## Massive IT Job Scam Reported in Uppal; Around Rs 2 Crore Collected from 80 Victims



“UPPAL, April 15 (INDIAN CHRONICAL): “A major fraud case involving fake IT job offers has come to light under the Uppal Police Station limits. According to details, engineering graduates from various regions were allegedly cheated in the name of providing IT jobs. “The accused, Kadavala Satya Sai Nagaraju, associated with

Career Right Solution Consultancy in the Uppal area, lured job seekers by promising IT placements. Based on the offered salary packages, candidates were asked to pay amounts ranging from ₹2 lakh to ₹3 lakh. “The consultancy claimed to provide jobs through Qus Corp Limited and issued appointment letters for positions in Deftia IT Solutions. Some candidates reportedly

worked for about a month but did not receive any salary. Others who joined for training found that the company shut down within a week. “Subsequently, Career Right Solution Consultancy and Deftia IT Solutions also closed operations, leaving the candidates stranded. Realizing they had been cheated, around

80 victims approached the Uppal Police and filed a complaint against Career Right Solution Consultancy, Deftia IT Solutions, and Qus Corp Limited. “The victims have appealed to the police and the media to ensure justice and take action against those responsible for the scam.

# KTR Leads BRS Induction Drive in Peerzadiguda, Targets Centre and State

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) attended as the chief guest. “Khammam District Wyra APRIL 15 (INDIAN CHRONICLE):” The Telangana Rythu Sangham has urged district authorities to enhance maize and paddy procurement facilities across Khammam district during the ongoing Rabi season. “On Wednesday, under the leadership of the district committee, a representation was submitted to district officials highlighting several issues faced by farmers. The leaders demanded an increase in the number of procurement centers for maize and paddy to ensure farmer convenience. “They pointed out that in several maize procurement centers, procurement activities have not begun due to the non-issuance of MARKFED ID numbers. They requested authorities to immediately issue these IDs to enable smooth operations. They also called for the establishment of sub-centers wherever necessary to reduce the burden on farmers. “The Sangham further demanded the timely supply of gunny bags for maize procurement and the allocation of rice mills for the transportation and processing of paddy. They urged the government to expedite procurement



on a war footing to prevent farmers from suffering due to extreme heat and unseasonal rains. “Speaking on the occasion, District Secretary Bonthu Rambabu highlighted specific issues, including the need to sanction a maize procurement center for Gollapadu and

Ashnagurthi villages in Wyra mandal. ## Utilize medical camps for handloom workers from today to May 13:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

## KTR Challenged to Debate Congress Development in Peerzadiguda Congress Leader Tungaturthi Ravi Slams KTR's Remarks, Questions BRS Record

“Medchal- Malkajgiri, Staff Reporter, April 15 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Tungaturthi Ravi, President of the Congress Party in Peerzadiguda, strongly condemned the remarks made by BRS leader K. T. Rama Rao against Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and the Congress government during a recent public meeting in Peerzadiguda. Ravi alleged that during the ten-year rule of KCR, Telangana was pushed into heavy debt while corruption and irregularities became widespread. He



criticized KTR for making statements without acknowledging the failures of his own party's governance, calling his remarks inappropriate and misleading. He further stated that promises such as making a Dalit Chief Minister were not fulfilled by KCR after coming to power, which he described as a betrayal of public trust. Ravi said the people of Telangana had already delivered a verdict against such governance, yet KTR continues to ignore these realities. Highlighting welfare initiatives under the current Congress government led by Revanth Reddy, Ravi pointed to schemes such as Indiramma housing, free bus travel for women, Gruha Jyothi, farmer loan waivers, Rythu Bharosa, restoration of ration cards, and supply of fine rice to the poor. He claimed these programs are being implemented effectively across the state. Ravi also accused the previous BRS government of misusing public funds under schemes like the double-bedroom housing program. He stated that the

present government has ensured better transparency and delivery. Referring to infrastructure, Ravi questioned why projects such as SNDP works initiated earlier were left incomplete. He also criticized delays in the Uppal-Narapally elevated corridor, alleging that the previous government failed to take the project forward, causing inconvenience to the public. He said the Congress government had expedited pending works, including road development between Peerzadiguda and Kachavani Singaram, completing them in a short period for public benefit. Ravi further mentioned that enforcement initiatives like HYDRA have acted against illegal encroachments and helped protect public resources, including several lakes that were under threat. Concluding his statement, Ravi challenged KTR to an open debate on the development carried out in Peerzadiguda over the past 30 months under the Congress government, asserting that the party is ready to present facts before the public.

He criticized the previous regime for neglecting this initiative and assured that eligible poor families in Rejerla village would be allotted house sites in the future. “He highlighted several welfare initiatives being implemented by the government, including issuance of new ration cards, free bus travel for women, interest-free loans

for women, and 200 units of free electricity. He stated that every rupee of government revenue is being spent for the welfare of the poor. “Encouraging women, he advised them to join DWCRAs and utilize interest-free loans to achieve financial independence. He also assured that steps would be taken to establish a solar power plant on available government land in the village. “Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said that despite financial constraints, the Telangana government is prioritizing welfare and development. He added that both development and welfare are being delivered simultaneously. “He mentioned that three new hospitals were inaugurated and foundation stones were laid for four new substations on the same day. She announced that another phase of Indiramma housing beneficiaries’ list would be released soon and that steps are being taken to allocate house sites to around 400 people. “Several officials, public representatives, and local residents participated in the program.
