“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 10, (Indian Chronicle): “It has been alleged that several corporate educational institutions in Khammam district are functioning in violation of government regulations. Even before exam results are announced, these institutions are reportedly attracting admissions by offering fee concessions and special offers, thereby misleading parents. In this context, representatives of the Sevalal Vidyarthi Sena submitted a memorandum to the District Education Officer (DEO) superintendent, demanding special inspections of all private and corporate educational institutions in the district. They requested strict action against institutions violating norms, including cancellation of recognition if necessary. They also urged authorities to immediately stop illegal summer classes. The memorandum was submitted under the leadership of Sevalal Vidyarthi Sena Khammam district president Bhukya Sai Kumar. District-wide extensive police inspections...: Police Commissioner

“Avnreddy Khammam Town Reporter April 10, (Indian Chronicle): “As part of crime control, the district police machinery is carrying out widespread inspections to curb illegal transportation and unlawful activities, said Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt. Police patrolling has been intensified in ATM centers, banks, and surrounding areas. Suspicious individuals and vehicles are being checked during midnight hours. “Similarly, to prevent illegal transportation of sand, ganja, and ration rice across neighboring state borders, the district police have intensified vehicle inspections. Officials have been instructed to register cases against lorries illegally transporting sand from neighboring states. Cases are also being filed against vehicles without valid documentation that violate transport department regulations, along with the imposition of fines. “In view of road accidents caused by drunk driving, drunk-and-drive checks are being conducted intensively. Cases are being registered against those caught. To prevent thefts, police officials are carrying out extensive inspections across all police station limits to monitor the movements of known offenders. “If suspicious individuals or vehicles are found, complete details are being collected and they are subsequently given clearance after verification.



Bheri Ramachander Yadav Extends Full Support to the 'BC Dharma Deeksha

Khammam: Centre trying to suppress voices questioning it



“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 10, (Indian Chronicle):“CPI (National Committee) member Hemantar Rao has alleged that the central government is attempting to silence those who question it. He said that cases are being registered by national investigation agencies against democratic voices by summoning them for inquiries. He made these remarks in a press statement issued on Friday. “He stated that summoning CPI (ML) Mass Line State Secretary Pothu Rangarao for inquiry is nothing but an attempt to stifle democratic voices. He said that questioning governments on public issues and exposing anti-people policies to raise awareness among people is the duty of left-wing forces, and no government has the authority to obstruct this responsibility. “Hemantar Rao questioned

whether those opposing the BJP and raising democratic concerns in the country are being branded as “urban Naxalites” and jailed. He remarked that those who were earlier hailed as patriots are now being labeled as urban Naxalites simply for questioning the government. “He further said that the communist movement has faced many threats and imprisonments over time, but it is only the Modi government that has instigated national agencies against opposition leaders without justification. He warned that the government will have to face consequences for such actions. “He said that the government's treatment of those working continuously among people for welfare and social development amounts to a violation of the right to freedom of expression. He alleged that the Modi government is favoring corporates and the wealthy while ignoring people's issues. “He also stated that the country is facing a complex situation due to war-like conditions, with visible direct and indirect impacts, yet the Prime Minister remains silent. He expressed concern that agreements between Modi and Trump could severely affect India's agriculture sector. “CPI district secretary Dandi Suresh demanded the withdrawal of the case registered by the NIA against Pothu Rangarao. District Collector Anudeep Durishetty has directed officials to ensure that 10,000 Indiramma houses are made ready for housewarming ceremonies by the end of this month and to implement a well-planned action strategy to achieve this target

“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 10, (Indian Chronicle):“He held a review meeting on the progress of Indiramma housing construction at the Collectorate meeting hall on Friday, along with Khammam Municipal Corporation Commissioner Abhishek Agastya and Additional Collector P. Srinivasa Reddy, with MPDOs, Tahsildars, and Housing Department officials. “During the meeting, the Collector stated that as part of the “Praja Palana – Pragathi Pranalika” programme, a target has been set to complete housewarming ceremonies for 10,000 houses in the district. He instructed officials to extend all necessary support to beneficiaries and take steps to achieve the target within the stipulated time. “He informed that slab work has been completed for 9,199 Indiramma houses in the district, while finishing work has been completed for 2,018 houses. He outlined a phase-wise plan for housewarming ceremonies: “By April 10: 1,439 houses “By April 17: 2,794 houses “By April 24: 2,794 houses “By April 30: Remaining 2,973 houses “The Collector also mentioned that in the first phase, 16,497 Indiramma houses were sanctioned. Of these, construction of 1,912 houses has not yet been started, 2,520 houses have been completed and housewarming ceremonies conducted, while the remaining houses are at various stages of construction. “He directed officials to initiate construction on a war footing for 311 houses sanctioned in Velugumatla and 101 houses sanctioned in various mandals. He emphasized that officials must ensure all necessary support is provided to beneficiaries, field-level officers remain active, and daily progress is monitored to ensure steady improvement in construction works. “He also instructed that continuous reviews should be conducted to closely monitor the progress of the works. “The review meeting was attended by Housing PD Bhukya Srinivas, MPDOs from various mandals, Tahsildars, Housing engineers, and other officials.



