Strict Measures Needed to Prevent Child Marriages: TGSCPCR Chairperson Seetha Dayakar Reddy

During the visit, a review meeting was held in Raghunadhapalem mandal under the chairmanship of District Welfare Officer Mrs. Velpula Vijetha. The meeting was attended by sarpanches, panchayat secretaries, teachers, Anganwadi staff, and officials from various departments. Key issues such as child rights protection, prevention of child marriages, eradication of child labour, and the right to education were discussed in detail. Officials emphasized that Village Child Protection Committees (VCPCs) should function

more actively at the grassroots level to identify children's issues and take immediate action. Speaking on the occasion, District Welfare Officer Velpula Vijetha said that awareness programs are being conducted extensively under the guidance of the District Collector to prevent child marriages. She expressed confidence that Raghunadhapalem mandal would soon be developed into a child marriage-free mandal. Sarpanches who attended the meeting assured their full support and commitment to completely eliminate child marriages at the village level. District Panchayat Officer Rambabu stated that structured plans are being implemented to strengthen sarpanches and panchayat secretaries in protecting children's rights across the district. District Medical and Health Of-

ficer Dr. Rama Rao highlighted that Khammam is a polio-free district and that the health department is working towards ensuring the well-being of children. Child Rights Committee member Mrs. Chandana stressed the importance of maintaining accurate data on school-going, non-school-going, and dropout children at the village level. She said such data would help in preparing effective child protection plans. Another committee member, Saritha, emphasized that along with parents and teachers, sarpanches as village leaders must also take responsibility for child protection. The Chairperson expressed satisfaction over the effective functioning of VCPCs in the district and appreciated the efforts of the district administration.

Mega Health Camp Conducted at Pedda Gopathi Village



“Avnreddy Khammam Town Reporter April 8, (Indian Chronicle):“As part of the “Praja Palana – Pragathi Pranalika 99 Days Program,” a mega health camp was successfully organized at the Pedda Gopathi Primary Health Centre in Konijarla Mandal under the supervision of Dr. K. Radhakrishna. The camp was inaugurated by Pedda Gopathi Village Sarpanch Mrs. Velinati Sunitha and Khammam Deputy District Medical and Health Officer Dr. Venumadhav. A team of specialist doctors, including general physicians, gynecologists, dentists, orthopedic specialists, pediatricians, and ophthalmologists, participated in the camp and provided medical check-ups to 265 patients. During the event, doctors educated the public on preventive healthcare measures, emphasizing precautions against heart diseases, diabetes, and cancer. They advised people not to panic if diagnosed with conditions like BP, diabetes, or cancer, but instead to seek timely treatment from government healthcare providers. Special awareness was given to girls aged 14 and above about taking the HPV vaccine to prevent cervical cancer. With rising temperatures, doctors also advised the public to stay hydrated by consuming buttermilk, water, coconut water, and lemon juice to avoid heatstroke. The program saw participation from hospital staff including Nageswara Rao, Pedda Pullayya, Jamuna, Rambabu, Bhavani, and Anuradha, along with Para Legal Volunteer T. Madhavi Latha from the District Legal Services Authority, Khammam, as well as ANMs and ASHA workers from various villages.

Ensure Punctuality, Improve Patient Care: Collector to Hospital Staff

Hariitha has directed doctors and staff at government hospitals to strictly adhere to punctuality and ensure improved healthcare services for patients. During a surprise inspection of the government hospital at Bejjur mandal headquarters on Wednesday, she reviewed attendance registers, wards, and overall sanitation. Safety Lapses three Workers Fall During Railway Bridge Work in Kagaznagar

They claimed that basic safety protocols were not followed and pointed to visible lapses in construction safety measures. “Workers have demanded strict action against the contractor, holding him responsible for the accident.



