

## SP issues strict orders on crimes in Rajanna Siricilla



“Rajanna Siricilla April 28 (Indian Chronicle): District SP Mahesh B. Gite has ordered to conduct a comprehensive investigation into the cases registered in the district and take steps to ensure that the accused are punished. He spoke at a crime review meeting held at the district police office. The SP, who reviewed the pending cases, arrests of the accused, progress of the investigation and execution of warrants by police station-wise, suggested that special focus be placed on old cases. He said that pending cases should be resolved expeditiously and justice should be served to the victims. He suggested that efforts should be made to ensure that the accused are punished by conducting an impartial investigation in every case and that coordination with judicial officers should be increased. He warned that there should be no negligence in the execution of non-bailable warrants issued by the courts. He said that modern technology should be used to prevent thefts, and the recovery rate should be increased by increasing the speed of solving cases. He ordered that awareness programs on child protection and drug prevention be organized in every police station as part of the Public Governance-Progress Plan. He said that surveillance should be increased on anti-social activities and surprise checks should be carried out on rowdies and history sheeters. He clarified that strict action should be taken against the transportation and use of marijuana. He suggested that drunk and drive checks and vehicle checks should be conducted regularly to prevent road accidents and strict action should be taken against those who violate the rules. ### Case Registered Against Lorry Driver for Negligence

...“Zaheerabad April 28 (Indian Chronicle ):“In a tragic road accident that occurred in the early hours of Tuesday, two persons sustained serious injuries near Indraprastha Venture under Zaheerabad town limits in Sangareddy district.““According to police sources, the complainant Channa Basappa (son of Siddi Ramappa) owns a car bearing registration number KA40 A 8911, which was being driven by Bhinnaiah on a rental trip from Hyderabad to Gulbarga. At around 06:40 AM, when the vehicle reached near Indraprastha Venture in Zaheerabad, a lorry bearing registration number MH 25 P 5647, moving ahead of the car, reportedly applied sudden brakes without any caution.““As a result, the car following behind rammed into the lorry, leading to a severe collision. In the accident, the car driver Bhinnaiah and one passenger traveling in the vehicle sustained grievous

## Collector Warns of Strict Action Against Sale of Fake Seeds in Rajanna Sircilla

““Rajanna Sircilla, April 28 (Indian Chronicle): District Collector Garima Agrawal has warned of strict action against those involved in the sale of fake seeds in the district. She chaired a review meeting with agriculture, horticulture, cooperative, and police officials at the Integrated District Offices Complex (IDOC) in view of the upcoming Kharif season. The Collector directed officials from the agriculture and police departments to conduct joint inspections to curb the sale of



spurious seeds. She instructed that cases must be registered against anyone found selling seeds without proper company details or authorization. Farmers were also advised not to purchase seeds from unauthorized vendors. Highlighting progress on the Farmers Registry, she stated that 73% of the process has been completed and urged officials to expedite the remaining registrations by directly reaching out to farmers and procurement centers. As per state government directives, the Collector emphasized increasing the cultivation area of fine varieties of paddy and oil palm. She noted that the government is providing fine rice through ration shops, residential schools, and mid-day meal schemes, along with a ?500 bonus, encouraging farmers to take up fine paddy cultivation. She also stressed the importance of oil palm cultivation for higher and long-term income, directing officials to motivate interested farmers. Targets were assigned to horticulture and agriculture officials at various levels to expand oil palm cultivation, and steps were ordered to ensure timely supply of drip irrigation systems and saplings to farmers who have already made payments. ## Some land grabbers and brokers tried to occupy the road leading from Husnabad to Hanmapuram...

The trees planted across the road...the brokers fled as soon as the revenue officials entered the field. "If a government road is encroached upon...if trees are planted across the road, legal action will be taken against them:- Bhuvanagiri Tahsildar Jaganmohan" (Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...April 28):- When some land grabbers and brokers tried to block the

road leading from Husnabad to Hanmapuram by planting trees, the farmers there complained to Bhuvanagiri Tahsildar Jaganmohan, who immediately sent revenue staff and the Hanumapuram secretary to the scene and took up an investigation. The real landowners are facing many difficulties in survey numbers 205, 207, 208 as the landowners are short of land. Some brokers have deceived them that there is surplus land in the respective survey numbers..they have five hours of land per acre and have registered it secretly..for 50 years, the fake landowners Marri Vasantha, Marri Chandrayya and their sons, (who have no land, no paper cover..the fake landowners Allam Mallesha and his sons who sold the land once) have been paying them off..the brokers Nakkala Anjaiah, Gundeboina Narasimha, come to the landowners' lands on Tuesday mornings and plant fences..plant fences across the roads...measure the land night after night, plant fences..this has become their daily occupation. Threatening the



landowners as if these lands are theirs.. and the landowners come and take them away.. has been happening for the past year and a half. In this regard, the agricultural landowners, Mandava Srisailam and Allam Mahesh Niranjana Reddy, have complained to the police several times.. but to date, there has been no result.. the land grabbers.. the brokers.. have become more agitated.. and are trying to seize the government road itself..

