

Need Both of Temple and School Former Minister T.Harish Rao

“Ashok Nagar/Warangal, May 11 (Indian Chronicle) : Leaders of the Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) have demanded that strict legal action be taken against those responsible for the demolition of an ancient Shiva temple located within the premises of a historic earthen fort dating back to the Kakatiya era, in Ashok Nagar village of the Narsampet constituency. They urged that the temple be reconstructed immediately and that construction work for the proposed integrated school also commence without any delay.”“On Monday, former Minister and BRS Deputy Floor Leader T. Harish Rao visited the area. He was accompanied by former Minister Errabelli Dayakar Rao; former MLAs Peddi Sudarshan Reddy, Shankar Naik, Vinay Bhaskar, and Aroori Ramesh; and former Corporation Chairman Errolla Srinivas. After performing prayers alongside local residents within the temple premises, he addressed media representatives.”“Harish Rao alleged that the demolition of the temple took place in the dead of night and that excavations reaching a depth of nearly 24 feet were carried out in the vicinity of the Garbhagudi (the sanctum sanctorum where the presiding deity resides). He questioned why these excavations—which could have easily been completed during the day as part of the school construction work—were undertaken at night, stating that this gives rise to serious suspicions. He pointed out that although the District Officer of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) submitted a written complaint to the District Collector as early as the 7th of this month, no FIR has been registered to date, nor have the machinery and equipment used in the incident been seized. He demanded a comprehensive inquiry to identify those responsible for this incident.”“He alleged that while this site was recorded as 'temple land' in official records during the tenure of the BRS government, subsequent alterations were made to the land records. He remarked that it is highly suspicious that the exact spot where the temple stood was chosen for the construction of a school, despite ample space being available nearby for the purpose.”“Reminding officials that structures over a hundred years old fall under the jurisdiction of the Archaeological Survey of India, he suggested that this site be immediately handed over to that department. He also called for the temple restoration works to be undertaken on a war footing.”“Harish Rao expressed concern regarding the tender process for the construction of integrated schools across the state. He alleged that a large number of contracts were awarded at inflated rates.



Demanding a transparent inquiry into this matter, he sought clarity regarding the utilization of public funds. He further noted that

local residents are also demanding an official explanation from the authorities regarding this incident.

GHMC reports 1.27 lakh online self-enumeration entries

Hyderabad: GHMC Commissioner and Principal Census Officer for Core Urban Region Economy (CURE) RV Karnan said a total of 1.27 lakh households across the CURE region had completed self-enumeration online. Speaking to media persons here on Monday, Karnan said a total of 19,868 House Listing Blocks (HLBs) in the CURE area had been created and digitally demarcated on the Census portal. He said 21,773 enumerators and 3,402 supervisors, includ-

ing reserve staff, taking the total to 25,175 personnel, were trained through 693 training batches. Enumerators will identify all buildings and census houses within the HLBs and carry out systematic numbering in a structured sequence as per guidelines. Building numbers and census house numbers will be marked at the main entrance of structures to facilitate uniform identification and future field verification, he said.

Traffic Police and Auto Driver Return Lost Bag to Woman in Khammam



"Khammam, May 11 (Indian Chronicle): "A woman who had lost her bag while traveling in an auto-rickshaw in Khammam city received timely help from traffic police and the auto driver, leading to the safe return of her belongings, including cash worth ₹20,000." According to Traffic Inspector Satyanarayana, Maloth Manjula, a resident of Sarvaram village in Bhadradi Kothagudem

district, came to Khammam for medical treatment. She traveled from the old bus stand to Sri Chakra Hospital in an auto-rickshaw bearing registration number TS04 14697. "After reaching the hospital, she realized that she had forgotten her bag in the auto. She immediately approached the nearby traffic police station and lodged a complaint using the identification details displayed on the auto. "Traffic police collected information from the auto stand near the old bus stand and contacted the auto driver. Responding promptly, the driver brought the bag to the police station and handed it over to Maloth Manjula in the presence of traffic police personnel. "The bag contained ₹20,000 in cash, all of which was returned safely. Free Borewell Power Connections Should Be Provided to Agency Farmers

