

People should be alert in view of the increasing temperatures day by day:- Bhaskar Rao, Additional Collector of Local Bodies,



Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District,“(Mandava Srisaillam.. Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Indian Chronicle Bureau.. April 4):- “In view of the increasing temperatures day by day, Bhaskar Rao, Additional Collector of Local Bodies, District, advised people to be alert. On Saturday, the National Heat Related Illness and Death Survey Lines District Task Force Committee meeting was held under the chairmanship of District Medical and Health Department, Education Department, Disaster Management Authority, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Public Works, Environmental Pollution Prevention, Rural Development, Panchayat Raj and Municipal Departments at the Collectorate IDOC Mini Meeting Hall. Speaking on the occasion, Additional Collector of Local Bodies Bhaskar Rao instructed the officials to prepare a comprehensive action plan with preventive measures to prevent any loss of life due to heatstroke. He suggested that disaster management teams be formed at the district level and mandal level and a three-man committee should also be formed. He said that cold storage centers should be set up in government

and private educational institutions, ORS packets should be made available in examination centers, necessary medicines and ORS packets should be kept ready at rural employment guarantee workers, ASHA workers, and primary health centers. He said that ORS and packet cold storage centers should be set up in gram panchayats, wards, bus stands, police stations, labor camps, construction sites, and paddy procurement centers in the district. He suggested that cold storage centers should be set up in places where people gather a lot with the help of voluntary organizations like Lines Club, Rotary Club, and Vasavi Club. He said that children, the elderly, pregnant women, people with high blood pressure, and diabetes who are at risk of heatstroke should be identified in advance and awareness should be created through health workers on appropriate precautions. If necessary, special wards should be set up in government hospitals. People should not go out unnecessarily during the afternoon and should frequently take drinking water, buttermilk, lemon juice, coconut water or ORS solution. If symptoms of sunburn appear, they should be taken to the nearest hospital for treatment and in case of emergency, they should use 108 ambulance services. “The officials were instructed to pay special attention to the care of livestock and to clean and fill the water tanks set up in the villages. “They were advised to take appropriate measures for safe drinking water supply, prevent water pollution, and use the water supplied by Mission Bhagiratha or the Water Board only after testing. Posters to create awareness among the public on measures to prevent sunburn in summer, as well as posters related to livestock protection, were unveiled on the occasion. Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Y. Manohar, District Medical and Health Officer, said that ORS packets are available in abundance in the district and ORS packets have already been sent to the primary health centers, so whoever needs ORS packets can contact the medical officer of their primary health center and get ORS packets. He informed that all necessary steps have been taken to prevent sunstroke during the summer season. “Officials of the District Medical and Health Department, Education Department, Disaster Management Authority, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Public Works, Environmental Pollution Prevention, Rural Development, Panchayat Raj, Municipal Departments and other departments participated in this meeting.

Indiramma Housing Scheme Should Be Extended to Khammam Journalists: WJI Resolution

“Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 4,(Indian Chronicle):““The



Khammam district committee of the Working Journalists India (WJI) has urged the Telangana government to extend the ‘Indiramma’ housing scheme to journalists working the district. The committee appealed that under this scheme, journalists across various sectors should be allotted house sites

and provided financial assistance for constructing homes. “The resolution was passed during a district committee meeting held on Saturday in Khammam city under the ?????????? (chairmanship) of District Convener Gantela Anand. State Secretary Nara Subrahmanyeswara Rao (N.S. Rao) attended the meeting as the chief guest. Detailed discussions were held regarding the issue of housing plots for journalists in Khammam, and it was decided to soon prepare an action plan to secure house sites and benefits under the Indiramma scheme. “The meeting also passed another resolution demanding the implementation of a pension scheme

for senior journalists. It noted that several states are already providing pensions— ?15,000 in Bihar, ?20,000 in Madhya Pradesh, and between ?6,000 and ?20,000 in 19 states including Assam, Tamil Nadu, and Puducherry. The committee demanded that Telangana introduce a similar pension scheme at the earliest. “Additionally, WJI called on the central government to immediately restore railway passes for journalists that were suspended during the COVID-19 pandemic. It was also decided to submit representations to Members of Parliament from the district to push for reinstatement of these passes. “The meeting strongly condemned attacks on journalists covering the ongoing conflict involving the United States, Israel, and Iran in West Asia. Concern was expressed over media personnel being targeted, and the committee urged authorities to prevent such incidents. Condolences were also offered to journalists who lost their lives in these attacks. “WJI Continues Fight for Journalists’ Welfare and Rights “Speaking on the occasion, State Secretary N.S. Rao said that WJI has been consistently striving for the welfare, rights, and professional dignity of journalists across India. He stated that the union works to safeguard the interests of reporters, editors, photographers, videographers, desk journalists, and other media personnel. “He further added that the organization is pressuring media institutions to implement recommendations such as those of the Majithia Wage Board. Ensuring pension benefits, health insurance, and other welfare schemes for journalists, as well as combating yellow journalism and upholding truth and credibility in news, remain key objectives of the union. “The meeting was attended by district co-conveners Yenneboyina Srinivasa Rao, M.A. Ansar Pasha, N. Ramakrishna, Khammam Assembly Constituency Convener K. Kalyan Chakravarthy, and other district leaders including G. Narayana Rao, Modepalli Kiran, Enigandla Srinivasa Rao, and Jabishetty Kutumba Rao.