Encroachments Cleared as Kagaznagar Expands Key Roads

“Indian Chronicle (Taj Khan), April 8, “Road widening works are in full swing in Kagaznagar as the municipality undertakes a major expansion drive to address rising traffic congestion and increasing vehicular movement. “The project covers key stretches including NTR Chowk to Bhatpally Junction, Rajiv Chowk to Ambedkar Chowk, Potti Sriramulu Chowrasta to Sanjeevaiah Colony, Ambedkar Chowk to Ellagoud Thota Government Hospital, and both sides of the Railway Flyover Bridge. “While several traders have voluntarily removed encroachments in line with markings issued by municipal town planning officials, authorities have also initiated demolition drives using JCB machinery in certain areas. “Tension briefly prevailed on Tuesday evening when compound walls of Sirpur Paper Mill quarters were demolished along the ESI Gate-Lorry Chowrasta stretch, leading to a dispute between mill authorities and municipal officials. Police intervened to restore order and ensure continuation of the works. “Officials stated that the removal of encroachments, particularly at NTR Chowk, has significantly widened roads, helping ease traffic congestion and improve public convenience.

Speaking on the occasion, Bar Association President Nisangi Vidyasagar said



that he had received information that the ADJ court was being moved to Ramannapet, and that it was not reasonable, and that the authorities should stop such an attempt. He said that the attempt to move the ADJ court to Ramannapet should be stopped, and that he had gone to the Hyderabad High Court and submitted a petition in this regard to the higher judiciary. In any case, the authorities should stop the attempt to move the ADJ court from Bhuvanagiri to Ramannapet, otherwise, large-scale protest programs would be organized. He said that he had left for Hyderabad on the same day to submit a petition in this regard to the High Court judges. As part of this, lawyers have been boycotting the court for three days and protesting, and every lawyer should participate in these programs as their duty, said Bhuvanagiri Bar Association President Nisangi Vidyasagar.

Gang Illegally Transporting Soil Arrested

“---Six Tractors, One JCB Seized — Geesugonda CI Visweshwar” “Devulapally Srinivas, Warangal Bureau (Geesugonda), April 8 (Indian Chronicle): Geesugonda police have taken into custody a gang that was illegally transporting soil on the outskirts of Chandrayyapalli village within the mandal limits. The police seized six tractors along with a JCB that was being used to carry out rampant soil excavation without any government permits. According to details provided by Geesugonda CI D. Visweshwar, the police received information that certain individuals were excavating soil from government land on the outskirts of Chandrayyapalli village—using a JCB and without any official permissions—and transporting it away via tractors. Responding immediately to this tip-off, the police rushed to the scene and halted the excavation operations. They

seized the vehicles involved in transporting the soil in violation of regulations and registered cases against the accused individuals. A total of seven persons have been identified as the accused in this case. Geesugonda CI D. Visweshwar confirmed that these seven individuals—Gandikota Satish (Manugonda), Gadudula Rajkumar (Manugonda), Gadudula Shraavan Kumar (Maheshwaram, Narsampet), Kuppala Srinivas (Chandrayyapalli), Kuppala Ajay (Chandrayyapalli), Thota Parusharamulu (Manugonda), and Gadudula Balaraju (Manugonda)—have been taken into custody. He issued a stern warning, stating that the illegal transportation of government resources would not be tolerated and that strict action would inevitably be taken against anyone engaging in the unauthorized excavation of soil or sand.

