

Dowry ban..Police should cooperate to strictly implement the ban on child marriage:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Chief Justice A. Jayaraju

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...April 25):- On the instructions of the District Legal Services Authority, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri President, and District Chief Justice A. Jayaraju, First Additional District Judge P. An awareness and review conference was organized on the premises of Muktda Court on issues such as child marriage, dowry ban, POCSO Act, compensation provided to victims, coordination of relevant departments, legal aid, etc. Speaking on this occasion, the judge said that the Honorable Supreme Court has made appropriate suggestions to eradicate the evil practice of dowry. According to these suggestions, legal science seminars, action plan programs, and appropriate training should be given to all sections of society on dowry ban, especially the National Legal Service Authority has prepared a national scheme with awareness, support, assistance, and measures for the prohibition of child marriage. To implement this scheme throughout the district, Child Line, Education Department, Medical and Health Department, Welfare Department, and Police Departments should cooperate with the District Legal Service Authority and take effective measures to strictly implement the prohibition of child marriage. He said that the police, welfare departments, and Child Line should work together on the issues of resolving POCSO cases, protection, rehabilitation, and compensation for victims. All Legitimate Issues Raised in Praja Darbar Will Be Resolved: Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy

“Khammam, Tirumalayapalem, April 25 (Indian Chronicle):” State Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy assured that every genuine grievance submitted during Praja Darbar will be resolved within a maximum of three months. “The minister participated in a Praja Darbar program held on Saturday at the Zilla Parishad High School premises in Subled village of Tirumalayapalem mandal. He inaugurated the event by lighting the ceremonial lamp, along with Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt and Additional Collectors Dr. P. Srija and P. Srinivas Reddy. “Addressing the gathering, the minister said that the government, under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, is committed to the welfare of the poor, focusing on providing security and assurance. He stated that the government is completing pending works, continuing effective schemes from the previous administration, and implementing election promises without neglecting development. “He highlighted that instead of making people visit government offices repeatedly, officials were sent directly to villages in the early days of governance to collect applications and deliver welfare schemes. As part of the 99-day Praja Palana progress plan, one department each week is addressing issues raised by villagers. “The minister explained that in the Paleru constituency, each mandal has been divided into three clusters, with Praja Darbars being conducted in each cluster to understand local issues firsthand. He reiterated that all legitimate applications received during these programs would be resolved within three months. “He noted that around 55% of the applications received in Nelakondapalli mandal were related to Indiramma housing. After the current government assumed power, 4.5 lakh houses have been sanctioned, and funds are being released based on construction progress, increasing public confidence. “The minister also announced that eligible beneficiaries would receive houses in the second phase in May and in subsequent phases. He added that land issues arising from the Dharani system are being addressed through the Bhu Bharati initiative, and applications related to simple land transactions (Sada Bainama) will also be resolved. “Applications concerning Aasara pensions, ration cards, roads, and drainage systems will be addressed systematically. He urged people to submit applications calmly, assuring that every grievance would be accepted and processed. “The minister further announced that approval has been sought for a new police station in Subled village, and its foundation stone will be laid soon. “Khammam Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt stated that the Praja Darbar program is an important initiative under the Praja Palana progress plan, where officials from all departments directly interact with the public to receive complaints. While some issues can be resolved immediately, others may take time, but all will be addressed. He also requested public cooperation to ensure the smooth conduct of the program. “Additional Collector Dr. P. Srija said that a Praja Darbar was successfully conducted earlier in Nelakondapalli mandal and is now continuing in Tirumalayapalem. She emphasized that resolving grievances is a hallmark of good governance and assured that every application would be followed up. “The event was attended by district officials, RDO Srinivas, Tahsildar, MPDO, sarpanches of various villages, public representatives, and local residents.

