Realtors are busy in Husnabad lands.. Police are ignoring them

.... Fake landowners are terrorizing landowners.. Farmers have been facing many hardships for a year..!! "It is regrettable that legal action has not been taken against those who complained to the police that the finishing wire was removed and the land was planted.. Grievances of the landowners.. "There is land in two survey numbers.. There is land here.. Addimar.. Fake landowners who planted land blindly



(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau.. Voice Today Representative):- "Survey numbers 208,205,207 in Hussainabad village of Bhuvanagiri town have surplus lands. For the past year, some land grabbers have been harassing and intimidating the landowners of those survey numbers, saying that there is surplus land in your lands, and without the knowledge of those landowners, they are conducting private surveys and measuring the lands.. Removing the existing land.. How reasonable is it to trouble the farmers? Mandava Srisailam, Kamma, Kishtaiah, Allam Mahesh, Niranjana Reddy expressed their concerns. Although the Bandlabata from Hussainabad to Hanmapuram has been there for the last 50 years, recently, a program was carried out to widen the road by spending about ten lakhs with Gram Panchayat funds 20 years ago. Later, the former councilor of Hussainabad Colony recently spent lakhs of rupees with municipal funds and carried out a program to widen the same road last year. The landowners are expressing their concerns that this path is on the lands of fake landowners, and that the real landowners do not have roads for those lands, and how reasonable is it for the fake landowners to threaten them. He said that if there are no roads for agricultural lands as per government regulations, then roads will be



constructed under the auspices of the Revenue Department Tehsildar to provide the opportunity for roads. Even though there is no land in the respective survey numbers, and their boundaries are somewhere, they have changed those boundaries and joined the landowners, threatening the landowners that there is land here. Recently, Marri Vasantha, Marri Chandrayya, their sons (who have no land... and cannot afford paper... Allam Mallesha and his sons) and others have come together to create fake land titles of 19 acres of land and are causing trouble to the original landowners. The above landowners are expressing their concern. He said that he had complained to the Bhuvanagiri CI on 6/2/26 that there was five pits of land on his land, that your road was on patta land, that the land above was purchased by fake patta holders, that there was land on his land, that his rods and finishing wire were removed and his rods were planted in his land, and that no case was booked against them. In the same order, they came to his land again on 10-4-26 and asked how reasonable it was to remove the rods and wire on the boundaries of his land and plant his rods in his land. The patta holders of Survey No. 208, Mandava Srisailam and others expressed their regret that no legal action was taken against them even after they had made a complaint to the Bhuvanagiri CI on this date. For the past year, brokers Nakkala Anjaiah, Gundeboina Narasimha, and Paka Gopal from Bhuvanagiri Tata Nagar have been coming to these survey numbers regularly. They have conspired with the landowners who have registered forgeries. They are hoping to get a tenth of the landowners. They are currently causing many problems to the landowners on those lands, and the landowners are expressing their grievances. In the past, the government survey has surveyed these lands many times, and even though the survey numbers have given a report that there is no surplus land here, these brokers are constantly threatening the landowners and causing them problems. In this landless area, a realtor broker and two ex-councilors' husbands... One acre of land with 19 pits, there is land in the lands of three landowners, these realtors who have gone astray, took lakhs of rupees from others and made a fake land certificate for a person... in the same month, they exchanged one or two land certificates for others... "It's like throwing a bowl of rice in a bowl and making a fight with dogs.. One person's money belongs to one person, another's money belongs to another... these games played by the husbands of these former women councilors... farmers have to face many difficulties. The voters of these councilors who caused trouble in their respective colonies gave them the right advice in the recent municipal elections and defeated their "wives" in the elections. On this matter, senior police officers, revenue, tahsildars and senior officials took the initiative against the fake landowners and the realtor who sold them to them and made money. Many landowners are demanding legal action against brokers. Many landowners are alleging that they have less land than the sacred land. The land that should have been given to the real landowners is falling into the hands of fake landowners and they are facing many problems. The landowners have called 100 several times to complain to the police in this regard. However, the landowners are alleging that they do not understand the reason behind the police not paying attention. When Bhuvanagiri Tehsildar Jagan was asked to explain about the road from Hussainabad to Hanmapur, he warned that if anyone encroaches on the existing road, roads will be built with government funds and legal action will be taken against them under land encroachment. Collector seeks comprehensive arrangements at paddy procurement centres

Asks officials to ensure basic amenities, take measures against rain and heat; calls for joint monitoring.

