## District SP Rohit Raju Pays Surprise Visit to Chunchupalli Police Station The Public Must Be Constantly Alerted to Prevent Them from Falling Victim to Cybercrimes.

On this occasion, he inspected the premises of the police station. Subsequently, he issued several instructions to the police officers and staff present. He directed them to maintain the station premises in a clean and hygienic condition at all times and urged them to act responsibly to ensure that justice is delivered to victims who visit the station seeking redressal for various issues. He then inquired about the details of several cases registered within the jurisdiction of the police station. He emphasized that everyone must strive for the speedy resolution of pending cases. He also took the time to inquire about the issues and concerns faced by the officers and staff working at the station. Following this, he visited the District Cyber ??Crimes Coordination Center, located on the upper floor of the Chunchupalli Police Station. ## Special subsidies should be provided to offer direct relief to the agriculture sector



“— Warangal MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya “Devulapally Srinivas, Warangal Bureau, April 2 (Indian Chronicle): Warangal Member of Parliament Dr. Kadiyam Kavya stated that special prices or subsidies should be provided to directly relieve the agriculture sector, as farmers are facing severe difficulties due to the rising prices of petrol and diesel. She questioned the central government in the Lok Sabha on Thursday, saying that the market-based pricing system is placing an additional burden on farmers, increasing cultivation costs and affecting their incomes. “She expressed the view that the measures being taken by the central government are not sufficient for farmers and reiterated the need for special prices or subsidies to provide direct relief to the agriculture sector. She pointed out that with transportation costs of crops, fertilizers, and machinery usage all dependent on fuel, the price hikes are financially crippling farmers. “Responding to the question raised by MP Kavya, Union Minister of State for Petroleum Suresh Gopi stated that fuel prices are determined by government-owned oil marketing companies, and the central government intervenes through tax reductions when necessary. He mentioned that steps such as reducing excise duties in the past and recently cutting duties by ?10 in view of rising international crude oil prices have been taken. “However, MP Kavya stated that these measures are limited to general consumers and do not provide specific relief to farmers. She noted that although fuel prices have slightly decreased in Warangal district, there has been no significant change in the actual burden on farmers. She urged that at least now, special concessions should be provided to farmers. MP Kadiyam Kavya emphasized the need for immediate action considering the problems faced by farmers.

## Strict Action Against Sex Determination and Sex Selection – PCPNDT Act to be Enforced Rigorously: District SP Nitika Pant

April, 02.” “Kumuram Bheem Asifabad: District Superintendent of Police Nitika Pant, IPS, stated that strict action will be taken to completely curb illegal practices such as sex determination and sex selection of the fetus in the district. She emphasized that the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, 1994 is being implemented rigorously. “The



SP noted that identifying or disclosing the sex of the unborn child, or conducting abortions based on it, poses a serious threat to society and is a major reason for the declining number of girl children. All ultrasound and scanning centers in the district have been strictly instructed to operate only with valid registration and to fully comply with the legal guidelines. “Prohibited Activities: “Determining or revealing the sex of the fetus “Practicing sex selection before or after conception “Advertising or promoting sex determination services “Operating ultrasound/scanning centers without proper registration “Permitted

Use: “Scanning is allowed only for detecting genetic disorders or monitoring the health condition of the fetus. Under no circumstances should it be used for sex determination. “Key Sections of the Act: Section 3A – Complete prohibition of sex selection “Section 4 – Regulation of pre-natal diagnostic techniques “Section 5 – Mandatory written consent of the pregnant woman “Section 6 – Ban on sex determination “Section 22 – Ban on advertisements related to sex determination “Punishments (Section 23): “For the first offence: “Up to 3 years imprisonment “Fine up to ₹10,000 “For repeated offences: Up to 5 years imprisonment “Fine up to ₹50,000 or more Additionally, doctors or medical staff found violating the Act may face suspension or cancellation of their medical licenses. “Public Appeal: “Citizens are requested to immediately report any instances of sex determination or sex selection to the nearest police station or Dial 100, Police Control Room: 8712670581. “Protecting the girl child and ensuring gender equality is a shared social responsibility, the SP added. “– District Police Office, Kumuram Bheem Asifabad

