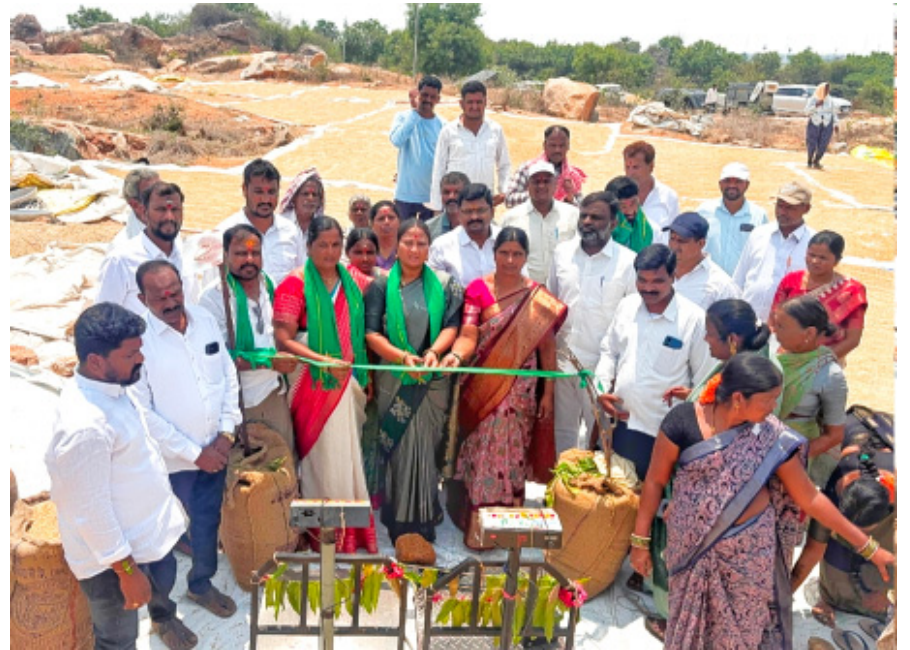


## Farmers' Welfare is the State Government's Primary Objective; Paddy Procurement Centers Launched Exclusively for Farmers' Development: Bhuvanagiri Market Chairperson Rekha Baburao

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau – Indian Chronicle – April 24): Bhuvanagiri Market Chairperson Rekha Baburao stated that the welfare of farmers is the state government's primary objective, and that paddy procurement centers are being launched specifically for the development of the farming community. As part of this initiative, on Friday, Bhuvanagiri Agricultural Market Chairperson Rekha Baburao inaugurated paddy procurement centers—established under the aegis of IKP—in the villages of Anajipuram, Reddy Nayak Thanda, Pacharlabodu Thanda, Surepalli, Akuthotabavi Thanda, Bollepalli, Nandanam, and Namathpalli within the Bhuvanagiri Mandal. Speaking as the chief guest at the event, Bhuvanagiri Agricultural Market Committee Chairperson Rekha Baburao reiterated that the welfare of farmers remains the state government's foremost priority. She noted that the government has undertaken special measures to procure the paddy harvested by farmers at a fair price. She affirmed that justice is being ensured for farmers by procuring their produce at the Minimum Support Price (MSP). Furthermore, she mentioned that a system is being implemented to procure grain directly from farmers, thereby eliminating the need for intermediaries. She added that, with the support of Bhuvanagiri MLA Kumbham Anil Kumar Reddy, essential amenities such as drinking water, weighing machines, gunny bags, and transportation facilities have been made available at the procurement centers to ensure that farmers face no difficulties during the process. He advised farmers to bring their grain in a clean condition, ensuring that the moisture content is maintained at the appropriate level. He stated that measures are being taken to ensure the speedy deposit of funds into the accounts of farmers who have sold their grain. He further clarified that the government remains steadfastly committed to the welfare of farmers. “““(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...April 24):- Telangana Agricultural Workers Union District General Secretary Kondamadugu Narasimha criticized the Modi government for conspiring to keep such wealth creators away from employment, saying that employment-guaranteed workers are acting as wealth creators in rural areas. They demanded that the workers be supported by providing basic facilities at the workplace of employment-guaranteed workers. After visiting the employment-guaranteed work site under the auspices of Telangana Agricultural Workers Union in Kurella village under Atmakur mandal on Friday and



