People with sunburn should not drink cold drinks,

The temperatures have already reached 40 to 46 degrees. People are afraid to step outside due to the fear of the sun. Due to this, many people are confined to their homes. However, doctors warn that even if they are at home, there is a risk of getting sunburn if proper precautions are not taken. Along with the sun, heat waves have also increased. Due to this, room temperatures are increasing. People indoors are also getting sunburned. The effect of heat waves is especially severe on children, the elderly, women and those with chronic diseases. That is why doctors advise taking proper precautions even when at home. Room temperatures are increasing significantly due to the sun. Normally, room temperatures should be between 26 and 28 degrees. But currently, room temperatures are being recorded as high as 40 to 46 degrees. Due to this, the room heats up and that effect is seen on the body. To cool the body, water in the body is released. This causes dehydration and sunburn. Doctors warn about how dangerous indoor heat stroke is when you go out. Windows and doors in narrow rooms Do not keep them closed. If you keep them closed, the temperature will increase. Windows and doors should always be open. Wet curtains should be drawn to prevent hot air from entering. If the room temperature rises, fans, ACs and coolers should be turned on to cool it down. The room temperature should be between 25 and 30 degrees. Children, the elderly and women are especially prone to indoor heat stroke. Drink water every half hour. It is advised not to take cold drinks when dehydrated. Precautions to be taken in intense sun, ensure that the room temperature is between 26 and 28 degrees. Drink water every half hour. Drink at least 4 to 6 liters of water a day. Wear cotton clothes even when at home. Keep windows and doors open. Close curtains to prevent direct hot air from entering. If necessary, tie wet curtains, thermocol and sheets to the windows for cool air. Elderly people should consume more buttermilk and lemon juice. Children and pregnant women suffering from sunburn should consume more fruit juices. Do not drink cool drinks at all for sunburn. Stay away from spicy foods as much as possible. If you suffer from sunburn, wipe your body with a wet cloth. Keep your house cool. If the body temperature crosses 99 degrees Fahrenheit in summer, water is lost in the form of sweat. Due to this, the person is at risk of dehydration. Sometimes, a person suffering from sunburn can even go into a coma. Keep your house as cool as possible. Drink at least 4 to 6 liters of water every day. People suffering from dehydration should avoid consuming cold drinks and should consume energy drinks like lemon juice, buttermilk, fruit juices and ORS, said ammailpalli Congress party senior leaders Ananta Naresh Goud on this consaltenstoin Precautions should be taken while consuming

Mr. Narendra Reddy said the State government led by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and the Congress party would oppose any move that undermines regional balance. He also alleged that the BJP was attempting to discredit the Congress on the issue of the Women's Bill and urged people, particularly women, to take note of the developments.

Stating that the Bill had remained pending for several years, he called upon the BJP to bring forward a standalone Women's Reservation Bill if it was committed to women's representation.

Mr. Narendra Reddy criticised Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Bandi Sanjay Kumar, alleging that local developmental issues in Karimnagar were being overlooked in favour of publicity. He cautioned that support for delimitation measures perceived to favour certain regions could have long-term consequences.

Referring to comments made by BRS leader K.T. Rama Rao, he said political discourse should remain within democratic limits and avoid personal remarks against the Chief Minister. He warned that such statements could lead to political confrontation if continued.

BJP Leaders Submit Representation to Rahul Gandhi Over Opposition to 33% Women's Reservation Bill

“UPPAL, APRIL 19 (INDIAN CHRONICAL):” Bharatiya Janata Party leaders in Uppal on Sunday submitted a representation to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, alleging that the Congress party and the INDIA alliance had obstructed the passage of the 33 per cent Women's Reservation Bill and urging them to reconsider their stand in the interest of women's empowerment. “Addressing the media on the occasion, Uppal Division BJP president Marneni Phanindra said that Prime

Minister Narendra Modi had introduced the landmark legislation in Parliament with the objective of ensuring greater political representation and empowerment for women. He described the Bill as a historic step that would shape the country's future and strengthen democratic participation. “Criticising the Congress and the INDIA bloc, he said it was contradictory for parties that claim to champion women's rights to oppose a measure aimed at enhancing women's representation. He alleged that their political stand had hindered the progress of women and exposed what he termed as a “double standard” in their approach. “Phanindra further stated that women's rights cannot be denied indefinitely and asserted that the rise of women's leadership is essential for the nation's progress. “Justice may be delayed, but it cannot be denied. Respecting women's rights is our collective responsibility,” he said. “The representation was submitted under