# Musi River Clean-up – Securing Godavari Waters " Conference: Make It a Success!

## Call by Senior Farmers' Union Leader Gudooru Anji Reddy

“(Mandava Srisailam – Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District, Indian Chronicle Bureau – April 2): ??On the occasion of the 3rd District Conference of the Farmers' Union, scheduled to be held in Pochampally town on the 6th and 7th of this month, Gudooru Anji Reddy—a senior leader of the Farmers' Union and President of the Reception Committee—issued a call for farmers, professionals, agricultural laborers, and the general public to participate in large numbers and ensure the success of the seminar titled "Musi River Clean-up – Securing Godavari Waters." This seminar is scheduled to take place on the 6th at G.B.R. Gardens in Pochampally town. On Thursday, a "pamphlet" urging the public to make the conference a success was unveiled at the local Farmers' Union Mandal office. Speaking on this occasion, Anji Reddy recalled that, in the past, the Musi River flourished as a lifeline, providing pure drinking water and irrigation water for the people. However, he expressed deep anguish that due to the policies of the ruling authorities—and driven by the profit motives of industrial investors—industries have been indiscriminately discharging toxic effluents, garbage, debris, and chemical waste directly into the Musi Project, thereby rendering the entire Musi waters poisonous. He stated that farmers and residents across eight Mandals in the Yadadri district are facing severe hardships due to these toxic waters, noting that the Pochampally region, in particular, has become over 90 percent contaminated by the poisonous waters of the Musi. The farming community and agricultural... He stated that laborers, professionals, fisherfolk, dairy farmers, and toddy tappers are facing numerous challenges. He expressed deep anguish over the fact that people are falling ill and even losing their lives due to these conditions. He demanded that the government take immediate action to halt the flow of toxic waters from the Musi River and instead provide water from the Godavari River. Anji Reddy urged people from all walks of life to participate in and ensure the success of the conferences being organized on the 6th of this month at 10:00 AM, which aim to advocate for the provision of alternative Godavari water. ## Steps for Permanent Resolution of Land Issues: District Collector Anudeep Durishetty

“Avnreddy Khammam Town Reporter April 2, (Indian Chronicle): “District Collector Anudeep Durishetty stated that the government is taking steps toward the permanent resolution of land-related issues. As part of this initiative, an Integrated Bhu Bharati Portal has been introduced on a pilot basis in Kusumanchi



Mandal of Khammam district to provide transparent and simplified services to the public. “He explained that the portal has been designed to bring land survey and registration departments under a single platform, ensuring that survey maps are made available at the time of land registration at the Tahsildar’s office. “Under this system, once a slot for

registration is booked in Kusumanchi Mandal, the details will automatically be shared with the surveyor. Farmers can also book slots from their homes through the portal. Upon logging in, land details will be visible, and farmers can request surveys based on the extent of land by paying the required fee. “Following this, the request is forwarded to a licensed surveyor in the village. Notices are issued to neighboring landowners within two days, and the survey is completed within seven days. After completion, the surveyor uploads the details into the system, and the applicant is assigned unique survey map and Bhu Dhar numbers, which are also stored in the Bhu Bharati portal. “Once the survey is completed, the survey map is generated and uploaded to the portal. Citizens will receive updates at every stage of the process via SMS to their registered mobile numbers—from application to registration completion. “The Collector added that the Integrated Bhu Bharati Portal is currently being implemented in Kusumanchi Mandal as a pilot project. Based on the results, the government plans to expand the system to other mandals in the future.

