Training for Teachers on Census 2027 – 249 Staff Deployed in Zaheerabad



““Zaheerabad April 25 (Indian Chronicle):“Sangareddy district authorities have made elaborate arrangements for the upcoming house listing phase of Census 2027, scheduled to begin from May 11 in Zaheerabad. As part of the preparations, a three-day training program was conducted for teachers who will serve as enumerators. ““Master trainers Tulasiram Rathod, D. Srinivas, and Omkar Swamy jointly imparted training, providing comprehensive guidance on census procedures, data collection methods, and field-level responsibilities. On the final day of the training, census kits were distributed to the participants. ““According to Master Trainer Dr. Tulasiram Rathod, the town of Zaheerabad has been divided into 37 wards and further segmented into 199 blocks. A total of 199 enumerators have been appointed to carry out the census operations, supported by 37 supervisors. Including reserve personnel, a total of 249 teachers have been

deployed for the census work. ““He emphasized that enumerators must carry out their duties with utmost accuracy and ensure there is no scope for errors in the enumeration process. In case of any doubts, they have been instructed to directly approach the in-charge officers for clarification. ““He also advised them to seek support from local public representatives and officials while conducting fieldwork in their respective blocks. ““For administrative coordination, Revenue Officer Dasarath has been appointed as the charge officer for the rural areas, while Municipal Commissioner Jaitram will oversee the census operations in urban areas. ““Officials stated that all necessary arrangements have been put in place to ensure the smooth and successful conduct of Census 2027 in the region.

Collector urges wide participation in self-enumeration for Census 2027

Online exercise from April 26 to May 10; district readies machinery for digital census.

Karimnagar April 26 (Correspondent) : District Collector Chitra Mishra on Sunday called for large-scale public participation in the self-enumeration exercise for Census 2027, underscoring its role in improving the accuracy and reliability of population data used for governance and planning.



Addressing a press conference at the Collectorate, Ms. Mishra said the self-enumeration facility would be available from April 26 to May 10, enabling households to submit their details online using mobile phones. The process, she said, was designed to be simple, secure and transparent, with all information collected to be kept confidential.

The digital questionnaire will cover 34 parameters, including housing conditions, access to basic amenities, religion, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes status, drinking water sources and cooking fuel. The data, she noted, would aid evidence-based policymaking and equitable distribution of resources.

Residents can access the self-enumeration portal (<https://se.census.gov.in>), log in using their mobile number, geo-tag their residence and complete the process in about 15 minutes. On submission, an 11-digit self-enumeration ID beginning with the letter “H” will be generated. This ID must be preserved and shared with enumerators during field verification.

The first phase of the census — house listing — will be conducted from May 11 to June 10, during which enumerators will visit households to validate the data. The second phase, involving collection of individual details, is scheduled from February 9 to 25, 2027. Officials clarified that residents should participate in the census at their place of current residence, irrespective of their native district or State. The Collector said the district administration had drawn up a comprehensive plan for the exercise. A total of 1,234 enumerators and 215 supervisors have been deployed across 1,227 house-listing blocks in 16 mandals and urban local bodies. In the Karimnagar Municipal Corporation limits, 666 blocks have been identified, with 733 enumerators and 122 supervisors assigned. Training programmes are under way for all personnel involved. Additional Collector (Revenue) D. Srinivas Reddy has been designated as the nodal officer at the district level, with Tahsildars and municipal commissioners functioning as charge officers in rural and urban areas respectively. Reiterating that no supporting documents such as Aadhaar, voter ID or ration card need to be uploaded, Ms. Mishra sought to allay concerns over data privacy and urged citizens to participate without hesitation. A toll-free helpline (1855) has been set up to assist users facing difficulties. Earlier, the Collector formally launched the self-enumeration process by registering her own details, describing the census as a vital national exercise that provides a comprehensive picture of socio-economic conditions and supports effective governance.

BJP, BRS acted in concert during Karimnagar civic polls, alleges Congress leader

Says Mayor election and co-option process point to "tacit coordination" between parties.

Karimnagar April 26 (Correspondent) : Alleging coordinated action between the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), Karimnagar City Congress president and corporator Vaidyula Anjan Kumar on Saturday said developments during the recent Mayor election and the subsequent co-option process in the Karimnagar Municipal Corporation indicated a "tacit understanding" between the two parties.

Addressing a press conference, Mr. Anjan Kumar claimed that the BJP, despite not having adequate numbers during the Mayor election, secured the required quorum with the support of BRS corporators. He said the outcome pointed to a "pre-arranged understanding" between the parties.



Referring to the co-option election held on Friday, he alleged that the support extended by BRS members to the BJP reinforced the perception of coordination. The Congress, he said, had boycotted the co-option process to draw public attention to what it described as a nexus between the two parties.

He also questioned the participation of the BRS in the co-option exercise despite its political positioning, and raised concerns over the selection of co-opted members, stating that the process required closer scrutiny in the context of provisions of the Municipal Act.

Mr. Anjan Kumar further alleged that public statements by leaders of the BJP and the BRS projecting political rivalry were at variance with their conduct during the elections. He said the electorate was closely observing the developments.

Leaders of the BJP and the BRS were not immediately available for comment.