Karimnagar, April 22 (Correspondent): District Collector Chitra Mishra has directed officials to put in place comprehensive arrangements at paddy procurement centres for the ongoing Yasangi season, emphasising that farmers should not face any inconvenience during the procurement process.



Inspecting centres at Pichupalli and Lambadipalli villages in Chigurumamidi mandal, and Malkapur in Kothapalli mandal on Wednesday, the Collector, accompanied by Revenue Divisional Officer Maheshwar, Civil Supplies Officer Narsinga Rao and District Manager Rajanikant, reviewed the facilities and functioning of the centres.

Ms. Mishra instructed officials to ensure the availability of drinking water, shaded areas and other essential amenities for farmers at all centres. In view of the possibility of unseasonal rains, she directed that tarpaulins be kept ready to protect the procured paddy from damage.

She also underscored the need to keep weighing machines and moisture meters in proper working condition, and to arrange immediate replacements in case of malfunction. With temperatures rising, officials were asked to carry out procurement operations preferably during morning and evening hours and take precautions to prevent heat-related illnesses among farmers.

The Collector further called for the availability of medical kits, ORS packets and basic health services, including ANM support, at procurement points. Referring to last year’s procurement data, she asked officials to review daily purchase figures and plan current operations accordingly.

Emphasising accountability, Ms. Mishra directed mandal-level special officers, along with Revenue and Civil Supplies officials, to undertake joint inspections and closely monitor procurement activities. They were asked to verify records, oversee arrangements and engage with farmers to address grievances promptly.

She also stressed coordination with the Agricultural Market Committee to ensure that procured paddy is swiftly transported for milling, facilitating a smooth and timely procurement process.

During the visit, the Collector inspected paddy stocks, verified records and assessed moisture levels using testing equipment, while issuing instructions to the staff to streamline operations. Tahsildars and officials from various departments were present.

Kaman on Tuesday. The accused were later remanded to judicial custody. “Acting on a tip-off, SI Iddayya and his team reached the spot and detained three persons moving under suspicious circumstances. They were identified as Dasari Surender alias Surya Muneer, Aditya Thakur Singh and Tanay alias Kanna. “Police said a search of their bag led to the seizure of an air gun revolver with six rounds, an axe, a knife and iron rods. “During interrogation, Surender reportedly confessed that he had procured the weapons fearing an attack from one Purushottam, following an earlier murder attempt case registered in 2024 under the Chaitanyapuri police station limits. “According to police, Surender and his associate Boddu Mahesh had earlier attempted to murder Purushottam, who later allegedly killed Mahesh a few days after escaping the attack. “Police said Surender, a known offender involved in around 40 criminal cases, had enlisted the help of Aditya and Tanay. The air gun was allegedly arranged by his associate Saketh, who is currently absconding. “A case has been registered and further investigation is in progress.

project. In a statement issued on Wednesday, he said that the High Court clearly stated that no action should be taken based on the Commission's report. “He explained that the High Court, in its judgment, clarified that basic legal principles and procedures were not followed during the Commission's inquiry, which made it evident that the report lacks legal validity. “He further stated that the High Court strongly objected to the fact that, especially under Section 8, allegations were made without issuing any notices to the concerned individuals. “The MP criticized the government for allegedly misusing commissions with the intention of politically pressuring the first Chief Minister of Telangana and BRS President K. Chandrashekar Rao, and

former minister and BRS Legislature Party Deputy Leader T. Harish Rao. “He alleged that Congress leaders have been spreading baseless stories and narratives about the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project, which is considered the lifeline of Telangana, with the intention of damaging KCR's reputation. Vikarabad District SP Sneha Mehra, gives key suggestions to the public on thefts and children swimming in dangerous areas during summer