# Condemning Irresponsible Remarks by Telangana Chief Minister

“Hyderabad, April 2: The State BJP on Thursday took strong exception to the “irresponsible and immature” remarks made by Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy during his recent election rally in Kerala. “State BJP Chief Spokesperson and Media in-charge N. V. Subash, in a statement, said: “The Chief Minister’s comments, attempting to draw a frivolous comparison between Pinarayi Vijayan and Narendra Modi as ‘brothers’ and blaming them for the State’s challenges, are not only factually untenable but also unbecoming of a leader holding a constitutional office.” “He further stated that such remarks reflect a disturbing level of political immaturity and a disregard for the dignity of the office of a Chief Minister. “Public discourse, particularly during election campaigns, must be anchored in facts, accountability, and constructive criticism—not reduced to cheap rhetoric aimed at grabbing headlines,” he said. “Subash reiterated that the political landscape of India, including Kerala, has been significantly shaped by decades of governance involving both the Congress and Communist parties. “Attempts to conveniently shift blame while ignoring this historical reality only expose political opportunism,” he said, adding that the Chief Minister’s own political journey reflects inconsistency. “Referring to A. Revanth Reddy’s past, he noted that the latter began his political career in the Telugu Desam Party, founded by N. T. Rama Rao to challenge the Congress, and later switched to the same party. “Such shifts raise serious questions about ideological consistency,” he remarked. “He also alleged that the Congress party’s long-standing duplicity—maintaining tactical alliances with Left parties at the national level while posturing as adversaries in Kerala—stands exposed once again. “The so-called contest between the UDF and LDF has, over the years, done little to fundamentally alter the State’s developmental trajectory,” he pointed out. “Subash said that such opportunistic transitions, coupled with aggressive posturing, weaken public trust in leadership. “At a time when voters expect seriousness and solutions, such remarks trivialize critical governance issues and lower the standards of political debate,” he said. “He emphasized that leaders must rise above partisan theatrics and engage responsibly with the electorate, offering vision and accountability rather than divisive commentary. “There is an urgent need for those in positions of power to uphold the sanctity of democratic institutions and maintain the decorum befitting their office. Reckless statements may serve short-term political narratives, but they ultimately erode the credibility of public life and democratic discourse,” he added.

# Tight Police Security Arrangements for Day & Night IPL Matches on April 5 and May 22

“KISHORE VADDEPALLI, Uppal, April 2 (Indian Chronicle):““Elaborate security arrangements have been put in place by the police for the upcoming Tata IPL 2026 matches scheduled to be held at the Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium in Uppal on April 5 and May 22. Considering the stadium’s seating capacity of around 39,000, special measures have been taken to ensure that no untoward incidents occur during the day-and-night matches.“Addressing the media, Uppal DCP Suresh Kumar stated that nearly 2,000 police personnel from various departments have been deployed for match duties. Additionally, four fire engines have been kept on standby.“A total of 430 CCTV cameras (including 330 existing and 100 newly installed) have been set up to monitor vehicle checks, parking areas, and routes around the stadium. A Joint Command Control Room has been established for real-time surveillance. Anti-sabotage checks will be conducted continuously on match days, with the support of bomb disposal squads and sniffer dogs.“Each Sub-Inspector has been equipped with VHF communication sets to ensure quick and effective coordination.“Gate No. 1 has been re-

served exclusively for players, while spectators will be allowed entry only through designated gates as per their tickets. Gates will open three hours prior to the match, and spectators are advised to arrive early.“The following items are strictly prohibited inside the stadium: laptops, banners, water bottles, cameras, cigarettes, electronic gadgets, matchboxes, lighters, sharp objects, binoculars, pens, batteries, helmets, perfumes, bags, keychains, flammable materials, pets, laser pointers, ear pods, and outside food.“Special SHE Teams have been deployed to prevent eve-teasing. Dedicated teams will also monitor and prevent black marketing of tickets. Authorities have instructed spectators to use designated parking areas only, as parking on main roads is prohibited. People are encouraged to use RTC buses and metro services for transportation.“To ensure public safety, the number of ambulances has been increased from 3 to 5, and emergency response teams will remain on alert. Digital ticketing will come into effect from April 13. Police officials stated that all departments are working in coordination to ensure that the IPL matches are conducted smoothly and without any disruptions.
