He urged everyone to completely abandon these dangerous habits and emphasized that every individual must take responsibility for their own safety as well as the safety of others. He declared that wearing a helmet while riding a two-wheeler, and wearing a seatbelt while traveling in a car, are mandatory requirements. He further mentioned that various programs are being undertaken to enhance awareness regarding road safety. Subsequently, the MP and the Additional DGP filled potholes on the roads in Jagadevpur by shoveling soil into them.

They also stopped a motorist passing by and counseled him on the importance of wearing a helmet while driving.
