Mahila Congress meet calls for greater role for women in governance

Minister outlines welfare initiatives; leaders pitch for representation in legislatures.

Karimnagar April 29 (Correspondent) : A review meeting of the Mahila Congress from the undivided Karimnagar district on Tuesday focused on enhancing women's participation in governance and expanding their economic opportunities, with leaders highlighting welfare measures being implemented by the State government.

State Social Welfare Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar, addressing the meeting, said the government was prioritising women-centric schemes aimed at financial inclusion and social empowerment. He noted that initiatives such as housing assistance in the name of women and livelihood opportunities in sectors such as transport and fuel retail were intended to strengthen their economic position.

Recalling the role of women in the 2023 Assembly elections, Mr. Laxman Kumar said their participation had been significant in mobilising support at the grassroots level. He added that the party leadership at the national level, includ-



ing Sonia Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi, had consistently advocated greater representation for women in political institutions.

He said steps were being taken to improve access to education for girls, particularly from rural and disadvantaged backgrounds, through the establishment of integrated educational institutions across constituencies. He also indicated that women party workers who had contributed to the organisation during difficult phases would be considered for positions in governance structures.

State Mahila Congress president Errabelli Swarna, who was visiting Karimnagar district after assuming office, said the present dispensation had accorded priority to welfare measures targeting women and economically weaker sections. She referred to initiatives such as the issue of new ration cards and supply of subsidised rice, and called upon party workers to take these programmes to the grassroots.

Emphasising the need for organisational strengthening, she urged Mahila Congress workers to engage more actively at the field level and improve outreach, including through digital platforms.

Choppadandi MLA and Karimnagar District Congress Committee president Medipalli Satyam, along with SUDA chairman Komatireddy Narendra Reddy, said the government had introduced free bus travel for women under the Mahalakshmi scheme soon after assuming office, describing it as a key step towards easing the financial burden on households.

They reiterated the party's position in favour of reservation for women in legislatures and stressed the need for measures that would enable greater political participation.

The meeting, presided over by Karimnagar District Mahila Congress president Karra Satya Prasanna Reddy, was attended by women public representatives, including municipal chairpersons, sarpanches, corporators, councillors, and party workers from across the district..

Measures to prevent road accidents and save precious lives in the district: -Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

April 29):- District Collector Anurag Jayanti has advised the concerned officials to take measures to prevent road accidents and save precious lives in the district. On Wednesday, the review meeting was attended by District Collector, SP Akshanksh Yadav, Additional SP Lakshminarayana, Traffic DSP Prabhakar Reddy, district level



officers, National Highways officers, Engineering and Transport officers. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that road safety measures are crucial in reducing road accidents. Coordination between all departments is necessary in taking these measures and each department should work collectively. “ Road accidents occur due to human error, vehicles and high speed.”He said that rumble strips, studs, speed limit, sign boards, blinkers etc. should be installed on the roads. To prevent accidents, strong arrangements should be made in the districts with coordination between all departments. Accidents are happening due to high speed and the speed limit should be strictly enforced. Seat belts and helmets should be worn while driving. Precautions should be taken to prevent accidents on the Vijayawada-Warangal highway.”SP Akshanksh Yadav said that speed limit boards, lighting and barricades should be installed wherever necessary. Revenue Divisional Officer Krishna Reddy, R&B Officer Saritha, Transport Officer Sai Krishna and concerned officials participated in this program.

Police welfare, fraud control in focus: CP Gaush Alam inaugurates martyrs’ barrack; calls for time-bound probe into cheating cases.

Karimnagar April 29 (Correspondent) : Linking personnel welfare with policing efficiency, Karimnagar Police Commissioner Gaush Alam on Wednesday inaugurated a martyrs’ memorial barrack-cum-rest facility at Huzurabad and directed officers to fast-track investigations into cheating and forgery cases across the division.

The facility, built in memory of personnel who died in the line of duty, is intended to improve accommodation and basic amenities for police staff. “Better welfare measures directly impact efficiency and responsiveness,” Mr. Alam said, underlining the need to upgrade infrastructure across police stations. Later, reviewing pending cases at the Huzurabad ACP office, the Commissioner expressed concern over delays in disposing of cheating and forgery cases and called for time-bound investigations. He instructed officers to ensure speedy justice to victims and take stringent action against those defrauding the public. Observing that offenders were increasingly using sophisticated methods, he stressed the use of technology and forensic tools to strengthen investigations. Officers were also directed to file charge sheets within stipulated timelines with robust evidence to improve conviction rates. Emphasising accountability and public trust, Mr. Alam said police personnel must remain accessible and responsive even as they intensify crime control measures.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector ordered that all departments should take strict measures in coordination to curb illegal drug activities in the district. In the wake of increasing drug use targeting the youth, he suggested that special vigilance



should be maintained at intermediate colleges and sports competitions. He said that precautionary measures should be taken to keep students away from misbehavior.” He suggested that steps should be taken to ensure that the anti-drug committees formed at the village and ward levels function effectively and that their activities should be reviewed regularly. He also said that a special calendar should be prepared in intermediate colleges to create awareness about the side effects of drugs and programs should be organized accordingly. The District Education Officer (DEO) was instructed to conduct awareness programs widely in educational institutions and explain to students the health and social harms caused by drugs. Similarly, the Superintendent of Excise Department was advised to conduct strict checks on the supply, storage and use of drugs and take legal action against those who violate the rules. The District Collector said that all the relevant departments in the district should work in cooperation with each other and work to completely eradicate the drug problem. District SP Akshanksh Yadav said that awareness seminars on drugs should be organized in colleges, factories and villages. He wanted to see that the youth do not get addicted to drugs. He urged people to act responsibly and said that drug use can be reduced by raising awareness among the people. Students of 'Shine High School' Excel in SSC Results

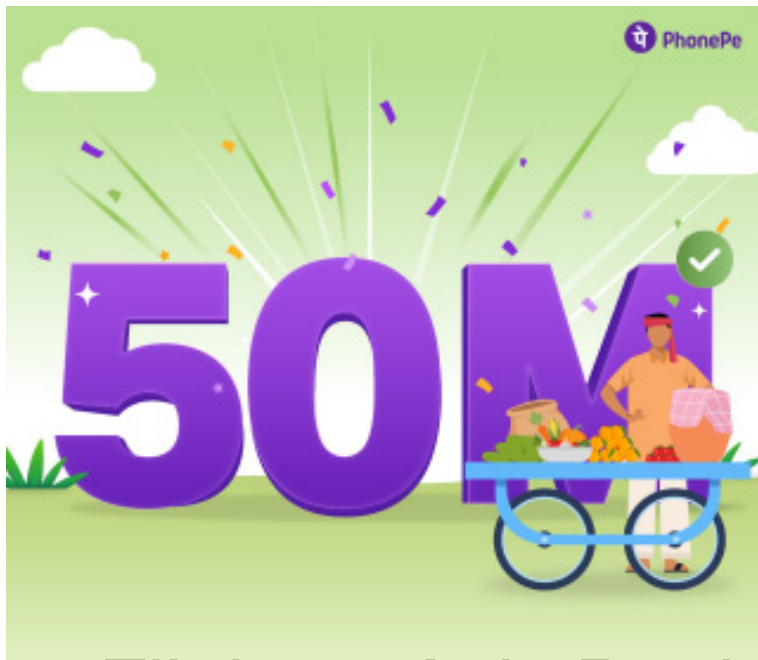
