# One Unit Sealed, Two Still Operating "Illegal Bolt Manufacturing Units in Residential Area Trouble Locals

"MEDCHAL- MALKAJGIRI, April 27 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Residents of Arun Jyothi Colony in Bansilalpet Division under GHMC Kavadiguda Circle 40 are facing severe hardship due to illegal iron bolt manufacturing units operating in the middle of residential houses. Continuous air and noise pollution from these units has made daily life difficult for the locals. Alleging negligence by authorities, several residents approached the High Court. Following court directions, GHMC officials recently conducted a field inspection and cancelled the trade licenses of two units operating in the colony. Subsequently, one unit was sealed. Residents have demanded that authorities immediately seal these remaining units and relocate them permanently from the residential area.

He said that steps are being taken



to provide employment and job opportunities to the youth who have completed 18 years through the DRDA department. “He clarified that the government will support these children in every way and is committed to their comprehensive development. “District Welfare Officer Lalitha Kumari said that all the necessary facilities are being provided to the children in all the childcare institutions in the district under the supervision of the government. She said that special attention is being paid to the welfare of the children by inspecting the CCIs every week. “As part of this program, aftercare certificates were issued to 10 children who have crossed the age of 18. “CWC members Venkatesham, Vishnu Murthy, DCPO Ratnam, DLPO Anitha, DMHO Vasantha Rao, DRDA MPT Surya Rao, Lead Bank Manager, Child Line Coordinators Yadagiri, Lingam, CCI representatives and staff, etc. participated in this program.

## Neat arrangements should be made for NEET (UG)-2026 exam:: District Collector Prateek Jain

“Sangareddy, April 27:--indian chronicle correspondent“District Collector Prateek Jain has instructed the concerned officials to make all arrangements for the smooth conduct of the NEET (UG)-2026 entrance exam to be conducted in the district without any room for mistakes. “A meeting of the District Level Coordination Committee was held at the Collectorate Conference Hall on Monday along with District SP Paritosh Pankaj. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector suggested that steps should be taken to ensure that the candidates appearing for the NEET exam to be conducted on May 3 (Sunday) from 2.00 pm to 5.00 pm do not face any difficulties. “A total of 2,772 candidates will appear for the exam in the district, and 8 examination centers have been set up for this. It was stated that candidates will be allowed to enter the examination centers only from 11.00 am to 1.30 pm. Candidates are advised to reach the centers early in view of the



processes like biometric attendance, registration and verification. “Candidates are advised to affix one passport size photograph on the admit card and bring another passport size photograph along with a recent photo ID proof. It was clarified that items like mobile phones, electronic devices, wallets, watches, belts, chains, earrings, bangles, rings and other ornaments will not be allowed in the examination centers. Candidates are requested to strictly follow the rules. “It

was suggested that CCTV cameras be installed in every examination center and surveillance be tightened, and police security be provided for the transportation of question papers and the security of answer sheets after the examination. “The District Medical and Health Department officials were instructed to set up first aid centers at the examination centers and keep ORS packets and necessary medicines ready. “He said that the electricity department officials should take steps to ensure continuous supply of electricity without interruption on the exam day and ensure that facilities like drinking water, toilets, sanitation are available. “The Collector said that this exam is very crucial for the future of the students and asked the officials of all the departments to work in coordination and conduct the exam successfully. “Additional Collector Pandu, officials of the concerned departments, center superintendents, deputy superintendents, observers, DMHO, Municipal Commissioner, RTO, RTC, electricity department officials, etc. participated in this meeting.

## Development Works Hit as Constituency Funds Withheld: Talasani

“Hyderabad correspondent, April 27 (Indian Chronicle): Alleging that the suspension of constituency development funds by the Congress government has severely impacted grassroots governance, former minister and Sanath Nagar MLA Talasani Srinivas Yadav on Monday said even minor civic issues are becoming difficult to resolve. He made these remarks during a field visit to Leela Nagar Colony in Ameerpet division, where he inspected local conditions along with officials from various departments. At an interaction held in the colony committee hall, residents raised concerns over rising anti-social activities during night hours,



inadequate street lighting, and safety issues, particularly affecting women. They pointed out that overgrown tree branches were obstructing streetlights, leaving several stretches in darkness. Responding promptly, the MLA directed horticulture officials to trim the branches and instructed the electrical department to restore and install streetlights wherever required. He also spoke to police officials over the phone, urging intensified night patrolling in the area. Officials were asked to prepare proposals for the construction of the main road and ensure immediate removal of silt from the drainage system. Emphasising community participation, he suggested installation of CCTV cameras under the colony association and advised regular meetings to flag civic issues. Recalling the previous BRS government's tenure, Talasani said ₹5 crore per constituency was allocated annually to address public issues, whereas the current government's lack of planning has led to recurring drinking water problems. ## Review with medical officers of primary health centers through Google Meet:- District Collector.