Release Nagarjuna Sagar Water Till April 30: CPI Submits Representation to Officials

(Avnreddy Khammam Town Reporter April 4, (Indian Chronicle):- Leaders of the Communist Party of India (CPI) submitted a representation to officials requesting the release of water from the Nagarjuna Sagar Left Canal ayacut area until April 30. "The memorandum was submitted on Saturday to Nagarjuna Sagar Chief Engineer Mangalapudi Venkateswarlu under the leadership of CPI National Council Member Bagam Hemanth Rao. "Speaking on the occasion, Hemanth Rao stated that nearly 2.5 lakh acres are cultivated under the Nagarjuna Sagar Left Canal ayacut in Khammam district. He explained that crops such as paddy, maize, chilli, and other second-season crops require irrigation water until the end of this month. "He warned that if water supply is reduced or released under a rotational system (warabandi), tail-end farmers may not receive adequate water, leading to severe difficulties. Therefore, he urged authorities to ensure full-scale water release until the end of April. "Responding to the request, the Chief Engineer acknowledged the necessity of water for crops and assured that he would discuss the matter with higher authorities and make efforts to supply irrigation water until the end of the month to protect the crops. Discrimination Against Journalists – Issues Won't Be Resolved Without Struggle

:"TWJF (H-2843) Founder President Mamidi Somaiah""Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 4, (Indian Chronicle):""Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) Founder President and State Convener Mamidi Somaiah has demanded that the state government immediately address the issues faced by journalists and end what he described as discriminatory and neglectful treatment. "Speaking as the chief guest at the TWJF district general body meeting held in Khammam on Saturday, Somaiah expressed concern that the condition of journalists in the state has become uncertain. He said that despite acting as a crucial link between the government and the public, journalists are now forced to take to the streets to protest for their own rights. "He criticized the Congress government, stating that even after two years in power, it has failed to resolve any of the key issues affecting journalists. He pointed out that the government has not even issued new accreditation cards so far. Somaiah demanded that all eligible journalists be granted accreditation without unnecessary cuts and that the promises made in the government's manifesto for journalists be fulfilled. "He further alleged that the process of issuing accreditation cards has been mishandled, creating confusion and pushing journalists toward agitation. Warning of intensified protests across the state if the government's indifferent attitude continues, he also called for the immediate resolution of the long-pending issue of house sites for journalists in Khammam district. "The meeting, held under the chairmanship of District Vice President Suryanarayana, was attended by Hyderabad District Convener V. Ravikumar, Khammam District Secretary Nanabala Ramakrishna, Treasurer Nagesh, Legal Advisor Srinivasa Rao, and other members. ""New District Committee Elected""During the general body meeting, a new district committee of TWJF (H-2843) was elected. Nanabala Ramakrishna was elected as Dis-



trict President, Arvapalli Nagesh as General Secretary, and Vemulakonda Ramesh Kumar as Treasurer, along with a full committee. High Court Remarks on Fee Reimbursement Painful

; Students Under Severe Mental Stress""Arvapalli Nagesh Khammam Bureau April 4, (Indian Chronicle):""Dr. S. Nageswara Rao, State President of George Reddy PDSU (Telangana), expressed concern that the recent High Court remarks on fee reimbursement are distressing and that governments in Telangana are causing serious delays in releasing pending fee reimbursement dues. "Speaking at a press conference held at the Khammam Press Club on Saturday, he said that uncertainty is looming over the educational future of students, pushing them into severe mental stress. He noted that parents and student organizations have been staging protests for several days against the government's negligence in releasing pending fee dues. "He criticized the government for repeatedly setting deadlines for releasing the funds but failing to fulfill those promises. He stated that while courts usually direct governments to act responsibly, the recent directions appear to place an additional burden on students. "Referring to the recent Telangana High Court judgment issued on April 3, Dr. Nageswara Rao said it has created confusion among students. He pointed out that allowing private college managements to collect fees from students in advance, if the government fails to reimburse, would impose a heavy financial burden on poor students. "He urged the High Court to review its decision and direct the government to immediately release fee reimbursement dues as promised. "He further stated that nearly ₹10,000 crore worth of fee reimbursement and scholarship funds are pending in the state. Despite assurances from the government to release the funds in phases, no concrete action has been taken so far, putting the academic future of lakhs of students at risk. "He appealed to the judiciary to ensure that governments act responsibly, protect students' constitutional rights, and prioritize the education sector, which is vital for the country's development. "Dr. Nageswara Rao demanded the im-



mediate release of pending fee reimbursement and scholarship funds. "Others present at the press conference included State Girls Convener K. Differently-Abled Students Need Greater Support, Says Press Academy Chairman



Special school's annual day highlights inclusive education and self-reliance initiatives.

Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, April 04: Telangana State Media Press Academy Chairman Srinivas Reddy on Saturday underscored the need for greater support to differently-abled students, stating that serving children with

intellectual and physical disabilities brings deep personal fulfilment and reflects true humanity.

He was addressing the 36th annual day celebrations of a special school for intellectually challenged students run by the Freedom Fighters' Trust at LMD Colony in Thimmapur mandal. The programme commenced with the lighting of the ceremonial lamp in the pres-

ence of Trust Chairman and former MLA Chada Venkata Reddy and other members.

Mr. Srinivas Reddy lauded the foresight of the founders in establishing the institution to cater to children with intellectual disabilities and described the school as a "temple" for the surrounding community. He commended the dedication of teachers, caregivers, and staff, calling them key contributors to the well-being of the students.

He said the State government had sanctioned ₹50 lakh for the school and assured continued support for its development. He also noted that efforts would be made to bring the institution to the attention of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and facilitate an official visit.

Highlighting a success story, he pointed out that a student from the school earns about ₹500 a day by making eco-friendly leaf plates and has saved ₹3 lakh, demonstrating the potential for self-reliance among differently-abled individuals.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Chada Venkata Reddy said the school, established in 1990, has grown steadily with the support of donors and well-wishers. He recalled that two acres of land were secured for the institution and that buildings were constructed with ₹25 lakh after he was elected MLA in 2004.

He added that a bus worth ₹26 lakh was sanctioned with the support of Social Welfare Principal Secretary Anita

Ramachandran. Several public representatives and donors have also assured assistance for the school's development.

The school has introduced skill development units such as candle-making and leaf plate production for students above 18 years, along with training in speech therapy, physiotherapy, yoga, and life skills.

From an initial strength of 20 students, the institution now caters to 127 students, including 77 residential students and 50 day scholars.

In a message read out at the event, Industries Commissioner Nikhil Chakravarthy conveyed his support. State Teachers' Association president Sadanandam Goud called for establishing similar schools in every district.

Revenue Divisional Officer Maheshwar appreciated the staff for empowering students, while senior journalist Madhusudan Reddy assured his support to the institution. Trustee B. Venkataiah recalled that the school began in a rented building with just 15 students.

Chief Engineer Sumathi Devi announced an annual contribution of ₹20,000.

On-site FIR system key to victim-centric policing, says CP Gaush Alam reviews implementation, urges prompt response and strict SOP adherence.

Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, April 04: Police Commissioner Gaush Alam on Saturday conducted a comprehensive review of the implementation of the On-site FIR registration system through a video conference with Station House Officers across the Karimnagar Police Commissionerate.



Emphasising the importance of the initiative, the Commissioner said the system was introduced to make justice more accessible, particularly for vulnerable sections such as women, children and the elderly. By enabling police personnel to register First Information Reports at the victim's residence or at the scene of the offence, the process reduces the need for victims to visit police stations and ensures timely intervention.

Mr. Alam directed officers to respond promptly to information about incidents and reach out to victims without delay. He instructed that initial statements should be recorded on the spot and that a copy of the FIR must be provided to the complainant immediately after registration.

Highlighting the sensitivity of cases involving women and children, he made it mandatory to record video documentation during complaint registration in such instances. He also stressed strict adherence to Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) in all cases to maintain transparency and accountability.

The review meeting was attended by CCRB ACP Srinivas G, Inspectors Sarilal, Reserve Inspector Kiran Kumar, and other officials. The Commissioner called upon the officers to ensure effective implementation of the system and enhance public service delivery across the Commissionerate.

Speed up voter mapping, says CEO

Directs officials to fast-track revision work and clear pending applications. Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, April 04: State Chief Electoral Officer Sudarshan Reddy has directed officials to expedite the voter mapping process in view of the ongoing Special Summary Revision, stressing the need for timely completion of all preparatory activities.

Chairing a review meeting via video conference from Hyderabad on Saturday, Mr. Reddy assessed progress with District Collectors, Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), Assistant EROs and other officials across the State. Key issues discussed included voter mapping, training of Booth Level Officers (BLOs), and the appointment of Booth Level Agents (BLAs).



Mr. Reddy emphasised that mapping of voters must be carried out swiftly at the booth level and instructed officials to ensure that no vacancies remain in BLO positions. He called for immediate filling of any gaps and urged authorities to organise structured training programmes for BLOs.