PM Narendra Modi to Visit Telangana on May 9

“Khammam, April 25 (Indian Chronicle): Prime Minister Narendra Modi is scheduled to visit Telangana on May 9. During his tour, he will officially lay the foundation stone for the development works of Warangal Airport. Upon arrival in Warangal, the Prime Minister will first visit the Bhadrakali Temple, where he will offer special prayers. Later, he will attend a public meeting at the Arts and Science College Grounds in Hanamkonda. From the same stage, he is expected to launch multiple development projects, including national highways and railway initiatives, along with the airport project. The event, titled “Vijaya Sankalpa Sabha,” is being planned on a grand scale by the state unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party, aiming to draw a crowd of around 500,000 people. The visit is also seen as a significant move to energize BJP cadres in the state, where the party has been gaining strength. Remove 24-Quintal-Per-Acre Cap

“““Set Up Maize Procurement Centre at Gurijala Society — Sarpanch Banoth Kavitha

“““Gurijala/Warangal, April 25 (Indian Chronicle) : “Sarpanch Banoth Kavitha demanded that the government remove the 24-quintal-per-acre procurement limit and establish a maize procurement centre at the Gurijala Society to support farmers. On Saturday, under the aegis of the BRS village committee of Gunturupalli, she inspected heaps of dried maize brought by farmers. “Speaking on the occasion, Banoth Kavitha recalled that earlier, under the supervision of PACS and during the government of K. Chandrashekar Rao, a maize procurement centre was set up at Gurijala, ensuring smooth purchases for farmers from Gurijala and all villages within the society’s limits. She also mentioned that maize procurement was once carried out directly from Gunturupalli village using lorries. “She expressed concern that although many farmers in the villages under the Gurijala



Society have cultivated maize this season, the absence of a procurement centre is causing severe hardship. She urged the government to respond immediately and set up a maize procurement centre within the Gurijala Society limits to assist farmers. “Banoth Kavitha stated that the government’s decision to procure only up to 24 quintals per acre is unreasonable, noting that the average yield can reach up to 40 quintals per acre. Main Accused Arrested in Massive Cash Fraud Case Operated Under “Divine Group of Company

“““Indian Chronicle, Jade Srinivas, April, 25. ““Police achieved a major breakthrough in a large-scale financial fraud case reported under Kagaznagar Town Police Station limits. District SP Nithika Pant disclosed that the main accused, Thakur Shivaranginibai, was arrested for allegedly cheating people by running a fake business under the name “Divine Group of Company.” She revealed the details during a press conference held at the District Police Office, Komaram



Bheem Asifabad. According to police, the accused lured victims by promising high returns ranging from 5% to 20% on investments and collected huge amounts of money from the public. “The present case was registered as Cr.No. 23/2026 under Sections 420, 409 IPC and Section 5 of the Telangana Protection of Depositors of Financial Establishment Act, 1999 at PS Kagaznagar Town, involving fraud of ₹1.08 crore. The accused persons are: A1. Thakur Karan Singh – absconding “A2. Thakur Ratan Singh – absconding “A3. Thakur Ravinder Laddu Singh – absconding “A4. Thakur Shivaranginibai – arrested “A5. Thakur Rana Singh – absconding “Police also stated that several other cases are pending against the accused, including cases in Kagaznagar Town, Penchikalpet, Lalaguda, and CCS Hyderabad police stations. With all these cases combined, fraud worth crores of rupees has been reported. “On 24.04.2026, police apprehended Thakur Shivaranginibai in Secunderabad and later produced her before the court, seeking 15 days judicial remand. Police said the accused had stayed in Kagaznagar town between August 2021 and January 2023, gained the trust of local people, cheated them, and later absconded. So far, three more complainants are ready to file complaints against the accused. “Search operations are continuing to trace the remaining absconding accused. SP Nithika Pant appreciated Kagaznagar DSP Waheeduddin, Town Inspector Prem Kumar, SI Raju, Women Constables Lakshmi, Joshna, Blessy, Shameena, and Constable Vijay for their efforts in arresting the accused.