BJP Demands Unconditional Apology from Mallikarjun Kharge for Incendiary Remarks Against RSS

“Hyderabad, April 8: The Telangana unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Wednesday strongly condemned the derogatory, inflammatory, and deeply irresponsible remarks made by Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge against the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), demanding an immediate and unconditional apology. “Reacting sharply, BJP State Chief Spokesperson and Media In-Charge N V Subash termed Kharge’s call for a renewed ban on the RSS as “historically ignorant, politically motivated, and dangerously provocative.” He said such statements not only distort well-established facts but also seek to malign an organisation that has contributed selflessly to nation-building for nearly a century. “Kharge, while addressing a public gathering, not only called for banning the RSS but went a step further by using highly objectionable language, reportedly describing the organisation as a “poisonous snake.” More disturbingly, Subash alleged that Kharge made an

outrageous appeal suggesting that minority Muslims should, if necessary, even cut short their namaz prayers and attack or kill RSS workers if they encountered them. “If this does not qualify as hate speech and open incitement to violence, then what does? Such statements from the president of a national party expose the dangerous mindset Congress has nurtured over decades,” Subash said, adding that the Election Commission must take immediate cognisance, especially since the remarks were made in the context of a poll-bound state like Assam. “Taking strong exception to Kharge invoking Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Subash said it was a blatant misrepresentation of history. “Sardar Patel’s legacy cannot be appropriated to justify baseless attacks on the RSS. “On the contrary, history shows that the ban imposed on the RSS after Mahatma Gandhi’s assassination was later revoked due to lack of evidence—exposing the Congress party’s politically driven narrative

even then,” he noted. “Subash further pointed out that even former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi had acknowledged the disciplined and nationalist character of RSS volunteers. “Their participation in national events, including Republic Day celebrations, stands as testimony to their commitment to the nation,” he added. “Highlighting the RSS’s contributions during national crises, he recalled its role during the 1962 Sino-Indian War, where volunteers assisted in relief and rehabilitation efforts. “From floods and earthquakes to cyclones and humanitarian emergencies, RSS cadres have consistently stood at the forefront of service, without seeking publicity or political gain,” he said. “Contrasting this with Congress’s approach, Subash accused the party of maintaining a “consistent pattern of ideological hostility” towards the RSS. “For decades, Congress has attempted to demonise the RSS purely out of political insecurity, ignoring its unmatched contribution to social service and national integration,”

he said. “He also warned that such reckless statements could have serious consequences on the ground. “This kind of rhetoric can embolden fringe elements and lead to targeted violence against RSS workers, as has been witnessed in states like Kerala and Karnataka. This is unacceptable in any democratic setup,” he asserted. “Refuting allegations linking RSS to violence, Subash emphasized that the organisation remains one of the most disciplined and service-oriented volunteer groups in the world. “RSS has consistently upheld restraint, focusing on nation-building, cultural preservation, and social harmony,” he said. “The BJP reiterated that attempts to malign the RSS will not succeed and cautioned the Congress against indulging in divisive and dangerous rhetoric for political gains. “The people of India are fully aware of the truth. The Congress must immediately apologise for these irresponsible remarks and stop its politics of hate against an organisation that epitomises ,” Subash concluded.

BRS, BJP accused of ‘playing politics’ over Karimnagar dump yard issue

SUDA chairman alleges misgovernance, questions Centre’s contribution.

Khaja Sikander Mohiuddin Staff Reporter, Indian Chronicle Karimnagar, April 08: SUDA Chairman Komatireddy Narendra Reddy on Wednesday accused the BJP and the BRS of indulging in “politics over garbage” in connection with the dump yard issue in Karimnagar, while alleging administrative lapses during the previous regime.

Addressing a press conference, Mr. Narendra Reddy said the accumulation of garbage heaps across the city was a result of “inefficient governance” during the BRS rule. He alleged that funds allocated under the Smart City mission were misused and failed to address core civic issues.

Targeting BJP leader Bandi Sanjay Kumar, he questioned the progress made during his tenure as Member of Parliament and later as Union Minister. Mr. Narendra Reddy recalled that assurances were made last year, in the presence of Union Urban Development Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, to resolve the dump yard issue, but claimed that no tangible steps had followed.

He further alleged that the issue was politicised during municipal elections through “unfulfilled promises” of clearing waste. Criticising what he described as “contradictory statements” by BJP leaders in Karimnagar and Huzurabad, he said such actions were misleading the public.

