Anjaneyulu Sagar Highlights the 'Hellish Ordeal' of Traffic Jams to the DCP



“Serilingampalli April 20: Anjaneyulu Sagar, a senior leader from the Anjayya Nagar Division, met with Cyberabad Traffic DCP Rajan Ratan Kumar (IPS) and Assistant DCP Hanumanth Rao to submit a memorandum regarding the severe traffic congestion prevailing near the Ammavari Temple in Siddiq Nagar Colony, within the Anjayya Nagar Division limits. “Explaining the issue during the meeting, he noted that the road near the Siddiq Nagar Ammavari Temple is extremely narrow; consequently, IT professionals and other employees are compelled to use this very route daily to commute to Hi-Tech City. “As a result, traffic volume has surged significantly, creating a situation where commuters are forced to remain stuck on the road for approximately 20 minutes every day. “He expressed deep concern that even emergency service vehicles—particularly ambulances—are getting trapped in this congestion, leading to life-threatening situations. “With heavy vehicles on one side and the constant movement of commuters on the other, the road frequently comes to a complete standstill, causing severe inconvenience to the public. As a solution to this problem, he requested the DCP to specifically deploy a traffic constable during the peak hours—from 8:30 AM to 11:30 AM and from 6:30 PM to 9:30 PM. “Responding positively to this appeal, the Traffic DCP assured him that appropriate measures would be taken to resolve the issue expeditiously. Gas Agency Mismanagement Leaves Consumers Distressed; Allegations of Black Marketing Surface

“Wanaparthy correspondent April 20(Indian Chronicle): “Serious allegations have emerged against a Bharat Gas agency over inordinate delays in LPG cylinder delivery, leaving consumers frustrated and distressed. Despite booking cylinders nearly 20 days ago, several customers claim that deliveries are yet to be made, raising concerns over service failure and possible malpractice. According to affected consumers, LPG cylinders are expected to be delivered within 24 hours of booking. However, the agency has allegedly failed to adhere to these norms, causing inconvenience to households dependent on timely supply. Customers also complained about the lack of proper response from the agency management, stating that calls go unanswered and no clear explanation is provided. Adding to the woes, delivery personnel are reportedly switching off their phones, making it difficult for customers to track their orders. While officials maintain that there is no shortage of LPG supply, consumers allege that the issue lies in the agency's inefficiency and negligence. In a more serious allegation, consumers claim that instead of delivering cylinders to households, the agency is reportedly halting supply vehicles at a main junction and forcing people in urgent need to collect cylinders from there. It is further alleged that cylinders are being sold in black market, bypassing genuine bookings. Consumers have expressed anger over what they describe as “inhuman and irresponsible behavior” by the agency operators. They are now demanding strict action against those responsible, including cancellation of the agency license, citing violations under the Consumer Protection Act. “Authorities are urged to conduct an immediate inquiry into the matter and ensure that consumers receive uninterrupted and fair service.

Thalassemia Awareness Drive Held at Uppal Government Degree College

Memorandum Seeks Amendments to Advocates Protection Act, Health Cards for Lawyers

“(KHAMMAM APRIL 18 (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“A memorandum was submitted to Ponnam Ashok Goud by Advocate Talluri Dileep Chowdary, President of the Federation of Legal Professionals Committee. “Speaking on the occasion, Dileep Chowdary stated that the Advocates Protection & Welfare Bill approved on March 30, 2026, is a significant step toward safeguarding lawyers. However, he pointed out that Chapter-II (Advocates Welfare Fund), which was part of the draft bill, was not included in the final version. “He explained that the existing ?100 crore fund is functioning as a revolving fund, and the interest generated is being used to provide health insurance benefits. However, these benefits are



currently limited to advocates registered up to 2018, leaving thousands of lawyers enrolled from 2019 onwards without access. “In this context, he requested the allocation of an additional ?100 crore to immediately issue health cards to advocates registered from 2019 to the present. “He further proposed that

the existing ?100 crore along with the proposed ?100 crore be combined into a ?200 crore corpus fund. The interest generated from this fund, he suggested, should be utilized for health insurance and financial assistance to junior advocates. “He also called for clarity regarding the future of the Bar Council Welfare Trust and recommended integrating it into a legal framework to ensure transparency and stability. “Additionally, he urged authorities to provide another opportunity for advocates above 35 years of age who have not yet enrolled in the Telangana Advocates Welfare Fund. “Dileep Chowdary emphasized that implementing these measures would ensure comprehensive welfare for all advocates, promote the legal profession, and strengthen the justice system. “Government Pleader Peddinti Ganesh and others were also present at the program.

Congress rejects Centre's 'conditional approach' to women's quota.

Karimnagar, April 20 (Correspondent): Karimnagar Urban District Congress Committee (DCC) president Vaidyula Anjan Kumar on Sunday alleged that the Centre was attempting to link the implementation of women's reservation to the proposed delimitation exercise, and accused the BJP of "misleading the public" on the issue.

Addressing a press conference here, Mr. Anjan Kumar criticised Prime Minister Narendra Modi, alleging that the Women's Reservation Bill was being used as a "political tool" under the pretext of empowerment. He further accused the BJP of spreading "false propaganda" that the Congress had opposed the legislation in Parliament.

He said that the Women's Reservation Bill had already been passed unanimously by Parliament in 2023 and had received Presidential assent. "The demand now is for immediate implementation of reservations for women based on the existing strength of the Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assemblies," he said.

Mr. Anjan Kumar alleged that what failed in the Lok Sabha was the proposed Constitution (131st Amendment) Bill, which, according to him, sought to increase the number of seats in Parliament and Assemblies through delimitation. He claimed that linking women's reservation to such an exercise would adversely affect smaller States and weaken the federal structure.

The Congress, he said, opposed any move to tie women's quota to delimitation and reiterated its demand for immediate implementation without altering the current number of seats. He accused the BJP of delaying the process for political reasons.

Referring to past measures, he said the Congress had demonstrated its



commitment to women's empowerment by implementing 33% reservation in local bodies during the tenure of former Prime Minister P. V. Narasimha Rao, fulfilling a vision associated with Rajiv Gandhi. He also noted that 50% reservation for women had been implemented in local bodies in the erstwhile united State under Congress rule. Among those present were SUDA Chairman Komatireddy Narender Reddy, Urban Bank president Karra Rajashekar, Fisheries Development Society chairman Pittala Ravi, and several corporators, including Mallikarjun Rajendar, Ganta Srinivas, Jagan Reddy, Gummadi Rajkumar, Parvathula Mallesh, Parishetti Bhumayya, and Ikram Sikandar.
