Justice Must Be Done for All Displaced Families: OPRD Leaders Demand



“Arvapalli Nagesh khammam bureau April 3 indian Chronicle:”“OPRD State President and Secretary, Dr. Jatin Kumar and Vijender, have demanded that justice be ensured for all displaced families of Bhoodan lands and that those who lost

their homes be provided houses at the same location. “Speaking at a press conference held at the Khammam Press Club on Friday, they expressed anguish that the houses of poor families, who had been residing in Velugumatla for the past eight years following ministerial directions, were demolished in an inhumane manner. “They stated that despite the lack of basic amenities in the Velugumatla colony, residents had been living there facing numerous hardships. However, without understanding their struggles, revenue and police officials carried out the demolitions, they alleged. They also refuted claims that money had been collected from the residents, calling them false and misleading. “The leaders recalled that a fact-finding committee had visited the area in February and conducted an inquiry under the leadership of retired Justice Chandrakumar. The committee had urged the authorities to alleviate fear among the poor who possess land documents. “They criticized that, despite the committee’s visit, demolitions were carried out by revenue and police officials on the orders of ministers. Due to growing criticism against the government, they alleged that only a few beneficiaries were being selected and promised houses at the same site, leading to injustice for many eligible families. “They demanded that all eligible displaced persons be allotted house sites at the same location and that proper housing be constructed for them. “Dr. Mohan, an OPRD state leader, was also present at the meeting.

Do not harm the livelihood of handloom workers Cancellation of Rs 105 crore tender leaves handloom workers without employment“

Lingamurthy, Media Secretary of the State Handloom Joint Forum

“Devulapally Srinivas, Warangal Bureau, April 3 (Indian Chronicle): Lingamurthy, Media Secretary of the State Handloom Joint Forum, said it is not appropriate for the government to cancel the orders it gives annually to TESCO (Telangana State Handloom Cooperative Society). Speaking to reporters at the Warangal district headquarters on Friday, he expressed dissatisfaction with the government's approach. He said that canceling the ₹105.54 crore order given to TESCO for stitching school uniforms for students in the 2026–27 academic year would directly hit the livelihoods of handloom workers. “He added that handloom workers are worried as they are not receiving orders even from various welfare departments. For decades, the responsibility of stitching clothes for students under the education and welfare departments has been handled by the handloom cooperative society, but with the government's current decision, workers are being left without employment. He expressed concern that workers are losing income as the annual order, usually issued in January, has not been given even by April. “He urged the government to withdraw its plan to hand over uniform stitching orders to private companies. Already, workers in 393 handloom cooperative societies across the state are distressed due to lack of adequate work, and the government withdrawing its orders is a severe blow, he said. He appealed to the government to reconsider its decision and ensure that orders are given to TESCO. Lingamurthy also requested that orders from various government departments be entrusted to handloom societies to support their economic progress.



Senior Journalist Sambhoju Shekhar Passes Away in Karimnagar

Special action plan for the restoration of lakes... Minister Konda Surekha

“---Minister lays foundation stone for restoration works of Chinna Vaddepalli and Ursu Rangasamudram lakes” Devulapalli Srinivas, Warangal Bureau, April 3 (Indian Chronicle): State Endowments, Forest, and Environment Minister Konda Surekha stated that the state government is implementing a special action plan for the restoration of lakes in the city. As part of the 99-day action program under the Praja Palana Pragati plan, the minister attended as the chief guest at a program held on Friday in the Warangal (East) constituency and laid foundation stones for several development works. “Speaking on the occasion, the minister said that restoration and development works for Chinna Vaddepalli Lake and Ursu Rangasamudram Lake, to be undertaken at a cost of ₹5 crore, have been initiated. She mentioned that once these works, taken up under the AMRUT 2.0 scheme, are completed, they will help in lake conservation, increase groundwater levels, protect the environment, and enhance the beauty of the city. “She added that by cleaning the lakes and developing them on the lines of a tank bund, a pleasant environment will be created for the public. She revealed that the government has already sanctioned funds for the development of Ursu Rangasamudram and Desayipet lakes. She said the works will be completed swiftly and made available for public use. Tight Security Arrangements for IPL 2026 at Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium

During the visit, he issued key instructions to ensure smooth and safe conduct of the matches. Around 3,000 police personnel will be deployed for match duties. The security setup will include OCTOPUS teams, Special Branch, and Crime teams to maintain strict vigilance. A total of 450 CCTV cameras have been installed in and around the stadium. A dedicated Command Control Room has been set up to monitor surveillance operations.



Special focus has been given to women's safety. SHE Teams will be deployed to keep a close watch and ensure security for female spectators.