When the agricultural landowners complained to the Bonagiri Tahsildar on Tuesday afternoon, he sent his staff to the scene.. Although he asked the fake landowners to remove the trees planted across the road.. but since they did not remove them, they said that they would report the matter to their concerned officer, the Tahsildar. When Bhuvanagiri Tahsildar Jaganmohan was asked to explain this matter, he sternly warned that whoever tries to close the government road from Husnabad to Hanmapuram, who planted obstacles, should remove them immediately, otherwise legal action will be taken against them. Although land grabbers and brokers are eyeing the lands of agricultural farmers in Husnabad... despite the agricultural pattees complaining to the police on this matter several times... what is the point in the police acting as if they are not involved... people are questioning. At least the senior police officers should take the initiative and register land grabbing cases against the land grabbers and illegal brokers and take legal action against those involved, the land mafia and bigwigs who are inciting the anonymous people and take steps to ensure peace in Husnabad village.



## Focus on Strengthening Basic Infrastructure in Villages

Geesugonda, April 28 (Indian Chronicle) : Revuri Prakash Reddy, MLA of Parkal, instructed officials to pay special attention to improving basic infrastructure in villages and to take necessary steps to ensure that all eligible beneficiaries receive government welfare schemes.

On Tuesday, the MLA held a review meeting with officials at the MPDO office in Geesugonda mandal as part of the Mandal-level Praja Palana--Pragati Pranalika review. He emphasized the need to focus particularly on essential amenities such as drinking water, electricity, and drainage systems.

The MLA further called for stringent action against the manufacture of illicit liquor and urged vigilance against illegal activities related to ganja and narcotic substances, asking officials to respond promptly to any such information. He directed all department officials to work in coordination for the overall development of villages. He also emphasized strict monitoring of rice distribution at ration shops and reiterated that every eligible person must receive the benefits of government welfare schemes.

# Awareness Seminar on IIHT Diploma Admissions Held in Warangal



“Kothawada/Warangal, April 28 (Indian Chronicle) : An awareness seminar on admissions to the three-year diploma courses for the academic year 2026–27 at the Indian Institute of Handloom Technology (IIHT) was conducted on Tuesday at the Padmashali Welfare Trust Building in Kothawada. The programme was presided over by Assistant Director of Handlooms and Textiles, Srikant Reddy. Principal OSD of the Textile Department, V. Himaja Kumar, and TPCC Handloom Cell State Working President Chippa Venkateshwarlu

Naetha attended as chief guests. Speaking on the occasion, Chippa Venkateshwarlu said that earlier, students aspiring to join handloom technology courses had to travel to Salem in Tamil Nadu and Venkatagiri in Andhra Pradesh, where limited seats and stiff competition posed challenges for students from Telangana. He noted that despite repeated representations to the previous government for establishing such an institute in Telangana, there was no response. Later, upon a representation made through Minister Konda Surekha to Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, the diploma course in Handloom and Textile Technology was started with 60 seats at the premises of Potti Sreeramulu Telugu University in Hyderabad, with the approval of the Central Government. V. Himaja Kumar informed that students seeking admission must have passed the SSC (10th class) or an equivalent examination. The upper age limit as of July 1 is 23 years for BC and General category students, and 25 years for SC and ST students. The course duration is three years, comprising six semesters. He further stated that each student will receive a monthly stipend of ₹2,500 from the State Government, while the annual fee is only ₹4,050. Hostel facilities will also be arranged near Potti Sreeramulu Telugu University at Nampally. Assistant Director Srikant Reddy advised students to submit completed applications either by registered post to the Commissioner, Handlooms and Textiles Department, Handloom Bhavan, 3rd Floor, Nampally, Hyderabad, or at the respective District Assistant Director's office. Chippa Venkateshwarlu also mentioned that students who pass all subjects in a single academic year will be awarded a cash incentive of ₹50,000 by the Central Government. Admissions for the academic year 2026–27 were accepted following the seminar. He further advised parents to closely monitor behavioural changes in children after results and spend quality time with them to ease anxiety. Teachers, he said, must actively engage with students and reinforce that

failure is temporary and opportunities remain abundant. Stressing that life is far more valuable than examination scores, Sajjanar encouraged students to share their concerns openly, seek support when needed, and face challenges with confidence and resilience.
