

## District Steps Up Medical Services, Quality Healthcare Reaches Remote Areas: Collector Haritha

“Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), April 7,” District Collector K. Haritha stated that the administration is making consistent efforts at the grassroots level to ensure improved healthcare services even in remote and inaccessible areas of the district. “On the occasion of World Health Day, a programme was organized on Tuesday at the conference hall of the Integrated District Collectorate. The event was attended by Additional Collector (Revenue) David, Asifabad MLA Kova Lakshmi, Sirpur MLA Palvai Harish Babu, District Medical and Health Officer Seetharam, and Government Medical College Principal Dr. Subodh, among others. “Addressing the gathering, the Collector said that the government is taking steps to strengthen the healthcare sector by implementing development works in sub-centres, primary health centres, community health centres, rural and urban health facilities, and government hospitals, with the aim of providing better medical services for public welfare. “She further informed that the construction of the Government Area Hospital in Kagaznagar is being expedited and is likely to be completed and inaugurated by September. “The Collector highlighted that HPV vaccination is

being administered to children aged 14–15 years, while timely immunisation is being ensured for infants and children. Efforts are also being made to promote proper nutrition for the healthy growth of children. “She emphasized that doctors, medical staff, and health workers are actively creating awareness among the public on sanitation, hygiene, and preventive healthcare practices. Noting that the medical profession involves significant challenges, she urged healthcare personnel to remain vigilant and carry out their duties responsibly. “The Collector also stressed the importance of co-ordination among various departments in delivering effective healthcare services. She stated that the government is ready to appoint professors on a contract basis in the Government Medical College to strengthen academic and medical services. “Adequate equipment and staff have been arranged to provide dialysis services for kidney patients in the district, she added. “Speaking on the occasion, Asifabad MLA Kova Lakshmi urged medical and Anganwadi staff to extend their services effectively at the village level. She emphasized that all stakeholders should contribute to the district’s development and ensure the



availability of healthcare services in tribal villages. “The MLA also called for increased awareness on nutrition, encouraging the promotion of locally available nutritious food products such as ippa flower laddus and intercropping practices. She stated that dialysis centres are being established for kidney patients and awareness campaigns on

family planning are being conducted in remote areas. “She further suggested appointing specialised medical experts for conducting post-mortem examinations in government hospitals. “Officials from the Medical and Health Department, doctors, staff, and other concerned authorities participated in the programme.

## Arrests if questioned?. Is this public governance? Former BRS MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy



“Devulapally Srinivas, Warangal Bureau (Narsampet), April 7 (Indian Chronicle): Former Narsampet MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy said that arresting Harish Rao, who was going to visit and support the farmers of Kalapur and Rapol in Parigi constituency who are losing 1,200 acres of land in the name of an industrial park, is a highly shameful act. Speaking to the media on Tuesday, he strongly condemned the house arrest and detention of former minister Tanniru Harish Rao at his residence in Kokapet, stating that he had been questioning in the Assembly and in the media the ongoing mining and land scams allegedly carried out daily by ministers with the support of the Chief Minister, who are supposed to safeguard public assets. “He alleged that the Congress party, which came to power in the name of change by giving unfulfilled promises, is misusing its authority to grab people’s lands and carry out illegal mining activities.

He called it a cowardly act that instead of curbing encroachments and illegal dealings, the government is placing opposition leaders under house arrest and detaining them for raising questions. He criticized the move to prevent Harish Rao from going to Parigi to support victims who are losing their lands and to expose the land scams allegedly committed by the Congress government and its leaders, saying it goes against governance ethics. “He expressed concern that the Revanth Reddy government is troubling farmers across the state by failing to provide farmer assurance schemes, not implementing loan waivers, and not supplying fertilizers on time. He warned that if the Congress fails to fulfill its promises to the people and instead resorts to illegal arrests of those who question them, it will face consequences in the public arena. He questioned whether fighting on behalf of the people regarding promises made to them amounts to illegal cases, and asserted that BRS leaders are neither intimidated nor afraid of such actions. He added that struggles, movements, cases, jails, and arrests are nothing new to them, and warned that if the government tries to suppress the opposition using police force, it will have to pay a price.

## Ensure best medical care, Collector tells staff Chitra Mishra inspects Mohataj Khana health centre on World Health Day.

Marking World Health Day, the Collector visited the Urban Primary Health Centre (Mohataj Khana) in Hussainpura, where she conducted a detailed review of healthcare services being provided to the public.



During the inspection, Ms. Mishra enquired about the daily patient footfall, availability of essential medicines, laboratory testing procedures, and maternal healthcare services, particularly antenatal check-ups for pregnant women. She also interacted with patients to obtain first-hand feedback on the quality of services.

Emphasising accountability, the Collector said that government hospitals must match private institutions in terms of service quality to instil confidence among people. “Doctors are often seen as life-savers, and it is imperative to uphold that trust

through dedicated service,” she said.

She noted that government facilities are equipped with modern infrastructure and urged the public to make greater use of these services. The Collector also directed officials to take focused measures to increase the number of normal deliveries and ensure better maternal care outcomes.