.Magistrate Anurag Jayanti“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle... April 27):- On (Monday) day, under the auspices of Collector District Magistrate Anurag Jayanti, a review meeting was held on the performance of the District Medical Health Department, Telangana Vaidya Vidhana Parishad, Director of Medical Education, Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District, and TGMSIDC departments in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district. On this occasion, a review was conducted with the medical officers of the primary health centers through Google Meet. In the meeting, the NQAS certification of health centers, diagnostic tests conducted through T-Hub, pending civil works in hospitals, pending statutory meetings, registration of pregnant women and 3 and 4 government hospital check-ups, details of deliveries in government hospitals, TB detection targets, NCD screening, cancer screening, RBSK report etc. were extensively reviewed. Similarly, details of OP, IP, deliveries, Arogyasri, Arogya Mahila, TIFFA scans, equipment malfunctions, shortage of reagents etc. were ordered to be collected from GGH, area hospitals and CHCs. On this occasion, the Honorable Collector ordered to increase screening in the low performing centers in the NCD program in the district. He directed the TGMSIDC officials to complete the pending civil works in the hospitals at the earliest. The NQAS preparation should be completed in the selected centers in the district and all primary health centers and Vaidya Vidhan Parishad hospitals should achieve at least 80% score. It was suggested that the internal assessment should be completed in all the selected centers before the state assessment to be held in the month of June. “Similarly, it was ordered to take appropriate precautions keeping in mind the heat wave conditions and prepare an advance action plan to prevent mosquito-borne diseases. It was suggested that anemia screening should be conducted among adolescent girls through RBSK teams and necessary measures should be taken to provide treatment for deworming in young children. It was also directed that the officials should review the progress of cancer screening programs being conducted in the district and submit a complete report on the details of cancer screening and the number of cancer patients district-wise.” The Honorable Collector has directed the TGMSIDC, EE, officials to complete the ongoing civil works at the Nursing College in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district, the 100-bed hospital in Yadagirigutta, Choutuppal CHC, Ramannapet CHC and Bhuvanagiri GGH expeditiously within the stipulated time limits, and to continuously review the progress of the works and implement them without any delay. Additional Collector (LB) Bhaskar Rao, District Medical and Health Officer Dr. Manohar DCHS Dr. M.S. ## Fuel Supply to Stabilize in 1–2 Days: Additional Collector Reviews Situation in Medchal–Malkajgiri

“MEDCHAL- MALKAJGIRI, April 27 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Additional Collector D. Vijayender Reddy conducted a teleconference with oil companies to review the fuel supply situation across the district. Fuel sales have surged due to panic buying, resulting in temporary shortages at some petrol pumps. Officials said Indian Oil Corporation (IOCL), Bharat Petroleum (BPCL), and Hindustan Petroleum (HPCL) have increased fuel supply to meet the rising demand. Fuel depots are operating until midnight to ensure continuous distribution. Authorities stated that 80 to 90 percent of fuel stations will receive stock by this evening, while the remaining outlets will be replenished by tomorrow morning. The Additional Collector clarified that sufficient fuel stocks are available in the district and urged the public not to indulge in panic buying. Police support will be deployed to control crowds and maintain order at fuel stations. Officials said the situation is expected to return to normal within one to two days.



## Collector Suspends Panchayat Secretary Over MGNREGS Fund Misuse

“Indian Chronicle, Kagaznagar, April 27: In a significant action against financial irregularities, District Collector K. Haritha has suspended a Panchayat Secretary for allegedly diverting funds under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme. “Ashok, serving as Panchayat Secretary of Gangapur village in Chintalamanepally mandal of Komaram Bheem district, was found to have redirected payments meant for genuine beneficiaries to other accounts, besides showing negligence in official duties. “The action follows complaints regarding irregularities in the clearance of bills for CC road works executed under MGNREGS. A detailed field inquiry confirmed that payments were made in violation of guidelines, bypassing actual beneficiaries. “Issuing the suspension orders on Saturday, the Collector reiterated that transparency and accountability in the use of public funds are non-negotiable. She cautioned that any negligence in the execution of development works or welfare schemes would invite strict disciplinary action.