Mohammad Rajab remembered as immortal leader; call to uphold his ideals

He was elected as an MLA six times and consistently raised his voice in the Assembly for the welfare of the poor. “Suresh highlighted that the idea of the government constructing and providing houses for the poor was first proposed by Mohammad Rajab. Khammam: Findings of Judicial Fact-Finding Committee Released



“Avnreddy Khammam Town Reporter April 10, (Indian Chronicle):“A fact-finding committee headed by High Court advocate Shravan has released its report regarding the demolition of houses constructed by poor families on assigned land at Velugumatla, Khammam. “Committee chairman, retired High Court judge Justice Chandrakumar, said during the release of the report that the issue of demolition of houses built by the poor on assigned land is well known. He noted that following large-scale protests and hunger strikes organized by BC, SC, ST JAC and Jagruti organizations, the government had allotted house sites to 311 poor families at the same demolished location under the Indiramma housing scheme, and sanctioned houses for another 100 families in their respective villages. “To examine the extent of assigned land, the number of demolished houses, and the reasons for declaring some beneficiaries ineligible, a fact-finding committee was formed under the leadership of retired High Court judge Justice Chandrakumar by BC-ST JAC and Jagruti organizations. “The committee reportedly examined affected families, interacted with district collectors, and reviewed court judgments before submitting its report to the state government and

the Khammam District Collector on Friday at the Basheerbagh Press Club in Hyderabad. “According to the report, 730 houses were demolished and all 730 beneficiaries were found to be eligible. It also stated that there were very few government employees among them and recommended that those employees be excluded while reconstructing the 730 houses using government funds. “Regarding the 62-acre assigned land issue, the committee observed discrepancies, stating that while government records show 30 acres, some documents mention 62 acres and 7 guntas, and in certain records, pattadar names appear in relation to the 30-acre extent. The committee demanded that the District Collector hold a press meet and publicly display the relevant records. The committee also stated that it would approach courts regarding the remaining 30 acres of assigned land issue. It demanded immediate reconstruction of all demolished houses and urged the government to provide ?1 lakh financial assistance as immediate relief to each affected family. It warned that otherwise a large-scale agitation would be launched. “The event was attended by Telangana movement activists Vittal, High Court advocate Sunkara Naresh, advocate Noorzan Begum, PYL leader and BC-ST JAC state secretary Podakandi Rambabu, and others.

Srinivasa Reddy and submitted a memorandum highlighting the difficulties being faced by farmers. Speaking on the occasion, Koteswar Rao said maize farmers in the district are currently in a very distressing situation. He alleged that despite their hard work throughout the season, farmers are unable to sell their produce and are facing severe hardship. He



stated that middlemen in the open market have formed syndicates and are exploiting farmers’ helplessness by purchasing maize at only ₹1,700 to ₹1,800 per quintal. He also criticized MARKFED officials, alleging that procurement is being delayed under the pretext of quality checks. He said officials are rejecting produce citing reasons such as fungal infection and poor grain quality, which is pushing farmers into further financial distress. He urged the government to adopt a humanitarian approach and procure maize without unnecessary restrictions, considering the rising cultivation costs. He further demanded that the government procure maize at ₹2,400 per quintal to ensure a fair price for farmers and immediately establish full-scale procurement centers across the district on a war footing. He appealed to the district administration to respond promptly and issue necessary instructions to concerned officials to provide financial security to farmers. Awareness Drive on Vector-Borne Diseases Conducted in Boduppal Circle

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR) Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, April 10 (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“Boduppal: As part of the 99-day action plan under the Praja Palana Pragathi Programme, an awareness campaign on vector-borne diseases was conducted on Day 36 in Ambedkar Nagar and Mallikarjun Nagar colonies under Boduppal Circle of Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation. According to AMOH Dr. A. Chaitanya Kumar, awareness rallies were organized to educate residents on preventive measures against the spread of vector-borne diseases. Deputy Commissioner Shailaja attended as the chief guest and addressed the public on the risks associated with diseases such as malaria, dengue, chikungunya, Zika, and Lyme disease. She explained that these diseases are caused by parasites, viruses, and bacteria, and are transmitted to humans through vectors like mosquitoes and flies. She noted that over 700,000 deaths are reported globally every year due to such diseases. Emphasizing prevention, she urged residents to maintain cleanliness in their surroundings, avoid dumping waste on roads, and ensure proper disposal through sanitation services. Since diseases like dengue and malaria spread through mosquitoes, the public was advised to eliminate stagnant water sources and keep their premises clean. Residents were also advised to wear loose-fitting clothing and take precautionary measures to prevent mosquito bites. During the awareness drive, anti-larval spraying was carried out in Devender Nagar and Mallikarjun Nagar colonies. Officials stated that regular fogging operations, spraying in residential areas, and the use of oil balls in stagnant water bodies will continue as per schedule. The public was also encouraged to observe a “Dry Day” once a week to prevent water stagnation in households. The programme saw participation from AMOH Dr. A. Chaitanya Kumar, DE Jahnavi Shashank, AE Mahesh, SI Praveen Kumar, Assistant Entomologists Naresh Reddy and Rambabu, sanitary field assistants, entomology staff, and local residents.