Calling for a compassionate approach, Ms. Mishra advised medical staff to serve patients with patience and professionalism to enhance the reputation of public healthcare institutions.

District Medical and Health Officer Venkataramana, Programme Officer (MHN) Sana, Medical Officer Imran, and other staff were present during the visit.

## 18 Women Sanitation Workers Reinstated Unconditionally at Pranam Apartment After Protest Union Leaders Stage Protest at Apartment Gate

“NARRA SRINIVAS REDDY (NSR) Medchal - Malkajgiri Staff Reporter, April 7 (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“Medchal District: Eighteen women sanitation workers employed at Pranam Apartment in Saket Colony, Kapra Mandal, were reportedly removed from their duties without valid reason on April 6, 2026. In response, union leaders organized a protest on April 7, 2026, at 9:30 AM in front of the apartment gate, demanding the immediate reinstatement of the terminated workers. Following the protest, residents and former association members intervened and invited the current Association President, P. Krishnamurthy, for discussions. After negotiations

held in the presence of the workers, the association agreed to reinstate all 18 workers unconditionally. Union leaders also raised concerns about the alleged misconduct of Association Secretary G. Shashi Kumar, accusing him of behaving irresponsibly and using inappropriate language towards workers. They demanded his removal from the position of Secretary. The union further demanded that workers be provided with ESI and PF benefits, granted national and festival holidays, and issued identity cards. They warned of further agitation if these demands are not fulfilled. Additionally, Nurse Anusha, who was reportedly removed from service without reason on April 1, was also reinstated from today. ## Comprehensive Inspections of Education, Healthcare, and Infrastructure – District Collector Ankit’s Visit to Aswaraopeta

“Kukkadapu Naresh Kumar, Bhadradi Kothagudem Staff Reporter, April 07, Indian Chronicle: On Tuesday, District Collector Ankit conducted an extensive tour of the Aswaraopeta Mandal in the Bhadradi Kothagudem district, carrying out surprise inspections of schools, the government hospital, and the site proposed for the 'Young India' Integrated School. During this visit, he comprehensively examined the state of education, healthcare services, and infrastructure, issuing several directives to the concerned officials. First, the collector inspected the Telangana Minorities Residential School; he examined the food items prepared and ready to be served to the students, reviewing their quality. He inspected the maintenance of the dining hall and the storeroom; expressing doubts regarding the quality of the stored jaggery, he questioned officials to obtain details regarding its supply. Furthermore, he inspected the quality of tamarind and vegetables, issuing strict orders that only fresh and high-quality food must always be served to the students. He directed that the food intended for students be thoroughly inspected before being served, suggesting that students from the 8th, 9th, and 10th grades also be involved in this food inspection process. He emphasized that, in addition to providing nutritious meals strictly according to the pre-

scribed menu, a hygienic environment must be maintained at all times. In the classrooms, he interacted directly with 6th and 7th-grade students to gather details regarding the amenities available to them, the frequency with which chicken is served, the quality of the food, and any other issues they might be facing. The Collector inspected the Mandal Parishad Primary School, examined the midday meals, and questioned the staff regarding whether the food was being provided in accordance with the prescribed menu. After inquiring about the gas supply, kitchen maintenance, and hygiene standards, he issued directives to ensure that adequate, high-quality food is provided in proportion to the number of students. He noted that instances of non-compliance with the menu had come to his attention within the district and instructed officials to implement strict supervision to prevent such lapses from recurring. Subsequently, the collector inspected the Aswaraopeta Government Area Hospital, examining the outpatient department, wards, blood testing center, and medicine storage rooms. He interacted with patients, inquiring about the medical services they were receiving and the issues they were facing. He instructed the staff to ensure that necessary medicines remain readily available and to place immediate indenta-

tions in the event of any shortages. Inspecting the Aarogyasri services section, he issued orders to take necessary measures to ensure that every eligible patient receives timely medical care. While inspecting the scanning and X-ray departments, he noted that reports of delays in service delivery had reached his attention and inquired into the reasons behind them. Upon learning of a shortage of radiology technicians, he gave an assurance that steps would be taken to resolve the issue. Finally, he inspected the food being provided to patients in the inpatient wards and examined the food preparation area. When he asked the contractor how much funding the government allocates per patient for food, the contractor replied that the amount is 80 rupees. The collector expressed dissatisfaction, observing that the quality of the food provided did not correspond to the funds being allocated by the government. He questioned the absence of bananas and eggs in the nutritious diet prescribed for patients. Speaking on the occasion, the collector stated that the government provides these meals specifically to ensure that poor patients visiting government hospitals receive healthy, nutritionally rich food; he emphasized that it is the responsibility of officials to ensure that every patient is served high-quality, hygienic meals in



accordance with this objective. He directed medical department officials to maintain continuous supervision over the food provided to patients. Subsequently, the Collector inspected the site designated for the "Young India Integrated School"—a prestigious project being undertaken by the State Government. He sought details from officials regarding various aspects, including the extent of the land, geographical conditions, accessibility, and the availability of infrastructure. He issued directives to provide all necessary facilities required for the school's construction and to expedite the commencement of the works. Accompanying the Collector during these inspections were Tahsildar Kishore, MPDO Apparao, Municipal Commissioner Nagaraju, RMO Mounika, Headmistress Sangeetha, and other concerned officials.