Because the temperature will increase from 45°C to 55°C, we are informing you on this occasion to follow the appropriate precautions. At this time, 70% of the ultraviolet rays of the sun are directly transmitted to the earth. If anyone has difficulty breathing or suddenly feels unwell, contact a doctor immediately. Keep the doors of the rooms open for proper ventilation. Reduce the use of mobile phones, due to high heat, mobile phones There is a risk of explosion. Be careful and share this information with others. On this occasion, Charakonda Yashwanth Kumar informed that food additives can be changed by taking proper precautions as per the advice of doctors. Drink more cold drinks like curd, buttermilk, and lemon juice. Very important information The temperatures will increase from 47°C to 55°C in the coming days. There is a possibility of hot winds that will make it difficult to breathe in some areas. So, these precautions must be followed. I would like to inform everyone who travels in cars and bikes to take proper precautions and try to leave only in the morning and evening. Items that should not be kept in vehicles Gas materials, lighters, and batteries should be taken care of while carrying them in vehicles. Keep the car windows slightly open for air circulation. Do not fill the car's fuel tank completely. Refuel the car only in the evening. In the afternoon Avoid traveling by car. Do not over-inflate the tires while traveling. Poisonous insects, scorpions and snakes can enter homes for cool places, so take proper precautions, Charakonda Yashwanth Kumar said on this occasion. Drink plenty of water and fluids, do not keep the gas cylinder in the sun, do not put excessive load on the electricity meters, use air conditioner only in necessary rooms. Take a break for at least 30 minutes every 2-3 hours. When the temperature outside is 45–47°C, keep the AC in the house in cool places. Avoid direct sunlight from 10 am to 3 pm, so try to avoid sunlight during this time. Since the sun is extremely hot, children, the elderly and the elderly should take special care and take proper precautions, Charakonda Yashwanth Kumar said on this occasion.

Congress Party Office Sealed Amid Allegations of Tax Evasion and Illegal Occupation

Nacharam(Indian Chronicle, April 19): ““ Authorities have sealed a Congress party office located on the main road of Nacharam Circle, opposite CS Brothers, in HMT Nagar Division, following multiple allegations including property tax arrears, illegal construction, and encroachment on government land. “The commercial building, reportedly owned by Damodar Reddy and Kondal Reddy, had accumulated pending property tax dues amounting to ?14 lakh. In addition, complaints were received regarding unauthorized construction, encroachment of nearly 250 square yards of government land, and the building being in a dilapidated condition. “Taking serious note of these complaints, Medchal–Malkajgiri Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy personally visited Nacharam Circle to inspect the premises. He reviewed the situation on-site and sought details from Deputy Commissioner Nithyanand. Following the inspection, he immediately ordered the sealing of the building. Officials executed the order and sealed the pre-

mises in his presence. “Was the Office Used to Cover Irregularities? “The building, an old commercial structure, previously housed a liquor shop and had been unused for the past two years. Recently, repair works were initiated, and an unauthorized shed was reportedly constructed behind the building without any approvals. Despite long-pending tax dues, no payments had been made in recent years. “Local residents had lodged complaints regarding the encroachment and demanded strict action. JAC leaders also staged protests and initiated a hunger strike, urging authorities to take action against the illegalities. “Allegations have surfaced that the Congress party office was set up in the same building to divert attention and possibly prevent official action against the property. “Officials Foil the Strategy “It is alleged that setting up a political party office in the disputed building was a deliberate move to deter authorities from taking action. However, acting on multiple complaints, Commissioner Vinay



Krishna Reddy ensured that due process was followed and the building was sealed, effectively nullifying such attempts. “Disappointment Among Party Cadre “Nacharam has traditionally been considered a stronghold of the Congress party, with leaders like Nemali Suresh and Sai Jan Shanti having previously won elections from the party. With the

Congress currently in power in the state and having a strong base in the newly formed HMT Nagar Division, the sealing of the office has come as a setback. “Party workers have expressed disappointment as the newly established office has now been sealed, leaving them without a functional space for activities.

Will not tolerate any insult to Telangana's identity Warangal MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya



““““ Hanamkonda, April 19 (Indian Chronicle) : Warangal MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya said that opposition parties will continue to fight unitedly to protect the spirit of federalism in the country and will not tolerate remarks that damage the dignity of the state. Speaking at a media conference held at the Hanamkonda District Congress Committee office on Sunday, she strongly criticized the BJP government at the Centre. She termed it shameful to use women's aspirations

for political gain in the name of the census and delimitation. Questioning the BJP's "pretended love" for women, she asked why the Women's Reservation was not implemented in 2024. She said the bills being introduced by the BJP alliance in Parliament go against the spirit of democracy, as they are being rushed without prior information to MPs and without proper discussion, which amounts to insulting the Constitution. In this context, she stated that opposition parties, especially the Indian National Developmental Inclusive Alliance (INDIA) alliance, are coming together to counter the BJP's approach. She recalled that the Women's Reservation Bill was passed in 2023 with the consent of all parties and that the Congress party had demanded its immediate implementation. However, she criticized the BJP government for delaying it in the name of the census and delimitation. She said the people of the country should question why the BJP government, which has passed hundreds of bills since coming to power in 2014, has failed to implement this crucial bill. She alleged that the BJP is attempting to gain political advantage through the delimitation process under the cover of the Women's Reservation Bill. Referring to the injustice being done to southern states that contributed to development by effectively implementing family planning. She expressed concern that the Centre is looking down upon the South despite its significant contribution to the country's GDP. She also alleged that certain political forces in Andhra Pradesh are yielding to the BJP in ways that harm southern interests.
