Vikarabad Women Police Station CI and SI caught by ACB while taking a bribe of Rs. 20,000/-

caught by the ACB while accepting a bribe of Rs. 20,000/- According to details provided by ACB officials and the complainant, Irshad, a resident of 7th Ward in Tandur town, had a case registered against him and his family members at the Women Police Station in Vikarabad district headquarters due to family disputes at his home. Irshad stated that CI Saroja demanded Rs. 60,000 to grant bail within 41

days. Finally, after CI Saroja agreed to a demand of Rs. 40,000 for granting bail, Irshad secretly lodged a complaint with ACB officials. When CI Sujatha and SI Rani were accepting the first installment of the bribe money of Rs. 20,000, ACB officials who were lying in wait caught them red-handed. It is reported that ACB officials have registered cases against both of them and are remanding them. Irshad has so far had ACB raids conducted against three officials involved in corruption in the district.

“Khammam, April 21 indian Chronicle:”“Students should not restrict themselves to conventional courses after completing Class 10, but instead choose technical vocational education that ensures better employment opportunities, said Ms. M. Vijayalakshmi, Assistant Director of the Handlooms and Textiles Department, Hanamkonda district.”“She was speaking as the chief guest at a



special awareness seminar organized on Tuesday at the Khammam District Collectorate by the Indian Institute of Handloom Technology (IIHT), Hyderabad.”“Addressing the gathering, Ms. Vijayalakshmi stated that in today's modern era, the handloom sector is rapidly evolving with advanced technologies such as fashion designing and textile chemistry. She explained the opportunities available for admission into the Diploma in Handloom & Textile Technology (DHTT) course for the academic year 2026-27 to students and parents.”“She noted that apart from traditional weaving, students will receive international-standard training in areas like CAD (Computer-Aided Design) and smart garment manufacturing. During the course, students will receive a monthly stipend of ₹2,500, and those from handloom families may receive additional support of up to ₹5,000.”“The course can be completed with a nominal annual fee of ₹4,250. After completion, students can secure jobs in major textile companies or pursue self-employment opportunities, she added.”“Eligibility for admission is a pass in Class 10, and a total of 60 seats will be filled based on merit. Interested candidates are advised to apply by the first week of April. Applications can be submitted at the campus of Potti Sreeramulu Telugu University, Nampally, Hyderabad.”“Officials urged students from Khammam district to make the best use of this opportunity and build a strong foundation for their future.”“The event was attended by officials of the Handlooms Department, students, parents, and others.

*Farmers Demand 100% Compensation for Madhira Sai Balaji Cold Storage Fire Accident Victims

“* “Khammam, April 21 Indian Chronicle:“Leaders of the Telangana Rythu Sangham and the affected farmers’ struggle committee have demanded immediate 100% compensation for farmers who suffered losses in the fire accident at Sai Balaji Cold Storage in Madhira. “District Secretary Bonthu Rambabu, along with Farmers’ Struggle Committee Convener Devela Veeraiah and Co-Convener Guvvala Seetharama Reddy, urged the state government to intervene and ensure that insurance companies fully compensate the affected farmers. They also appealed for immediate financial assistance from the government to help farmers meet urgent needs. “On Tuesday, the affected farmers staged a protest in front of the Khammam Collectorate and later submitted a memorandum to Additional Collector Srinivasa Reddy. “Speaking on the occasion, the leaders said that farmers had stored their chilli produce in cold storage during the last agricultural season, hoping for better prices as market rates were low at that time. However, the fire accident led to complete loss of their produce, leaving them in distress. “They requested the government to: “Ensure 100% insurance compensation for the losses. “Provide immediate financial assistance of ₹5,000 per quintal to help farmers recover. “The



leaders pointed out that although chilli prices were around ₹11,000 per quintal in the previous season, farmers could not recover their investments. Many had taken loans to sustain their families. When prices rose to ₹19,500 per quintal around March 20, farmers hoped to sell

their stored produce and clear debts. However, the fire accident destroyed their entire stock, shattering their hopes. “They emphasized that the government must provide moral support and financial relief to the affected farmers and ensure that district authorities take

responsibility for securing full insurance compensation. “Telangana Rythu Sangham District Vice President S.K. Meera and several affected farmers also participated in the protest.

“Won’t Tolerate Remarks Against Ajay Tummala

No Conditions in Maize Procurement: BJP Khammam District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao Slams Government Negligence.

*** "KHAMMAM, 21 APRIL (INDIAN CHRONICLE) : "Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Khammam District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao strongly criticized the government for its alleged negligence towards farmers. He said it is extremely unfortunate that farmers, who toil day and night to grow their crops, are forced to wait in markets to sell their produce, while the harvested paddy is drying up before their eyes and the government remains indifferent. "He demanded that maize procurement should be carried out without any conditions and that every grain should be purchased. He also urged the authorities to immediately release water from the Nagarjuna Sagar project to save the drying paddy fields. "In a statement issued on Tuesday, he expressed deep concern over the hardships faced by maize farmers and paddy farmers under the Sagar ayacut in various parts of the district. "Harassment by Officials; Farmers Forced to Sell at Low Prices" Koteswara Rao said that despite increasing investments and good yields, farmers are not receiving remunerative prices in the market. He pointed out that maize is currently being sold at just ₹1,700 to ₹1,800 per quintal in the open market, which does not even cover the cost of cultivation. "He alleged that even when farmers bring quality produce to the market, MARKFED officials are creating hurdles by citing issues like fungus and grain size, thereby halting procurement. He accused officials of deliberately delaying the process and harassing farmers, despite the crop quality being satisfactory at the field level. "Due to delays in opening government procurement centers, farmers are left with no option but to sell their produce to middlemen at lower prices. He demanded that the market chairman intervene immediately to stop harassment in the name of quality checks and ensure there are no delays in transportation of grain. "Release Sagar Water to Save Drying Paddy Fields" He further criticized that along with natural calamities, unplanned decisions by officials are worsening the situation for farmers. The sudden stoppage of water from the Nagarjuna Sagar has severely affected tail-end farmers, he said. "At a crucial stage when the crop is ready for harvest, lack of water is causing fields to dry up completely, leaving farmers in distress. He appealed to the government and officials to immediately release Sagar waters to save paddy farmers. "Collector Must Respond Immediately" Koteswara Rao demanded that the District Collector take immediate action on this issue, which is causing severe distress to farmers. He called for strict action against MARKFED officials responsible for creating obstacles in procurement and showing negligence towards farmers. "He warned that if the government continues to delay in supporting farmers, it will not be tolerated.
