Golden Hour Crucial for Saving Lives in Accidents Arrive Alive awareness program held at Huggelli Huggelli Chowrasta.. CPR training imparted to shop owners on emergency response



...“Zaheerabad April 17 (Indian Chronicle) :“Detailed Print Media Script:“Highlighting the importance of the “Golden Hour” in saving lives during road accidents, a special awareness program was conducted as part of the 5th day of the Arrive Alive initiative at Huggelli Chowrasta under the limits of Zaheerabad Rural Police on Friday. “The program was organized under the supervision of Zaheerabad Rural SI M. Kashi Nath. Local shop owners from nearby areas were invited and educated on how to respond effectively during emergency situations following road accidents. “On this occasion, ambulance staff along with Dr. Manoj Kumar from Balaji Hospital explained that providing timely medical assistance within the first hour of an accident—the “Golden Hour”—can significantly reduce fatalities and prevent serious complications. They emphasized the need to shift the injured person to the nearest hospital without delay. “The team also demonstrated how to perform CPR (Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation) in cases where the victim is unconscious or suffers cardiac arrest. Practical training was given to the shop owners, enabling them to respond promptly and potentially save lives in emergency situations. “Speaking at the event, SI M. Kashi Nath urged the public not to panic during accidents but to act courageously and assist victims. He stated that such awareness programs play a vital role in building a responsible and life-saving community response. “A large number of local residents and business owners participated in the

program and showed keen interest in learning these life-saving techniques.

Extensive Awareness Program on Soil Health Conducted in Nyalkal Mandal

...“Experts emphasize soil testing, balanced fertilizers, and sustainable farming practices...“Zaheerabad April 17 (Indian Chronicle) :“Detailed Print Media Script:“An extensive awareness program on soil health management was conducted in Malgi, Miriyampur, and Ratnapur villages of Nyalkal mandal in Zaheerabad constituency of Sangareddy district under the aegis of DDS–KVK. A large number of local farmers, women farmers, village sarpanches, and agriculture officials participated in the program. “Addressing the gathering, DDS–KVK soil testing expert E. Swamy elaborated on the importance of soil testing. He explained the correct method and timing for collecting soil samples from agricultural fields and gave a practical demonstration to the farmers. He stated that soil testing helps in identifying key parameters such as nutrient levels, soil pH, soluble salts, and organic carbon content, which are crucial in understanding soil condition and fertility status. “He further added that by adopting appropriate soil management practices based on test results, farmers can not only improve crop yields but also reduce input costs. He emphasized that soil testing plays a vital role in maintaining long-term soil health and sustainability. “Later, crop management scientist

V. Ramesh advised farmers to apply fertilizers based on soil test results instead of indiscriminate usage. He suggested that reducing excessive chemical fertilizer use can significantly cut down cultivation costs. He also stressed the importance of crop rotation, recommending that farmers should avoid cultivating the same crop every year and instead adopt crop diversification at least once in two years. “He highlighted that intercropping practices help in balanced nutrient utilization and provide additional income to farmers. The use of organic inputs such as vermicompost and Jeevamrutham was also encouraged to improve soil fertility and increase productivity. “During the program, soil samples were collected from fields, and previously tested soil reports were distributed to farmers with proper explanation. Farmers actively interacted with experts and clarified their doubts. “The program was attended by Malgi Sarpanch M.D. Ameenabi, Miriyampur Sarpanch Nageshwari, Ratnapur Sarpanch Pavitra Jaju, DDS supervisors Vinay and Prahlad Balanna, along with several women farmers and other participants. The initiative proved effective in enhancing awareness among farmers on soil conservation and scientific farming practices.

CPR Awareness and Training Program Conducted at Zaheerabad Town Police Station

Police Personnel and Ambulance Drivers Trained in Life Saving Techniques Under 'Alive Arrive' Initiative.