“Indian Chronicle Vikarabad (April 22) “In a statement, Vikarabad District SP Sneha Mehra, alerted the public to take necessary precautions as people are locking their homes and going to their native places or on vacations amid summer holidays, and also in view of increasing temperatures. She warned that with schools and colleges declaring holidays and many people going out with their families, thieves may take advantage of the situation and commit thefts. “She suggested that those who lock their homes and go out should not keep cash, gold ornaments, or valuable items at home and instead store them in bank lockers. Similarly, she said that installing CCTV cameras around the house and linking them to mobile phones can help maintain



constant surveillance. She mentioned that it is advisable to inform trusted neighbors or relatives about travel details and request them to check the house occasionally. “She stated that by installing automatic timers to keep lights on outside the house at night and making advance arrangements to prevent mail or parcels from piling up, one can avoid giving the impression that no one is home. She requested that if any suspicious persons or vehicles are noticed, information should be immediately given to Dial 100 or the nearest police station. “The SP also advised the public to be cautious about rising temperatures during summer. Since children have the dangerous habit of going to ponds, tanks, and canals for swimming for fun, she warned parents to pay special attention to them as accidents can occur in unknown deep waters. She suggested that children should not be sent alone to water bodies and should always be under adult supervision. “Vikarabad District SP Sneha Mehra, stated that the police department remains alert at all times for public safety, yet if people also act responsibly and follow the above suggestions, thefts and accidents can be prevented.

Demand to Provide Basic Facilities at Double Bedroom Housing Colonies

“Khammam Urban April 22 Indian Chronicle:“CPI district executive member Pagadala Mallesham demanded that the government immediately provide essential facilities at double bedroom housing colonies, stating that residents are facing severe hardships due to lack of infrastructure. “On Wednesday, CPI leaders from the 14th and 15th divisions, under the leadership of Pagadala Mallesham, visited the double bedroom housing units located at Allipuram in Khammam city. They interacted with residents and inquired about their problems. “Speaking on the occasion, Mallesham said that houses in the Allipuram double bedroom colony



were allotted to people who lost their homes due to road widening works in Kothagudem and Allipuram, as well as to residents from various parts of the city. However, despite the allocation of houses, basic amenities have not been provided, he alleged. “He pointed out that there are serious issues related to electricity and

drinking water supply. Although temporary electricity arrangements were made, power supply was recently disconnected by electricity department officials and later restored. He demanded the installation of a dedicated transformer to ensure uninterrupted electricity supply. “He also highlighted the acute shortage of drinking water, urging the government to take immediate steps to prevent water scarcity, especially during the summer season. Crackdown on unlicensed riders: 140 TVS XL vehicles seized in Karimnagar

Karimnagar, April 22 (Correspondent): Several passengers were injured when a Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) bus collided with an oncoming lorry and rammed into a road divider on the Kothirampur bypass road in Karimnagar district on Wednesday morning.

According to preliminary accounts, the bus, which had departed from Karimnagar and was bound for Warangal, hit a truck approaching from the opposite direction. The impact forced the vehicle off its course before it crashed into the median.

Passengers alleged that the accident was the result of negligent driving. Notably, the driver was reportedly a private hire engaged by the TGSRTC management in view of the ongoing strike by RTC employees.

Local residents rushed to the scene and shifted the injured to a nearby hospital. The extent of injuries was not immediately known.

The incident comes against the backdrop of a statewide RTC strike, which has severely disrupted bus services. In the Karimnagar region, most buses remained confined to depots, with only a limited number of hired and electric buses operating.
