# Illegal Bolt Manufacturing Units Operating Amid Residential Areas Work carried out on roads Residents suffer due to noise and air pollution Vibrations from units causing cracks in house walls GHMC fails to act despite High Court orders



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, April 1 (Indian chronicle):“Secunderabad: Residents of several colonies are facing severe hardship as small-scale industrial units continue to operate illegally within residential areas. In Arun Jyoti Colony under Bansilalpet Division of Kavadiyuda Circle 40, iron bolt manufacturing units are being run in the middle of residential neighborhoods, causing widespread distress. The units are reportedly operating on roads, obstructing public movement and creating inconvenience for pedestrians and motorists. Continuous noise, dust, and air pollution from these units have made daily life difficult for residents. Locals say the vibrations generated by heavy machinery are leading to visible cracks in the walls of their houses. Despite multiple complaints to concerned authorities, no effective action has been taken. Residents earlier approached the Pollution Control Department, whose officials visited the area and prepared a report. Locals allege that several of these units are operating without proper licenses and are not paying any taxes. Frustrated by inaction, residents including Srinivasachari and Shanthikumar filed a writ petition (No. 13462/2015) in the High Court. On December 5, 2025, the High Court directed authorities to investigate the issue, conduct a joint hearing with both parties, and take appropriate action if industries were found operating in residential areas. Following the court order, a hearing notice was issued on January 28 this year, and complainants attended and presented their grievances. However, residents allege that no action has been taken so far by GHMC officials. Residents say that the continuous noise and pollution from the bolt manufacturing units have made even basic activities like eating and resting difficult. They have urged the government to intervene immediately, implement the High Court’s directions, and take strict action against the illegal units.”“Inquiry will be conducted and action will be taken”– Pushpalatha, Deputy Commissioner, Kavadiyuda Circle“Officials have acknowledged receiving complaints regarding illegal industrial activity and pollution in Arun Jyoti Colony. As per High Court directions, the Assistant Commissioner has been instructed to conduct an inquiry and submit a report. Necessary action will be taken based on the findings, the Deputy Commissioner stated.

# ECONOMIC OFFENCES WING (EOW) POLICE STATION INAUGURATED AT CPO, NEREDMET



“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, April 1 (Indian chronicle): “The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) Police Station, Malkajgiri, has commenced operations at the Police Quarters in Neredmet. The facility was formally inaugurated by the Commissioner of Police, Malkajgiri, with the proceedings initiated through a General Diary (GD) entry. The EOW Police Station will function under the supervision of DCP Road Safety K. Manohar, supported by two Assistant Commissioners of Police, P. Sathaiiah and C. Anjaiah, along with three Inspectors—K. Bhaskar, A. Surya Nayak, and K. Ravi Kumar. The Economic Offences Wing will handle cases related to financial fraud, including cheating, criminal breach of trust, and fabrication of documents where the fraud amount exceeds ₹2 crore. It will also take up cases under the Telangana State Protection of Depositors of Financial Establishments Act, 1999 (amended in 2023), involving amounts above ₹1 crore. Additionally, the EOW will investigate any other cases assigned by the Commissioner of Police, Malkajgiri.

## Aleru MLA and Government Whip Beerla Ailaiah Raises His Voice in the Assembly

He stated that the CM Relief Fund serves as a pillar of support for affected families. “Hospital Modernization:” — He requested that the Alair Government Hospital be upgraded to a 50-bed facility and that the number of beds in the Dialysis Center be increased to provide better assurance to patients. “Prohibited Lands – Housing Construction:” — Prohibited List: He requested that houses and residential plots be removed from the prohibited list to ensure that common citizens face no difficulties in their buying and selling transactions. “Indiramma Houses:” — He expressed satisfaction that the construction process for Indiramma houses is progressing rapidly across the state. He noted that certain issues had arisen regarding Indiramma houses due to technical glitches and requested that efforts be made to resolve them. “Employment, Labor, and Social Issues:” — “Gig Workers & Anganwadis: He requested that the issues faced by gig workers be resolved. ## CYBER CRIME POLICE BUST INVESTMENT FRAUD CALL CENTER IN MALKAJGIRI

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR), Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, April 1 (Indian chronicle): “Malkajgiri Cyber Crime Police dismantled a call center run by cyber fraudsters involved in large-scale investment scams. The case was registered as Crime No. 185/2026 at Cyber Crime Police Station, Rachakonda. A 35-year-old faculty member from Nagole, Hyderabad, fell victim to the fraud and lost ₹36.30 lakh. According to police, the victim was added to a WhatsApp group named “Barclays,” where fraudsters posed as professional traders. They lured him into investing on a fake trading platform by displaying fabricated profits running into crores.

Trusting the claims, the victim invested ₹36.35 lakh but received only ₹5,000 in return. Based on his complaint, a case was registered under relevant provisions of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and the Information Technology Act. During



the investigation, cyber crime police collected technical evidence and tracked digital footprints linked to the fraud network. A police team led by Inspector G. Sudhakar traced the accused to Peddameeram village in West Godavari district of Andhra Pradesh. On March 31, 2026, a raid was conducted and eight accused persons were arrested. The arrested individuals include students, drivers, and private employees from West Godavari and Konaseema districts. Police seized 45 mobile phones, a laptop, routers, tablets, cheque books, ATM cards, SIM cards, and multiple identity documents from their possession. Investigators found that the accused were operating a fake call center to target victims across the country through online platforms. Police officials stated that the fraudsters used multiple bank accounts and fake digital identities to execute the scam. The operation was carried out under the supervision of senior officers of the Malkajgiri Commissionerate. Police advised the public to remain cautious of online investment offers promising unusually high returns. They urged citizens to verify the authenticity of platforms and avoid falling prey to fraudulent schemes.

## Young Man Found Dead at Home in Suspected Suicide

According to the complaint filed by his mother, Pampuri Padma, her son Pampuri Aravind had left home on March 31 at around 11:00 am, stating that he was going to work. Aravind, who worked as a Rapido driver, had been in a relationship for the past five years with his relative, Chintala Shirisha (25), a resident of Mallikarjuna Colony in Kapra Mandal. The relationship had reportedly led to frequent disputes within the family. At around 3:00 pm on the same day, Padma spoke to her son over the phone, during which he said he would call back later and disconnected the call. She later left for her night duty. Subsequently, a video call was made by her daughter, during which family members participated. In the early hours of April 1, at around 2:30 am, Aravind’s father noticed that the door of his room was slightly open. On entering the room, he found Aravind hanging from an iron rod using a yellow and blue saree. The family members immediately brought him down but found that he had already



died. Following the complaint, police have registered a case and initiated an investigation.

## Plan to Procure 2.37 Lakh Metric Tonnes of Paddy in Khammam: Additional Collector Srinivas Reddy

"Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 1, (Indian Chronicle): "Additional Collector P. Srinivas Reddy announced that a comprehensive plan has been prepared to procure 2.37 lakh metric tonnes of paddy in Khammam district during the Rabi (Yasangi) season 2025-26. "On Wednesday, the Additional Collector held a meeting with rice millers at the Collectorate conference hall to discuss procurement arrangements for the Rabi season. Speaking on the occasion, Srinivas Reddy said that out of the estimated 2.37 lakh metric tonnes, rice millers have been instructed to make arrangements to handle at least 1.5 lakh metric tonnes of paddy.