..“Zaheerabad April 17 (Indian Chronicle): “A comprehensive awareness and training program on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) was conducted at the Zaheerabad Town Police Station premises on Friday as part of the ongoing ‘Alive Arrive’ initiative. The program, held on its fifth day, aimed at equipping first responders with essential life-saving skills during medical emergencies.”“The event was attended by Zaheerabad Sub-Division DSP Syed Nayak as the chief guest. Medical experts including Dr. Samad from Balaji Hospital and Dr. Amer from Samrohi Hospital, along with Manager Kumar, participated in the session. The program was organized under the leader-

ship of Sub-Inspector K. Vinay Kumar.”“During the session, around 15 ambulance drivers and police personnel were given hands-on training and live demonstrations on how to perform CPR effectively. The doctors emphasized the importance of immediate response in cases such as cardiac arrest and breathing failure, highlighting that the first few minutes—often referred to as the “Golden Hour”—are critical for saving lives.”“They explained that proper chest compressions help maintain blood circulation to the brain and other vital organs until advanced medical care is available. The speakers also stressed that police personnel and ambulance drivers serve as first responders at the ground level and are often the first to reach emergency scenes. Hence, having basic medical knowledge like CPR is crucial for them.”“The session included practical demonstrations followed by interactive discussions, where participants clarified their doubts regarding the procedure.”“Participants expressed that the training would greatly enhance their ability to respond effectively during emergencies and fulfill their responsibilities more efficiently. The organizers stated that such initiatives play a vital role in strengthening emergency response systems and saving lives.

TGEJAC Stages Protest in Zaheerabad Demanding Resolution of Employees' Issues

Black badge protest... memorandum submitted to RDO and Tahsildar.

..“Zaheerabad April 17 (Indian Chronicle):“Employees under the banner of TGEJAC staged a protest in Zaheerabad on Thursday, demanding immediate resolution of long-pending issues. As part of their phased agitation, leaders and members of various unions wore black badges and expressed their dissent against the delay in addressing their concerns.”“Addressing the gathering, TGEJAC leaders demanded that the Pay Revision Commission (PRC) report be brought out and implemented before June 2. They also urged the government to clear all pending bills in a single installment, issue new health cards to employees, and abolish the Contributory Pension Scheme (CPS) by implementing the Old Pension Scheme (OPS).”“Later, the leaders submitted memorandums to the Zaheerabad RDO office, handing them over to AO Vamshidhar, and to the Tahsildar office to MRO Dasarath, seeking immediate action on their demands. They stated that similar protests were being organized across the state in government offices and schools.”“Leaders from PRTU-TS, TRESA, UTF, TPTF, and the Gazetted Officers' Association participated in the protest. Among those present were Dr. Tulasiram Rathod, Dasarath, Sirajuddin, Jagadeeshwarayya, Ranthirth Narsimlu, and several other union representatives.



Ameerpet MRO Staff Submit Representation to Deputy MRO Madhavi, Urge Government to Address Demands

“Hyderabad correspondent, April 17 (Indian Chronicle): Employees at the Ameerpet Mandal Revenue Office (MRO) submitted a representation to Deputy MRO Madhavi, requesting that their demands be brought to the notice of the government and necessary steps be taken for their early fulfilment. The staff also displayed posters within the office premises to highlight their concerns. The employees urged the immediate implementation of the 26th Pay Revision Commission (PRC) and release of pending Dearness Allowance (DA) arrears. They also demanded the scrapping of the Contributory Pension Scheme (CPS) and restoration of the Old Pension Scheme (OPS), citing concerns over post-retirement security. Further, they sought resolution of issues faced by employees appointed after 2004 and called for ensuring job security. The staff emphasized transparency in transfers and promotions, and proper implementation of service rules. Highlighting increasing work pressure, the employees requested measures to rationalize workload, improve working conditions, and provide adequate leave facilities. They appealed that their demands be duly considered and addressed by the government at the earliest. The employees stated that the representation was submitted with the expectation that the authorities would take up their concerns with the government and ensure appropriate action.