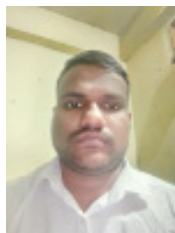

RTI System Failing Citizens, Says Activist Ande Raghu

“KISHORE VADDEPALLI, APRIL 10 (INDIAN CHRONICAL): “Ande Raghu, an RTI activist since 2012, states that the Right to Information system is no longer serving the people as intended. Over the years, he has filed thousands of applications across central and state government departments, seeking transparency and accountability. According to him, many officials show neither respect for the law nor fear of consequences. In several cases, authorities have demanded excessive fees—sometimes as high as ₹25,000—for providing just 12 to 15 pages of information, citing photocopying charges. He further points out that a large number of applications had to be escalated to Information Commissions due to non-response or incomplete replies. Even when officials were found guilty of denying information, penalties were rarely imposed. In cases where fines were ordered, enforcement remained weak, and many officials did not pay the penalties. Raghu argues that a law once considered one of the most powerful tools for public empowerment in India is now being seen by citizens as ineffective. He calls for strict implementation, accountability, and reforms to restore the credibility of the RTI system.”

1.40 crore salary fraud unearthed in Karimnagar Police Commissionerate

Head constable, retired officer among five arrested for siphoning funds using names of deceased personnel.

Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, April 10: Police Commissioner Gaush Alam has ordered stringent action following the detection of a major salary fraud in the Karimnagar Police Commissionerate, where over ₹1.40 crore of government funds were allegedly misappropriated using the identities of deceased police personnel.

The scam came to light after the Commissioner noticed suspicious transactions in salary disbursements and directed a detailed probe. The investigation, led by ACP (Task Force) Vasala Satish, revealed that ₹1,40,18,308 had been fraudulently diverted into fake bank accounts between June 2022 and March 2026.

According to officials, the prime accused, Head Constable Neelam Rammohan, who earlier worked in the pay section of the Commissionerate and is currently posted at Chigurumamidi police station, allegedly masterminded the operation by misusing employee IDs of three deceased constables—C.H. Ravinder, K. Gangaswamy, and K. Ravi.

The accused reportedly created fake bank accounts in the names of private individuals—Lavudiya Ravi, Chukka Gangaraju, and Shankar Namatababu—at HDFC Bank branches in Bhagath Nagar and Bommakal. These accounts were linked to his personal contact details, enabling the diversion of monthly salaries.

Investigators said the funds were withdrawn through ATMs and transferred to personal accounts via IMPS. The accused also allegedly secured loans against these fake salary accounts and repaid the EMIs using the siphoned government funds.

A retired Administrative Officer, Y.V. Muni Ramayya, is suspected to have facilitated the fraud, while the three private individuals are believed to have assisted in opening and operating the accounts.

Police have registered criminal cases against all five accused and arrested them. They will be produced before a court and remanded to judicial custody.

During the investigation, officials seized gold ornaments weighing 341.1 grams and ₹50,000 in cash from Mr. Rammohan. From Mr. Muni Ramayya, a mobile phone, a government SIM card, and ₹18,000 in cash were recovered.

Mr. Alam said strict disciplinary and legal action would be taken against those involved in financial misconduct, asserting that misuse of public funds and breach of trust would not be tolerated. He added that further investigation is underway to ascertain the involvement of others, if any.

Based on intelligence inputs, joint teams from Buxar and Dumraon police launched operations. Aman Tiwari was arrested after a raid at his residence in Buxar district. Based on the information he provided, two more individuals were taken into custody. “The incident has created a nationwide sensation. Security agencies are treating the matter with utmost seriousness, and a comprehensive investigation has been initiated. The DGP stated that the accused is in custody and is being interrogated.

Drunk Driving Turns Fatal; Accused Gets Six-Year Jail Term

PDJ Court in Karimnagar delivers verdict in 2021 road accident case.

Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, April 10: Delivering a stern message against drunken driving, the Principal District and Sessions Court in Karimnagar has sentenced a 28-year-old man to six years of rigorous imprisonment and imposed a fine of ₹6,500 for causing the death of a woman in a road accident. The court held Vodnala Naveen Kumar guilty of driving under the influence of alcohol and at excessive speed, leading to a fatal collision with an auto-rickshaw on the night of February 18, 2021, near Chekkala Lachayya Saw Mill in Choppadandi. According to the prosecution, the accused, driving a car (TS 09 EJ 0656), rammed into an oncoming auto, leaving several passengers injured. Vadluri Lakshmi (50), one of the occupants, sustained grievous injuries and later succumbed while undergoing treatment. Based on a complaint lodged by her son, Vadluri Kumaraswamy, the Choppadandi police registered a case under Section 304-II of the Indian Penal Code and carried out the investigation. After examining the evidence, the court found the accused guilty and awarded the sentence. Public Prosecutor Malyala Pratap represented the State and secured the conviction.