The SUDA chairman also questioned whether any financial assistance had been secured from the Centre for addressing the dump yard problem. He accused BJP leaders of projecting that development in Karimnagar was solely driven by the Centre, while ignoring the State’s role.

Referring to protests by leaders of both parties, Mr. Narendra Reddy alleged that the public was being misled in the name of agitations. He asserted that people would respond appropriately to what he termed as “political opportunism”.

Mr. Narendra Reddy said the State government was committed to resolving the issue by completely clearing the dump yard and establishing a waste-to-energy plant to ensure scientific disposal without accumulation. He expressed confidence that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy would fulfil the assurances made



to the people.

He added that once proper waste management systems are in place, the location of such facilities would not pose inconvenience to residents.

WOMEN RESERVATION WOULD BE IMPLEMENTED FROM 2029

Hyderabad, Apr 8 :: Telangana state BJP President N Ramchander Rao today asserted that 33 per cent reservations for women in legislative bodies would be implemented from 2029 general elections." He was addressing a gathering after meeting residents of Shilpa Park Apartments in Kondapur. He said Nari shakti Vandan Adhinyam introduced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi was a landmark decision for women's empowerment. This was a monumental step toward ensuring greater political representation for women," he stated. He urged citizens to use Forms 6, 7, and 8 for new registrations, deletions, or corrections to ensure their voting rights are protected." still needed—especially in rural areas. BMS Demands Resolution of Contract Employees' Issues at Hyderabad Central University



“Serilingampalli 8 April: Expressing the grievances of contract employees working at the University of Hyderabad, leaders of the BMS Union held consultations with the University Registrar and administration on Wednesday. However, receiving no positive response from the administration, the BMS Union leaders—including President K.V. Radha Krishna, leader Rami Reddy, Working President J. Jitender, Vice Presidents J. Sumanjali and B. Anjayya, Deputy General Secretary B. Srinu, Secretary L. Sushma, Organizing Secretaries S. Jagannadha Rao, A. Prashanth, and B. Shekhar, Finance Secretary M. Chandrasekhar Chary, Office Secretary G. Praveen, Secretary T. Srinivas, and Committee Member K. Ananthayya—addressed a media conference. “Expressing his displeasure, he stated that it is unjust for the administration to subject workers to hardships by imposing various arbitrary rules—such as mandating manual signatures in a register in addition to biometric attendance—especially given that nearly 850 contract workers are employed there. “Speaking on the occasion, they stated that despite having worked at the Central University for the past 25 years, they lack any job security, do not receive wages commensurate with their labor, and are not paid their salaries on time. “They expressed anguish that the administration is keeping employee numbers artificially low and is pressuring the existing staff to work for extended hours. “Union leaders lamented that the administration has introduced a biometric attendance system and has begun harassing the workers. “To address the workers' issues, the union representatives met with the University admin-

istration on Wednesday and presented their demands: they sought wages proportionate to their labor, an end to labor exploitation, the discontinuation of the biometric system, and an increase in the workforce, urging the administration to resolve these various demands. “They warned that if the Central University administration continues to behave in this manner, the BMS union will stage protests and lay siege to the Registrar's office. The BMS State Union leaders questioned the propriety of issuing show-cause notices to employees simply for raising legitimate issues concerning their rights and entitlements. He warned that if the show-cause notices were not withdrawn immediately, the consequences—manifesting in the form of an agitation—would be severe. “Our Key Demands: “1. Equal pay for equal work must be implemented. “2. All pending bonus arrears must be paid immediately. “3. Gratuity must be paid immediately to all retired workers. “4. The arbitrary biometric attendance system must be abolished. “5. The mandatory signing of attendance registers within the administration section on Saturdays must be discontinued. “6. The Principal Employer must pay workers' salaries directly into their respective bank accounts. “7. Health Insurance coverage must be provided.

Missing Boy Reported in Shamirpet Police Station Limits