Contract Employees Protest with Black Badges, Demanding Resolution of HCU Workers' Issues



“Serilingampalli April 17: The BMS UOH (BMS Union of Hyderabad Central University) staged a protest on Friday, wearing black badges, to express their disapproval of the administration's unfair treatment of contract employees. “Speaking on the occasion, union leaders stated that the outsourced contract workers of Hyderabad Central University were registering their protest—symbolized by the wearing of black badges—to demand the resolution of their long-pending issues. “They announced that this protest program was specifically organized to oppose the harassment allegedly being perpetrated by the Hyderabad Central University administration. “The union leaders respectfully urged the university administration to abandon its obstinate stance and resolve their demands immediately, warning that if their demands remain unaddressed, they would intensify their agitation in the future. “Key Demands: 1. Regularization of services. 2. Equal pay for equal work. 3. Immediate payment of all pending bonus arrears. 4. Abolition of the contract intermediary system within the university. 5. Implementation of a uniform attendance system for all employees. 6. Extension of the Group Insurance Policy to outsourced workers. 7. Immediate implementation of Gratuity benefits. Resolve State Employees' Issues Immediately Demands for clearing dues, PRC announcement, and implementation of health scheme

“MEDCHAL- MALKAJGIRI, Staff Reporter, April 17 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Kapra: State employees, teachers, and pensioners have demanded immediate resolution of their pending issues. TGRSA Medchal-Malkajgiri district secretary Kashiram submitted a memorandum to Kapra Tahsildar Baireddy Rajesh on Friday under the banner of the Telangana Employees, Teachers, and Pensioners State Joint Action Committee. Speaking on the occasion, Kashiram said that several dues payable to government employees have been pending for a long time and should be cleared without further delay. He demanded that the government announce the Pay Revision Commission (PRC) by June 2, as previously promised. He also called for the immediate implementation of the health scheme for employees and pensioners and issuance of health cards to all beneficiaries. Referring to pre-election promises, he urged the government to replace the Contributory Pension Scheme (CPS) with the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) without delay. Kashiram further demanded the release of five pending Dearness Allowance (DA) installments and sought employment opportunities and job security for the dependents of Village Revenue Assistants (VRAs) above 61 years of age. Employees and staff of the Tahsildar office were present during the submission of the memorandum.

Road deaths eclipse murders in Telangana; DGP calls for societal push on safety

'Arrive Alive' campaign scaled up; helmet, seat belt compliance stressed as fatalities remain high.



Karimnagar, April 17 (Correspondent): Road accidents have overtaken violent crime as the leading cause of unnatural deaths in Telangana, Director General of Police B. Shivadhar Reddy said on Friday, underscoring the urgency of a coordinated, society-wide response to improve road safety.

Launching an intensified phase of the State's 'Arrive Alive' campaign, Mr. Reddy said that while about 800 people were killed in murders last year, road accidents claimed nearly 7,500 lives. "Every life is valuable. Ensuring that people return home safely must become a

collective responsibility," he said.

Positioning road safety as a social movement, he noted that the initiative—being implemented in coordination with the police and transport departments—has been integrated into the State's Praja Palana – Pragathi Pranalika, with participation expected from all levels, from local bodies to the government.

The DGP flagged key risk factors contributing to fatalities, particularly among two-wheeler users, who account for nearly 70% of deaths. He stressed the need for both riders and pillion passengers to wear quality helmets with properly fastened straps. In four-wheelers, he said, seat belts are essential not only for safety but also for the effective deployment of airbags.

Cautioning against drunk driving, wrong-side travel, and overconfidence, he said such behaviours were leaving families devastated. He urged motorists to adopt defensive driving practices, reduce speed near schools and habitations, and prioritise pedestrian safety.

Calling on parents to refrain from allowing minors to drive, Mr. Reddy said vehicles should be given only after obtaining a valid licence, while students should avoid pressuring families for bikes.

District Collector Chitra Mishra said the campaign, part of the 99-day gover-

nance programme, is being implemented across the State and needs to be strengthened at the grassroots. She emphasised awareness on schemes offering free treatment to accident victims and financial assistance in hit-and-run cases.

Police Commissioner Gaush Alam said around 600 awareness programmes had been conducted in Karimnagar since December, alongside free eye tests for drivers and training in CPR and first aid. He added that accident-prone "hotspots" had been identified and addressed in coordination with other departments, resulting in a 16% reduction in road accident deaths over the past three months compared to last year.