Mass Line Party Leaders Speak Out Only Struggle Can Solve Farmers' Problems

"Governments must work for farmers' welfare" "Protecting the agriculture sector is the responsibility of governments" "Khammam, Karepalli, May 11 Indian Chronicle: "Mass Line Mandal Party Secretary Gummadi Sandeep and All India United Farmers Association Mandal Secretary Bikkasani Bhaskar Rao stated that both the Central and State governments must make serious efforts to resolve farmers' issues completely, otherwise farmers would be forced to achieve their demands through struggles and protests. "On Monday, leaders of the CPI(ML) Mass Line Party village committee from Tekulagudem village under Singareni mandal, along with villagers, left for the National First Conference of the United Farmers Association scheduled to be held in Yellandu on May 11, 12, and 13. "Addressing the gathering, the leaders said that farmers are trapped in a severe crisis and pointed out that the suicide of more than five lakh farmers is the most tragic example of this crisis. They alleged that, on average, 48 farmers are ending their lives every day in the country due to the anti-farmer policies of the Central and State governments. May 11):- State Chief Electoral Officer Sudarshan Reddy has instructed the officials to expedite the process of mapping the latest voter list with the 2002 SIR list as part of the Special Comprehensive Revision (SIR) process. On Monday, a video conference was held from Hyderabad with the collectors of all districts, district election officers and concerned officials and reviewed the progress of SIR mapping. In this context, the State Chief Electoral Officer said that at least 90 percent mapping should be completed in all the constituencies in the state in the next 15 days. He said that constituencies like Ghanpur (Station) and Ashwaraopet have already completed more than 80 percent of the mapping. He instructed the district election officers to encourage their teams and speed up the mapping process. He clarified that the role of political party representatives in mapping should be limited to house identification and identification of individuals. He advised that precautions should be taken so that the



public does not get the impression that private individuals are conducting SIR mapping. He said that the data entry operators required for the SIR process should be identified and appointed from all sources. He stated that a review would be conducted on the distribution and collection of forms every day after the start of SIR. He instructed that steps should be taken to ensure that the people know who the BLO is in their area and that no genuine voter loses his right to vote. He especially advised that priority should be given to mapping the names of VIP and VVIP voters. He said that sensational news should be prevented that the names of celebrities are wrong. He also instructed that the names of all government employees should be mapped. He advised that meetings should be held with political parties every Wednesday to increase the progress of mapping. He said that the cooperation of women from self-help groups should also be utilized. Revenue Additional Collector Venka Reddy, other concerned officials, and others participated in this video conference.

Society representatives appeal to Minister Ponguleti. "Justice will be done to all eligible journalists." "Minister calls for unity among all societies.

"KHAMMAM, 11 MAY, (INDIAN CHRONICLE) : "The President and Secretary of the Greater Hyderabad Journalists Mutually Aided Cooperative Housing Society, Mamidi Somaiah and Bollam Srinivas, appealed to the government to recognize their society in the allotment of house sites for journalists. On Monday, they met Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy at the Secretariat and submitted a memorandum containing the details of the society. "They stated that their society was established in 2008 to provide residential plots and housing facilities to journalists working in print and electronic media within the Greater Hyderabad limits.

Over the past 17 years, membership registrations were conducted in four phases, and currently more than one thousand journalists working in various newspapers and television channels across Hyderabad district and different municipalities under GHMC limits are members of the society. "Despite this, they expressed concern that the government has not been considering their society, and that it has neither been invited to meetings conducted with journalist housing societies nor included in the Joint Action Committee (JAC). They clarified that they are not against the present people's government and mentioned that although they had repeatedly requested the previous government to allot land to their society, no land was provided."

They further stated that, as per the society rules, they are prepared to pay the nominal price fixed by the government if land is allotted. They said this was conveyed several times to the previous government, but the issue of journalists' housing sites was neglected then as well. They urged the present government to allot house sites to the journalists who are members of their society and deliver justice. "Later, they also submitted memorandums to Media Academy Chairman K. Srinivas Reddy and I and PR Special Commissioner Mukunda Reddy. Society leaders Ravikumar, Srinivas Goud, Venkatesh and others participated in the program. "House sites will be provided to all eligible journalists" All societies should unite "Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy" State Revenue, Housing and I and PR Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy said that the government is sincerely working towards providing house sites to all eligible journalists. leagues in a transparent manner. He clarified that open trials and league matches were being organized on a larger scale and that every decision would be taken

impartially. "The organizers further stated that the final decisions regarding the upcoming leagues would be taken by the selection committee and that the process of appointing players and umpires had already begun.