raising the problems of the workers, Narasimha said that employment-guaranteed workers in rural areas are not just doing work but are strengthening the rural economy by providing basic facilities. He said that through the employment guarantee scheme, the employment laborers are increasing their permanent assets in rural areas through works like desilting ponds, constructing gullies, earthworks, construction of roads, construction of canals and planting saplings. He criticized the Modi government for repealing the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act and bringing the VB-G Ramji Act to keep the employment guarantee workers, who play a key role in the rural economy, away from work. He demanded that the old law be continued and e-KYC be lifted. He said that workers are facing many conditions at work, such as drying themselves in the scorching sun, not having drinking water, and not having medical kits in case of an accident. He also demanded that the workplace be provided with basic facilities. He suggested that the government should provide 200 working days a year in the employment guarantee scheme and give a daily wage of eight hundred rupees, pay an ex-gratia of 10 lakh rupees in case of death in an accident, and pay compensation until recovery if injured. To achieve these goals, Narasimha called for a large-scale participation of agricultural laborers and employment-guaranteed workers in the mandal-level conference being held in Kurella village on May 4th. ## Fire accident at Parsha Nayak Thanda – Maize crop on 6 acres burnt

Narsampet/Warangal, April 24 (Indian Chronicle) : A major fire accident occurred on Friday at Parsha Nayak Thanda, located in the 16th ward of the town. Around 1 PM, flames suddenly broke out and completely destroyed nearly 6 acres of maize crop that was ready for harvest. The affected crop belonged to farmers Banothu Sammayya, Banoth Megha, Banothu Ravi, Banoth Kishan, Banothu Narayana, Bhanoth Sarayya, Bhanoth Hari Singh, and Bhanoth Veeraswamy. The incident occurred at a crucial time when the crop was about to be harvested,



leaving the farmers' families in deep distress. Local residents who noticed the fire tried to douse the flames and informed the fire station. Fire service personnel arrived on time and brought the fire under control, preventing it from spreading to nearby fields. On receiving information about the incident, local councillor Bhanoth Naveen Nayak reached the spot and consoled the affected farmers. At his initiative, revenue officials (RI) and GPOs conducted a field inspection and prepared a damage report (panchanama). Farmers expressed anguish, stating that the fire accident caused an estimated loss of around ₹10 lakh. Speaking on the occasion, Councillor Naveen Nayak said that the farmers were shocked to see the crop they had cultivated with great effort turn to ashes before their eyes. He noted that the farmers are now at risk of falling into debt as they may not even recover their investment. He demanded that the government respond immediately and provide special compensation to the affected farmers.

Calls household data collection a primary civic duty; urges self-enumeration ahead of field survey.

Karimnagar April 24 (Correspondent) : District Collector Chitra Mishra on Friday urged citizens to actively participate in the Census 2027, describing it as the country's largest participatory exercise and vital for planning development.



Unveiling awareness flex banners at the Collectorate Conference Hall under the slogan "Our Census – Our Development," Ms. Mishra said that recording information of every household was a primary responsibility of all citizens. The awareness campaign at the Collectorate is aimed at informing visitors and facilitating wider outreach, she said, adding that collective responsibility was key to the successful conduct of the Census.

## "Are arrests the answer to democratic protest?" Former BRS MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy

## Negligence by Power Officials Leaves Woman in Distress

“““MEDCHAL- MALKAJGIRI, April 24 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Kushaiguda, A resident of Jai Jawan Colony in Kushaiguda has alleged serious negligence by electricity department officials over a long-pending safety issue. Srilatha stated that she has been approaching authorities for the past eight years, requesting the removal of 11 kV high-tension power lines passing directly over her house, but no action has been taken. According to her, despite submitting multiple representations, officials have failed to respond, leaving the family under constant risk. She said that during her recent attempt to resolve the issue, officials informed her that the lines would be shifted only if she paid a contribution of ₹1,92,000. When she asked for official sanction documents, they allegedly failed to provide clear information and instead demanded nearly ₹4 lakh. Srilatha said she is not in a financial position to pay such a huge amount. Questioning the demand, she said if they had such money, they would not be living in a slum area. She expressed concern that the overhead high-voltage lines pose a serious threat and could lead to a major accident at any time. She further alleged that officials made irresponsible remarks, stating that in case of any fatal accident, compensation of ₹5 lakh would be provided through insurance. This comment has triggered anger among local residents, who described it as highly insensitive and negligent. Colony residents and local representatives have urged higher authorities to intervene immediately, take strict action against the concerned officials, and provide a permanent solution to the affected family.