The DGP also launched campaign material, distributed helmets, and administered a road safety pledge to participants.

Sidebar 1: 'She Leads' platform empowers women in police

As part of his visit, Mr. Reddy attended a 'She Leads' programme aimed at strengthening the role of women in policing. He noted that women's representation has increased, with 33% reservation in civil posts and 10% in Armed Reserve units.

Highlighting Telangana's initiatives, he said the 'She Teams' model has gained national recognition, while 'Bharosa Centres', launched in 2016, have expanded to 35 across the State and received appreciation from the Supreme Court.

Commissioner Gaush Alam said women personnel are being trained in leadership, cybercrime awareness, stress management, and CPR. Special health screenings and distribution of mobility and safety equipment, including scooters and pepper spray, are also part of the initiative.

Sidebar 2: Stay ahead of cybercrime, DGP tells police

In a review meeting with officers, the DGP stressed the need for the police force to stay ahead of criminals by adopting technology and continuously upgrading skills.

Pointing to the rise in cybercrime and drug-related offences, he said emerging threats require constant vigilance. Referring to past cases involving financial and cryptocurrency frauds, he urged officers to remain alert to evolving crime patterns.

Mr. Gaush Alam presented a review of law and order and crime trends in the district. The DGP commended officers for solving key cases and presented cash rewards to personnel for meritorious service.

Strict Measures to Make Hyderabad a Drug-Free City: CP Sajjanar

"Indian Chronicle / Secunderabad, April 17" The police are taking stringent measures to transform Hyderabad into a drug-free city, said Hyderabad Police Commissioner V. C. Sajjanar. "On Friday, he visited the de-addiction centre set up at Gandhi Hospital in Secunderabad. He interacted directly with rowdy-sheeters who recently tested positive in drug tests conducted by the Task Force police and enquired about their health condition and the steps being taken to overcome addiction. "The Commissioner also spoke with family members of the affected individuals, advising them to provide emotional support. Later, he held a meeting with doctors and gathered detailed information about the counselling process and treatment methods. "Speaking on the occasion, Sajjanar said that constant surveillance is being maintained on rowdy-sheeters who pose a threat to law and order in the city. As part of this effort, drug tests were conducted on 239 rowdy-sheeters, of which 188 tested positive. "He stated that 35 individuals are currently undergoing treatment at the Gandhi de-addiction centre, while others are being provided counselling at different centres. He expressed hope that the 15-day special counselling and treatment program, launched a week ago, would bring positive changes. "He further said that advanced drug detection kits have been made available in all police stations across the city. Field-level officers have been instructed to conduct drug tests, especially on suspicious individuals and youth during nighttime. "Sajjanar appreciated the proposal of Eagle Force Director Sandeep Shandilya for establishing 35 de-addiction centres across the state, calling it a model initiative for the country. He described it as a historic decision by the Government of Telangana, noting that such a large-scale initiative is unprecedented in the nation. "He warned that while efforts are being made to rehabilitate victims, strict action will be taken against drug peddlers. History sheets will be opened against offenders, and stringent legal action will follow if they reoffend. "Highlighting the effective performance of the H-New wing in controlling drug abuse, he appealed to the public and voluntary organizations to cooperate with the police in eradicating the drug menace. "He also noted that the coordination between the medical team led by Dr. N. Vani at Gandhi Hospital and the police department is a positive development. 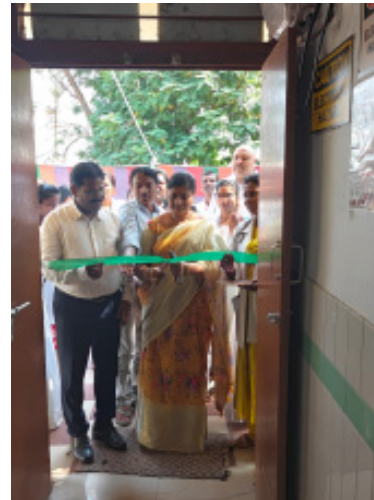
Training classes for the first phase of census begin in the district:- District Chief Census Officer, Additional Collector of Local Bodies Bhaskar Rao