## At Least You Should Resolve Journalists' Issues

“: TWJF State President Mamidi Somayya“

“— A Memorandum of Long-Pending Issues Submitted to the New Commissioner

“(Hyderabad – Indian Chronicle – April 27): “Mamidi Somayya, State President of the Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF), appealed to Mukunda Reddy—the newly appointed Special Commissioner of the State Department of Information and Public Relations—to immediately resolve the various issues facing journalists, noting that these matters have been pending for a considerable time. On Monday, accompanied by several federation leaders, he met Mukunda Reddy—who recently assumed charge as Special Commissioner—to offer his congratulations and to present a memorandum detailing the pending issues concerning journalists. Mamidi Somayya pointed out that there were no budgetary allocations made specifically for journalists' welfare. He alleged that, over the past two years, the government has shown a dismissive attitude toward journalists' welfare as well as toward small and medium-sized newspapers and periodicals. He further stated that there has been a lack of adequate advertising support; moreover, the government has failed to clear the bills for advertisements already issued, resulting in publishers plunging into a severe financial crisis. Expressing his deep concern to the Commissioner, he highlighted that not only have bills for government advertisements remained unpaid for the last two years, but the government has also completely halted the issuance of advertisements to periodicals over the past few months. Consequently—caught between a lack of fresh government advertisements on one hand and the non-receipt of pending payments on the other—numerous small and medium-sized newspapers and periodicals have been grappling with a severe financial crisis for the past two years. Similarly, the empanelment of numerous small and medium-sized newspapers in the state has been kept pending for many years. Consequently, many journalist-publishers are facing severe difficulties as they are unable to bear the financial burden. Newspapers operating with approvals from the RNI and PRGI are not receiving government advertisements; they are not even being issued accreditation cards. Therefore, we urge the authorities to resolve these issues immediately and extend support to the small and medium-sized newspapers in the state. Furthermore, funds must be allocated in the budget specifically for the welfare of journalists. “No clarity has been provided regarding the issuance of accreditation cards to cable channels. Government Order (G.O.) 252 needs to be amended to ensure that accreditation cards are issued to cable channels in accordance with the previous procedure. Furthermore, journalists have not yet been provided with houses or housing plots. It was pointed out that while many other states provide pensions to senior journalists, not a single senior journalist in our state is currently receiving a pension. Mamidi Somayya noted with concern that new accreditation cards have not been issued to journalists for the past two years; instead, the validity of existing cards is merely being extended by affixing a sticker every two months. He highlighted that although three months have elapsed since the issuance of G.O. 252—which paved the way for new accreditation cards—the cards have yet to be distributed; this delay is particularly alarming given that the validity of the old cards is set to expire in just two days. Additionally, the Chief Minister had promised to issue health cards to journalists—similar to those provided to government employees—but these, too, have not yet been issued. Therefore, they stated that they earnestly request the Commissioner to examine these issues favorably and take steps to resolve them. Those who met with the Commissioner included Mamidi Somayya, along with Federation State Co-convenor Tanniru Srinivas, State Council Member Samrat Gupta, Hyderabad District Convener M. Ravikumar, Co-convenor R. Srinivas Goud, and State leaders Govind, Ravi Kumar, Brahmam, among others. “Issues Requiring Resolution“1. Allocate Rs. 100 crores in the State Budget for the welfare of journalists.“2. Immediately clear all pending advertisement bill arrears due to small and medium-sized newspapers and periodicals.“3. Empanel small and medium-sized daily newspapers and periodicals that demonstrate regularity in publication.“4. Release government advertisements to small newspapers on a regular basis, on par with large newspapers.“5. Empanel small and medium-sized newspapers that demonstrate regularity in publication.“6. Issue accreditation cards to un-empanelled newspapers that are currently operating with valid RNI and PRGI registrations.“7. Issue accreditation cards to Cable TV channels adhering to the previous methodology; Government Order (G.O.) 252 must be amended.“8. Issue accreditation cards and health cards to all eligible journalists.“9. Allot house sites to all journalists, irrespective of the Supreme Court verdict. 10. Pensions should be provided to retired senior journalists.“11. New accreditation cards should be issued to journalists immediately.“12. Health cards should be provided to journalists, similar to those given to government employees.



## Massive Vector Control Drive Conducted in Boduppall Under 99-Day Action Plan

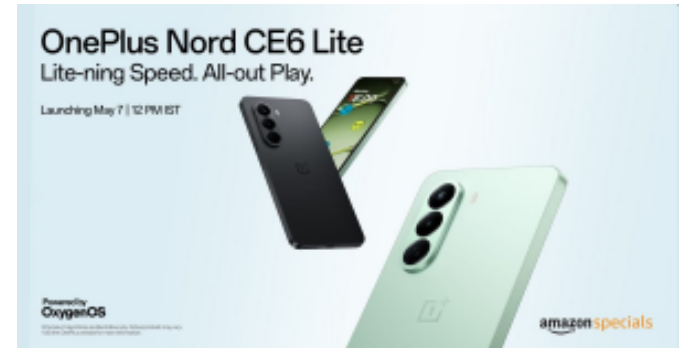

## Lion Dr. Kiron Hosts Autism Round Table Session

Hyderabad: Suchirindia Foundation, under the leadership of Lion Dr. Kiron, Honorary Consul of the Republic of Bulgaria and CEO of Suchirindia Group, organized a Round Table Session on Autism Intervention & Inclusion titled "Understanding Minds, Empowering Lives" at Ravindra Bharathi Mini Conference Hall on 27th April, 2026. He pointed out that stigma and social fear often make it difficult for parents to accept the condition early, while some schools hesitate to admit children with special needs or fail to create inclusive environments. He also emphasized the financial burden on families, noting that autism intervention and therapies can cost between \*Rs. 40,000 and Rs. 60,000 per month\*, making treatment difficult for many economically weaker households.
