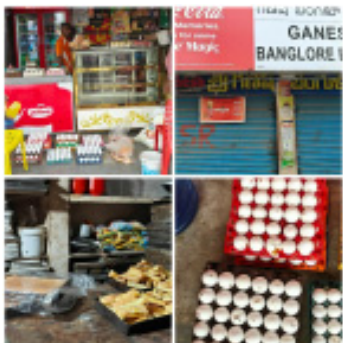
Major confusion in PACS accounts – lakhs of rupees missing  
CPI Mandal Secretary Pathi Ananth Reddy demands a full-scale audit

“Devulapally Srinivas Warangal Bureau (Narasampet), March 30 (Indian Chronicle): CPI Mandal Secretary Pathi Ananth Reddy has exposed sensational facts that there are serious inconsistencies in the accounts of Chennaraopet Primary Agricultural Cooperative Society (PACS). In a press note released on Monday, it was stated that there has been a complete loss of transparency in the transactions related to the financial year 2024-2025 and lakhs of rupees have been misappropriated. “?18.37 crore transactions... but doubts over profits. According to the annual accounts announced by the society, a total of ?18.37 crore transactions were made, while a net profit of ?57.54 lakh was recorded. However, Ananth Reddy expressed surprise that these profit figures are not clear and that the mere presentation of amounts without providing complete details in the income section raises suspicions. “He alleged that interest income on loans, income from agricultural services, deposits and share capital details were not disclosed properly. ““Golmaal’ in petrol bank”— Where did the income go? ““The CPI alleged that there was a huge golmaal in the transactions of petrol banks run by the association. It was stated that the daily sales details, expenses and balances were not recorded properly and an attempt was being made to hide the actual income. “There are allegations that there are huge discrepancies between the income and expenses from the sale of petrol and diesel. “Corruption in fresh water accounts – loss to members... “It was revealed in the press note that irregularities had also taken place in the fresh water supply transactions run by the association. They said that the water supply costs were shown in excess and were actually being operated at a lower cost. This discrepancy led to misuse of funds, suspicious expenses in the godown repair expenses “He alleged that high amounts were shown in the name of repairs to the godowns of the society, but in reality the work was not done to that extent. He said that the lack of clear details of the repair costs and the irregularity of the bills raise suspicions. “Confusion in costs – have the real figures been hidden? “He clarified that not only were the salaries of employees and administrative expenses shown in excess, but the details of the interest paid on bank loans were not properly disclosed, and an attempt was being made to hide the real figures by showing some expenses in total rather than separately. “Auditor is a bridge to corrupt practices” – “Pathi Ananth Reddy alleged that the nodal officer and auditor are providing silent support to the corruption taking place in the society. They said that they have caused corruption to increase by not noticing or ignoring the errors in the accounts. “Demand for a full-scale independent audit. “The CPI demanded that a full-scale independent audit be conducted on the PACS accounts with full details disclosed in today’s 68th society meeting. They demanded that all the accounts be made public without any doubts in the use of public money and that an inquiry be conducted with high-level officials. They demanded that strict action be taken against those responsible for the confusion in the accounts and immediate action be taken against the nodal officer and auditor. “These allegations made by the CPI leadership on the Chenna Raopet PACS accounts have led to a heated debate locally. It has now become interesting whether the society organizers will clarify these allegations or go ahead with a full-scale audit.



## Food safety violations found at Karimnagar bakery; licence suspended

Rotten eggs, insect-infested ingredients detected during inspection in Rekurthi.



Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, March 30: Food Safety officials on Monday suspended the licence of a bakery in Rekurthi area of Karimnagar after an inspection revealed serious violations of hygiene and food safety norms. The action followed a complaint that an egg puff purchased from the Ganesh Bangalore Bakery emitted a foul smell. Acting swiftly, officials inspected the premises around 4 p.m. and found multiple irregularities in food preparation and storage. According to officials, rotten and broken eggs were being used in the preparation of cakes and egg puffs. The kitchen was found to be in an unhygienic condition, while insects were noticed in key ingredients such as refined flour (maida), cream and even in sugar syrup stored in the freezer. In the storage area, 14 trays containing about 420 broken eggs were detected, leading to a heavy presence of flies across the kitchen. Cakes worth around ?7,000, allegedly prepared using spoiled eggs, were also found on the premises. Officials immediately disposed of the contaminated stock, destroying food items valued at approximately ?9,000. The bakery’s FSSAI licence has been temporarily suspended, and it has been directed to cease operations until necessary corrective measures are undertaken. Authorities have also initiated adjudication proceedings under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, for violations of prescribed norms.

# CPI Launches "Door-to-Door" Campaign in Khammam District from April 1 for 10 Days

# Electricity Department Workers Hold Massive Protest in Khammam Under JAC

# Census Operations Must Be Conducted Efficiently: Bharati Holikeri, Director of Census

Furthermore, she instructed officials to ensure the smooth progression of the process by promptly resolving any technical glitches that may arise during the operation of the mobile application. It was directed that enumerators and supervisors be appointed on a Charge (Mandal) basis; specifically, one enumerator is to be assigned for every 300 households or a population of 750–800 individuals. Furthermore, instructions were issued to prepare Enumerator Blocks/

House Listing Blocks and to ensure the efficient discharge of duties at the field level. District Collector Anurag Jayanti and Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Bhaskar Rao participated in this video conference. The directions were conveyed during a video conference organised by the Central TB Elimination Division, New Delhi, in which Additional Collector Ashwini Tanaji Wakade, District Medical Officer Venkataramana, and District TB Control Officer Dr. Ravinder Reddy participated from the Collectorate.

Officials said that the 100-day TB testing campaign, which commenced in the district on March 24, is being implemented in 49 identified villages. The initiative aims to enhance early detection and curb the spread of the disease through focused screening.

Dr. Ravinder Reddy urged people experiencing symptoms suggestive of tuberculosis to avail themselves of free diagnostic services at government hospitals. He said that all necessary medicines, including costly drugs, are being provided free of charge under the government programme.