## Car Driver Responsible for Woman's Death Sentenced to 18 Months' Imprisonment and Rs 5,000 Fine

“Kukkadapu Naresh Kumar, Bhadradi Kothagudem Staff Reporter, April 07, Indian Chronicle: Kothagudem Legal: Kothagudem First Additional Judicial First Class Magistrate K. Sai Sri delivered a verdict on Tuesday, sentencing a car driver to imprisonment for causing the death of a woman. The details of the case are as follows: Nachaboyina Prashanth, a resident of Padamati Narsapuram in Julurupadu Mandal, filed a complaint at the Julurupadu Police Station on April 22, 2016. In his complaint, he stated that on the night of April 21, 2016, while his parents—Nachaboyina Venkanna and Lalitha—were sleeping inside their home, a Mahindra car (bearing registration number TS 04 EJ 999), driven by Nandigama Pavan Kumar of Palvancha, crashed into their house. The driver, Pavan Kumar, had been operating the vehicle at excessive speed and in a negligent manner; as a result of the collision, his mother, Nachaboyina Lalitha, sustained severe injuries and died on the spot. The complaint further noted that, prior to this incident—approximately 100 yards away—the same car had crashed into a motorcycle (bearing registration number AP 24 AL 1262) belonging to Lakavath Saikumar and Boda Ashok Kumar of Machinapeta, causing severe injuries to both of them. Based on this complaint, the then head constable, K. Rama Das, registered a case. Following an investigation conducted by the then sub-inspector, P. Srinivas, a chargesheet was filed in the court, and the court subsequently examined 14 witnesses during the trial proceedings. Following the trial, the court delivered a verdict sentencing Nandigama Pawan Kumar—who was driving the car—to one year and six months of imprisonment and imposing a fine of 5,000 rupees. APP B. Vishwashanti conducted the prosecution, assisted by Court Nodal Officer SI D. Raghavayya and Court PC Upender Rao.

## Permanent solution for flood-affected colonies

### Development works should be completed quickly.. MLA KR Nagaraju

“Devulapally Srinivas, Warangal Bureau, April 7 (Indian Chronicle): Wardhannapet MLA KR Nagaraju said that the public government is committed to providing a permanent solution for flood-affected colonies. He instructed officials to complete development works quickly. On Tuesday, along with Warangal MP Kadiyam Kavya and Mayor Gundu Sudharani, the MLA laid the foundation stone for the construction of a retaining wall costing ₹4 crore in Gopalapuram Colony of the 56th division. It is known that the bund of the Gopalapuram village tank in the 56th division under the Greater Warangal Municipal Corporation limits was recently breached due to the impact of the Montha storm, causing severe flooding in several colonies in the Gopalapuram area. Due to the breach of the



tank bund, heavy floodwater entered the colonies and damaged household items in homes. Residents of the colony were gripped with fear and anxiety, leading to a situation where daily life became difficult. With the aim of providing a permanent solution to this problem, it was decided to construct a strong retaining wall near the

Gopalapuram tank bund. For this, approximately ₹4 crore funds were sanctioned, and the retaining wall construction work has been initiated. “On this occasion, MLA Nagaraju said that he personally inspected the difficulties faced by the people of the Gopalapuram area and brought them to the notice of the government. He stated that steps are being taken toward a permanent solution to ensure that such problems do not arise again. He mentioned that by constructing a strong retaining wall near the tank bund, floodwater can be prevented from entering the colonies in the future. The MLA said that solving public problems is the main goal of their government and that they are working to immediately identify and resolve issues wherever they arise in the constituency. He especially noted that measures are being taken to strengthen infrastructure in areas prone to floods and waterlogging to ensure the safety of the people. He added that the government is focusing special attention on the development of the constituency and is undertaking several development works to provide necessary infrastructure to the public. He advised the concerned officials to complete the works with quality and speed so that they benefit the people. MLA Nagaraju assured that all measures will be taken so that the people of the Gopalapuram area can live peacefully in the future without fear of flooding. “He also said that he would take special measures to prevent encroachment of the tank and work towards establishing a walking track. ## 24-Year-Old Man Reported Missing in Malkaram

The missing person has been identified as Prashanth, son of Rambabu, a daily wage labourer. According to family members, he left for work on the morning of April 5, 2026, and returned home at around 6:30 PM. Later, he went out again on his motorcycle, saying he would be back shortly, but failed to return. Concerned family members tried to contact him at around 10:00 PM, but his mobile phone was switched off. They searched at relatives’ houses and among known contacts, but could not trace him. Following a complaint filed by his mother, Sujatha, a case has been registered and police have started an investigation.

# 17-Year-Old Inter Student Goes Missing in Ippapalli...! Family in Panic, Police Begin Investigation.

According to his father, Mahipal, Pawan Kumar had recently returned home on March 12 after completing his examinations. On April 7, 2026, at around 10:00 AM, his parents left the house for work.
